THE LAND ACT, 1898, AND THE LAND ACT AMEND-MENT ACT, 1904.

TIMBER REGULATIONS.

Department of Woods and Forests,

300/1917. Perth, 21st December, 1917. HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Timber Regulations under the provisions of "The Land Act, 1898," and "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1904."

TIMBER REGULATIONS.

- 1. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1918.
- 2. The Timber Regulations made under the Land Act, 1898, and the Land Act Amendment Act, 1904, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th day of March, 1910, and the amendments thereof and all additional Regulations incorporated therewith are hereby repealed.
- 3. Timber Regulation No. 71 published in the Government Gazette of the 27th day of July, 1917, has been re-enacted, and is inserted as Regulation No. 20a among the Regulations published in the Government Gazette of the 21st day of December, 1906.

SOUTH-WEST DIVISION.

Interpretation.

In these Regulations the following words and expressions have the meaning herein set against the same respectively:—

- "Conservator"—Conservator of Forests.
- "Department" Department of Woods and Forests.
- "Minister"—The responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being charged with the administration of Part XI. of "The Land Act, 1898," and "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1904."

REGISTRATION OF TIMBER WORKERS.

- 1. On and after the first of January, 1918, no person shall fell, cut, saw, split, or remove any description of trees, hewn or sawn timber, piles, poles, or beams, on any Crown Land, Saw Mill Permit Area, or Hewing Permit Area in the South-West division of the State unless he hold a registration certificate.
- 2. Application for registration shall be made to the District Ranger in whose district the applicant resides or works, and the District Ranger shall forward the application together with his recommendation to the Conservator of Forests.
 - (a) Such registration shall be annual and shall specify the nature of the employment, and, in the case of fellers, hewers and splitters, the registered mark or brand employed in marking the stumps and timber.
 - (b) A fee of one pound ten shillings shall be paid for each such registration, provided that for the duration of the present hostilities and for twelve months thereafter, a rebate of ten shillings shall be made.
 - (c) Such registration may be suspended or cancelled by the Conservator for breach of the regulations.
 - (d) The certificate of registration shall be in form No. 1 Schedule. The holder of a certificate of registration is hereinafter referred to as a "timber worker."

- 3. All registered timber workers shall, before taking up employment on Crown Land, Sawmill Permit Area, or Hewing Permit Area other than specified in the certificate of registration, apply to the District Ranger in charge of the new area, and the District Ranger shall set out the number or other distinguishing mark of the area, the name of the Permit Holder or Contractor and shall certify to the same by appending his signature to the certificate of registration.
- 4. All applications for re-registration must be accompanied by a previous certificate. Copies of certificates or registration may be obtained on application to the Conservator of Forests and a fee of two shiftings and sixpence shall be charged for each such copy.
- 5. Every timber worker shall produce his certificate of registration to any officer of the Department on demand.
- 6. A certificate of registration shall only be available by the person named therein, and shall not be transferable.
- 7. Every registered timber worker, unless his certificate of registration is limited, and restricted to the carting and removal of timber may, subject to the Act and Regulations, fell, cut, saw, split, and remove timber only on and from the locality and within the boundaries thereof as specified in his certificate of registration.
- 8. No person shall, without the special permission in writing of the Conservator or any officer acting on his behalf, fell or remove any tree under standard size, as prescribed by the Regulations in force for the time being, or any tree which shall have been marked by a forest ranger to signify that it is not to be felled.
- 9. Every feller and hewer working on a State Forest or Crown Land, whether held under Timber Lease, Sawmilling Permit, or otherwise, shall provide himself with a distinctive branding hammer which he shall obtain from the Conservator, and for which he shall be required to pay a sum of 6s. and a registration fee of 1s. This branding hammer shall be registered in the office of the Conservator after recommendation by and approval of the officer by whom it is issued. Such registration shall hold good for one year only, but may be renewed on application to the Conservator. Such registration may be cancelled at any time by the Conservator on a breach of the regulations.

The Conservator may grant registration for any hammer already held by a registered timber worker, and in that case a registration fee of 1s. only shall be paid.

