All goods landed from or shipped into any ship shall pay Wharfage Dues and Handling Charges as under (excepting goods on which full inward wharfage dues have once been paid at any other port within the State, which goods shall pay handling charges only). Such wharlage dues and handling charges, except where otherwise provided, shall be levied on ship's measurement or weight, at the option of the Wharfinger or Officer-in-Charge :-

on inward cargo shall, except where otherwise specifically provided, include receiving from ship's slings, tallying (which provided, include receiving from sinp's sings, tailying (which tallying shall be done in conjunction with and in the presence of any tallying which may be done by the ship), and delivering to the tail or side of vehicle, but not loading the vehicle. Inward cargo shall not, for any purpose whatever, be deemed to be in the custody of the Wharfinger until the sling is released from the ship's crane or hoisting hook, or deposited on the wharf or conveyance provided by the Wharfinger to receive the same.

Outward cargo shall be deemed to be in the custody of the ship when the ship's crane or hoisting hook is inserted in the sling.

Order 2, Rule 20, of the Local Court Rules 1905 is amended by deleting all words after the word "Prac-

Order XLI. of the Local Court Rules, 1905 to 1912, hereby amended by the insertion of the following Rule, after Rule 4 thereof:-

(4a.) If in any proceedings for the recovery of Land or Income Tax or both, with or without fines, against any taxpayer, the defendant—

(a) is absent from Western Australia and has not, to the knowledge of the Commissioner of Taxation after reasonable inquiry in that behalf, any attorney or agent in Western Australia on whom service of process can be

effected; or (b) cannot, after reasonable inquiry, be found; then good service of any summons may, without leave of the Court, be effected on him by posting the same, or a copy thereof, in a letter addressed to him at his last-known place of business or abode; and, in case the proceeding is for the recovery of Land Tax with or without fines, by affixing a copy thereof on a conspicuous part of the land to which the tax relates.

The above amended Rules will come into operation as from the 5th July, 1918.

Regulation 9—Clause (C), Subclause (2), paragraph (b), sub-paragraph (iii.), is repealed and the following is inserted in lieu thereof:—

"If the father and mother of the deceased are

dead, or are not entitled to an allowance, a weekly sum of five shillings in respect of each brother or sister, if any, of the deceased until such brother or sister, attains the age of fifteen years, payable to the legal guardian of such brother or sister, if, in the opinion of the Committee, he, or she, was at the time of death dependent on the deceased for support."

Perth Road Board District. Extension of Building By-laws.

The Perth Road Board, under and by virtue of the rower conferred on them by Building Regulation No. 36 of the Second Schedule of "The Roads Act, 1911," and of every other power enabling it in this behalf, do hereby make and publish the following further By-laws, to apply only to those parts of the Perth Road Board District enumerated and described in a certain Order in Council, published in the Government Gazette of 22nd day of June, 1917, page 990 (whereby the provisions set out in the Second Schedule of the said Act were extended to such parts of the said Perth Road Board District).

PLANS.

By-law No. 5.

(a) Every person intending to creet any building or alter or add to any building shall, before commencing

to erect, alter, or add to the same, make application in the form provided in the Schedule to the By-laws, and deposit with the Building Surveyor for the periods hereinafter mentioned, drawings showing the plans, eleva-tions, and sections of such proposed building, addition, or alteration, together with full and complete specifications of the work proposed to be done.

At the same time a locality plan, and also a plan or tracing not less than 22in, by 15in, in size of the ground plan (Scale 8ft. to 1in.) of all buildings showing the size of all rooms, position of doors and windows, the thickness of walls, and the covered floor area of such buildings, and the relative position of all boundaries, outbuildings, proposed drains, and dry-wells, also the relative positions and nature of buildings on the adjoining property if within 10ft. of the common boundary, shall be deposited with the Surveyor, to remain permanently

in his custody.

