WHEREAS by "The Postponement of Debts Act, 1914," it is provided that the Governor may, on the advice of a Royal Commission, from time to time by Proclamation declare that payment of all debts then due or accruing due within the period mentioned in such Proclamation, of the classes specified or of persons of the classes specified in the Proclamation, or a specified proportion of any such debts, may, subject to such conditions and exceptions as may be contained in such Proclamation, be postponed to a date or for a period to be therein specified: And whereas a Royal Commission appointed under the said Act has advised that payment of all debts incurred in connection with the farming industry now due, or to accrue due within the period commencing on the publication of this Proclamation and ending the 31st day of March, 1918, should be post-poned to the 1st day of April, 1918, but subject to the conditions that the crops of the debtors are or were charged or intended to be charged to the Colonial Treasurer or the Industries Assistance Board, under and subject to "The Industries Assistance Act, 1915," and except debts incurred on and after the 1st day of March, 1916, for stores by settlers in receipt of eash advances from the Industries Assistance Board, for stores to be procured by such settlers and debts of settlers in receipt of eash advances for the purposes mentioned in paragraph (a) of Societies 6 of the purposes mentioned in paragraph (c) of Section 9 of the said Act, and not for the purposes mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b) thereof, and except Road Board and other rates and taxes: Now therefore I, the said Governor, on the advice of the Royal Commission and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that payment of all debts incurred in connection with the farming industry now due or to accrue due within the period commencing on the date of the publication of this Proclamation and ending on the 31st day of March, 1918, may be postponed to the 1st day of April, 1918, but subject to the condition that the crops of the debtors are or were charged to the Colonial Treasurer or the Industries Assistance Board under and subject to "The Industries Assistance Act, 1915," and except debts incurred on and after the 1st day of March, 1916, for stores by settlers in receipt of cash advances from the Industries Assistance Board for stores to be procured by such settlers, and of debts of settlers in receipt of advances for the purposes mentioned in paragraph (c) of Section 9 of the said Act, and not for the purposes mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b) thereof, and except Road Board and other rates and taxes.

Land set apart for selection under the Returned Soldiers' Settlement Scheme may be made available under Parts V., VI., VIII. and IX. of the Land Act, or the Reguations for the sale of Suburban Lands for Cultivation, and may be declared by notices in the Government Gazette, open under these Regulations for selection by persons who have been on Active Service with His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces, outside the Commonwealth during the present War, and have received an honourable discharge, or the dependents of those who have been killed or have died while on such Active Service.

Abandoned holdings held by the Agricultural Bank and Crown land not declared open for selection under these Regulations must be formally approved and declared by notices in the Government Gazette as open for selection under these Regulations before any advances may be made as herein

5. Land Rents shall be payable in accordance with the provisions of the Land Act and amendments as modified by these Regulations. Settlers are entitled to exemption from payment of rent for five years from the date of approval of the lease of holdings under Sections 55 and 68 of the Land

On land granted under Part VIII. of the Land Act (Homestead Farms) survey fee 'only is payable; and if desired this fee may be paid by the Agricultural Bank as portion of

the advance hereinafter provided for.

In cases where land is already held by the settler and brought under these Regulations, the five years' exemption shall date from the date to which the rent has been paid.

Protection of Holdings during Service.

Any settler holding land who has enlisted or is about to enlist, on supplying satisfactory evidence of his enlist-ment, may, on application to the Lands Department, obtain protection against forfeiture for non-compliance with conditions and non-payment of rent in respect of his holding during the period of his absence on active service: Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to holdings held by two or more persons jointly unless all the joint proprietors shall have enlisted.

Should the holdings be mortgaged to the Agricultural Bank arrangements must be made with that Bank for the completion of a power of Attorney in favour of some person to look after the property and maintain the improvements

during the settler's absence.

Conversion of Holdings.

Any settler who, prior to his enlistment, held land under Conditional Purchase conditions may apply to have his holding brought under the operation of these Regulations, and on the approval by the Minister, in his discretion, such holdings may be gazetted as being subject to the provisions of these Regulations accordingly, subject to such variations in respect to purchase money paid and improvements made as the Minister may think fit.