- 10. Every feller and hewer working on a State Forest or on other Crown land, whether held under timber lease, sawmilling permit, or otherwise, shall, immediately after every tree is felled, distinctly brand the stump with his registered brand on the surface caused by falling. He shall also, before removing any timber, brand with his registered brand the head of the tree, on the surface caused by its severance from the trunk.
- 11. A certificate of registration shall be held by every person engaged in carting or removing timber, and it shall not be lawful for any person to engage in carting or removing timber from any State forest, or timber reserve or other Crown land unless he be registered.
- 12. Every registered timber worker shall pay royalties in accordance with the scale prescribed by the regulations in force for the time being, except in the case of timber cutters employed solely in felling, carting, or removing timber within or from the area of a sawmilling permit or hewing permit area for the holder thereof.
- 13. All royalties shall be paid in full before the timber is removed from where it is felled, unless special arrangements are made with the Conservator for payment for large and continuous purchases by approved contractors, or purchasers at intervals not exceeding one calendar month.

SAW-MILLING AND OTHER PERMITS

14. The Conservator may grant permits to fell, hew, or get and remove timber or other forest products on and from specified areas of Crown land, State forests, or timber reserves, at a royalty per unit of measurement, for such period and subject to such conditions as the Conservator may think fit.

Such permits may be submitted to public auction or tender. If submitted to auction, a reserve price per unit of measurment of the estimated timber or other forest product on the area may be fixed, and, subject thereto, the highest bidder shall be declared the purchaser, and the price bid shall be the royalty payable. If submitted to tender, the highest or any tender shall not necessarily be accepted.

The permit may be in the form of No. 2 in the Schedule to these regulations, with such modifications thereof, and subject to such further conditions (if any) as the Conservator may think fit.

- 15. The Conservator may set apart certain areas to be hereinafter called "Sawmill Permit Areas." A notice shall be published in four issues of a newspaper circulating in the district and in the Government Gazette setting forth the position and boundaries of such areas and calling for tenders on the basis of royalty per load on the timber therein contained. Each tender shall be accompanied by a deposit of £20. Such deposit shall be refunded to the unsuccessful tenderers and to the successful tenderer on his compliance with the regulations as to the erection of a sawmill. The highest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.
- 16. After the expiration of the time fixed for receiving tenders the successful tenderer shall be notified, and he may then make application on form No. 3 in the Schedule, which shall be delivered or sent by post to the Conservator of Forests at his office in Perth, accompanied by such survey fee as may be determined by the Conservator and stated in the acceptance of tender.
- 17. On the approval by the Governor of the application, a permit in the form of No. 4 in the Schedule will be granted to the applicant for a term not exceeding ten years, to date from the first day of the then current quarter.
- 18. The successful tenderer under Regulation 14 or No. 15 shall pay such demarkation fee as shall be fixed by the Conservator, but it shall not exceed the survey fee prescribed by the scale of fees contained in the regulations under "The Land Act, 1898," gazetted on the 26th day of February, 1909: Provided that the Minister may at any time require a survey of the boundaries of the area to be made by a licensed surveyor, and the permit holder shall pay the survey fee prescribed by the before-mentioned scale of fees.
- 19. A saw-milling permit may, subject to the Act and the regulations in force for the time being, be held by any person or company not interested, directly or indirectly, in any timber lease or concession, and shall entitle the holder, subject as hereinafter provided, to the sole and exclusive right to cut and remove timber on and from the area described in such permit, which shall contain approximately sufficient forest to provide ten years' cutting, if available in the vicinity, proportionate to the horse-power of the mill proposed to be erected, based on the estimated daily output shown in the application for such permit.

Provided that it shall be lawful for the Minister and for any person or persons acting in that behalf by his authority to cut and take away on and from the said area any indigenous timber that may be required for making and keeping in repair any railways and railway stations, and generally for any other works and purposes of public utility or convenience, without making to the holder of the permit any compensation in respect thereof.

