WHEREAS by a Crown Lease under "The Land Act, 1898," registered in the books of the Office of Land Titles as Crown Lease No. 1996/1913, Avon Location 18141 was granted to Sarah Charlotte Elsie Ottey, as Grazing Lease No. 6619/68, subject to the reservation to His Majesty the King, his heirs and successors, of the right to resume and enter upon possession of any

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1911," it is provided that the Governor may by Order in Council unite two or more districts into one district, assign, and alter the names of districts, dissolve the Board of a district, and divide or re-divide a district into wards, and define the boundaries and assign names to wards: And whereas it is desirable to unite the Menzies and Kookynie Roads Districts into one district, to form the area of the said Kookynie Road District into a ward of the said united district, to dissolve the Kookynie Road Board, and to define the boundaries and assign the names as hereinafter appearing: And whereas notice of intention so to do has been duly given, published, and served in accordance with the requirements of the said Act, and insufficient cause was shown to the Governor why the powers proposed to be exercised should not be so exercised: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and under and by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the said Act, and of every other power him enabling in this behalf, doth hereby order and declare:—

1. The Menzies and the Kookynie Road Districts shall be, and the same are hereby united into one district to be called the Menzies Road District.

2. The area of the late Kookynie Road District as previously constituted shall be, and the same is hereby made an additional ward of the Menzies Road District, to be called the Kookynie Ward, and to be represented by two members, and the membership of the Menzies District is accordingly increased from seven to nine.

3. The Kookynie Road Board shall be, and is hereby dissolved, and the Menzies Road Board shall take over all assets and collect all rates and other moneys due to the Kookynie Road Board, and discharge all liabilities owing thereby.

By-law No. 44.

Keeping of Horses, Cows, Sheep, and Goats.

A By-law of the Subiaco Health District made under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911," and numbered 44, for regulating the keeping of animals so as not to be a nuisance, injurious, or dangerous to health.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Subiaco Municipality, being the Local Health Authority, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

44. (a) The occupier of any premises shall not allow any horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be loose in any paddock, yard, or other place forming portion of such premises, and the owner of any yard, paddock, or other place shall not allow any horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be loose in any such yard, paddock, or place unless and until due provision is made to prevent such horse, cow, sheep, or goat from approaching to within twenty feet of any dwelling, or within twenty-five feet of any shop, factory, bakery, or other place where food is manufactured, stored, or exposed for sale.

(b) The occupier of any premises to which any such yard, paddock, or other place is appurtenant and in which yard, paddock, or other place any horse, cow, sheep, or goat is kept, and where such yard, paddock, or other place is not appurtenant to any premises, then the owner thereof shall at all times maintain the same in a clean state and condition and shall provide a receptacle of brick, iron, or other impervious material with a close-

fitting cover in such yard, paddock, or place, and shall once at least in each day cause all droppings from such horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be cleaned up from such yard, paddock, or place and deposited in such receptacle, and shall at all times, save when in actual use, cause the said receptacle to be covered with such tight-fitting cover, and shall cause such receptacle to be emptied once in each week, or oftener if required by the Inspector, and shall, after each emptying, cause such receptacle to be cleaned out, and shall take such precautions against allowing the breeding of flies as the Inspector shall from time to time direct."

Plant Diseases Act, 1914, Regulation.

Notwithstanding anything contained in any regulation or proclamation under "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," to the contrary, it shall be lawful for second-hand fruit cases to be used for the carriage of figs to any jam factory if the following conditions are duly observed:—

- (a.) Before any second-hand fruit case is used all existing brands must be cleaned off the case and the case must be steamed or dipped in boiling water at the factory to the satisfaction of the Inspector
- (b.) Before any empty case treated as aforesaid is forwarded from the factory to a fig grower or seller, the case must be legibly branded on one end thereof in stencilled letters not less than half-inch in height with the word "Figs," together with the name of the jam factory to which the case of figs has to be forwarded.
- (c.) Before any case of figs is forwarded by the grower or seller of the figs to the factory the name and address of the grower must be legibly branded on one end of the case, in stencilled letters not less than half-inch in height.
- (d.) Any second-hand fruit case treated as aforesaid and received at the factory with figs contained therein must not be again used for the carriage of figs unless the case is again steamed or dipped in boiling water to the satisfaction of the Inspector before such case is forwarded to the grower or seller of figs.
- (e.) If the foregoing conditions are not duly observed the provisions of the regulations and proclamations in force will apply, and penalties for the breach thereof will be enforced.
