WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend waterworks: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

*Description and Location of Reticulation Works to be exempted.*

*Metropolitan Water Supply, Claremont.*

A 12in. cast-iron reticulation main with all apparatus relating thereto (including the taking up of existing 6in. main), commencing at the High Level Tank at the corner of Congdon and William Streets, and proceeding to East side of Congdon Street, thence Northerly along the East side of Congdon Street to Alexandra Avenue, thence Easterly along the South side of Alexandra Avenue to the junction with the existing 8in. main in Parry Street; total length about 14 chains, as shown on Plan W.S., S., & D.D. No. 3338.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 14th day of June, 1918.

*Alteration of Boundaries and Creation of Roe Road District.*

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Governor in Council may constitute a new Road District and divide such District into Wards, alter the boundaries of any District or Ward by transferring any portion thereof to another district or ward, assign names to Road Districts and Wards, and allot the number of members to represent Wards. And whereas it is desirable to alter the boundaries of the Corrigin and Wickepin Road Districts by transferring portions of such Road Districts and constituting a new Road District therefrom to be called the Roe Road District, and to divide such District into six wards, with the names and the number of members to represent each as and in manner hereinafter set forth: And whereas notice of intention so to do has been duly published in the *Government Gazette* and served on the Boards concerned as required by Section 8 of "The Roads Act, 1911." Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent and advice of the Executive Council, doth in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by "The Roads Act, 1911," and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby order as follows:—

1. Alter the boundaries of the Corrigin and Wickepin Road District by transferring therefrom respectively all those portions thereof which are comprised and described in Schedule "A" hereto. And the respective boundaries of the said Districts and of the Wards thereof, or of such of them as are hereby affected, are altered accordingly.

2. Constitute the territory described and comprised in the said Schedule "A" a new Road District under the name of the Roe Road District with the boundaries defined by the said Schedule "A," and declare the Board to consist of seven (7) Members.

3. Divide the said Roe Road District into six (6) Wards with the boundaries, the names, and the number of Members described, assigned, and allotted in the Schedule "B" hereto.

4. To come into operation as from the first day of July, 1918.

Location 18704, the East and the South boundary of Location 18701, the East boundaries of Locations 18696 and 18697 to the latter's South-East corner; thence East following a line connecting the said South-East corner with the 103 M.P. on the Rabbit-proof Fence to the West boundary of late P.L. 2347/93, and along part of the West, the South, and part of the East boundary of said P.L., and again following the aforesaid line through the said 103 M.P. to the West boundary of the late P.L. 629/95, and along part of its West and its South boundary and part of the West and the South boundary of P.L. 657/95 and the latter's production East to intersect a North and South line passing through Koorarawalyee Well (on the Eastern Goldfields Railway) and the 145 M.P. on the No. 1 Rabbit-proof Fence.

On the Eastward by part of the said North and South line from the aforesaid intersection to the said 145 M.P.

On the Westward by the Rabbit-proof Fence from the aforesaid intersection to the starting point.

*Kulin Ward.*—Bounded by the boundaries of Kulin Townsite. One member.

*Kondinin Ward.*—Bounded by the boundaries of Kondinin Townsite. One member.

*Kulin Rock Ward.*—Bounded on the Westward, North-Westward, and Northward by part of the district boundaries from their intersection with the production West of the North boundary of Williams Location 9484 to the North-East corner of Location 16139.

QUEEN'S PARK ROAD BOARD.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-15," a Local Health Authority may make By-laws; now, therefore, the Queen's Park Road Board, being the Local Health Authority for the Queen's Park Road Board District, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 34.—No unlicensed person shall keep swine within the district, except upon the following conditions:—

(a.) Every portion of such premises to which pigs shall have access shall be at least 100 feet distant from any street or thoroughfare, dwelling house, dairy, or premises where food is prepared for sale.

(b.) All enclosures or structures of any description wherein swine are confined, shall be maintained in a clean condition, and at any time when so directed by an Inspector or other officer of the Health Authority, the occupier shall immediately cleanse and disinfect any such enclosure or structure.

(c.) No swine shall be slaughtered upon any such premises.

MURRAY ROAD BOARD.

A BY-LAW of the Murray Road Board, made under Section 179, Subsections 41, 42, and 43 of "The Roads Act, 1911," No. 29, 1 Geo. V., for the general management of the Mandurah Baths at Mandurah; the conduct of the visitors thereat, and for fixing the charge to be made for the use thereof.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act the sub-committee appointed by the said Road Board order as follows:—

(1).—Hours of Admission.