- Provided that the holder of such permit or a manager appointed by him and every person employed by the holder of such permit or his manager in falling, carting, or removing timber shall hold a certificate of registration, issued under these regulations.
- 20. Nothwithstanding anything contained in these regulations a saw-milling permit may, in the discretion of the Governor in special cases to be recommended by the Minister, be granted to and held by any person or company, notwithstanding that such person or company is interested as owner or otherwise in a timber lease or concession.
- 21. The holder of a saw-milling permit shall, within six months from the date of approval of his permit, erect within the area to which the permit relates, or on such other site as the Conservator may approve, a fully equipped saw-milling plant of the capacity provided for in his application, and shall thereafter maintain such plant in working order.
- 22. Within six months of the approval of the permit the holder shall proceed with the felling and removal of the timber in accordance with the Act and regulations.
- 23. No saw-milling permit holder shall, without the special permission in writing of the Conservator or any officer acting on his behalf, by himself or any registered timber worker acting for him, fell or remove any tree under standard size as prescribed by the regulations in force for the time being, or any tree marked by a forest ranger to signify that it is not to be felled.
- 24. Every holder of a saw-milling permit shall pay, for all timber felled and removed on and from the area to which his permit relates, the royalties prescribed by these regulations or any other regulations made in lieu thereof and in force for the time being, and the timber worker's registration fee of one pound ten shillings per year, for every man employed in felling, earting, or removing timber within such area.
- 25. Every permit holder shall from time to time confine his operations to certain defined sections of the area, marked under his directions by an officer of the Department, and not exceeding at any one time such area as is sufficient to supply the mill with two years' cutting. At the expiration of each period of two years the sections as denuded of timber shall be closed from cutting, and reserved with the object of encouraging the preservation and nurture of young timber.
- 26. The holder of a saw-milling permit shall, on the first day of every calendar month, furnish the Conservator with a return verified by statutory declaration, showing the number of logs put through the mill every day, the measurements of same in the round, and their cubic contents, and the total output of the mill during the last preceding month.
- 27. Returns of royalties due shall be delivered or forwarded by post or otherwise by the ranger or other officer of the Department to the permit holder, as soon as practicable after the expiration of every month, and the permit holder shall pay to such officer the amount due within seven days after the date of the return, or within such extended time as may be allowed by the Minister, and no alleged inaccuracy in the return shall be an excuse for delay in such payment beyond the prescribed time; but any proved inaccuracy shall be taken into consideration in any subsequent account, or a refund may be made of any overcharge proved to the satisfaction of the Minister.
- 28. Should any royalties or fees payable under a permit or any part thereof be in arrear for 14 days after the due date, whether payment shall have been demanded or not, the Conservator or any officer acting under him in his hehalf may enter, and prohibit the felling, sawing, and removing of timber, and may seize all timber felled, and any machinery, horses, plant, or other effects, the property of

the permit holder, that may be found upon the land comprised in the permit.

- 29. No permit holder shall fell and leave lying in the bush at any time more than one month's supply of logs in advance of the requirements of the mill.
- 30. The Minister may grant to a permit holder authority to hold an area not exceeding 50 acres as a mill site, during the currency of his permit, at a rent of £2 per annum. Application for such site, defining the position hereof, and accompanied by the first year's rent, shall be forwarded to the Conservator in Perth.
- 31. The Conservator or any officer of the Department nay, in the performance of his duties under the Act and the regulations, enter upon any land the subject of a saw-milling permit, and into any sawmill or other building, and inspect any machinery or timber, and all books containing any entries relating to the timber cut or procured under these regulations, which the permit holder shall produce for inspection on demand.
- 32. In the event of the permit holder failing to maintain his estimated output, as set forth in his application, he shall notwithstanding be required to pay at least 60 per cent. of the royalty computed on the amount stipulated in his original estimate, and further, if, in the opinion of the Conservator, he fails to maintain his estimated output for what the Conservator in his discretion considers an unreasonable period, the Minister may reduce the area of such permit proportionately.

For the purpose of computing the royalty due under this regulation, the number of working days per month shall be taken as 23 and the waste per load as 50 per cent.

