PLANTAGENET ROAD BOARD.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1911-15," the Plantagenet Road Board being the local Health Authority for the Plantagenet Health District has power to make By-laws, now therefore the said Board doth make the following By-laws:-

Pias.

The occupier of any premises whereon a pig is kept, shall comply with the following conditions :-

(a.) The sty or enclosure wherein the pig is kept shall not be within 100 feet of a road, thoroughfare

house, dairy, or slaughteryard.

(b.) No pigs shall be kept within the townsites of Mt.

Barker, Tenterden, or Narrikup, except within a sty or enclosure.

(c.) The floor of the sty shall be constructed of impervious material, so graded and provided with channels that such floor shall drain to an approved receptacle, having a tight-fitting cover. Such receptacle shall be emptied at least once weekly.

(d.) All manure produced on the premises shall be collected daily, and placed in an approved receptacle.

(e.) The sty or enclosure shall be maintained in a cleanly condition, and shall be cleansed and disinfected when so ordered by an Inspector.