The baths shall be open daily from the 1st of November to the 30th of April from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m.

(2).—Costume.

Every person using the baths shall at all times whilst bathing wear a neck-to-knee bathing costume with tunic attached.

(3).—Admission and Entrance Tickets.

(a.) No person shall enter the baths save through the gates or doorway set apart for entrance purposes.

(b.) No person (save the officers of the board) shall enter the baths except upon payment of the charge herein prescribed or upon the production of an appropriate season ticket.

(c.) No person to whom any season ticket has been issued shall lend, give, or sell, or otherwise dispose of the same to any other person.

(d.) Every person to whom a season ticket has been issued shall at any time when required by the caretaker or any member of the committee so to do, produce and show the same, and no person shall enter or attempt to enter the baths on any expired ticket belonging to any other person.

(4).—Charge for Admission.

The following shall be the sums to be paid for admission to and the use of the baths:—

Adults, each—3d.

Children under 14 years, each—1d.

Season tickets (not transferable)—1s. per week, 2s. per month, three months 3s.; children half-price under 14 years of age.

Cash charges for admission are payable at the entrance to the baths.

Tickets may be obtained from the committee.

A season ticket shall admit the holder at all times to the baths except when the committee require it for a carnival.

(5).—Control of Premises.

(a.) Every person using the baths shall obey all reasonable directions of the caretaker with regard to such use.

(b.) No person shall obstruct, interfere with, or hinder the caretaker in performance of any duty in the baths.

(6).—*Offences.*

- (a.) No person shall enter the baths while in an intoxicated condition.
- (b.) No person shall at any time while suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, enter or use the baths or any part of the bath premises.
- (c.) No person in charge of any dog shall allow such dog to enter any part of the bath premises.
- (d.) No person shall smoke in any part of the bath building.
- (e.) No person shall behave in a disorderly or riotous manner, swear, nor use any indecent, obscene, or abusive language, nor misconduct himself in any part of the bath premises.
- (f.) No person shall climb up to or on any partition or roof of the bath building.
- (g.) No person shall spit or expectorate in any of the dressing rooms, or on any of the platforms, or commit any nuisances on or in any part of the bath premises.
- (h.) No person resorting to the baths shall wilfully damage any part of the bath premises.
- (i.) No person resorting to the baths shall in any way interfere with any person therein, nor throw any stones, or sticks, or glass bottles, or any other matter or thing, to the annoyance or danger to any person using the baths.
- (j.) No person shall enter or attempt to enter any dressing room that is already occupied.
- (k.) No man, and no boy apparently above the age of seven years, shall enter, remain upon, or use any dressing room, passage, latrine, platform, or other portion of the bath premises which shall be set apart for the exclusive use of women, or girls, or children under the age of seven years, and no woman or girl shall enter that portion set apart for the use of men.
- (l.) No man, and no boy apparently above the age of five years, shall enter or use the baths or bath premises during the time set apart for the exclusive use of women, or girls, or children under the age of five years only.

(7).—*Enforcement of By-laws.*

- (a.) Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

*By-law No. 94.**Advertising Hoardings, Posting Bills, Painting Advertisements.*

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Fremantle Municipal Council doth hereby make the following by-law:—

*Repeal.*

1. All by-laws hitherto made by the Fremantle Municipal Council, with reference to the matters herein contained, are hereby repealed.

*Interpretation Clause.*

2. In the construction of this by-law—

- (a) The word "hoarding" shall mean a hoarding or other structure erected on private property for advertising purposes, but shall not include such notices as are usually put up offering premises for sale or to let if such notices do not exceed in area twenty square feet, but shall apply to all exceeding these dimensions.
- (b) The word "occupier" shall mean the person having the use and control of a hoarding.
- (c) The word "owner" shall mean the owner of the land on which a hoarding is erected.
- (d) "Engineer" shall mean the Engineer for the time being of the Municipality of Fremantle.
- (e) The word "Council" shall mean the Council of the Municipality of Fremantle.
- (f) The word "Municipality" shall mean the Municipal District of Fremantle.
- (g) The word "advertisement" shall mean and include papers, bills, or posters and all other advertisements of any nature, stencilled, painted, or embossed and affixed or placed in any way on walls, fences, or hoardings.

3. No person shall erect or cause to be erected a hoarding or continue any existing hoarding unless and until a plan and specification, showing clearly the position and size and the method of and the materials to be used in the construction of, and the manner of fixing same, shall have been deposited with and approved by the Engineer, and except in accordance with such plan and specification, and a license in the form of Part 1 of the Schedule attached hereto has been issued by the Engineer.

