DEDICATION OF PUBLIC HIGHWAY.

City of Perth Municipality.

L. & S., Corr. No. 816/18.

WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and whereas the City of Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain lands named and described in the Schedule hereunder which have been dedicated for streets or ways within the City of Perth, be declared public highways: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said lands to be public highways, and such lands shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as highways within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter By-laws for the control and management of such Reserve, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such By-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette: the Governor and published in the Government Gazette: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserves 11714, 10022, 11134, 9959, 14645, and 17011, for Commons, at Sandstone, Erroll's, Barrambie, Birrigrin, Maninga-Marley, and Youanmi, respectively, should be placed under the control of the Black Range Road Board, as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserves under the control of the Black Range Road Board, as a Board of Management. Black Range Road Board, as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter By-laws for the control and management of the said Reserves, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach,

Alteration of the External Boundaries of the Kalgoorlie Municipal and the Kalgoorlie Road Districts.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 26 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and Section 8 of "The Roads Act, 1911," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, alter the boundaries of any conterminous Municipal District and Road District: And whereas it is desirable to alter the boundaries between the Kalgoorlie Municipal District and the Kalgoorlie Road District: And whereas due notice of the intention of the Governor in Executive Council to exercise such power has, in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and "The Roads Act, 1911," been duly published in the Government Gazette and served on the Authorities concerned, in the manner prescribed by the said Acts: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and accept of the Executive Council under the production. and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and "The Roads Act, 1911," and all other powers him enabling, doth hereby alter and amend the boundaries of the Kalgoorlie Municipal District and the Kalgoorlie Road District, by making the common boundary between

the two districts to be the centre of so much of Bourke Street as lies between Oxford and Russel Streets, in

lieu of the North side of Bourke Street as at present, and the common boundary between the Kalgoorlie Muni-

cipal District and the Kalgoorlie Road District is altered

THE FISHERIES ACT, 1905-13.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the following Regulations being made under "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13."

Fishing Boat Licenses.

1. Fishing boat licenses issued under Section 11 of the Act shall be in Form "A" appended to these Regu-

Fishermen's Licenses.

2. Fishermen's licenses issued under Section 14 of the Act shall be in Form "B" appended to these Regu-

Boat License Transferable.

3. Any person taking out a license for a boat under Section 11 of the Act shall, if such boat is destroyed, sold, or otherwise disposed of during the currency of the license, be entitled to have the registered number of the boat licensed transferred to another boat owned by him; provided, however, that no such license shall be transferred to another person.

Marking of Licensed Fishing Boats.

The owner or person in charge of a boat licensed under Section 11 of the Act shall paint and keep painted on both port and starboard sides of the boat, near the bow outside above the water line, white upon a dark ground and black upon a light ground, in legible letters and numerals not less than four inches in length, the registered number of the boat, preceded by or beneath the capital letters L.F.B., together with the initial letter or letters of the port or place where the license was issued.

Persons to produce Licenses on demand.

Every person licensed to catch fish for purposes of sale shall, upon demand at any time by any Inspector or Assistant Inspector of Fisheries, produce his license or satisfy the Inspector or Assistant Inspector that he has taken out such license, and any person failing to produce such license or failing to satisfy the Inspector or Assistant Inspector as hereinbefore set out shall be liable to prosecution. The owner or person in charge of any boat licensed under the Act failing to comply with requirements aforesaid shall be guilty of a breach of this Regulation.

Persons to give Name and Address.

Any person catching fish for purposes of sale in Western Australian waters, or any person using any fishing net, fishing line, or other appliance for the purposes of catching fish, or any person having in his possession undersized fish, or any underweight fish known as or called the "crayfish," or any "crayfish" having eggs or spawn attached to its abdominal appendages, shall, on demand of any Inspector or Assistant Inspector, give his true name and address. Any person who shall

refuse or neglect to comply with such demand, or shall give a false or fictitious name or address, shall be guilty of a breach of this Regulation.

Disposal of Forfeited Fish.

7. Fish forfeited pursuant to the provisions of Sections 6 and 22 of the Act shall be handed over to the authorities of any hospital, benevolent asylum, or charitable institution near to the place where such fish were seized; provided, however, that should, in the opinion of the Inspector, such fish be unfit for human consumption, they shall be destroyed.

Disposal of forfeited Fishing Nets, Boats, or other gear.

