WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Minister subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water and other works: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Execu-tive Council, hereby approves of the construction by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act:—

#### Metropolitan Water Supply, Perth.

Enlargement of Main from Bellevue Terrace to St. George's Terrace (36in. Main).

## Description and Location of Proposed Works.

Water Main constructed of 36in. diameter C.I. Pipes with valves and all necessary apparatus, starting at the intersection of Bellevue Terrace, Cliff Street, and Mount Street, and proceeding north-easterly along Mount Street to the South side of St. George's terrace, as shown on Plan W.S.S. & D.D. No. 3250.

## Stock Disease Act, 1895. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chambers, Perth, this 16th day of January, 1918.

WHEREAS by "The Stock Disease Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to be pub-lished in the Government Gagette from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations under the said Act as may be deemed necessary for any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor in exercise of the powers vested in him as aforesaid, with the advice of the Ex-ecutive Council, does hereby make the Regulations set out hereunder and vary the Stock Diseases Act Regula-

30, to be numbered as follows:-

#### Re Cattle affected with Tick, Boundaries of affected Area, and Periods of Dipping.

31a, Notwithstanding anything in these Regulations contained, every owner of cattle within that portion of of the State lying east of the 120th meridian of east longitude and north of the 20th parallel of south latitude shall, before the first day of November and the first day of June respectively in each year, dip or cause to be dipped, in a swim bath prepared with some specific known to be fatal to tick, all cattle running on the land whereof he is the owner or occupier, provided that for every head of cattle not so dipped within the periods described above, and to the satisfaction of an Inspector, such owner shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding 5s.

#### Statutory Declaration after Dipping required by Owner.

31b. Within seven days after the dipping of his cattle the owner shall make a statutory declaration before a Justice of the Peace to the effect of Schedule 5a hereto, stating that he has dipped his cattle in accord-ance with the provisions of these regulations, the date of dipping, the number of cattle dipped, and the class of dip used, and he shall forward a copy of such de-claration to the Chief Inspector of Stock, at Perth, and retain the original in his possession for production when called upon to do so by an Inspector.

#### Affected Stock not allowed to stray.

31c. Every person who by himself, as agent or servant, drives, without the permission of an Inspector, or suffers to stray across or upon any land, or drives to pastures or suffers to stray upon, or along any highway or stock route, any cattle which have not been dipped according to these regulations, or affected with tick, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £50.

#### Dipping before Removal.

31d. Every owner or occupier of any land east of the 120th meridian of east longitude and north of the 20th parallel of south latitude shall, within seven days before removing cattle from his holding or run, cause same to be dipped in a swim bath prepared with some specific known to be fatal to tick, and such cattle shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration made before a Justice of the Peace to the effect of Schedule 5a hereto.

#### Inspector discovering Stock to be affected must give Notice.

31e. If an inspector is satisfied that a herd depasturing in any part of the State is affected with tick he shall give the owner thereof notice to dip such stock forthwith to the satisfaction of the inspector or his agent, provided that the owner who refuses, neglects, or fails to comply with such notice on or before the date specified therein shall be liable, on conviction, to a enalty not exceeding £50 for the first offence, and, if immediately after conviction for the first offence such cattle shall not be dipped to the entire satisfaction of the Inspector, such owner shall, upon conviction, be liable to a further penalty not exceeding £50, and so on for each and every succeeding conviction. If any cattle affected with tick shall be found in any pound or in any yard or yards or on any land or other place at which cattle are offered for sale, the owner exposing the cattle so affected shall be liable to a penalty not ex-ceeding £50, provided that any inspector, if he deems it necessary, may order the withdrawal from sale of any cattle affected with ticks until such cattle have been dipped or dressed to the satisfaction of such inspector or any other inspector, and shall give notice to the aforesaid owner of such cattle to dip or dress the same forthwith at such place as the Inspector may direct, and every such owner who refuses, neglects, or fails to comply with the aforesaid notice is liable to a further penalty not exceeding £20, but if the Inspector is satisfied that such cattle are intended for immediate

slaughter he may withold such notice to dip. 2. Regulation 48 is amended by inserting "subject to Regulation 48a" between the words "that" and "cattle" in the first line of the first proviso.

3. The following Regulation is hereby inserted in the said Stock Diseases Act Regulations, 1914, after Regulation 48, and to be numbered as follows:---

## Introduction of Horses and Cattle.

48a. No horses or cattle shall be introduced into Western Australia across the border between the Northern Territory and Western Australia unless same are accompanied by a declaration to the effect that such horses or cattle have, within seven day immediately prior to crossing, been dipped in a solution known to

Such charge will be made in respect of each berth occupied during a vessel's stay in nort and must be poid before chargenes is ground respect of each berth occupied during a vessel's stay in port and must be paid before clearance is granted. This charge will only apply to cleaning up the rubbish, etc., which naturally collects on the wharf while a vessel is berthed, and does not include the removal of planks, trams, stages, horse-boxes, gangways, or other gear used in the loading or unloading of a vessel, which removal must be done to the satisfaction of the wharf manager by the master or agents of the vessel. In the event of such work not being done promptly and to the satisfaction of the wharf manager, the Trust will do it at the expense of the owners of the vessel.
