

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Nos. 15 and 16 of 1917.

Between Coastal Dock, Rivers, and Harbour Works Union of Workers, Applicant, and the Honourable the Minister for Public Works and the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, Respondents.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

AWARD.

1. Interpretation.—" Minister for Public Works " means the Minister for Public Works in the capacity of Minister controlling the Harbours and Rivers Branch of the Public Works Department.

2. *Hours of Duty.*—Except as hereafter provided forty-eight hours shall constitute the week's work for all workers. Except in the case of men working shifts the hours of work shall be so arranged as to allow of a cessation of work at noon on Saturday and so that no day's work shall exceed eight and three-quarter hours.

The above provisions shall not apply to watchmen or to workers on pilot boats and launches. The week's work for workers on pilot boats shall consist of seven shifts which, taken over a fortnight, shall average twelve hours. Day shifts and night shifts shall be worked in alternate weeks. Watchmen's hours shall be regulated in accordance with the present practice.

3. Overtime.—All work outside a worker's ordinary working hours shall be paid for the first four hours at time and a-quarter, for the next two hours at time and a-half, and thereafter at double time.

All work performed on Sunday, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours' Day, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time, except in the case of watchmen on pilot boats.

The above provisions shall not apply to workers in ship's mooring gangs, who shall be paid for work performed outside of ordinary working hours, or on Sundays and holidays, the sum of one shilling and sixpence for the first hour or fraction thereof, and after the first hour at time and a quarter: Provided that any worker specially called for work at such times shall be paid two shillings and sixpence for the first hour or fraction thereof.

4. Holidays.—Workers after twelve months' continuous service shall be entitled to the following holdiays on full pay :—namely, New Year's Day, Foundation Day, King's Birthday, Eight Hours' Day, Annual Pienie Day, Good Friday, Easter Eve, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, and two days in addition to be taken at the discretion of the employer. Workers of less than twelve months' continuous service shall be entitled to one day's holiday for each month of continuous service, provided that any worker dismissed for misconduct shall forfeit all claim to holiday pay.

The above shall not apply to workers on pilot boats, who shall be allowed fourteen days' annual leave on full pay in addition to fifteen paid holidays, on such days throughout the year as shall be fixed by the Harbour Trust Commissioners.

5. *Travelling Time*.—The ordinary day's rate shall be paid to workers whilst travelling on duty, but no worker shall be entitled to more than a day's pay of eight hours for the time spent in travelling.

6. Wet Work.—Any worker working in water shall be paid an extra allowance of one shilling per day.

7. Payment of Wages.—Workers inside the metropolitan area shall be paid weekly and those outside s ch area fortnightly.

8. *Higher Duties.*—Workers acting in a higher grade for more than two hours shall be paid the minimum rate for such higher grade for half a day, and if over four hours the minimum rate for such grade for the full day.

9. Away from Home Allowances.—Workers employed at a port other than the port at which they were engaged shall be paid an allowance of two shillings and sixpence for each twenty-four hours.

10. Incompetent Workers.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and, in default of such an agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall again have been fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

12. This award shall not in itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker who is at present receiving above the minimum rate prescribed for his class of work.

13.—Area.—This award shall be binding upon the applicant Union and upon the Minister for Public Works and the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, and shall operate over the coast line of the State from a point immediately north of Geraldton to a point immediately east of Albany and for a distance of ten miles inland therefrom.

14. Term.—The currency of this award shall be three years: Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA

No. 1 of 1915.

Between Coastal District Committee Amalgamated Society of Engineers' Industrial Association of Workers, Applicant, and A. W. Dobbie and Company, Limited; Tomlinson Brothers; J. and E. Ledger; Wright and Gibb; George Kent, Limited; Atlas Engineering Company; James Chalmers; The Metropolitan Ironmasters' Industrial Union of Employers; The Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth; and the Fremantle Municipal Tramway and Electric Lighting Board, Respondents.

In pursuance of Clause 10 (b) of the Award in this matter, the Court approves of the terms set out in the scheme set out below as a scheme providing for holidays and payment for overtime to the employees of the Fremantle Municipal Tramways and Electric Lighting Board, and the terms of such scheme shall be incorporated with the said Award in lieu of Clause 2 thereof so far as regards the said Fremantle Municipal Tramways and Electric Lighting Board and their employees.

THE SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

Ten (10) days' annual leave on full pay after twelve months' service shall be allowed to all employees coming under the award.

