#### NORTHAM MUNICIPAL COUNCIL. Amendment of By-laws.

Whereas Model By-laws have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Section 267 of "The Health Act, 1911-15," and published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of November, 1914: And whereas the Northam Municipal Council, being a Local Model. Authority under the provisions of the soil Health Anthority under the provisions of the said Act, did by resolution published in the Government Gazette on the 24th day of August, One thousand nine hundred and seventeen, adopt either wholly or in part such Model By-laws to be its By-laws: And whereas by the provisious of the Act aforesaid, a Local Health Anthority may alter or amend By-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Northam Municipal Council, being the

Local Health Authority for the Northam Health District, doth hereby amend such By-laws, as follows:-

PART I.—General Sanitary Provisions.

Keeping of Swine.

By-law No. 34.—This By-law is amended by the addition of the following words:—"without the consent in writing of the Local Authority."

Part IV .- Dairies and Milk Shops.

An additional By-law is added, as follows:-

4a. Any person keeping one or more cows within the district of the Local Authority, and not coming within the definition of "dairyman," shall forthwith make application to the Local Authority for a permit to keep such cow or cows within the district, and shall at the same time pay a fee for such permit of 2s. 6d, per head for such cows, which permit shall operate only during the current calendar year and must be renewed annually: provided that the maximum amount to be paid by any one person for such permit per annum shall not exceed the sum of One pound.

Part X .- Offensive Trades -- Section A -- General.

Schedule D.-Fees to be paid on application for regis-

tration of offensive trade premises.

Schedule D is amended by the addition of the words "and fish shops" to the words "fish curing establishments.'

#### PART XI.—Private Morgues.

The following additional By-laws to be added:-

1. Any person who intends to open or conduct any premises as a private morgue for the temporary reception of the bodies of the dead, and for keeping such bodies for the purpose of view, examination, or other lawful purpose before burial or cremation shall, before opening such premises make application for registration thereof as a private morgue, and shall pay a fee of £2 2s. per annum, and application for renewal of such registration shall be made annually. Every license and registration effected under this By-law shall operate only during the current calendar year.

No such license shall be granted in respect of any premises unless-

- (a) The walls thereof are constructed of stone or brickwork, or other approved material; and
- (b) The interior surface of the walls is covered with glazed tiles or is rendered with some impervious material to be approved by the Board, so as to be non-absorbent and washable; and
- (c) All floors are constructed of some impervious material to be approved by the Board, such as granolithic or glazed tiles, laid upon a bed of 4in. concrete, having a fall to an outlet discharging over a trapped gully; and
- (d) The premises are adequately ventilated by direct communication with the outer air.
- 3. No such license shall be granted in respect of any room, the dimensions of which are less than 10ft. by 9ft. by 12ft. in height.
- 4. No such license shall be granted in respect of private premises, unless the site thereof is approved by the Board, or if the same are within 20ft. of any dwelling house.

#### Penalties for breaches of By-laws.

5. Where anything by this part of the By-laws is directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or where authority is given to any officer to direct to be done or to forbid anything to be done, and such act so directed to be done remains undone or such act forbidden to be done? bidden to be done is done, in every such case the person making default as to such direction and prohibition respectively, shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this part of the said By-laws, and every person guilty of part of the said By-laws, and every person guilty of a breach of this part of the said By-laws shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person guilty of such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for every breach of any such By-law, or to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, and in addition to such penalty shall be liable to pay to the Local Authority any expense incurred by such authority in consequence of any breach or non-observance of any By-law, or in the execution of any work directed to be done or executed and not so executed.

In any subdivision into allotments containing 10 acres and under, reference pegs shall be placed as the Surveyor General may direct. Reference pegs shall be placed at each angle of every isolated block, irrespective of its

area.

"A reference peg shall not be less than 2 inches square and 12 inches long and placed, where possible, at a distance of 5 links from the post, the top of the peg being sunk flush with the natural surface of the ground or the bottom of the trench. Glass or iron spikes half-inch diameter and 10 inches long may be used instead of pegs, at the option of the Surveyor.