Advances for Prescribed Improvements or Plant.

Advances for Prescribed Improvements or Plant.

8. Advances may be made by the Agricultural Bank of any sum up to £500 to the full value of prescribed improvements to be effected and for plant, etc., at the discretion of the Trustees, on the security of the holding.

Interest will be charged at the rate of 3½ per cent. for the first year, rising by ½ per cent. per annum until the maximum interest payable as fixed for the time being, is reached.

reached.

After five years the advances will be repayable to the Agricultural Bank by instalments extending over 25 years with interest added.

Such advances may be made for the purchase of machinery or plant, or for the purpose of paying for improvements on land purchased by the applicant, valued before purchase by a Covernment Valuer and approved and gazetted under these Regulations; but the total sum advanced under this Clause shall not exceed £500 to each selector.

Any further advances above £500 may be made at the

discretion of the Trustees under the provisions of the Agri-

cultural Bank Act.

Advances for Cropping, etc.
9. Advances may be made by the Industries Assistance Board for the purchase of requirements, such as fertiliser, seed, cornsacks, eartage, etc., for putting on, taking off, and marketing crops and produce, repayable out of the proceeds of the crops or produce, in accordance with the terms and requirements of the Industries Assistance Board, also for the statutory fees payable on lodging applications.

Advances for Machinery, Drays, Wagons, etc.
10. Advances may be made by the Agricultural Bank for the purchase on eight years' terms of machinery, drays, wagons, etc., and during the first three years interest only to be charged: or by the Industries Assistance Board on the usual terms.

Advances for Stock.

11. Advances for stock, such as cows, horses, pigs, etc., may be made on the same terms as provided in regard to machinery.

Advances for Stores.

12. Advances may be granted for sustenance on such terms and to such amount as may be decided by the Agricultural Bank Trustees, or the Industries Assistance Board, payments to be made through the Inspectors from month to month as the settler complies with conditions prescribed by the Bank or the Industries Assistance Board in respect of the work on his holding.

Advances for Fees.

13. The statutory fees payable on applications to the Lands Department and Agricultural Bank may be paid by the Bank if desired, and debited to the settler as part of the advance under Clause 9.

Applications for Advances.

14. After the approval of the lease has been issued application may be made by the settler to the Agricultural Bank on the prescribed form for such advance as he may require, as provided for under these Regulations,

Residence.

15. Residence on the land will be compulsory for at least six months of each of the first five years, and any request for special reasons for exemption will be subject to approval of the Minister on the recommendation of the Land Qualification Board, each case to be dealt with on its merits.

Minimum Areas.

16. The minimum area of a holding under these Regulations which will be considered a sufficient security will be as follows :-

For Poultry Farms.—House, fencing, poultry yards, incubator sheds, water supply.

Subject to such additions or alterations as may be decided

upon by the Agricultural Bank Trustees.

Transfers.

18. No transfer will be allowed without the approval of the Minister on the recommendation of the Land Qualifi-cation Board, and if the land is transferred to other than an approved applicant, any special privileges provided under these Regulations will cease.

Price of Land.

19. Special Proviso re Poultry Farms.

20. Poultry farms will be available only to men who are physically incapable of the heavier farm work, and to soldiers widows. Applicants may be required to undergo a course of training at the Subiaco Training School, or other similar institution, or produce evidence of their qualifications as poultry farmers.

Experience Necessary.

21. Any applicant who, in the opinion of the Land Qualification Board, has not had sufficient practical farming experience, may be required, before receiving assistance, to acquire experience on a training farm or with some established farmer, until he can be certified by the Board as competent to manage his own farm.

Progress Reports.

22. The Inspector will report from time to time as to the progress and prospects of settlers. If a settler should be guilty of neglect, or fail to carry on his operations in a proper manner, or prove unfitted for a farming life, the Agricultural Bank Trustees may, in their discretion, stop further advances.

General.

23. In all other respects the land shall be held and the Crown Grant issued under the conditions and in accordance with the provisions of the Land Act, 1898, and its amendments.