8. Fishing boats, fishing nets, or other appliances employed in the capture of fish ordered by any Court to be forfeited under Sections 6, 37, and 37a of the Act shall be sold or otherwise disposed of as the Minister may direct. The proceeds of all sales shall be paid into Consolidated Revenue.

Use of Long-line or "Bultows" prohibited in certain waters.

9. No person whether licensed as provided by the Act or unlicensed shall, in the waters of the Murray River or Serpentine River, or their tributaries, use or attempt to use for the purpose of catching fish, any line other than the ordinary hand line to which not more than two (2) hooks are attached, or a rod and line.

"Meshing" or "Set" Nets.

10. No person shall, in the waters of Peel's Inlet or of the Harvey Estuary cast, shoot, fix, or set any "meshing" net or "set" net within fifteen (15) fathoms (30 yards) of any other "meshing" net or "set" net already cast, shot, fixed, or set in the waters aforesaid.

Setting of Nets in the Upper Waters of the Swan River.

11. No person shall, in that portion of the Swan River situated between the Railway Bridge at Guildford and the Upper Swan Bridge, near Midland, set or fix any net nearer than 30 fathoms (60 yards) to any other net that shall have been set or fixed.

Priority among Netters.

- 12. The rights of priority in hauling nets, as between fishermen netting on the same ground, are hereby determined as follows:-
 - (a.) The first turn shall belong to the licensed fisherman who arrives on the ground with a bona fide crew of licensed fishermen in a licensed fishing boat marked in accordance with Regulation 4 with a lawful net ready for shooting and hauling.
 (b.) The next turn shall belong to the licensed

fisherman who next arrives as above, and so

(c.) A turn shall come to an end when a fisherman has shot his haul and shall in no case last more than twenty-four hours as against any other licensed fisherman who is on the ground

waiting for a haul.

(d.) During his turn a fisherman shall have exclusive right to the haul, provided he remains with his crew on the haul in readiness to "shoot" with one end of his hauling line

(e.) No licensed fisherman shall have a second turn until all the other licensed fishermen on the

ground have had their first turn.

(f.) No unlicensed fisherman or licensed fisherman in an unlicensed boat shall have any claim to a haul as against a licensed fisherman and crew in a licensed boat.

Two or more turns may be taken at the same time if Two or more turns may be taken at the same time in the water to be fished admits of double banking, but no net shall be shot round an inner net within a boat's length of the cork line of such net. It shall be unlawful to wilfully disturb or frighten

fish on or in the vicinity of a haul so occupied, or in any manner to obstruct a licensed fisherman during his turn.

When a licensed fisherman is lawfully in possession of a haul, no person shall impede him by the process known as "blocking," whereby another person sets or places his net as to prevent or attempt to prevent fish getting to such haul.

The occupancy of the haul, as aforesaid, shall cover a space not exceeding the length of the net being lawfully used, measured along the shore from a point where the boat in possession is moored in the direction in which the net is laid for hauling.

Any licensed fisherman who suffers any loss from a breach of this Regulation may be authorised by the Minister to take legal proceedings at his own expense.

Testing the length, depth, or mesh of nets.

For the purpose of testing the length of any fishing net, such net shall be measured along the cork line upon which the net is hung. The depth of any net shall be ascertained by counting the number of meshes situated between opposite points upon the cork and lead lines. The size of the mesh shall be determined by measuring from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact. In cases of dispute a half-pound weight shall be slung or attached to one knot of the mest to be measured, and the space between that and the opposite knot shall be measured. In the event of the net being dry, the part to be measured shall be soaked either in fresh or salt water for not less than ten minutes, and the dimensions of a mesh or meshes of the portion so soaked shall thereupon be determined.

Ova-bearing Crayfish.

14. No person shall, at any period of the year, remove or attempt to remove from the abdominal appendages of the fish known as or called the "crayfish" any ova or "spawn" attached thereto.

Notice of finding.

15. When any boat, net, line, implement or appliance for taking fish shall be found by any Inspector in any closed waters without any person in actual in any closed waters without any person in actual possession thereof, then such Inspector, or another Inspector, shall give notice of the finding thereof, by posting for seven clear days for public information outside his office, and the local Police Station, or the local Post Office, or in the case of Perth, ontside the offices of the Fisheries Department, Perth, full particulars of the thing so found, and the locality where it was found. found

Transfer of Exclusive License issued under the pro-

Transfer of Exclusive License issued under the provisions of Section 30 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13."

