A water main constructed of 18in. C.I. pipes, with valves and all necessary apparatus, starting at the existing 18in. main in Hobart Street and proceeding generally in a north-westerly direction to and along Coogee Street, as indicated in blue on plan W.S.S. & D.D. No. 3232.

*Amendment of Regulations.*

The Regulations made by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners and dated the tenth day of August, 1917, are hereby amended as follows:—

1. By repealing Regulation No. 63 and enacting the following new Regulation in lieu thereof, viz.:—

*Regulation No. 63.*

*Dues payable by vessels.*—The only vessels which are exempt from the payment of Pilotage or Port dues chargeable under these Regulations (in addition to vessels exempt from Pilotage charges under these Regulations are vessels of war of any nationality and vessels owned by the Government of any of His Britannic Majesty's States or Colonies, so long as such vessels are not engaged in trade.