- 33. All timber felled, cut, or sawn, and all buildings erected by, and all the effects of the holder of a permit not removed from the area within 90 days from the expiration of the permit shall become the property of the Crown, and may be taken possession of and removed by an officer of the Department or other person authorised by the Minister.
- 34. The Minister may from time to time set apart any portion of the area over which the sole right of cutting timber is granted by any saw-milling permit, for occupation by workmen and others employed in connection with such permit, or other persons supplying or ministering to the wants of the workmen. Such persons so desirous may obtain a "Residence Permit" or "Business Permit," which will be granted per annum or per month, at the rate of one shilling per month.
- 35. Should it appear to the Conservator, by personal inspection or the report of any officer of the Department, that the holder of a permit is causing unnecessary or wanton destruction of timber, the Conservator may notify the permit holder to desist from such destruction, and if such destruction is continued it shall be deemed to be a breach of these regulations.
- 36. The holder of a saw-milling permit shall not, without the permission in writing of the Conservator, cut or remove timber from any freehold, leasehold, or Crown lands while he is operating upon the land held under permit.
- 37. The holder of a saw-milling permit shall not, without the permission in writing of the Conservator, fall or cut or allow to be felled or cut any sleepers or any timber for sleepers until all the timber suitable for mill logs, piles, poles, and beams shall have been cut.
- 38. The rights conferred upon a permit holder by the Act and these regulations shall not affect the right of the Conservator or any person claiming under him to occupy or use the land therein comprised for any purpose consistently with the rights conferred by the permit.
- 39. The right is reserved to the Crown at any time during the continuance of a sawmill permit to sell, lease, or otherwise dispose of any Crown land within such per-

mit which, in the opinion of the Minister, has been denuded of marketable timber or timbers likely to develop into marketable timber, or which is not required by the permit holder for roads, tramways, mill sites, etc.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

Standard Sizes.

40. The standard sizes at which the undermentioned trees may be cut within the South-West Division, South of a line due East from Dongara, at three feet from the ground, with the bark on, are respectively as follows:—

41. Provided nevertheless that the Conservator or any officer acting on his behalf may, on application, give permission in writing allowing the felling, hewing, or sawing of any matured trees not being less than 72 inches in circumference measured at three feet from the ground with the bark on and not over 30 feet in length.

A forest ranger may mark and allow to be felled for sawing or hewing any defective or crooked trees, irrespective of length or girth, that in his opinion it is desirable shall be felled.

"Round-back" or "Rough Split Sleepers," used for the construction of light spur railways in the State, may be obtained from any timber growing on Crown lands at a royalty of 2s. 6d. per 100 sleepers, not including inspection fees, in addition to the registration fee prescribed by Regulation 2b. The standard size of timber shall not apply to timber used for this purpose, but any tree or trees may be marked by forest officers and reserved from felling.

Royalties.

42. Timber felled or obtained by a registered timber worker or under "Permit" shall, unless otherwise provided for, be subject to payment of the following royalties:—

43. Timber growing upon any Crown land, timber reserve, saw-milling permit area, timber concessions or timber leases, and cut under these regulations for poles or piles, shall be paid in accordance with the following scale:—

- 44. All sawn and hewn beams with the heart in shall be subject to a royalty of three-pence per lineal foot.
- 45. Provided that timber not included in the foregoing scale shall be charged for at the rates proportionate to the general scale of charges, and provided further, that the Conservator may, where small quantities of timber are required by settlers for bona fide use and not for sale, authorise the removal thereof from Crown lands without payment.
- 46. All royalties shall be paid in full before the timber is removed from where it is felled, unless special arrangements are made with the Conservator for payment for large and continuous purchases by approved contractors or purchasers at intervals not exceeding fourteen days.
- 47. No timber shall be removed from where it is felled without the consent, in writing, of an officer of the Department until the royalty is paid: Provided that with the approval in writing of an officer of the Department timber subject to royalty may be removed to and stored for a specified time in an authorised depôt, if such timber is marked with a distinctive brand registered with an officer of the Department; but such shall at all times be open to inspection by any officer of the Department, who shall have power to seize such timber should it be removed, or detain it should he have reason to suspect there is an intention to remove it from the depôt before payment of royalty, or in case of any breach by the permit holder of these regulations with respect to such timber.
- 48. Upon payment being satisfactorily arranged for, an officer of the department may inspect the timber felled and hewn at the stump, and brand with the inspection brand all such timber as he may consider suitable for market purposes, and such brand shall be deemed a certificate from the Department that the timber is passed as of first-class quality and true to name. If any timber on inspection does not come up to the required standard it shall be branded with a distinctive brand to indicate that such timber is not deemed to be of first-class quality.