Annual leave shall not be due until the expiry of twelve (12) months' service after their last annual leave was due and this time may then be varied by the Board to suit the season of heavy traffic, but in no case shall the annual leave average less than ten (10) days per year. Any employee leaving the service less than six months before he is entitled to bis annual leave shall receive one day's pay for every five weeks' service since the time he was last entitled to his annual leave.

All employees (other than Car Barn employees) shall be paid time and a-quarter for all work done between 5 p.m. and 8 p.m., on week days, and 12 noon to 4 p.m., on Saturdays, and time and a-half for all other time to starting time next morning including Sunday work, providing the work is made necessary owing to a breakdown, otherwise double time. Where a breakdown occurs on week days, or mains or material are so badly worn or damaged as to make it necessary that they be replaced, and for the purpose of keeping the service going it is not repaired or replaced till Sunday, the same shall be considered as breakdown work. This does not include any alteration to the system necessitated by the lighting and power changeover or any new work. No call back shall be for less than two hours' pay at overtime rates.

Any employee working four (4) hours or more in any one day in the Electrical trade as a leading han't shall be considered to have worked a full day and shall be paid accordingly.

All men working on Eight Hours' Day shall be paid at double time rates, and on Christmas Day and Good Friday, at Sunday rates.

Regulations relating to the Slaughter of Pigs for Bacon-curing.

Agric. No. 4318/16. Perth, 23rd May, 1918. HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations under "The Abattoirs Act, 1909."

ABATTOIRS ACT, 1909.

Regulations.

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the existing Regulations to the contrary, any person may, by license in writing of the Minister, slaughter pigs for bacon curing elsewhere than at an Abattoir: Provided that-

(a.) the premises on which the pigs are slaughtered are registered under Division 2 of Part VII. of "The Health Act, 1911";
(b.) all relative by-laws under "The Health Act,

1911," and its amendments are duly observed and performed by the licensee; and

(c.) the prescribed fees are paid by the licensee. Every licensee shall pay to the Department of 2 Agriculture, or its collector, the fees prescribed for the use of abattoirs.

3. Every license shall be revocable by the Minister in his absolute discretion.

4. A license may be in the form or to the effect of the Schedule.

Corr 1072/17. HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, by virtue of the power given in Section 161 of "The Land Act, 1898," has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations under Section 153 of the said Act:--

1. Town and Suburban lands may be set apart for leasing by persons who have been on Active Service with His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces, outside the Commonwealth during the present War, and have received an honourable discharge, or the dependents of those who have been killed or have died while on such Active Service. Such land shall be disposed of under leasehold conditions for a term of 99 years at a rental of Three Pounds per centum of the capital un-improved value to be fixed by the Minister, but the Minimum yearly rent of any lease shall be ten shillings.

The capital value of each lot shall be fixed by the Minister, and notified in the Government Gazette ; and on the while so fixed the yearly rent shall be computed for the first ten years of the term of the lease, and thereafter, until a fresh valuation is made as hereinafter provided. On every periodical re-valuation, the yearly rent thereafter, and until a fresh valuation is made, shall be computed on the value fixed by such re-valuation.

A fresh valuation may be made by the Minister from time to time during the currency of the lease, at intervals of not less than ten years, and notified in the *Government* Gazette. Provided that the value of all improvements made by the lessee shall be excluded from every such valuation. If any lessee is dissatisfied with any such valuation, he may require the question to be submitted to arbitration under the provisions of "The Arbitration Act, 1895,"

Every application for a lease of land under these Regulations shall be in the form, or to the effect of the First Schedule hereto. The applicant shall deposit with his application a lease fee of five shillings; a fee of five shillings for registration under "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893," and a sum equal to the instalment of rent to the lot applied for.

5. All applicants for land under these Regulations must lodge with their applications a Declaration in the firm of Schedule 2, accompanied by particulars of their discharge in the form of Schedule 3.

6. Applications may be lodge at the Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, or the Local Land Office of the district in which the land is situated accompanied by the Declaration, ctc., referred to above. Applications may be lodged on or before the specified date on which the land is gazetted open, in which ease they will be deemed simultaneous: if more than one application be received for the same land, the Land Board shall allot the land and the Board's decision shall be final.

If the land remains unselected, after the specified date, applications will then have priority according to the date on which they are lodged.

7. Rent shall be payable in accordance with the pro-visions of Section 136 of the Land Act and its amendments.

The lessee shall, within one year of the commencement of the lease erect an habitable house at a cost of not less than £50, and within five years fence the external boundaries with a fence sufficient to resist the trespass of great stock, such improvements to be maintained during the term of the lease, but the Governor may prescribe cultivation con-ditions at the time any land is made available under these Regulations.

