3135/16 WHEREAS by "The Aborigines Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Aborigines: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Aborigines should be declared at De Grey, near Nullagine: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a Reserve of about 640 acres at De Grey, near Nullagine, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Aborigines.

# Schedule.

Bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the South-West boundary of Nullagine Townsite with the left bank of the Nullagine River, and extending North-Westward 80 chains; thence South-Westward 80 chains; thence South-Eastward to the left bank of the Nullagine River aforesaid; thence downwards along said bank to the starting point.

STAMP ACT, 1882, AND ITS AMENDMENTS.

State Taxation Department,

T.D. 74/18. Perth, 20th June, 1918. HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations under "The Stamp Act, 1882," and its amendments.

#### Regulations.

#### Commencement.

1. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st July, 1918.

#### Repeal.

2. All Regulations heretofore made and prescribed under "The Stamp Act, 1882," and its amendments, are hereby repealed.

#### Interpretation.

3. In these Regulations the word "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Taxation appointed under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907."

#### Correspondence.

4. All correspondence on stamp duties business must be addressed to the State Commissioner of Taxation, Perth.

# Application for Stamps.

5. All applications for stamps by licensed vendors must be made to the Commissioner. Forms of application may be obtained at the State Taxation Department, Perth. The stamps must be paid for at the time of application.

#### Commission to Licensed Vendors and Notice to be Exhibited.

6. Every licensed vendor of stamps shall be entitled to a commission of 1½ per centum on the value of stamps purchased by him. He shall exhibit and keep exhibited in a conspicuous position outside his place of business a notification to the following effect, in not less than half-inch letters:—"Licensed to vend duty stamps.

## Manner of Stamping Instruments.

- 7. Unless otherwise provided in "The Stamp Act, 1882," or its amendments, or by proclamation thereunder, the duty on all instruments shall, in accordance with the proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 5th October, 1906, be denoted either by impressed stamps or adhesive stamps.
- 8. In accordance with the proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 2nd February, 1906:-
  - (1.) The duty upon bills of exchange and promissory notes drawn or made in Western Australia, except bills of exchange and promissory notes payable on demand, shall be denoted by impressed stamps, to be impressed upon a blank space to be provided for the purpose on the bill form or note form, seven inches (more or less) from the right hand side thereof, and one-half inch from the top thereof.
  - (2.) The duty on receipts may be denoted either by an impressed stamp or an adhesive stamp.
- 9. In accordance with the proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 9th March, 1906, the duty upon coupons or warrants, letters of allotment, scrip certificates, scrip and other similar documents, and policies of insurance or assurance, may be denoted either by impressed stamps or adhesive stamps.

# Alternative to Stamped Receipt.

- 10. In lieu of a stamped receipt, the Commissioner may, in the following cases, approve of an alternative method which, in his opinion, will ensure the payment in stamps of a value equal to the required receipt duty, which arrangement shall, if adopted, be deemed a sufficient compliance with the law:—
  - (1.) The winner of any totalisator dividend which amounts to £1 or over shall be relieved from the obligation to give a stamped receipt upon receiving such dividend, provided the racing club or association conducting the totalisator furnishes a return in Form A in the Schedule, and pays the required duty.

- (2.) When more than one payment, the receipt whereof is liable to duty, of wages, salary, or other emoluments, is acknowledged on one sheet of paper, the total duty payable may be denoted thereon by one stamp either adhesive or impressed, and if adhesive it may be cancelled by the employer, or by any of the payees mentioned on the sheet of paper.
- (3.) An orchardist or other producer who consigns fruit or other produce to an auctioneer or other agent for sale shall be relieved from giving a stamped receipt for the proceeds of such sale when remitted to such orchardist or other producer, provided that a stamp equal to the required duty is affixed to the account sales sent to him, such stamp being cancelled by the person who so affixes it. The value of such stamp may be charged in such account sales to the orchardist or other

### Assessment of Duty on Deeds of Gift.

11. In order to enable the duty to be assessed on an instrument in the nature of a deed of settlement, or a deed of gift, as described in the Schedule to "The Stamp Act Amendment Act, 1918," or a voluntary disposition inter vivos, the instrument must be submitted for adjudication by the Commissioner, and be accompanied by the adjudication stamp of one shilling.

#### Late Stamping.

12. When the stamp on an instrument is not cancelled within the period allowed by law, any application for the remission or reduction of the fine must be made to the Commissioner in Form B in the Schedule and satisfactory reasons given accounting for the delay, which reasons the Commissioner may require to be verified by statutory declaration in Form C in the Schedule.