16. (a) No transfer of an Exclusive License issued under the provisions of Section 30 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," shall be made without the express permission of the Minister first had and obtained.

(b) All applications for a transfer of an Exclusive License or licenses must be made by both the proposed transferror and transferee in the prescribed form (Form C. appended to these Regulations).

(c) All applications for a transfer of an Exclusive

(c) All applications for a transfer of an Exclusive License shall be lodged at the office of the Chief Inspector of Fisheries, Perth, together with a fee of ten

shillings.
(d) The Minister shall not be bound to entertain any application for transfer of an Exclusive License, and the granting or refusal of such application shall be in the absolute discretion of the Minister.

(e) In the event of an application for transfer being granted, such transfer shall be endorsed by the Minister and shall have the effect of vesting the license in the transferee with the rights and subject to the liabilities of the original licensee (Form D. appended to these Regulations).

(f) In the event of an application for a transfer of an Exclusive License being refused by the Minister under Regulation 4, the application fee shall be refunded.

Short title.

17. These Regulations may be cited as The Fisheries Regulations, 1918.

These By-laws shall be known and cited as the Black Range District Commons By-laws.

2. The following words and expressions used in these By-laws shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them respectively:—
"Owner."—The person having the property in or

"Cattle."—Bull, ox, cow, heifer, and calf.

"Commons."—All that country under the control and management of the Black Range Road Board, known as Sandstone Common Reserve 11714: Erroll's Common Reserve 10022: Bar-11714; Erroll's Common Reserve 10022; Barrambie Common Reserve 11134; Birrigrin Common Reserve 9959; Maninga-Marley Common Reserve 14645, and Youanmi Common

Reserve 17011. "Constable."—Any officer or member of the Police . Force.

3. All stock running on the Commons otherwise than in accordance with the following By-laws shall be treated as trespassing stock and shall be subject to the

4. No person shall depasture any animal or animals thereof without having upon the Commons or any part thereof without having

first obtained a license from the Board.

- (a) The following fees shall be paid for licenses by any person or persons, except butchers and dairymen, to depasture under these Bylaws, and such fees shall be paid in advance on or before the first day of November in each year; and if any payment be not made when due, the license shall be void and owner shall be subject to By-law No. 3 hereof.
- (b) For horses, cattle, mules, and asses, not exceeding thirty—One shilling per head per

For camels kept for packing or speculative -Forty shillings per head per anpurposes-

For goats—Threepence per head per annum.

5. Exemptions.—All stock under the age of one year are exempt from tax. Each family will be allowed to depasture free of charge two horses, two cattle, two mules, two asses, two camels, and twelve goats. Camels used by teamsters and local contractors whose animal licenses are paid to the Board will be allowed to depasture on the Commons free of charge. Provided, that in the case of travelling camels, these shall be allowed to depasture on the Commons for fourteen days free of charge, and after expiration of that time a fee of 6d. (sixpence) per head per day shall be paid in advance in respect of such travelling camels. Provided that wheel taxes are paid to the Board, any bona fide teamster shall be allowed to depasture free of charge one horse per wheel in respect of the tax paid in the working of drays, and two horses per wheel in the working of wagons.

6. In the case of butchers, the fee for a license to be issued under these By-laws shall be £1 per annum payable on the first day of November in each year, and for dairymen £1 per annum payable on the aforesaid

date.

7. No license granted to any butcher shall allow of the depasturing of more than 150 sheep, 30 head of cattle, and 50 pigs for killing purposes, and any license granted to dairymen shall not allow of the depasturing of more than 25 head for dairying purposes.

8. The Commonage Ranger shall have full power to direct the area of the Commons upon which camels shall depasture at any time, and owners shall depasture camels only on the area directed. No bull camel shall

be allowed loose on the Commons.

9. Owners of travelling stock shall give notice to the Ranger or Secretary of his intention to travel such stock, and shall comply strictly with the provisions of the Droving Act and its amendments.

Any bona fide traveller, teamster, or packer may depasture his horses, bullocks, asses or mules, for four-teen days free of charge, and after the expiration of such time a fee of sixpence per head per day shall be

paid in lieu of aforesaid fees.