- 49. Hewn timber may, at the discretion of the officer called upon to inspect the same, be inspected at the stump, and any that may have been obtained from Crown lands, private property, and timber lease or concessions on which inspection is required, shall be charged for by the Department at the rate of 1s. per load. All sawn timber on which inspection is required shall be charged at the rate of 9d. per load. The inspection fee for all piles, poles, and beams shall be at the rate of one-third of the royalty chargeable on each of such piles, poles, and beams. If required, inspection of hewn timber will be made at Siding or Depôt, but in all cases timber must be tallied for royalty purposes at the stump by an officer of the Department.
- 50. No timber obtained from privately held land shall be departmentally inspected unless such timber bears the registered brand of the owner of such privately-held land. Every such brand shall be registered at the office of the Conservator, and shall be subject to his approval. A fee of 1s. shall be payable on such registration.
- 51. No sleeper shall be removed from the stump before being tallied and branded with the tally brand by an officer of the Department without special permission of an officer of the Department.
- 52. If required so to do, such officer may also give a certificate that the timber inspected, in addition to being of first-class quality and true to name, is up to size in accordance with the specification; but no such certificate shall be deemed a guarantee, nor shall the Government be responsible for any error or misstatement therein.
- 53. All unbranded logs, or logs branded with an unregistered brand or mark, may be seized by any officer of the Department and shall be forfeited to the Crown.
- 54. Should it appear to the Conservator or any officer of the Department that a registered timber worker or permit holder is causing unnecessary or wanton destruction of growing timber, or is not utilising timber felled to the best advantage, then the Conservator or such officer may require payment by the registered timber worker or permit holder of a sum equal to the royalty per load for such timber, and the amount so required to be paid may be recovered from the registered timber worker or permit holder by action in any court of competent jurisdiction.
- If any registered timber worker or permit holder unnecessarily destroys or causes unnecessary destruction of growing timber, or fells any timber except for the purpose of utilising same in a reasonable and usual manner, he shall be guilty of a breach of this regulation.
- 55. No tree shall be felled so as to obstruct any railway, tramway, road, track, or watercourse, and if any tree is felled in a manner contrary to this regulation, in addition to the penalty thereby incurred for a breach of this regulation, any officer of the Department may cause the obstruction to be removed at the cost of the person offending against the regulation, and the same shall be recoverable from such person in any court of competent jurisdiction.
- 56. A permit holder shall be responsible for the acts of every person or persons employed by him in cutting or carting or removing timber.
- 57. It shall be unlawful for any registered timber worker or other person to strip the bark from any standing tree, or to fell any tree for the sole purpose of obtaining the bark.
- 58. Every person shall, whenever required so to do by an officer of the Department, show such officer the timber cut by him.
- 59. No unauthorised person shall make use of or have in his possession any Government timber brand.

- 60. The cutting or removal of Kurrajong, Quandong, Red-flowering Gum, and Christmas trees of every kind or size is absolutely prohibited throughout the State.
- 61. No Tuart or Wandoo shall be felled, cut, or sawn, except for supply to Departments of the Western Ausralian Government, for use only by such Departments and not for sale.
- 62. Any officer of the Department may seize and disose of any timber unlawfully cut or removed contrary to hese regulations or any regulations made in lieu thereof in force for the time being.
- 63. Any person who, without being registered, feils, suts, hews, carries or removes timber contrary to these regulations, or otherwise commits a breach of or fails to observe these regulations or any of them, shall for every offence be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £100.
- 64. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, but subject to "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1904," the Minister may, with the approval of the Governor, enter into any agreement with the holder or intending holder of a saw-milling permit with the object of imposing any other conditions in addition to those herein provided for which may be deemed advisable, and such conditions shall be deemed to be prescribed by these Regulations, and the conditions and terms of the permit may be so altered or framed as to give effect to such agreement.
- 65. No person shall light or kindle a fire within any State forest without clearing all surrounding inflammable material and débris beyond reach of the fire, or otherwise taking reasonable precaution to prevent the spread of fire. Any person who lights, kindles, or leaves fire the spread of which causes injury to or destruction of seedlings, saplings, trees, timber, or products thereof, shall be guilty of an offence, and on conviction be liable to the penalty precribed by Regulation 75 for a breach of the regulations.

