WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 15th day of May, 1918, made pursuant to "The Drainage Act, 1900," an area therein described was constituted a Drainage District for the purposes of the said Act under the name of the Waigerup Drainage District: And whereas under the provisions of Section 6 of the said Act the Governor may, on the constitution of any district, appoint by proclamation six persons to be the first members of the Board for such District: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint W. J. Eastcott, of Waigerup, W. Wilshusen, of Harvey Drain, *via* Waigerup, W. Jackson, of Yalup Brook, W. H. Murray, of Waigerup, John Hill, of Waigerup, P. G. Kan, of Waigerup, to be the first members of a Drainage Board for the said district until the third Thursday in December, 1918, under the name of the Waigerup Drainage Board.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Roads Act, 1911," it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council alter the boundaries of any Road District or Ward, and

transfer portion thereof to another District or Ward: And whereas it is desirable to alter the boundaries between the East Avon and Corrigin Road Districts in manner hereinafter appearing, and notice of the intention of the Governor to exercise such powers has in accordance with the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," been duly published in the *Government Gazette* and served on the Boards concerned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby in exercise of the powers contained in "The Roads Act, 1911," and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, alter the boundaries between the East Avon and Corrigin Road Districts by transferring to the Corrigin Road District all that portion of the East Avon Road District which is comprised and described in the Schedule hereto, and doth alter the boundaries of the East Avon and Corrigin Road Districts and the respective Wards of the same accordingly and direct that the portion of the East Avon Road District so transferred as aforesaid shall become and form part of the Kurrenkutten Ward of the said Corrigin Road District.

To come into force as from the 1st day of July, 1918.

WHEREAS by virtue of the power conferred by Section 8 of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Governor may by Order in Council divide any district into wards: And whereas it is desirable to divide the Wandering Road District into three wards: And whereas notice of the intention of the Governor to exercise such power in the manner aforesaid has, in pursuance of Section 8 of the said Act, been published in four successive issues of the *Government Gazette*, and served on the Board concerned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby divide the Wandering District into three wards, with the names and boundaries and the number of members allotted to each ward, as shown in Schedule hereunder.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that the following By-laws relating to the licensing of railway refreshment rooms were approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council on the sixth day of March, 1918:—

By-laws.

By-laws relating to the licensing of Railway Refreshment Rooms made pursuant to the provisions of Sections 23 and 59 of "The Government Railways Act, 1904," and approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council on the sixth day of March, 1918:—

1. All By-laws previously published in relation to Railway Refreshment Rooms are hereby superseded, but these By-laws shall not come into operation or have effect until the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and eighteen.

2. In these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, "Refreshment Room" means a refreshment room leased by the Commissioner under Section 59 of the said Act, and includes the kitchen and other appurtenances connected therewith.

3. Upon the lease of a Refreshment Room being entered into the lessee shall, if the terms of the lease so provide, be granted a license for the sale of alcoholic liquors in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

4. The fee for the said license shall be annually five pounds if the annual rent of the lease does not exceed two hundred pounds, and shall be annually five pounds and an additional one pound for every forty pounds of rent in excess of two hundred pounds if the annual rent exceeds two hundred pounds (a fraction of any forty pounds being reckoned as forty pounds), and be payable in advance: Provided, nevertheless, that the fees payable for any year shall not exceed thirty pounds, and that the annual fee in respect of portion of a year shall be proportionately reduced.

5. Alcoholic liquors may only be served for the periods following, namely:—

- (a) The period between the time thirty minutes before the arrival at, and the time thirty minutes after the departure of each passenger or mixed train from railway stations intermediate between starting points and terminus;
- (b) For thirty minutes before and thirty minutes after arrival of each passenger or mixed train at a terminus;
- (c) For thirty minutes before departure of each passenger or mixed train from a starting point,

and to persons holding *bona fide* passengers' current railway tickets or passes, and who on being requested so to do shall produce their tickets or passes before being served.

6. All liquors served shall be of the best quality and of such brands as the Commissioner may from time to time direct.

7. No alcoholic liquors shall be served to any of the servants of the Commissioner, except when off duty, and *bona fide* holders of a ticket or pass as aforesaid.

8. The licensee shall afford the Commissioner every reasonable opportunity for making such inspection from time to time as shall enable the Commissioner to be entirely satisfied that these By-laws have been duly complied with, and to take, without charge, samples of any

liquor in the Refreshment Room and which may reasonably be supposed to be intended for sale, without prejudice to any statutory right of inspection.

9. The license shall not be transferred without the consent in writing of the Commissioner first obtained.

10. The Commissioner reserves the right—

- (a) to alter the time-table or reduce the number of trains; or
- (b) to grant any other licenses for the sale of alcoholic liquors; or
- (c) to supply liquor in any restaurant car or railway carriage,

without entitling the licensee to any compensation by reason thereof or relief from any of the obligations under these By-laws.

11. The licensee shall duly observe and perform the provisions of the lease of the Refreshment Room, and all Commonwealth and State laws and regulations in force for the time being affecting the sale of alcoholic liquors on the said premises or the hours thereof.

12. The Commissioner, with or without notice in writing, may forfeit the said license before the expiry thereof in any of the following events:—

- (a) If the lessee commits a breach of any of these By-laws or of the laws for the time being in force respecting the inspection and adulteration of alcoholic liquors;
- (b) on the happening of any event which shall entitle the Commissioner to terminate the lease;
- (c) failure to continuously exercise the license in accordance with the By-laws.

13. For each breach of these By-laws the lessee shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

14. All liquors shall be of approved brands, of the best quality, and must be sold at prices not exceeding those ruling in the district in which the Refreshment Room is situated.
