Amendment of By-laws.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1911-15," the Commissioner of Public Health has power to make By-laws, and to make all such By-laws for any portion of the State as a Local Authority might make for such portion as is not within the district of a Local Authority; and whereas the Commissioner may amend any By-laws so made; and whereas by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd August, 1915, the Commissioner adopted Parts 2-6 and 8-10 of the Model By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of 20th November, 1914: Now, therefore, the Commissioner of Public Health, under the provisions of the said Act, doth hereby amend the By-laws so adopted as follows:—

Part 4.—Insert the following new By-law to stand as 3A:—

3A. No person shall carry on the trade of a dairyman or vendor,—

- (a.) Unless he is the holder of a subsisting license to carry on such trade issued by the Local Authority; or
- (b.) On any premises in respect of which he is for the time being not registered by the Local Authority as hereinbefore provided.

Provided that the foregoing provisions of this By-law shall not apply during the first week in January, in any year, in respect of a person who was lawfully carrying on the trade at the end of the preceding year.

Part 4.—Schedule C is hereby amended by the insertion of a new subclause as follows:—

(d.) If the applicant sells dairy produce other than milk Nil