(b) All drawings shall be neatly made in ink on drawing paper, tracing cloth, or sun-print of at least 15in. by 22in. in size. The drawings shall consist of complete plans of every storey, elevations of external fronts, and one or more sections, transverse or longitudinal, showing the heights of storeys, depths of foundations, level of ground, construction of walls, roofs, floors, etc., all clearly figured and dimensioned in feet and inches; also a locality plan showing location of proposed site, with cardinal or North point, showing the size and shape of the lot on which it is proposed to erect, alter, or make the lot on which it is proposed to erect, after, or make additions to the building, the position of the proposed building, and any building or buildings already on the lot, the relative levels of the lot with the street or way adjoining, and the position and size of any existing drains or sewers, and the position, size, depth, and the gradients of all proposed drains or sewers, and the position of inlet traps and ventilators. All sizes and positions shall be figured and shown on the locality plan. tions shall be figured and shown on the locality plan. Existing sewers shall be shown in black full lines, and the existing storm-water drains by broken lines thus
---- All proposed drains for sewerage shall be shown in green full lines, and the proposed storm-water drains in red full lines.

(c) All plans for single storey brick or stone or plain concrete buildings shall be lodged with the Surveyor

for three days before work is commenced.

(d) All plans for brick or stone or plain concrete buildings of the value of Ten thousand pounds or over, or that contain more than one storey, shall be lodged for seven days.

(e) All plans for steel skeleton buildings, or where the whole of the floor loads above the basement or above the ground floor in buildings having no basement or are carried on steel or cast-iron work, shall be lodged for fourteen days.

(f) All plans for reinforced concrete buildings, or where reinforced concrete is used in the construction of walls or floors, shall be lodged for fourteen days.

(g) Existing buildings shall be coloured "blue," and proposed new buildings shall be coloured "pink"

on the locality plan.

(h) The locality plan shall be drawn to a scale of 16 feet to one inch. General drawings shall be to a scale of not less than eight feet to one inch, and details to a scale of not less than four feet to one inch.

(i) When a block plan has already ben lodged for the site, the insertion of the new additions or alterations will be sufficient. The existing plan can be seen at the Building Surveyor's office.

(j) All plans, drawings, and specifications must be signed by the building owner or his duly authorised

agent.

(k) When plans are prepared, the calculated amount of the super-imposed or accidental load shall be endorsed on the various floor plans.

By-law No. 6.

No person shall commence to erect, alter, or add to any such building until the Building Surveyor shall have signified his approval of such plans and specifications by stamping the plans and specifications with his official stamp showing the number of the application, the date of his approval, and his written signature.

By-law No. 7.

On the approval of the Building Surveyor being so given, and on payment of the prescribed fees, a license in the form of Schedule 2 to the By-laws shall then be issued by the Building Surveyor to the building owner or his agent.

By-law No. 8.

No person who shall have obtained the approval of the Building Surveyor, as provided hereinbefore in respect of any building or alteration or addition, shall in the construction of such building or alteration or addition curtail or otherwise depart from the plans or specific construction. fications which have been approved by the Surveyor without his consent in writing first had and obtained, and such alterations or departures from approved plans and specifications shall be drawn, described, and endorsed on and in the plans and specifications.

SITES AND FOUNDATIONS OF BUILDINGS.

By-law No. 9.

No person who shall hereafter erect any house or building shall construct the foundation of any such house or building upon any site or portion of any site which shall have been filled in or covered with any material impregnated or mixed with feeal, animal, or vegetable matter, or which shall have been filled up or covered with dust or slop or other refuse, or upon which any such matter or refuse shall have been deposited, unless and until such matter or refuse shall have been properly removed by excavation or otherwise from such site. Any holes caused by such excavation shall, if not used for a basement or a caller be filled in with bead him. for a basement or a cellar, be filled in with hard brick or dry rubbish or concrete, sand, or other material to be approved by the Surveyor.

By-law No. 10.

Every person who shall hereafter erect a building shall cause the foundation of the walls of such building to be formed on a bed of good concrete not less than 9in. thick, and projecting at least 4in. on each side of the lowest course of footing of such walls. If the site be upon a natural bed of gravel or sand, concrete may be omitted from the foundations of the walls.