LICENSES.

- 66. A woodcutter's (firewood) and charcoal burner's license may be issued in the form No. 5 in the Schedule for one month or any number of months, at a fee of one shilling per month per man, and such license shall entitle the holder to cut and remove on and from the locality to be therein specified, for fuel or charcoal burning, such green timber as may be authorised by a forest ranger or other officer of the Department, and any dead timber not worked to a marketable size and shape. A similar license must be obtained by every person engaged only in removing the wood dealt with under a woodcutter's and charcoal burner's license.
- 67. A sandalwood license may be issued in the form No. 6 in the Schedule, for one month or any number of months, at a fee of one shilling per month per man, but subject to the royalty charge of five shillings per ton prescribed by Clause 13 of the Timber Regulations gazetted on the 21st December, 1906, and shall authorise the licensee to fell, cut, and remove sandalwood on and from the locality specified.

Sandalwood shall only be cut when fifteen inches at least in circumference three feet from the ground.

- A similar license must be obtained by every person engaged only in removing the sandalwood dealt with under a sandalwood license.
- 68. A wattle bark license may be issued in the form No. 5 in the Schedule for one month or any number of months, from August to January inclusive in any year, and shall authorise the holder to strip and remove the wattle bark on and from the locality to be therein specified.

The fee payable for a wattle bark license shall be five shillings per month per man.

- A similar license must be obtained by every person engaged in removing the bark dealt with under a wattle bark license.
- 69. A bark license may be issued in the form No. 5 in the Schedule for one month or any number of months, at a fee of five shillings per month per man, and shall authorise the licensee to strip and remove bark or to remove the gum from any trees, other than the wattle, the bark or gum of which contains tannic acid, on and from the locality to be therein specified, and the Minister may insert therein such other terms and conditions as he may think
- A similar license must be obtained by any person engaged only in removing the bark and gum dealt with under such license.
- 70. The Conservator or forest rangers may revoke or withhold any license in the event of the licensee obstructing any Officer of the Department in the execution of his duty or infringing any part of the Act or regulations thereunder.
- 71. Should it appear to the Conservator or any officer of the Department that a licensee is causing unnecessary or wanton destruction of growing trees or of forest produce, or is not utilising trees felled to the best advantage, then the Conservator or any officer authorised may require payment by the licensee of a sum equal to the value of such forest produce, and the amount so required to be paid may be recovered from the licensee by action in any court of competent jurisdiction.

If any licensee unnecessarily destroys or causes unnecessary destruction of trees he shall be guilty of a breach of this regulation.

- 72. The Conservator or any forest ranger may revoke or withhold any license in the event of the licensee obstructing any officer of the Department in the execution of his duty, or infringing any part of the Act or regulations thereunder.
- 73. Any officer of the Department may seize any sandalwood, firewood, bark, gum or other produce unlawfully cut, obtained, or removed contrary to these regulations, or of any regulations made in lieu thereof in force for the time being.
- 74. No person shall fell, cut, split or obtain any timber, whether growing or dead, on any reserve set apart for settlers' requirements, except under written permit from the Conservator.
- 75. Any person committing a breach of these regulations shall, for every such offence for which a penalty is not otherwise specially provided by the Act or these regulations, be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

REGULATIONS CONTROLLING THE STRIPPING OF MALLET BARK.

