MUNICIPALITY OF SOUTH PERTH.

Municipal By-law No. 32.

A By-law of the Municipality of South Perth made under Sections 179 and 181 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 32, for regulating the manner and mode of keeping and depasturing goats, and the driving of goats through or over any streets and requiring licenses to be obtained by persons for the keeping or depasturing of goats, and fixing the fees payable and the duration of such license.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of South Perth order as follows:—

1. Every owner or keeper of any goat within the Municipality shall, during the month of April in every year (and if he becomes the owner or keeper later than the month of April, then within one month of his so becoming owner or keeper) register with the Town Clerk his name and address, and the place where the goat or goats are to be kept or depastured. A license to keep and depasture such goat or goats will thereupon be issued to him, on payment of the sum of 1s. for every goat included in the license. Every license shall expire on the 31st day of March following the date of its issue. A license under this By-law shall be in the Form contained in the Schedule hereto.

2. Goats must be continuously kept and depastured by the licensee on the premises licensed for the purpose, and such premises must at all times be so enclosed or fenced that no goat can break away from or stray out of the same.

3. The license to keep and depasture a goat or goats may be issued by the Town Clerk, who may refuse to issue the license in respect to any premises he considers unsuitable for the purpose. A change of premises in which the licensee is authorised to keep and depasture the animals may from time to time be endorsed by the Town Clerk on the license.

4. No goat shall be driven through or over any street of the Municipality by any person unless such goat have fastened thereto a line or some means to prevent its escape, which shall be held by the person driving such goat.

If any person becomes the owner of a goat licensed under this By-law during the currency of the license thereof, he or she shall be entitled to have the license issued in respect of such goat transferred from the person to whom such license has been issued to his or her own name.

6. No person shall cause or suffer any male goat to be turned loose or to be tied up in any yard or other place within the Municipality with any female goat or goats for the purpose of covering the same, unless such yard or other place shall be screened from public view.

7. Any person offending against any portion of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