The concrete shall be composed of clean gravel, broken hard brick, properly burnt, ballast or other hard material, well mixed with cement in the following proportions:— One part of cement to two parts of sand, and four parts

By-law No. 11.

No building to be used solely as a dwelling house shall comprise two or more tenements separated by a common dividing wall unless such building shall contain more than one storey above the ground level, and no wall of a dwelling house shall be placed at a lesser distance than 4ft. from the side boundaries of the block.

By-law No. 12.

No building shall be erected without the consent of the Board, in writing, on any block of land liable to

inundation by flood water or soakage, or from which there is no natural drainage until such time as provision is made for carrying off the water by artificial means.

By-law No. 13.

The level of the ground floor of any building shall not be less than 3in, above the level of the footpath or crown of the road without the permission of the Board in writing; in cases where the road or footpath has not been constructed the level of the ground floor shall be at such height as the Building Surveyor shall determine, and for this purpose a cross-section of the building site shall be supplied showing the relative levels of the site and the unmade road.

DOMESTIC BUILDINGS.

By-law No. 14.

The expression "Domestic Building" includes a dwelling house, suite of offices, or any other building not being a public building or building of the warehouse class, or a building the property of or occupied by or under the control or management of His Majesty's

Government or any Department thereof.

The expression "Dwelling House" shall mean a building used or constructed or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation not being a building the property of or occupied by or under the control or management of His Majesty's Government or any Department thereof.

Every person who shall hereafter erect, alter, or add to any domestic building shall construct every external wall and every party wall erected in the course of such work in accordance with the following rules, and in every case the thickness prescribed shall be the minimum thickness of which any such wall may be constructed, provided that the several rules shall apply only to walls built of brick or of suitable stone or other blocks of hard and incombustible substance, the beds of courses being horizontal:-

(a) Where the wall does not exceed 25 feet in height, its thickness shall be as follows:—

If the wall does not exceed 30 feet in length and does not comprise more than two storeys, it shall be eight and a half inches thick for its whole height.

If the wall exceeds thirty feet in length or comprises more than two storeys, it shall be 13 inches thick below the topmost storey, and eight and a half inches thick for the rest of its height.

(b) Where the wall exceeds twenty-five feet but does not exceed forty feet in height, its thickness

shall be as follows:-

If the wall does not exceed thirty-five feet in length it shall be 13 inches thick below the topmost storey, and eight and a half inches thick for the rest of its height.

If the wall exceeds thirty-five feet in length it shall be seventeen and a half inches thick for the height of one storey, then thirteen inches thick for the rest of its height below the topmost storey, and eight and a half inches thick for the rest of its height.

(c) Where the wall exceeds forty feet but does not exceed fifty feet in height, its thickness shall

be as follows:

If the wall does not exceed thirty-five feet in length it shall be seventeen and a half inches thick for the height of one storey, then thirteen inches for the rest of its height below the topmost storey and eight and a half inches for the rest of its height.

the rest of its height.

If the wall exceeds thirty-five feet but does not exceed forty-five feet in length, it shall be seventeen and a half inches thick for the height of two storeys, then thirteen inches thick

for the rest of its height.

If the wall exceeds forty-five feet in length it shall be twenty-one and a half inches thick for the height of one storey, then seventeen and a half inches thick for the height of the next storey, and then thirteen inches thick for the rest of its height.

PUBLIC BUILDINGS.

By-law No. 15.

The expression "Public Building" shall mean and include every building used as a church, chapel, or other place of public worship, also every building used for

the purpose of public instruction; also every building used as a college, public hall, hospital, theatre, public concert room, public exhibition room, or for any other public purposes not being a building the property of or occupied by or under the control or management of His Majesty's Government or any Department thereof.

