WHEREAS a petition duly signed was presented to the Governor under the provisions of Section 4 of "The Land Drainage Act, 1900," with a view to the area defined as margined in red on the attached plan P.W.D., W.A., 19553, being constituted and declared a Drainage District: And whereas it has been resolved to give effect to such petition: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the area of land described in the schedule hereto to be a Drainage District within the meaning and for the purposes of "The Land Drainage Act, 1900," with the boundaries as defined in the said schedule, and by the name of the Bengier Drainage District.

FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST ACT, 1902.

1629/18.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Regulation under paragraph 3 of Section 58 of "The Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902," in lieu of the Regulation published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th March, 1907:—

Interest on Capital, etc.

1. All dues, charges, rents, and other moneys levied and collected by the Commissioners, and paid into the Treasury to the credit of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Account, after payment of all fees, salaries, and wages and other expenditure lawfully incurred by the Board in exercise of their powers under the Act, shall be charged with the payment to the Colonial Treasurer of interest—

(a) on the value of property vested in or charged to the Commissioners under Sections 56 and 57 of "The Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902," up to the 30th day of June, 1907, at the rate of 3½ per cent. per annum; and

(b) on property so vested or charged from the 1st day of July, 1907, to the 30th day of June, 1918, inclusive, at the rate of 4½ per cent. per annum; and

(c) on property so vested or charged from the 1st day of July, 1918, to the 30th day of June, 1919, and thereafter until further order at the rate of 6½ per cent. per annum;

and with the payment of £1 per cent. per annum on the aggregate value of the property so vested or charged as a provision of a sinking fund to be invested in Government securities at compound interest, and with the sum of £2,000 a year as a provision for a replacement fund to be invested in such manner as the Colonial Treasurer may think fit, and the balance shall be carried to the Consolidated Revenue Fund as provided by Section 58 of the Act.

The sections mentioned are of the Act as reprinted with amendments in 1906.

**JETTY REGULATIONS, WHARFAGE RATES, AND

**Regulations for the Working of such of the Sea Jetties of the
State as are under the control of the Commissioner of
Railways.**

BERTHING DUES, Etc.

Berthing Dues at the Sea Jetties.

1. *All vessels* using any of the Sea Jetties of the State under the control of the Commissioner of Railways for loading or discharging cargo shall pay Berthing Dues at the following rates, *i.e.*:—

For the first week or any part of two (2) weeks, Sundays included	1d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped. Minimum 30s.; maximum £12.
For any subsequent week or part of such week	1½d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped.
All lighters	1d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped. Minimum, 2s. 6d.
All Coasting Vessels (not exceeding 200 tons register)	1d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped. Minimum, 2s. 6d.

Vessels discharging or shipping 50 tons of cargo or over, per day, will be exempt from the additional ½d. per ton.

Coal Hulks, each, per annum ..	£10, payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January, and the first day of July in every year; provided that Coal Hulks shall not be allowed to occupy berthing accommodation when vessels with cargo or passengers require the same.

Computation of Berthing and Tonnage Dues.—In the computation of berthing and tonnage dues for cargo-carrying vessels, the Commissioner shall have the option of proceeding on a weight basis of 2,000 or 2,240lbs. to the ton (according to trade usage), or a measurement basis of 40 cubic feet to the ton, for the cargo in respect of which such dues are levied, except as follows:—

3. Transhipment cargo is cargo appearing as such upon a vessel's manifest, or declared in writing to the Commissioner before being landed as intended for transhipment into a vessel, but does not include cargo landed for land transport to another port.
4. No wharfage dues will be charged in respect of ballast in the shape of stone, sand, shingle, or such like material transhipped overside vessel to vessel.
5. The Commissioner will not supply labour to handle cargo transhipped overside vessel to vessel.
6. Cargo is allowed 48 hours' free storage in wharf sheds, except transhipment cargo, which is allowed 72 hours.
7. Goods which have already paid a full inwards wharfage at another port in the State of Western Australia shall (on prime entry) be exempt from the payment of wharfage dues on production of certificate on prescribed form.
8. Wharfage dues on bulk kerosene and other like oils will be 5s. per ton of 250 gallons. Handling charges will be subject to arrangement according as the oils are dealt with.

JETTY REGULATIONS, Etc.

9. Motor Cars, which have once paid a full inward wharfage rate, and which are being shipped from the Port for the owner's private use, or which are again landed at the Port for the owner's private use, shall only be charged one-half the Schedule rate of wharfage. To obtain this concession, the owner or his agent must give such proof as shall satisfy the Pier Master that he is entitled to such concession.
10. For the purpose of computing charges on specified rates, *see* Regulation No. 8.
11. For extra handling and other charges on goods, *see* Regulations Nos. 8 and 9.

Outwards Cargo.

All goods shipped outwards over wharves or out of ships or lighters shall pay wharfage dues and handling charges at the same rate as inwards cargo of similar character, with the following exceptions:—

At Port Hedland outwards cargo shall pay wharfage dues and handling charges at the same rates as inward cargo of a similar character, excepting as shown below.

Goods wholly manufactured within the State, also grain, flour, agricultural and horticultural produce and coal (the product of the State), shall be free of wharfage dues on shipment to any port.

All other goods shipped to ports within the State of Western Australia shall pay wharfage at the rate of 1s. 6d. per ton.

