SUBIACO HEALTH DISTRICT.

By-law No. 44.

Keeping of Vorses, Cows, Sheep, a d Goats.

A By-law of the Subiaco Health District made under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911," and numbered 44, for regulating the keeping of animals so as not to be a nuisance, injurious, or dangerous to health.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Subiaco Municipality, being the Local Health Authority, doth hereby make the following By-law:

44. (a.) The occupier of any premises shall not allow any horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be loose in any paddock, yard, or other place forming portion of such premises, and the owner of any yard, paddock, or other place shall not allow any horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be loose in any such yard, paddock, or place unless and until due provision is made to prevent such horse, cow, sheep, or goat from ap r aching to within twenty feet of any dwelling, or within twenty-five feet of any shop, factory, bakery, or other place where food is manufactured, stored, or exposed for sale.

(b.) The occupier of any premises to which any such yard paddock, or other place is appurtenant and in which yard, paddock, or other place any horse, cow, sheep, or goat is kept, and where such yard, paddock, or other place is not appur-tenant to any premises, then the owner thereof shall at all times maintain the same in a clean state and condition and shall provide a receptacle of brick, iron, or other impervious material with a close fitting cover in such yard, paddock or place, and shall once at least in each day cause all droppings from such horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be cleaned up from such yard, paddock, or place and deposited in such recep-tacle, and shall at all times, save when in actual use, cause the said receptacle to be covered with such tight-fitting cover, and shall cause such receptacle to be emptied once in each week, or oftener if required by the Inspector, and shall, after each emptying, cause such receptacle to be cleaned out, and shall take such precautions against allowing the breeding of flies as the Inspector shall from time to time direct.

Amendment of Uniform General By-laws for Regulating Motor Traffic and Standard Lights for all vehicles, published in the "Government Gazette" of the 3rd day of January, 1913.

The Uniform General By-laws for Regulating Motor Traffic and Standard Lights for all vehicles, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 3rd day of January, 1913, are hereby amended by repealing By-laws numbered 24 and 25 and substituting the following By-laws in lieu thereof:—

BY-LAW No. 24.

Lights,

24. No person shall, between sunset and the following sunrise, ride, drive, or impel, haul or place on any road any motor car, motor wagon, motor carrier, motor cycle, vehicle, cycle, hand-cart, engine, or trailer unless a lamp or lamps as hereinafter prescribed are kept continually burning sufficient to afford an adequate means of signalling the approach or position of the motor car, motor wagon, motor carrier, motor cycle, cycle, vehicle, hand-cart, engine, or trailer and as hereinafter provided.

- (a) The top of the main beam of light projecting from any lamp or lamps shall have the main beam of light projecting therefrom restricted to a height of three feet above any road at a distance of 75 feet on a level from the from of any motor car, motor wagon, motor carrier, motor cycle, cycle, hand-cart, engine or trailer in the direction in which the same is proceeding or intending to proceed.
- (b) Provided that if any lamp or lamps are provided with any lens or other immovable device which efficiently prevents the beam of light, dazzling, blinding, or confusing any other person, at a greater distance than that specified in the foregoing by-law and if written approval is obtained of such lens or other immovable device from the local authority by which such motor car, motor wagon, motor carrier, motor cycle, cycle, handcart, engine, or trailer is licensed, such lens or other immovable device shall be deemed to comply with the provisions of the foregoing by-law.
