WHEREAS it is desirable that a Court of General Sessions of the Peace should be held at Derby, in the West Kimberley District, on Thursday, the 27th day of June, 1918: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Ordinance 9 Victoria, No. 4, do hereby appoint Thursday, the 27th day of June, 1918, as the day for holding a Court of General Sessions of the Peace at Derby aforesaid.

ROEBOURNE COMMON.

By-laws.

Department of Lands and Surveys,
1715/89, Vol. 2. Perth, 28th June, 1918.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws made by the Roebourne Road Board for the management of Common (Reserves 611 and 613) and any other Commons which may have been heretofore or hereafter placed under the control of the Roebourne Road Board. All previous By-laws are hereby repealed.

BY-LAWS.

In this context the word “Common” shall mean all Commons vested in or under the control of the Board.

1. That all stock running on the Commons otherwise than in accordance with the following By-laws shall be treated as trespass stock.

2. That with the exception of stock owned by *bona fide* travellers, teamsters, and packers, as is hereinafter provided for, no stock of any description shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Commons free of charge, and

the following charges shall be payable in advance in respect of all stock so running or depasturing thereon. Persons residing within the towns only to have the right to run stock upon the Commons.

Horses and cattle shall be charged at the rate of 10s. per head per annum, 7s. 6d. per half-year, or 5s. per quarter or part of a quarter: Provided, however, that where any person, firm, or company run more than five head of horses and five head of cattle, the charges payable in advance shall be one pound per head per annum for all horses and cattle above that number. The number of horses and cattle run by any person, firm, or company not to exceed 16 in all at any one time. All stock under 12 months old, the progeny of stock running on the Common, being *bona fide* property of any ratepayer, shall not be charged for; recognised carriers and dairies to be allowed to run double the number of big head of stock at the discretion of the Board, but no male cattle over the age of 12 months to be allowed to depasture.

Sheep and cattle kept for killing by *bona fide* butchers for supplying the public shall be allowed to run and depasture on the Commons. Sheep will be charged for at the rate of ninepence per head per annum, 150 to be the largest number allowed on a Common at any one time. Cattle to be charged for at the rate of 7s. 6d. per head per annum, ten (10) to be the largest number allowed on a Common at any one time, if only one butcher carrying on business at any one time. Should there be more than one butchering establishment, 100 sheep and cattle to be the largest number allowed to be depastured at any one time by each butcher or firm of butchers.

Goats shall be charged for at the rate of 5s. per head per annum; each goat to carry a regulation disc, and no male goat over the age of six months shall be allowed to depasture on a Common; such goat shall be liable to be destroyed in accordance with Subsections 1 and 2 of Section 4 of “The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882” (46 Victoria, No. 7).

Under no circumstances shall swine be permitted to run on the Commons.

3. That any person or persons running stock on the Commons may change such stock from time to time; provided that he or they do not at any time exceed the number for which he or they shall have paid Common fees.

4. That it shall be compulsory for all persons making use of the Commons, as heretofore mentioned, to furnish the Secretary or Ranger of the Common with a list giving correct description of all stock placed by them upon the Common within 24 hours of placing such stock thereon; failure so to do, stock to be impounded.

5. *Bona fide* travellers, teamsters, and packers shall be allowed to run their horses or cattle on the Common for the space of four clear days free of charge; should that period, however, be exceeded, they shall be charged at the rate of 6d. per head per day or part of a day for all horses or cattle. In no case are horses or cattle to remain on the Commons under this Regulation longer than seven clear days at any one time. The Board shall in all cases be the sole judge of what constitutes a *bona fide* traveller, teamster, and packer.

6. No travelling stock, with the exception of those travelling to and from the Port of Cossack or Point Sampson, shall be allowed to cross the Commons. The owner or drover in charge of such last-mentioned stock to give written notice of his intention to travel such stock, and to comply strictly with Section 29 of “The Cattle, Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882” (46 Victoria, No. 7).

7. That all annual fees shall be due and payable on the 31st day of January in each year, and the Secretary shall at any time, with the approval of the Chairman and two members, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of any fees unpaid.

8. That no stock, upon which Common fees are due, shall be removed from the Commons unless with the written sanction of the Secretary, and after all such fees have been paid in full.

9. That stray stock proved to be accidentally upon the Commons shall not be liable to pay Common fees, but shall be treated in all respects as trespassing stock.

10. That no entire horse, pig, or bull over the age of six months (except the property of the Board) shall be allowed on the Commons, and in addition to the penalties hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereof, if known, any such horse or bull found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in a manner prescribed by “The Cattle Trespass,

Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Victoria, No. 7).

11. The Ranger for the time being shall have authority to demand particulars of stock depasturing on the Commons.

12. The Ranger for the time being will, on receiving instructions from any *bona fide* owner or person in charge of stock depasturing on the Commons, obtain one or any number of such animals, and deliver to the owner or person in charge. The fee to be charged on delivery shall be 2s. 6d. per head, a reduction to be made when more than one animal is delivered.

13. The Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever or from any stock straying off the Commons under the provisions of these By-laws.

14. (a) No person or persons shall cut grass on or from the said Commons.

(b) No person shall cut off, fell, or remove green, growing, or dead timber on or from the said Commons. This By-law does not prohibit residents from collecting dead wood for their own use only.

15. Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce his license upon being required by any member or officer of the Board, or any police constable.

16. (a) Any person or persons who shall introduce any diseased animals into the Commons shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds (£10).

(b) The Chairman, Secretary, or other authorised person, may, on suspicion of any animal being diseased, order or cause the same to be removed from any Common, and, if he shall think fit, cause the same to be impounded and examined, and if found to be diseased, all expenses incurred in connection with the same shall be borne by the owner, and until paid the Board shall have a lien on any other animals of such owner in the Common or Pound.

(c) In the event of any owner or person in charge of stock being fined under these By-laws or the Acts herein referred to, the Board shall have a lien on any other animals of the same owner or person in charge on any Common or in the Pound until such fines and all costs are paid and satisfied.

17. No person or persons shall muster or run in off the Commons any unbranded stock of any description and brand same, only under the personal supervision of the Common Ranger for the time being, under a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

18. No person shall permit any loose horse (except foals) travelling with a team to enter the townsite. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), with a further penalty of £2 per day for any continuing breach, but such penalty must not exceed £20 in the aggregate.

19. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds (£5), recoverable summarily before any one or more Justices of the Peace in the manner prescribed in "The Justices Act, 1902," and shall in no way affect any fines or fees recoverable under the By-laws of the Board regulating fees and fines to be paid in respect of impounded stock, and no prosecution shall be taken under these By-laws without the written permission of the Board first had and obtained.

20. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Board.

21. All previous existing Common By-laws are hereby repealed.