Bunker Coal.—Where worked out of trucks or other vehicles or off wharves into ship's bunkers or slings, wharfage *nil*; handling charges 1s. 3d. per ton for each handling incurred.

Timber.—Wharfage 1s. 6d. per ton of 40 cubic feet, handling charge 1s. per ton for railway sleepers, and 2s. per ton for paving and other blocks, and 1s. 6d. per ton for all other classes of timber, in respect of each of the following services:—

- (a) Unloading and stacking prior to shipping.
- (b) Handling from stack to ship's slings.
- (c) Handling in railway wagons at ship's slings.
- (d) Any other distinct labour service rendered.

Scrap Metal.—Wharfage (same as inward rates); handling charges, if loose 2s. 6d., and if crated, cased, or bagged 1s. 2d. per ton for handling out of truck or other vehicles into ship's slings.

Frozen or Chilled Meat.—Wharfage free; handling charges, as on inwards cargo of like nature.

Fruit in cases.—Wharfage free; handling charges:—

- (a) Where delivered to ship's slings through shed, 2s. per ton.
- (b) Where worked direct from railway wagons into ship's slings, 1s. 6d. per ton.

Sandalwood.—Wharfage (same as inward cargo rates); handling charges, if loose 3s. per ton, and if crated, cased, or bagged or bundled, 2s. per ton weight for each service incurred.

Firewood.—On rough timber exported as firewood: Wharfage, 1s. per ton weight; handling charges, same as paving blocks.

The minimum wharfage due shall be 6d.; and the minimum handling charge shall be 3d. per consignment.

HOPETOUN JETTY.

Copper Matte and Slag.—Wharfage, 2s. 3d. per ton; handling 2s. per ton.

WAR SURTAX OF 20 PER CENT.

Owing to conditions brought about by the European War, all wharfages, berthing dues, and storage charges are subject to a special War Surtax of 20 per cent. upon the amount of the dues or charges which may become payable under the headings mentioned. This surtax shall continue in operation until 31st December, 1918, when it shall be re-enacted or discontinued as circumstances dictate in the discretion of the Commissioner.

The hirer shall pay a return fare calculated at the rate of 6d. for each half-mile or fraction thereof from the point of discharge to the place of hiring.

Minimum charge, including return fare for any hiring, 2s.

Extra passengers.—For each passenger over four, 3d. per mile, from the point of taking up to the point of such extra passenger alighting.

Detention.—For each period of three minutes or fraction thereof, 3d.

Passenger's Luggage.—28lbs. free, every additional 28 lbs. or fractional part thereof, 6d.

Late hours.—Between the hours of 11 p.m. and 6 a.m., an additional charge of half the above rates may be made; provided that on any journey commencing before 11 p.m. and terminating before 11.15 p.m., only the ordinary fare shall be charged.

IT is hereby notified that the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following Amendment of Regulations under the abovenamed Act.

- Regulation 6 is amended by the addition of the following proviso:—
Provided that where the value and description of the land owned by a taxpayer and of the improvements thereon are, in the opinion of the taxpayer, the same as contained in the last Return in Form "G" furnished by the taxpayer, such taxpayer may, instead of a Return in Form "G," send to the Commissioner a notice in Form "GA" in the Schedule.
- The following Regulation shall be inserted after Regulation 8:—
8A. Every Company within the meaning of "The Dividend Duties Act, 1902," shall furnish annually to the Commissioner a Return in Form "AD" in the Schedule of the dividends paid or credited by the Company to shareholders wheresoever residing.
- Regulation 9 is amended by omitting the words "31st day of December" wherever they occur, and inserting in their place the words:—"30th day of June."
- Regulation 14 is amended by omitting the words "taxable income" wherever they occur, and inserting in their place the words:—"Income chargeable."

5. Regulation 28 is amended by omitting the words "the day or days appointed by the Commissioner from time to time by notice under Section 53 of the Act," and inserting in their place the words, "on the twenty-first day after the race meeting in connection with which the stakes are won."

6. Regulation 29 is amended by omitting paragraph (2) and inserting in its place the following:—

(2.) Provided that payments and allowances to any one person at a rate which in the aggregate is less than £100 per annum, may be omitted.

7. Regulation 33 is amended by the addition of the following paragraph:—

Provided that where it is desired to give to a taxpayer notice of assessment of land tax for more than one year of assessment at the one time, such notice may be given in the Form "AE" in the Schedule.

8. Regulation 41 is amended by omitting paragraph (2) and inserting in its place the following:—

The appellant shall, when lodging his Notice of Appeal, forward to the Commissioner at least one-half of the tax as shown in the Notice of Assessment, together with any fines accrued thereon, and any arrears of like tax and fines.

Mining Development.

9. The expression "development work in a mine," used in Subsection (11) of Section 30 of the Act, shall mean all underground mining work other than labour and material the cost of which is included in the outgoings and expenses incurred in the production of the income chargeable.

10. Form "E" in the Schedule is amended:—

(a) by omitting the words in Statement No. 2, "who received £200 or over";

(b) by omitting "£10" in Statement No. 3, and inserting in place thereof, "£26";

(c) by omitting the words, "Net Taxable Income," and inserting in their place, "Income Chargeable."

11. Forms "F," "G," "HF," "L," "M," "N," "O" in the Schedule are amended respectively by omitting the words, "31st December" wherever they occur, and inserting in their place, "30th June."

12. Form "GA" is inserted in the Schedule as follows:—