4. All hoardings existing at the time of the enactment of this by-law, which do not comply with the conditions thereby prescribed, shall not be repaired, renewed, altered or re-erected, and no existing hoarding shall be altered or repainted, save only in such manner as will cause the same to conform to the conditions as set out in this by-law.

5. No license shall be granted in respect of any hoarding erected either before or after the passing of this by-law, unless the distance from the face of the hoarding to the alignment of the nearest street or way shall be at least equal to the distance from the level of such street or way to the highest point of such hoarding.

6. Every person erecting a hoarding, or the occupier or owner of a hoarding already erected at the corner of two streets, shall cause such hoarding to be rounded off or splayed off to its full height, as may be required by the Engineer.

7. No person shall make any alteration or addition to any hoarding unless and until the proposed alteration or addition shall have been approved in writing by the Engineer.

8. If any hoarding is at any time, in the opinion of the Engineer, in a dangerous or neglected condition, and the owner or occupier shall upon receipt of a written notice to that effect fail to forthwith remove or refix the same to the satisfaction of the Engineer, the Council may remove the same and recover the cost of so doing from the owner or occupier.

9. The occupier of a hoarding shall maintain such hoarding to the satisfaction in all things of the Engineer, and if any paper or other material affixed thereto becomes detached shall forthwith remove and clear away such paper or other material.

10. If in the opinion of the Council any bill, placard, or advertisement attached to or painted on any hoarding be objectionable, and the occupier or owner shall upon receipt of a written notice to that effect fail to at once remove or cause to be removed such bill, placard, or advertisement, the Engineer or other person or persons authorised by the Council may remove the same and recover the cost of such removal from the occupier or owner.

11. All notices required under this by-law to be served on the owner or occupier shall, in the first place, be given by the Council to the occupier, but if he cannot be found, then any such notice may be served upon the owner.

12. If the occupier or owner of any hoarding fails to comply with a written order of the Council within the time named in such order, the Engineer or other person or persons authorised by the Council may carry out the requirements of the said order, and any costs incurred may be recovered by the Council from the occupier or from the owner.

13. No person shall attach, paste, or paint any bill or other form of advertisement upon any hoarding in any part of the Municipality without having a valid and subsisting monthly or yearly license therefor from the Engineer in the form of Part 2 of the Schedule hereto attached.

14. Every license issued by the Engineer under Sections 3 and 13 of this by-law shall terminate on the 31st day of October in each year.

15. The fee for a license under Section 3 shall be sixpence per superficial yard per annum. The fee payable for a monthly license under Section 13 of this by-law shall be seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.), and the fee payable for a yearly license under Section 13 shall be four pounds (£4). Full fees shall be charged for all licenses issued before the thirtieth day of April in each year, but for all licenses, other than monthly licenses, issued between the first day of May and the thirty-first day of October in each year, half-fees shall be charged, provided that in no case shall the charge be less than ten shillings (10s.).

16. Every hoarding shall at all times have the name of the occupier clearly shown in a conspicuous place on the front of the hoarding.

17. No person shall, without first having taken out a license as per Part 4 of Schedule hereto, post, paint, stencil, place, or affix any advertisement on any fence, wall, footpath, street or way, or over or across any footpath, street, lane or way, or on portion of any building facing or abutting on any street or way or public place within the Municipality.

18. Applications for such license shall be made in the form specified in Part 3 of the Schedule hereto attached.

19. Any license granted by the Council hereunder may be in the form specified in Part 4 of the said Schedule.

20. The fee for a license under Section 17 shall be such amount as the Council may determine in respect to such application, but not exceeding sixpence per superficial yard.

21. The Council may permit the display of advertisements at theatres or other places of public amusement, and may permit the advertising of meetings or objects of national or general importance, under such terms and conditions as the Council may in each case decide.

22. The provisions of Section 17 of this by-law shall not apply to bills or advertisements posted on or affixed to signboards to the erection or maintenance of which the Council has consented, or to the advertisement by the occupier of any shop or dwelling on the windows thereof in respect of the business carried on by him therein.

23. The use of any advertisement within the Municipality, otherwise than in accordance with this by-law, is hereby prohibited.

24. The occupier or owner of any premises within the Municipality on the walls, windows, or fences of which any bills are posted or any advertisements are painted, stencilled, placed, or fixed contrary to the provisions of this by-law shall, on receiving written notice from the Council so to do, remove the same, and if the same are not removed within seven days from the giving of such notice, then the Council may by its officers remove the same and recover from the owner or occupier in a court of summary jurisdiction the cost of so doing.

