WHEREAS by Section 267 of "The Health Act, 1911-15," it is provided that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which By-laws may be made by a Local Authority under any of the provisions of the said Act, and that a Local Authority may, of its own motion, by resolution, adopt the whole or any portion of such By-laws; and whereas Model By-laws have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the said section, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th day of July, 1915: Now, therefore, it is resolved and determined by the Tambellup Road Board, being a Local Health Authority within the meaning of the said Act, that Model By-laws Series "B" and Parts IV., V., and VI. of Model By-laws "A" published in the *Government Gazette* on the 20th November, 1914, and the 9th July, 1915, respectively, be adopted for the District of Tambellup; and whereas, under the provisions of the said Act a Local Authority may make By-laws: Now, therefore, the said Local Authority doth hereby make the following By-law:—

REGULATIONS UNDER THE DIVIDEND DUTIES ACT, 1902, AND ITS AMENDMENTS.

- 1. These Regulations shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Government Gazette.
2. All Regulations heretofore made and prescribed under "The Dividend Duties Act, 1902," and its Amendments, are hereby repealed.
3. In these Regulations the word "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Taxation appointed under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907."
4. The oath of fidelity and secrecy to be taken and subscribed by the Commissioner and every person appointed for carrying out the provisions of "The Dividend Duties Act, 1902" (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") shall be in the Form A in the Schedule.
5. Every Company, before distributing any dividend or profits chargeable with duty, shall furnish to the Commissioner a Return of Dividends in Form B in the Schedule, which return shall be accompanied by the duty payable on the said dividends or profits to be distributed.
