HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amending Acts for the management of the Gnowangerup Public Cemetery (Reserve 11626).

BY-LAWS.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Gnowangerup, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times

and manner therein mentioned.

- Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.
- 4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.
- 5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the grave-

digger.
6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Cor-

oner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from
8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to

5 p.m.; and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any

except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any

gratuity or being person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or wallt and in each case submitting along a state of the control of the grave. or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may if and when such work is done to their

Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form

"E'' in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of

the Trustees.
23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or

vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from

the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall,

- before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.
- 30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery, 31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, be subject to the super-vision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workmen permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-

Any person taking part in dressing or attending

(a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees. (c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.
(d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due

despatch, and only during regulation hours.

offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty

BY-LAWS FOR THE REGULATION AND MAN-AGEMENT OF MEEKATHARRA COMMON.

(Reserve 9469.)

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws by the Meekatharra Road Board, for the regulation and management of the Meckatharra Common, Reserve 9469.

- 1. All stock running on the Meekatharra Common, otherwise than in accordance with this By-law, shall be treated as trespassing stock.
- 2. That with the exception of stock owned by bona jide travellers, travelling teamsters as hereinafter provided for, no person shall depasture any animal on the common without first having obtained a license for the depasture of such stock and shall have paid the fees as hereinafter provided. hereinafter provided.
- 3. Bona fide travellers and teamsters travelling shall be allowed to run their horses, cattle, asses, and camels on the common for a space of seven clear days at one time free of charge; should that period, however, be exceeded, they shall be charged at the rate of three-pence per head per week or part of a week for all horses, cattle, camels, asses, and mules.
- 4. Every applicant for a license to depasture stock on the common shall furnish the secretary with a correct list in writing of the number and description of stock which it is intended to depasture, together with a description of brands and other distinguishing marks, and shall pay the following fees:—

For registration and depasturing each head of horse, cattle, or ass or mule, 5s. per head per

For registration and depasturing each camel, 20s. per annum.

For the registration and depasturing of each sheep

or goat, 1s. 6d.

All such registration and depasturage licenses shall terminate on the 31st day of December next ensuing the date of registration, after which date all such licenses shall be renewed.

5. No person or firm shall run or depasture on the common a greater number of stock of any age than the following:

Horses, not more than 10 head. Horned Cattle, any age, not more than 10 head. Donkeys, not more than 20 head. Sheep, not more than 50 head. Goats, not more than 30 head. Camels, not more than 15 head.

6. Any person or persons running stock on the common may change such stock from time to time, provided that he or they do not exceed the number for which he or they shall have paid fees; and provided that he or they shall have furnished the secretary with a list of the numbers, description, and brands of all such stock, and shall have obtained from the secretary a certificate showing the number and description of such stock.

7. All travelling stock, with the exception of those 7. All travelling stock, with the exception of those travelling to and from the railways, shall be allowed to cross the common conditionally that the owner or driver in charge of such stock gives written notice of his intention to travel such stock and to comply strictly with Section 29 of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).

8. No entire horse, bull, or bull camel over the age of six months (except with the permission of the Board) shall be allowed to run on the common.

The Board shall not be responsible for damage sustained from any cause whatever by any horse, sheep, cattle, goat, camel, asses, or other animals depasturing on the common under the provisions of this by-law.

10. The Board shall not be responsible for any damage done by any stock straying off the common.

11. No person shall run or permit to run on the common any beast that is diseased.

12. No person shall cut off or fell any green or

growing timber on any portion of the common, without permission of the Board.

13. Stock arriving by train or awaiting entrainment may be depastured on the common for seven days free of charge, after which a fee of 3d. per head per day for horses or cattle, and one half-penny per head per day for sheep, will be charged.

14. The Board shall be sole judge of what consti-

tutes a bona fide traveller, travelling teamster or drover,

within the meaning of this by-law.

15. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to this by-law, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law and be liable on conviction to a penalty of £5, and for any continuing breach thereof a further penalty of £2 per day, but such penalty not to exceed in the aggregate £20.

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1911," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purpose in the said Act mentioned, the Westonia Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws for regulating the construction, control, and management of Footpaths, Balconies, and Verandahs:—

By-law No. 125.

(a.) These By-laws shall apply to the town of Westonia and such other part of the District as may from time to time be prescribed as an area under Section 216 of "The Roads Act, 1911."

Interpretation.

- (b.) "Footpath" or "Footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed or otherwise.
- (c.) No person shall obstruct any road by the erection of any posts, pillars, or other obstacles for verandahs or balconies, without first having obtained the permission of the Board in writing.
- (d.) No person shall construct or erect any projection over a public road, either for eaves of buildings, sign-boards, or other objects, without first having obtained the permission of the Board in writing.
- (e.) No application for the permission of the Board to allow the erection of verandahs, balconies, or other obstructions over public roads will be entertained unless accompanied by a plan signed by the owners thereof.
- (f.) No permission will be granted by the Board for any verandah or balcony, unless built to the following specifications:

Roof, bull-nosed or flat.

Height from ground, 8ft. 6in. to plate. Width, 12ft. from building line.

Posts to be of jarrah of minimum measurement of 5in. x 5in., or iron of approved pattern, and placed not more than 10ft. apart.

Rafters, 4in. x 2in., not more than 3ft. apart.
Purlines, 3in. x 2in., not less than five to be put in. Suitable guttering and down-pipes.

- (g.) Every person using a footpath shall, when passing any other pedestrian, keep on the right hand side of such footpath
- (h.) No person shall lead, drive, or ride any animal upon any footpath in the district.
- (i.) No person shall, either alone or with another, behave, act, or stand on any footpath so as to obstruct the free passage and traffic along, through, or upon the same, nor loiter, nor act in any way to the annoyance of other pedestrians.
- (j.) No person shall pack or unpack, or cause to be packed or unpacked, any goods, wares, or merchandise, or any articles or effects on any part of any footpath.
- (k.) No person shall place any chairs, bench, or seat, or allow or suffer any other person to place any chair, bench, or seat upon any footpath.
- (1.) No person shall expose for sale or shall place or hang up any goods, wares, merchandise, articles or thing upon or over any footpath.

By-law No. 126.

No person shall drive, ride, or trundle, upon any footpath in the District, any wagon, cart, dray, motor car, bicycle, tricycle, or any other vehicle, or any wheel, wheelbarrow, truck, hogshead, cask, barrel, or other thing whatsoever.