*Penalties for Breaches of By-laws.*

25. Where anything in this by-law is directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or where authority is given to any officer to direct anything to be done or to forbid anything to be done, and such act forbidden to be done is done or directed to be done is not done, in every such case the person making default as to such direction and prohibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this by-law; and every person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable, for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person guilty of such offence, to a penalty of Ten shillings (10s.) for the first breach of this By-law and to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for every succeeding breach of such by-law, or to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, and in addition to such penalty shall be liable to pay to the Council any expense incurred by the Council in consequence of any breach or non-observance of any by-law, or in the execution of any work directed to be executed and not so executed. Provided that the minimum pecuniary penalty for any offence against this by-law other than the first offence shall be one-tenth of the maximum penalty hereby provided.

MUNICIPALITY OF FREMANTLE.

By-law No. 95.

*Signboards.*

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Council of the Municipality of Fremantle doth hereby make the following by-law:—

1. All by-laws heretofore made by the Municipal Council of Fremantle, with reference to the matters hereinafter contained, are hereby repealed.

2. No person shall erect or maintain any sign, signboard, awning, blind, overhanging lamp, or other thing over or near any footway or roadway or over any verandah, balcony or other structure of any kind which is over any roadway or footway within the Municipality, without a written license from the Council or except in accordance with and upon the terms and conditions of such license.

3. A license to erect or maintain a sign or signboard (other than an illuminated sign), in connection with any building, shall be granted only on and shall be subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) In case where there is a verandah, the sign or signboard—
  - (a) shall be fixed on the outer plate or fascia of the verandah parallel with the kerb, and shall not exceed a maximum width of four feet; or
  - (b) shall be under the roof of the verandah securely and rigidly fixed to the T-iron or rafter and following absolutely the contour of the verandah at right angles to the building line, and not exceed a maximum width of 12 inches. Signs under the verandah may be fixed to each rib, provided that the minimum distance between any two signs shall be 12 feet.
- (2) In cases where there is no verandah, the sign or signboard shall be of a maximum width of two feet, and—
  - (a) shall be securely bolted and attached to the wall without any intervening space between it and the building and parallel with the building line; or
  - (b) shall be securely bolted to the wall forming the building line, with an inclination outwards from the base not exceeding six inches.
- (3) In no case shall glass be permitted in the construction of any sign.
- (4) Signs and signboards shall be so placed as to allow in all cases a headway of not less than eight feet from the lowest portion thereof to the surface of the footway.

4. All electrically lighted signs must be protected by ample single-pole fuses and a double-pole switch.

5. Any sign may be removed by the Town Engineer at the cost of the licensee in the event of any of the conditions of the license not being complied with.

6. Any electrically lighted sign fixed under a verandah shall not exceed the following dimensions: maximum depth, 15 inches; width at top one foot, and at the bottom nine inches. It shall be fixed close up to and follow the contour of the roof of the verandah, and must be securely and rigidly fixed in position.

7. If the sign is over the verandah, or on a building having no verandah, it shall not project from the face of the building more than four feet and shall be securely stayed and braced to render it rigid and immovable.

8. Chemists and doctors shall be allowed to exhibit an approved lamp—colour red—so fixed as to be seen up and down a street.

9. Sun-blinds shall be white or of a light colour. They shall be so constructed that the lowest part thereof cannot hang lower than seven feet above the level of the footpath.

10. All signs and signboards or other similar attachments existing at the time of the enactment of this by-law, which do not comply with the conditions thereby prescribed, shall not be repaired, renewed, altered or re-erected, and no existing sign or signboard shall be altered or repainted, save only in such manner as will cause the same to conform to the conditions as set out in these by-laws.

11. Applications and licenses for signboards and sun-blinds shall be in the form of Schedules Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 respectively.

12. The scale of fees more particularly specified in Schedule 5 to this by-law shall be the scale of fees to be paid by the person obtaining any license under this by-law.

13. Where anything by this by-law is directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or where authority is given to any officer to direct anything to be done or to forbid anything to be done, and such act so directed to be done remains undone or such act forbidden to be done is done, in every such case the person making such default as to such direction and prohibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this by-law. And every person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person guilty of such offence, as well as any costs or expenses which may be incurred in the execution of the work directed to be so executed and not so executed, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for every breach of any such by-law, or to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