#### Cancellation.

13. For the purpose of Section 13 of "The Stamp Act Amendment Act, 1902," adhesive stamps may be Act Amendment Act, 1902," adnesive stamps may be cancelled by the Stamp Assessor attached to the Taxation Department by impressing them with a seal bearing the following words:—"State Stamp Office, Perth, W.A.," and the date on which such seal is impressed."

#### Mortgages and further Advances.

14. The declaration under Section 6 of "The Stamp Act Amendment Act, 1918," by mortgagees or others holding securities covering further advances, may be according to Form D in the Schedule, and shall be forwarded to the Commissioner at Perth, accompanied by the amount of such duty payable. The certificate given by the Commissioner under the said section may be in Form E in the Schedule Form E in the Schedule.

# Exchange of spoiled Stamps.

15. All spoiled stamps brought to the Commissioner for exchange, with the paper or parchment on which the same are affixed or impressed, must be accompanied by a declaration according to the Form F in the Schedule.

by a declaration according to the Form F in the Schedule.

16. Upon delivery of all stamped promissory notes or bills of exchange which have become damaged, spoilt, or rendered unfit for use or unnecessary, the Commissioner shall supply the applicant with a similar number of promissory notes or bills of exchange impressed with a like amount of duty, and charge therefor a fee of 1d. each, provided the said promissory notes or bills of exchange are presented to the Commissioner within two months of the date when they have become damaged, spoilt, or rendered unfit for use or unnecessary. spoilt, or rendered unfit for use, or unnecessary.

17. Upon delivery of all stamped cheque forms 17. Upon delivery of all stamped cheque forms which have become damaged, spoilt, or rendered unfit for use or unnecessary, the Commissioner shall impress for the applicant a similar number of cheque forms with the duty of 1d. each, and charge therefor 10 per cent. on the value thereof, provided the said cheque forms are presented to the Commissioner within two months of the date when they have become damaged, spoilt, or

rendered unfit for use, or unnecessary.

18. Upon delivery of any other document or instrunent which has become damaged, spoilt, or rendered unfit for use, or unnecessary, the Commissioner shall supply the applicant with an adhesive or impressed stamp of like amount, provided the said document or instrument is presented to the Commissioner within two mouths of the data when it has become data and account of the data when it has become data and account to the commissioner within two months of the date when it has become damaged, spoilt, or rendered unfit for use, or unnecessary, and the charge shall be a fee of sixpence in respect of each document or instrument.

Provided that if the duty is under 5s. the charge shall be at the rate of one penny for every 1s. or fraction thereof, and where the duty is one penny, the provisions of Regulation 17 shall apply.

#### Betting Tickets.

- 19. Every betting ticket issued by a bookmaker shall, before issue, be impressed with a stamp for the prescribed duty.
- 20. The duty stamp shall be impressed by the Commissioner on the tickets in sheet form, each sheet measuring 25 inches by 20 inches and being divisible into 32 tickets, each bearing an impressed stamp. Such sheets will be supplied by the Commissioner unprinted at the price of one penny per sheet (plus cost of postage or carriage, if any) on payment of the proper stamp duty.
- 21. The colour, size, and form of the betting tickets shall be white card 5 inches long by 3 inches wide, more or less. The bookmaker shall, at his own cost, have printed on each ticket before issue to the backer, the name of the bookmaker, the number of the ticket, and the letter distinguishing the series. Such tickets shall be numbered consecutively, and shall be issued by the bookmaker in proper consecutive order.
- 22. The stamp duty on every betting ticket shall be cancelled by the bookmaker when issuing it, by writing across the face of the ticket or otherwise defacing it in such manner as effectually to prevent the re-issue of such ticket as an unused betting ticket. Provided that in the case of a bet in respect of which cash is not paid to the bookmaker when the bet is made, he shall cancel a duly stamped betting ticket by tearing such ticket in two.
- 23. Every bookmaker who issues a betting ticket shall keep a betting book in which shall be entered particulars relating to every betting transaction with a backer, whether the amount wagered is or is not paid on the making of the bet, and such particulars shall include the number of the ticket, the name of the horse, the amount of the bet, and, in the case of a metropolitan or goldfields racecourse, a statement whether or not the bet was made within the enclosure.
- 24. The returns under Section 13 of "The Stamp Act Amendment Act, 1918," shall be forwarded to the Commissioner within 21 days after every race meeting, and shall be furnished by the secretary of the racing club or association in Form G in the Schedule. Such returns shall set forth the names and addresses of the bookmakers licensed by such club or association who have carried on the business of a bookmaker on the race-course of the club or association during such race meeting, and shall, in the case of a metropolitan or goldfields racecourse, state whether the bookmaker operated within or without the enclosure.

### Penalty.

25. Any person who commits a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