11. Every applicant for a license to depasture under these By-laws shall give a correct list in writing of the numbers of horses, sheep, cattle, asses, mules, goats, and pigs, and shall describe therein the brand, numbers, and distinguishing marks or colours thereon, and shall obtain from the Secretary or duly authorised person in that behalf a certificate setting forth the number and description of the animals licensed by the Board to decasture upon the Commons.

12. The Chairman, Secretary, or authorised person may permit the holder of a license to substitute any horses not exceeding the number prescribed by the license, such permit to be endorsed on the license.

No stock shall be mustered without written consent of the Common Ranger, and no person shall brand, stock running on the Commons unless in the presence of the Ranger or Secretary.

14. No person shall run or depasture stock upon the Commons except in accordance with the provisions of

these By-laws.

15. No entire horse or jack donkey over twelve months or bull over six months shall be allowed to run or depasture upon the Commons, and in addition to the penalty herein prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws, such entire horse, jack donkey, or bull shall be dealt with in accordance with the Cattle Trespass Act and its amendments.

16. The Board shall not be responsible or liable for any damage, injury, or death from any cause to any stock depasturing on the Commons under the provisions

of these By-laws.

17. Stray stock proved to be accidentally upon the Commons shall not be liable for commonage fees, but shall be treated in all respects as trespassing stock, and be subject to the Cattle Trespass Act and its amend-

Any person who shall introduce any diseased animal or animals shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence and

Two pounds per day for the continuance of such offence but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

19. The Chairman, Secretary, or Common Ranger, or authorised person may, if in his opinion any animal appears diseased, order or cause it to be removed from the Commons, and if he thinks fit, cause same to be impounded and examined and, if diseased, all expenses and costs incurred in connection therewith shall be paid by the owner.

20. Any person killing stock taken from the Commons must render to the Ranger, monthly, a list of

brands of stock killed.

- 21. The Board shall be sole judge of what constitutes a bona fide butcher, teamster, drover, or packer, within the meaning of these By-laws.
- 22. Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce his license upon being required by any constable or officer of the Board.
- Any person who permits or suffers to be done any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these Bylaws; or commits or permits any breach thereof either by act of commission or omission, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for any breach and £2 for a continuance of such breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate, where no other penalty is imposed by the By-laws in respect of the specific offence.
- 24. The Secretary or Common Ranger shall at any time, with the approval of the Chairman or any two members of the Board, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of fees unpaid, fine or penalty or breach of the within By-laws.

It is hereby resolved by the Road Board of the Black Range District, subject to any By-law, and with the approval and confirmation of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the above By-laws shall be in force within the Black Range District from the date of publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

Ex. Co. 1971; P.W. 3249/18. IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the attached By-laws of the Meekatharra Road Board, in accordance with the provisions of "The Roads Act,

MEEKATHARRA DISTRICT ROAD BOARD. By-laws.

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1911," the Road Board of any district is empowered to make, alter, and repeal By-laws for any of the purposes cited in the said Act under Section 139: Now, therefore, the Meekatharra Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in them under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby order as follow:-

Repeal of By-laws numbered VIII. and XXII. The By-laws as published in the Government Gazette of the 2nd October, 1914, and numbered VIII. and XXII., respectively, are hereby repealed.

BY-LAW VIII.

For the general regulating of traffic upon roads, etc. Vehicles obstructing street.

No person shall allow any vehicle to remain stationary in any street or any portion thereof for a longer period than shall be necessary for loading or unloading such vehicle.

No person shall camp or feed horses, whether attached to any vehicle or not, on any road or track so as to obstruct such road or track in any portion of the Road District, and shall not leave any waggon, cart, or other vehicle on any road or track at any time so as to obstruct same.

Position of vehicle left standing in a street or road. 2. The driver of any vehicle left standing in any street or public place shall place and keep the horse or other animal attached thereto close to a parallel with the kerb or footpath on the left hand side of such vehicle. If left standing on any road such vehicle shall be drawn clear off the trafficable portion of such road so as to give free and unobstructed passage for other vehicles over such portion of the road.

Vehicles and animals to keep to left.

3. Every person whilst driving any vehicle or riding any animal in or along any street shall keep such vehicle or animal on the left hand or near side of such street.

Vehicles and animals to keep passing vehicles and animals on the right.

