The new Rolls herein referred to shall come into operation at a date to be fixed by subsequent proclamation.

WHEREAS a petition duly signed was presented to the Governor under the provisions of Section 4 of "The Land Drainage Act, 1900," with a view to the area defined as margined in red on the attached plan, W.S., and D.D., No. 3231, being constituted and declared a Drainage District: And whereas it has been resolved to give effect to such petition: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the area of land described in the Schedule hereto to be a drainage district within the meaning and for the purposes of the Land Drainage Act, 1900, with the boundaries as defined in the said Schedenle, and by the name of the Saide Drainage District.

POLICE BENEFIT FUND REGULATIONS.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 18th January, 1918.

His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the repeal of existing Regulation No. 6 and the substitution therefor of the following:—

Regulation No. 6 of the regulations published in the Government Gazette on the 23rd day of July, 1915, as amended, is hereby repeated, and the following regulation is made and shall have effect in lieu thereof:

- 6. (1) Any member of the Force who entered the Service prior to the 14th day of December, 1917, and who may have served therein for twelve consecutive years, shall be permitted to claim his discharge therefrom, and a gratuity of one month's pay for each year's service.
 - (2) Any member of the Force who entered the Service prior to the 14th day of December, 1917, and who may have served for a longer paried then the last the served for a longer period than twelve years, may claim a gratuity calculated at the same rate as in the preceding rule.
 - (3) Any member of the Force who entered the Service on or after the 14th day of December, 1917, and who may have served therein for not less than 12 years, shall be permitted to claim his discharge therefrom, and a gratuity on the following basis:-

Period of Service, and No. of Weeks' Salary for each Year of Service. Over 12 and under 15 years—Two. Over 15 and under 20 years—Two and two-thirds.

Over 20 and under 25 years-Three. Over 25 years—Four.
