WHEREAS by Subsection 2 of Section 144 of "The Roads Act, 1911," it is provided that in any area specified by the Governor by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, one moiety of the expense incurred in paving footways shall be repaid to the Board by the owners of

all rateable lands abutting on any such footway or part thereof, apportioned according to the frontage of such lands abutting on the footway or part thereof, and may be recovered from such owners by the Board in any court of competent jurisdiction: And whereas it is desirable to constitute that portion of the Cottesloe Beach Road Board described in the Schedule hereto an area for the purposes of the said subsection: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby constitute the area situated within the Cottesloe Beach Road District and specified in the Schedule hereto an area within which one moiety of the expense incurred by the Cottesloe Beach Road Board in paving footways shall be repaid to the Board in accordance with subsection two of Section one hundred and forty-four of the said Act.

Northward along the East side of Victoria Avenue to its intersection with the East side of Waldeck Street; thence East across Waldeck Street to the West side of the Perth-Fremantle Railway Reserve; thence Northerly along the West side of the said Reserve to the point of commencement.

GREENBUSHES PUBLIC CEMETERIES.

BY-LAWS for the Regulation of the Greenbushes Pub-
lic Cemeteries (Reserves 6889 and 10819), duly made
by the Greenbushes Road Board, as Trustees of the
said cemeteries.

1. The duties of the secretary shall be to keep the
books of the cemetery, collect all fees, cause to be dug
all graves, and generally supervise the cemetery under
the direction of the Cemetery Board.

2. The salary of the secretary shall be fixed from
time to time by the said Board.

3. The area of ground allotted for each grave shall
not exceed eight feet by four feet.

4. The area of ground enclosed by any fence or tomb
shall not exceed eight feet by four feet, except where
two or more graves are enclosed by one fence or tomb.

5. No fence, headstone, or other erection shall be
placed within the above-named cemetery until first ap-
proved of by the Cemetery Board or its officers.

6. Eight hours' notice must always be given to the
secretary previous to any burial taking place.

7. No burial shall take place in the above-named
cemetery before sunrise or after sunset, except by special
permission of the Board or its officers.

8. All graves shall be dug to a depth of not less than
five feet, and not less than six feet six inches for a
double interment, except in the case of children under
the age of twelve years, when the depth shall be not
less than four feet.

9. A charge of one pound for adults, and fifteen
shillings for children under the age of twelve years,
shall be made for digging each grave.

10. No grave shall be dug in the above-named ceme-
tery, except by such person as the Board or its officer
may appoint.

11. All cemetery charges shall be collected by the
secretary, and paid into the account at the end of each

week, and such money shall be used to defray the cost of working the above-named cemetery.

12. No person shall remove any body from any grave in this cemetery after the burial without first having obtained a certificate of permission for such removal, signed by two members and the secretary of the said Board, which said permission shall be entered upon the minutes of the next ordinary meeting of the Board: Provided always that the order of the Governor for exhumation shall have been obtained before the granting of the said certificate.

13. No carriage, trap, cart, or other vehicle, excepting the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the above-named cemetery without an order from the Board or its officers. Any person violating this by-law will be prosecuted.

14. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from the District Registrar of Deaths, that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial, is first exhibited for the inspection of the secretary or a member of the Board; and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery except by permission of the Board.

15. This Board reserves to itself the right to grant to the several churches and bodies among whom the cemetery has been divided, the right to make such further rules or laws as they may deem desirable for the further regulation of their several portions thereof, subject, however, to the by-laws of this Board.

16. This Board will meet at the Road Board office at the second ordinary meetings of the said Board in the months of January, April, July, and October in each year.

17. Three members, including the chairman, shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Board.

18. Notice of motion must be given in writing at least seven days previous to the ordinary meeting of the Board before any of the by-laws can be altered.

19. Every person guilty of an offence against any of these by-laws shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

The foregoing by-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and passed at a meeting of the Board held at the office of the Road Board on 25th February, 1918.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and Amending Acts for the management of the Bruce Rock Public Cemetery (Reserve 16283).

BY-LAWS.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Bruce Rock, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the gravedigger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.;

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission to the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, morning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workmen permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-laws.