If a public building corresponds in form or structure or disposition with a domestic building, then the rules which obtain for domestic buildings shall apply to such public buildings, provided that the thickness of all external and party walls, and the width of their footings be at least four inches more than is required for similar walls of the domestic buildings, but should such public building correspond in form or structure or disposition with a building of the warehouse class, then the rules which obtain for buildings of the warehouse class shall apply to such public buildings; provided the thickness of all external and party walls, and the width of their footings be at least four inches more than is required for similar walls of the buildings of the warehouse class. Should, however, such public buildings not correspond in form and structure to either a domestic building or to a building of the warehouse class, then such building should be subject as to its walls and other construction to the special approval of the Building Surveyor.

BUILDINGS OF THE WAREHOUSE CLASS. By-law No. 16.

The expression "building of the warehouse class" shall mean a warehouse, factory, manufactory, brewery or distillery, and any other building exceeding in cubical contents one hundred and fifty thousand (150,000) cubic feet which is neither a public nor a domestic building nor a building the property of or occupied by or under the control or management of His Majesty's Government or any department thereof.

Every person who shall hereafter erect, alter, or add to any building of the warehouse class shall construct every external wall, party wall, and cross wall erected in the course of such work in accordance with the following rules, and in every case the thickness prescribed shall be the minimum thickness of which any such wall may be constructed; provided that the several rules shall apply only to walls built of bricks, or of suitable stone, or other hard and incombustible substance, the beds or course being horizontal:—

(a) Where the wall does not exceed twenty-five feet in height (whatever is its length), it shall be thirteen inches thick at the base.

(b) Where the wall exceeds twenty-five feet but does not exceed thirty feet in height, it shall be at

its base of the thickness following:—

If the wall does not exceed forty-five feet in length, it shall be thirteen inches thick at the base.

If the wall exceeds forty-five feet in length, it shall be seventeen and a half inches thick at the base.

(c) Where the wall exceeds thirty feet but does not exceed forty feet in height, it shall be at its

base of the thickness following:—

If the wall does not exceed thirty-five feet in length, it shall be thirteen inches thick at the base.

If the wall exceeds thirty-five feet but does not exceed forty-five feet in length, it shall be seventeen and a half inches thick at its base.

If the wall exceeds forty-five feet in length, it shall be twenty-one and a half inches thick at its base.

(d) Where the wall exceeds forty feet but does not exceed fifty feet in height, it shall be at its base of the thickness following:

If the wall does not exceed thirty feet in length, it shall be seventeen and a half inches thick at its base.

If the wall exceeds thirty feet but does not exceed forty-five feet in length, it shall be twenty-one and a half inches thick at its base.

If the wall exceeds forty-five feet in length, it shall be twenty-six inches thick at its base. (e) Where the wall exceeds fifty feet but does not exceed sixty feet in height, it shall be at its

base of the thickness following: If the wall does not exceed forty-five feet in length, it shall be twenty-one and a half inches thick at its base.

If the wall exceeds forty-five feet in length, it shall be twenty-six inches thick at its base. (f) Where the wall exceeds sixty feet but does not exceed seventy feet in height, it shall be at its

base of the thickness following:—

If the wall does not exceed forty-five feet in length it shall be twenty-one and a half inches thick at its base.

If the wall exceeds forty-five feet in length, it shall be increased in thickness from the base up to within sixteen feet from the top of the wall by four and a half inches (subject to any provision hereinafter contained respecting distribution in piers).

WOOD AND IRON BUILDINGS. By-law No. 17.

The external walls, and the verandahs of all buildings to be constructed of wood, iron, or other material approved of by the Building Surveyor not being brick, stone, or artificial stone, must be built at least four feet from the dividing boundary of the property on which the building is being erected and the adjoining property, and at least 25 feet from the road frontage or frontages. The inside walls shall be of lath and plaster, metal, T. & G. jarral, or other approved material, provided always that no license will be granted for the erection of a building of wood or iron or with materials other than brick, stone, or artificial stone, unless the position or design, or value of such building will not, in the opinion of the Building Surveyor, be prejudicial to the residents in the vicinity.