4. The driver of any vehicle and the rider of any animal when passing any other vehicle or animal proceeding in an opposite direction along any street or road shall keep such vehicle or animal on his right.

Vehicles and animals to pass others going in same

direction on the right.

No driver of any vehicle and no rider of any animal shall pass or attempt to pass any other vehicle or animal proceeding in the same direction except on the right hand side thereof.

Furious driving, etc.

6. No person shall ride, or drive, any animal furiously or carelessly in any street, road, or public place.

No intoxicated person to ride or drive.

7. No person whilst under the influence of liquor or in a state of intoxication shall ride any animal or be in charge of any vehicle in any street or public place.

Lights on vehicles. 8. No person shall, between the hours of sunset and the following sunrise, in or upon or along any of the streets of the town of Meekatharra or any road leading thereto and within three miles therefrom, drive any vehicle without having a lamp or lantern lighted and burning brightly securely fixed to such vehicle.

Corners and intersections, and crossings.

No driver of any vehicle or rider of any horse or other animal shall turn round or turn the corner of any street or cross over the intersection of the Main Street, Meekatharra, or any crossing upon any footpath in such main street at other than a walking pace.

Posting bills.

10. No person shall post any bill or paint any notice or other form of advertisement upon any lamp post nor upon any pole or fence in or abutting upon any street or way.

Rubbish.

- 11. No person shall sweep or throw any rubbish, garbage, sweepings, litter, or refuse of any description on to any footpath or street or into any gutter or channel thereof.
- Offensive liquid. 12. No person shall empty, throw, or discharge or permit to be emptied, thrown, or discharged, any foul or offensive water or other liquid into or upon any footpath or street or way, gutter, or channel.

Cattle in streets.

13. No person shall drive through or along any street or public place or way within the town of Meekatharra any sheep, unyoked cattle, or horses between the hours of 6 o'clock in the morning and 11 o'clock at night.

Goods, etc., not to remain on footpath.

14. No person shall permit any goods, wares, or merchandise, or any articles or effects to remain on any part of any street or footpath for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing or removing the same, or, in any event, after sunset.

Packing or unpacking goods.

15. No person shall pack, or cause to be packed or unpacked any goods, wares, or merchandise or any articles or effects on any part of any street or footpath.

Exposing goods, etc., on footpath.

16. No person shall expose for sale or shall place or hang up any goods, wares, merchandise, article or thing upon or over any footway.

Drainage under footways.

- 17. The owner of every house or premises from which any water is discharged, or permitted to flow upon or into any street or public place, shall construct and maintain a sufficient drain under the footway in such street or way for the conveyance of such water to the water channel.
- 18. The owner and the occupier of any house or premises who shall suffer or permit any water to flow from such house or premises over any footway shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Verandahs to have down-pipes.

19. The owner of every house or premises, the verandahs whereof have been erected over or projecting upon any footway, shall provide proper spouting to the eaves of such verandah and down spouting discharging at the level of the kerb of such footpath. All verandahs erected before the passing of this By-law and not complying with its requirements shall be be so brought into compliance by the owner thereof within one month after the passing of this By-law.

Penalty.

20. Every person who does, or permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to this By-law, or commits or permits any breach thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law and shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £10.

BY-LAW XVI.

Add to By-law 7 of the Uniform General By-laws for

Motor Traffic the following:-

But under no circumstance shall such speed, within the limits of the town of Meekatharra, exceed 12 miles per hour, nor when turning corners or across intersecting streets shall such speed exceed five miles per hour.

Add to By-law 9 of Uniform General By-laws for Motor Traffic the following:—

Such horn or other instrument shall be sounded when approaching or leaving the cutting near the intersection of Savage and Darlot Streets.

BY-LAW XXVI.

For the preservation of public deceney and public health. Brothels.

- 1. No person shall let any premises, or any part thereof, with the knowledge that the same are or is to be used as a brothel, or for the purpose of habitual prostitution, or shall wilfully continue as a tenant of his premises any person who shall keep such premises as a brothel or for the purpose of habitual prostitution.
- 2. No person shall keep, manage, or assist in the management of a brothel, house of assignation, house of ill-fame, or place used for the purpose of habitual prostitution.
- 3. No person shall knowingly permit any premises, or any part thereof, to be used as a brothel, house of assignation, or for the purpose of habitual prostitution.
- 4. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall for every such offence be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20.