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

- (b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
 - (c) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.
 - (d) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.
34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
35. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the cemetery.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased, under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and its amendments, to approve of the cancellations of all By-laws for the Management of Calingiri Public Cemetery (Reserve 16738) previously published in the *Government Gazette*, and to approve, in lieu thereof, of the amended By-laws as set out hereunder.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Calingiri Public Cemetery, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned, unless otherwise ordered.
 2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule B. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an "Order for Burial," in the form contained in the Schedule C.
 3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustee in such time as to allow at least five working hours' notice being given to the Superintendent at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Magistrates' order therefor, be handed in at the office in such time as to allow of at least six working hours notice being given as above.
 4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.
 5. Before any interment is allowed, the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the Superintendent.
 6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.
 7. Every grave shall be at least 7ft. deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3ft. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.
 8. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.
 9. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the Cemetery, unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Superintendent, at the latest, upon the funeral entering the Cemetery. Should the undertaker or his representatives be unable to produce the said certificate from the Registrar, he shall give a written guarantee to produce same within three days, and satisfactory reasons must be given for the non-production of such certificate in the first instance. In default of the production of the said certificate within three days, the undertaker's license may be suspended until such certificate is produced. The certificate will be retained, but the Coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.
 10. Unless otherwise ordered the principal entrance to the Cemetery shall be open daily between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. during the remaining months of the year.
 11. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—
1st September to 30th April—Week days from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.
1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 4.30 p.m.
- and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.
12. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and, if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to a fine of 10s. 6d.
 13. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicles, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery, or stand opposite the entrance gates. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the Cemetery, and shall proceed at and by such roads as directed by the Superintendent or other officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery. No bicycle shall be ridden within the Cemetery.
 14. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.
 15. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.
 16. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.
 17. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, grave, or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws, shall be expelled from the Cemetery.
 18. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers, which are to be placed in the receptacles provided by the Trustees for same), or any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the Trustees or their representatives.
 19. No person shall pluck any tree, plant, shrub, or flower growing in any portion of the Cemetery.
 20. No person shall remove or carry out of or attempt to carry out of the Cemetery any tree, plant, shrub, or flower without the written authority of the Trustees or their representatives.
 21. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever, without the written consent of the Trustees, and any person infringing this By-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.
 22. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery, other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.
 23. Subject to the By-laws, and to the directions of the Trustees, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.
 24. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased person whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.
 25. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof, or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.
 26. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.
 27. Every such Grant shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.
 28. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and any space surrounding such coffin to be filled in with charcoal, dry earth, or other suitable material, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.
 29. In the event of such exemption being obtained from the Trustees, each coffin placed in any brick grave or vault shall be properly lead lined and hermetically sealed.
 30. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee

or assignee shall be produced, together with the "Grant of Right of Burial."

31. Should the grantee be unable to produce the "Grant of Right of Burial" on making application for a grave to be reopened for the purpose of interment, through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, and shall pay the fee for a copy of such "Grant of Right of Burial" as prescribed in Schedule A, before an "Order for Burial" will be issued by the Trustees.

32. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with section 23 of the principal Act (61 Vict., No. 23).

33. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

34. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Superintendent or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.

35. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition, to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.

36. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of 10s., which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the two preceding By-laws be not complied with to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.

37. All material required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery; and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Superintendent shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

38. No catacomb shall be allowed.

39. Subject to the approval of the Trustees, each applicant for an "Order for Burial" shall, within three months from date of the application, enclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slate, or stone, and shall cause to be placed thereon a number-plate bearing the number of the grave or vault. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by, and at the expense of the grantee. Should the grantee's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the Trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee. No mounds shall be allowed.

40. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault, unless approved of by the Trustees.

41. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the Superintendent.

42. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Superintendent, shall be removable from the Cemetery.

43. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees in the form contained in Schedule G; such licenses to be renewed annually in the month of July.

44. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Superintendent.

(c.) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent.

(d.) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

45. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments every undertaker shall pay to the

Trustees an annual fee of £2 2s., and shall, at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit" to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and unless in the possession of such a "Permit" no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

46. The Trustees may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantee so to do. If the grantees do not desire the Trustees to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Trustees for that purpose.

47. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Trustees, or those licensed by the Trustees, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

48. Any person committing any breach of any of these By-laws and Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws, lawfully made under the authority of any Act, relating to cemeteries, shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall be forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, the Superintendent, or other officer of the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.

49. A plan of the Cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation and number of grave, and a Register of all certificates of "Rights of Burial," shall be kept at the office.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees and adopted.

KALGOORLIE ROAD BOARD.

By-law No. 20.

To prohibit any horse drawn vehicle being left unguarded standing in any street, right-of-way, or public place.

IN pursuance of the powers and provisions in, under or by virtue of "The Roads Act, 1911," and amendments thereof, the Kalgoorlie Road Board make and ordains the following By-law for safeguarding horse drawn vehicles while standing in any street, right-of-way, or public place, shall be observed and enforced:—

1. All horse drawn vehicles of any description while left standing unattended in any street, right-of-way, or public place shall have one at least of the wheels securely locked by means of a suitable and sufficient strap, chain, or rope.

2. No horse drawn vehicle shall be left standing in any street, right-of-way, or public place without an attendant of responsible age in charge, when the wheels are not locked.

3. To further safeguard such unattended vehicles the horse must, if means avail, be securely tied by a sufficient neck rope to post or rail. But in no case shall any horse or other animal be tied up to a tree guard or street tree.

For breach of above By-law every person shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every offence a penalty not exceeding £20.