9. Every lease shall be limited to the natural surface of the land demised, and the land below the natural surface to a depth not exceeding 40 feet, if situated within a goldfield or mineral field, and if not so situated, not exceeding 200 feet.

10. All rates, taxes, and outgoings charged on the land or payable by the occupier thereof during the said term shall be duly paid by the lessee.

11. No person shall (without the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands first obtained) acquire or hold more lots under these Regulations than by the conditions under which the lots are thrown open for selection may be prescribed; and no person who is already the holder of a lease under these Regulations shall be qualified to hold additional lots except with the approval of the Minister for Lands.

12. No person under sixteen years of age shall be eligible to acquire a lease under these Regulations.

13. Residence on the land will be compulsory for at least six months of each of the first five years, and any request for exemption, owing to special reasons, will be subject to approval of the Minister (on the recommendation of the Land Board), each case to be dealt with on its merits.

14. No transfer or sub-lease will be allowed without the approval of the Minister (on the recommendation of the Land Board), and if the land is transferred or sublet to other than a Returned Soldier any special privileges provided for under these Regulations will cease. No transfer will be allowed during the first 10 years except under very special circumstances.

15. Nothing in "The Land Act, 1898," or its Amendments or the Regulations thereunder shall be construed as giving the holder of a lease under these Regulations the right to convert the same to freehold.

CLAREMONT ROAD DISTRICT.

WHEREAS by virtue of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes mentioned in the said Act. Now therefore, the Claremont Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the following By-law regulating the crection and maintenance of hoardings:—

BY LAW No. 111.

Hoardings.

1. No person shall erect or cause to be erected a hoarding unless and until a plan and specification showing clearly the position and size, and the method of, and the materials to be used in, the construction of, and the manner of fixing the same, shall have been deposited in duplicate with the Board and approved by the Board, and except in accordance with such plan and specification, and a license has been supplied by the Board.

2. No license shall be granted in respect of any Hoarding erected either before or after the passing of this By-law unless the distance from the face of the hoarding to the alignment of the nearest street or way shall be at least equal to the distance from the level of such street or way to the highest point of such hoarding.

3. No hoarding shall be over twenty-one feet in height, and every hoarding shall be level along the top except that the name of the owner may be placed on the top.

the name of the owner may be placed on the top. 4. The owner and the occupier (if any) of the land on which such hoarding is erected shall maintain such hoarding to the satisfaction in all things of the Board.

5. If in the opinion of the Board any bill, placard or advertisement attached to, or painted on, any hoarding be objectionable, and the occupier or owner shall, upon receipt of a written notice to that effect, fail to at once remove, or cause to be removed, such bill, placard or advertisement, any person or persons authorised by the Board may remove the same and recover the cost from the occupier or owner.

6. No person shall attach, paste or paint any bill or other form of advertisement upon any hoarding in any part of the district without having a valid and subsisting license from the Board therefor.

7. All notices required under this By-law to be served on the occupier or owner shall in the first place be given by the Board to the occupier (if any), but if he cannot be found, then such notice may be served upon the owner. 8. If any occupier or owner fails to comply with any

8. If any occupier or owner fails to comply with any such order within the specified time named in such order, the Board may instruct any person or persons to carry out the requirements of such order, and any costs incurred may be recovered by the Board from the occupier or the owner.

the requirements of such order, and any costs incurred may be recovered by the Board from the occupier or the owner. 9. Every hoarding shall at all times have the name of the person on whose behalf it is erected clearly shown in a conspicuous place on the front of the hoarding.

10. No person shall post, paint, stencil, or place or affix any advertisement on any fence, wall, or footpath without the consent of the Board. (This provision does not apply to the advertisement by the occupier of any shop or dwelling in respect to the business carried on therein.)

11. Where anything in this By-law is directed to be done or forbidden to be done, and such act is done, in every such case the person making default as to such direction and prohibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this By-law and shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of ten shillings (10s.) for the first breach of this By-law, and to a penalty not exceeding *Ten pounds* for every succeeding breach of such By-law. 12. This By-law applies to hoardings erected in any townsite within the District, and to all heardings abutting on any road or public place.

on any road or public place. 13. A "Hoarding" within the meaning of these By-laws shall mean any erection or screen put up for advertising screening, or similar purposes.