- 1. The Minister, or such other person as he appoints, may issue a mallet bark license authorising the licensee to strip and remove mallet bark upon and from the Crown lands named in the license.
- 2. A similar license must be obtained by every person engaged only in removing the bark dealt with under a mallet bark license.
- 3. Each license will be available only by the person named therein as licensee, and will not be transferable except by the special permission of the officer authorised for the time being to issue licenses.

- 4. Every licensee must show his license whenever production thereof is demanded by an officer of the Woods and Forests Department or other authorised officer.
 - 5. All trees must be felled before being stripped.
- 6. No mallet tree of fifteen (15) inches in circumference or under, measured at four (4) feet from the ground. shall be felled.
- 7. All trees felled shall have the limbs as well as the bole stripped to a diameter of three (3) inches.
- S. No mallet tree, unless already "butt" stripped, shall be stripped of bark during the period from 1st February to 31st July inclusive in each year.
- 9. Bark stripped upon Crown lands and not removed during the currency of the license shall become, should the Minister so decide, the property of the State.
- 10. The officers of the Woods and Forests Department may seize and dispose of any bark stripped or removed contrary to these regulations.
- Any person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20 for any single offence, nor £2 per day for a continuing offence, and not exceeding £100 in the aggre-
- 12. The fee for a mallet bark license shall be 5s. per month for each person employed in stripping, and for each person engaged only in carting.

- 2. The permit holder shall pay to the Conservator of Forests' the office of Woods and Forests, Perth, the royalty of (2) at the office of for (3) obtained under this permit, and such royalty shall be payable forthwith as accounts are rendered from time to time by or on behalf of the Conservator to the permit holder.
- 3. The permit holder shall from time to time, at such intervals as the Conservator may require, furnish to the Conservator, at the office of Woods and Forests, Perth, true returns of all (4)

under this permit.

- 4. All trees within the said area marked by the ranger with his hammer brand shall be felled by the permit holder.
- 5. No trees shall be felled unless marked by a ranger with his hammer brand
- 6. Royalty shall be payable in respect of, and the permit holder shall be responsible for, all (5) area while this permit is in force.
- 7. The permit holder shall work continuously, and shall fell and hew or otherwise obtain on the said area (6) month at least, unless exempted by the Conservator.
- 8. All trees cut into or felled or other forest product obtained under this permit shall be utilised with the minimum of waste, to the satisfaction in all respects of the ranger in charge.
- 9. This permit shall not be construed as a guarantee that the area contains any specific quantity of timber or other forest product, and the permit holder accepts all risk of quantity, girth, accessibility and all other like matters pertaining to the timber or other forest product, and the right to fell, saw, and remove and obtain the same.
- 10. This permit shall not be transferred without the consent in writing of the Conservator.
- As security for the due observance and performance by the permit holder of his obligations under this permit, the sum of £ has been deposited by him at the office of Woods and Forests, Perth, to be retained until the expiration or sooner determination of this
- 12. In default of payment by the permit holder of the royalty hereby reserved or of the due observance and performance by him of the conditions of this permit, and the observance by him of the provisions of the said Acts and Regulations or any of them, to which this permit is subject, the Conservator may suspend this permit for such time as he may think fit, or, by notice in writing to the permit holder, cancel and determine this permit, and thereupon the deposit may be forfeited, together with all timber felled or hewn or other forest product obtained on the said area; and may seize all machinery, horses, carts, whims, or other plant the property of the permit holder, but without prejudice to the rights of the Conservator to recover royalty in arrear, and in respect of any other claims against the permit holder.
- 13. If any question shall arise as to the observance and performance by the permit holder of the conditions of this permit, or the observance by him of the provisions of the said Acts and the Regulations, or in case of any dispute in relation to the felling, hewing, or removal of timber (7) or as to the quantity of timber felled or hewn (8) the sam decided by the Conservator, whose decision shall be final. the same shall be
- 14. Any notice in writing to the permit holder may be served on him by addressing such notice to him, and sending it by post to, or leaving it at his address as stated in this permit.
- 15. The permit holder accepts this permit, and agrees with the Conservator to observe and perform the conditions and obligations of this permit, and to pay the royalty hereby reserved.
