PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency the Right Honourto WIT.

Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by "The Aborigines Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Aborigines: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Aborigines should be declared at Moore River, near Mogumber: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a reserve of about 9,600 acres at Moore River, near Mogumber, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Aborigines.

Schedule.

Bounded by lines starting from the South-East corner of Swan Location 2380, and extending in a West-North-Westerly direction along the North side of Road No. 2094 to its intersection with the South boundary of Muchanulla A.A. Lot 20; thence East and North along the South and East boundaries of said lot; thence East along the South boundary of Muchamulla Lots 21 and 22; thence North along the East boundary of the lastmentioned lot to a point in prolongation thereof on the right bank of the Moore River; thence Westerly along that bank to the South-East corner of Muchamulla A.A. Lot 15; thence North along its East boundary to a point in prolongation thereof, situate about 10 chains North from its North-East corner; thence East about 234 chains; thence South to the left bank of the Moore River; thence in a generally Easterly direction along that bank to a point West of a point situate about 230 chains North of the starting point; thence East to the former South to the starting point, excluding Reserve 12047.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH. By-laws.

M.P.H. 1026/18. WHEREAS by Section 267 of "The Health Act, 1911-15," it is provided that the Governor may cause to be 15," it is provided that the Governor may cause to be prepared By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which By-laws may be made by a Local Authority under the provisions of the said Act, and that a Local Authority may, of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such By-laws: And whereas Model By-laws have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the said Section and published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of November, 1914: And whereas the Commissioner of Public Health may

exercise all or any of the powers of the Local Authority in any place which does not lie within the boundaries of a district: And whereas the Commissioner of Public Health in pursuance of the aforesaid powers has adopted Parts II. to VI. and VIII. to X. of the Model By-laws referred to, and notice of such adoption was by-laws reterred to, and notice of such adoption was published in the Government Gazette on the 27th day of October, 1917: And whereas the Commissioner of Public Health in the exercise of his powers as a Local Authority may amend or alter any By laws so made: Now, therefore, the Commissioner of Public Health doth hereby amend such By-laws in the manner following:—

Part IV., Schedule "C" is hereby amended by the addition of the following proviso:—Provided that if the applicant makes and sells dairy produce other than milk—no fee shall be charged.

Part X., Section "A," Schedule "D," is amended by striking out all the words after the words "in respect of," in the first line, and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—"Slaughter houses, 10s.; piggeries, 10s.; any other trade, £1."

THE FOOTWEAR REGULATION ACT, 1916.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following regulations, under "The Footwear Regulation Act, 1916."

Regulations.

M.P.H. 576/18. WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor in Council may make Regulations under the provisions of "The Footwear Regulation Act, 1916": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor in Conneil acting in pursuance of such powers does hereby make the following Regula-

Stamps on Soles which consist of materials other than Leather.

- 1. Where a statement of the material or materials composing the soles of any boots or shoes is required pursuant to Section 4 of the said Act to be stamped on or impressed into the outer surface of the soles of such boots or shoes, the following provisions shall apply:
 - (a) The said statement shall be stamped in indelible permanent ink on the soles of such boots or shoes, and shall be in bold faced sans-serif capital letters
 - of not less than six points face measurement; or The said statement shall be impressed into the soles by means of a sunk or branded lettering, which shall be in bold faced sans-serif capital letters of not less than six points face measure-ment, or shall be embossed on the soles in lettering of like description:

(c) Provided that, where the sole is composed of materials which cannot be impressed or embossed, or stamped in indelible permanent ink, a label bearing the required markings may be attached to the waist instead.

Shanks.

2. Shanks may be made of leatherboard, papier mache, scandia, or wood, or combinations of those materials, and may be strengthened with steel, and shall be used only to fill the space in that part of the boot or shoe known as the waist, where the sides of the upper are pulled over and the edges do not meet. Weighting Substances.

- 3. The following shall be deemed to be weighting substances:-
 - (a) Glucose and sugar, if present to the extent of more than three per cent, taken together; or Any proportion of barium sulphate or other bar-
 - ium compounds; or
 - (c) Any other mineral substances whatsoever.

The Manufacturer's Name or Registered Trade Mark.

- 4. No person shall sell, supply, or keep for sale or supply, or have in his possession for sale any boots or shoes unless there be stamped on, or impressed into the outer surface of the soles of such boots or shoes in legible characters the name or registered trade mark of the manufacturer or maker. For the purpose of this regulation the following provision shall apply:
 - (a) The said name or registered trade mark shall be stamped in indelible permanent ink on the soles of such boots or shoes, and in the case of the said name shall be in bold faced sans-serif capital letters of not less than six points face measurement; or
 - The said name or registered trade mark shall be impressed into the soles by means of sunk or branded lettering, which shall in the case of such name be in bold faced sans-serif capital letters of not less than six points face measurement, or shall be embossed on the soles in lettering of like description.
 - (c) Provided that, where the sole is composed of materials which cannot be impressed, embossed, or stamped in indelible permanent ink, a label bearing the manufacturer's or maker's name or registered trade mark may be attached to the sole
- 5. Any breach of these regulations by act or omission shall be punishable on summary conviction by a fine not exceeding £20.
