WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Land Act, 1898," the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in Section 39 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Conditional Purchase Lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Victoria Location 3035 (Conditional Purchase Lease 12488/55), as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 13 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say, for Water: Now therefore I, Sir William Grey Ellison-Macartney, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation resume portion of Victoria Location 3035 (Conditional Purchase Lease 12488/55), for the purpose aforesaid.

*The Land Act, 1898.*

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 11th day of September, 1918.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 14933 for Common, at Westonia, should be placed under the control of Westonia Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Westonia Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 14049 should vest in and be held by the Honourable the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, in trust for the purpose of Water: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Honourable the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, in trust for the purpose aforesaid; subject, nevertheless, to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act.

## GREETING:

*First Assignment.*—Know ye that we have assigned you and each and every of you to be Our Justices to keep Our Peace in Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies either alone or with any one or more of Our Justices now or hereafter appointed in Our said State and its Dependencies and to keep and cause to be kept all laws for the preservation of the Peace and for the quiet rule and good Government of Our People in Our said State and its Dependencies according to the form and effect of the same and to punish all persons offending against them or any of them in the said State and its Dependencies as by the said laws is provided and to cause to come before you all persons within Our said State and its Dependencies who use threats to any of Our People to find security for keeping the Peace or for their good behaviour towards Us and Our People And if they refuse to find such security then to cause them to be safely kept until they find such security:

*Second Assignment.*—We have also assigned you and each and every of you either alone or with any one or more of such Justices now or hereafter appointed as aforesaid to inquire the truth concerning all manner of crimes misdemeanours and offences concerning which Our Justices of the Peace may lawfully or ought to inquire by whomsoever and in what manner soever done perpetrated or attempted in Our said State and its Dependencies And upon all complaints before you to issue such process against the persons charged until they are taken or surrender themselves as may by law be issued:

*Third Assignment.*—We have also assigned you and each and every of you either alone or with any one or more of such Justices now or hereafter appointed as aforesaid to have exercise and discharge all other the powers authorities and duties which under or by virtue of any law of Our Realm or of Our said State belong or appertain to the office of Justices of the Peace in or for Our said State:

And therefore We Command you and each and every of you that you diligently apply yourselves to keep and cause to be kept the Peace and all laws of our Realm and of Our said State and that at certain days and places duly appointed for these purposes you make inquiries into the premises and hear and determine all and singular the matters aforesaid and perform and fulfil the duties aforesaid doing therein what is just according to the laws of Our Realm and of Our said State And We command Our Sheriff and other officers of Our said State to aid you by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the premises.

In testimony whereof We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Our said State to be hereunto affixed.

*Second Assignment.*—We have also assigned you and each and every of you either alone or with any one or more of such Justices now or hereafter appointed as aforesaid to inquire the truth concerning all manner of crimes misdemeanours and offences concerning which Our Justices of the Peace may lawfully or ought to inquire by whomsoever and in what manner soever done perpetrated or attempted in Our said State and its Dependencies: And upon all complaints before you to issue such process against the persons charged until they are taken or surrender themselves as may by law be issued:

*Third Assignment.*—We have also assigned you and each and every of you either alone or with any one or more of such Justices now or hereafter appointed as aforesaid to have exercise and discharge all other the powers authorities and duties which under or by virtue of any law of Our Realm or of Our said State belong or appertain to the office of Justices of the Peace in or for Our said State:

And therefore We command you and each and every of you that you diligently apply yourselves to keep and cause to be kept the Peace and all laws of Our Realm and of Our said State and that at certain days and places duly appointed for these purposes you make inquiries into the premises and hear and determine all and singular the matters aforesaid and perform and fulfil the duties aforesaid doing therein what is just according to the laws of Our Realm and of Our said State: And we command Our Sheriff and other officers of Our said State to aid you by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the premises.

In testimony whereof We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Our said State to be hereunto affixed.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that under Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws for the management of the Westonia Common, Reserve No. 14983:—

*By-laws of the Westonia Common.*

THE Westonia Road Board, as a Board of Management of Westonia Common, do hereby, under the provisions of Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," make and publish the following By-laws for the regulation and good management of the Westonia Common:—

1. All stock running on the Common, otherwise than in accordance with the following By-laws, shall be treated as trespassing stock.

2. That with the exception of stock owned by *bona fide* travellers, travelling teamsters, or as packers, as hereinafter provided for, no stock of any description shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Common free of charge, except as hereinafter provided, and that the following charges shall be payable in advance in respect of all stock so running or depasturing thereon. Persons residing within the boundaries of the Westonia District only to have the right to run stock upon the Commonage.

3. *Bona fide* travellers, teamsters, and packers shall be allowed to run their horses, cattle, asses, and camels on the Common for the space of seven (7) clear days free of charge; should that period, however, be exceeded they shall be charged at the rate of threepence per head

per week or part of a week for all horses, cattle, camels, mules and asses.

4. The scale of charges is as follows:—Sheep and goats, 6d. per head per annum; horses, cattle, mules, and asses, 7s. 6d. per head per annum; dairy cows, 5s. per annum; bulls, over six months, 20s. per annum; camels, 40s. per annum; each family being allowed the following exemptions free of charge:—One horse, one cow, or three goats and progeny up to six months of age. Only sheep kept for killing by *bona fide* butchers, for supplying the public, shall be allowed to run and depasture on the Common. One butchering firm may keep up to 300 head, or two firms may keep 150 each. Should there be more than two butchering establishments, 150 sheep to be the largest number allowed to be depastured at any one time by each butcher or firm of butchers.

5. No license shall be granted to any person to depasture on the said Common at any one time a greater number of horses than 20 head, or cattle a greater number than 40 head over the age of six months; camels more than 15 head; mules or asses more than 40 head.

6. Any person or persons running stock on the Commonage may change such stock from time to time, provided that he or they do not at any time exceed the number for which he or they shall have paid Commonage fees.

7. That it shall be compulsory upon all persons making use of the Common, as heretofore provided, to furnish the Secretary of the Board, or the Ranger of the Common, with a list giving a correct description of all stock placed by them upon the Common, within 12 hours of placing such stock thereon, and to obtain from such officer a certificate showing the number and description of such stock.

8. All travelling stock, with the exception of those travelling to and from the railways, shall be allowed to cross the Common, conditionally that the owner or drover in charge of such stock gives written notice of his intention to travel such stock, and to comply strictly with Section 29 of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).

9. That all annual fees shall be due and payable on the first day of July in each year, and the Secretary or Ranger shall, at any time, with the approval of the Chairman or any two committeemen, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of any fees unpaid.

10. That no entire horse, pig, bull, or bull camel, over the age of six months (except by permission of the Road Board) shall be allowed on the Common, and in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereof, if known, any such horse, pig, bull, or bull camel found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).

11. The Road Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever by any horses, sheep, cattle, pigs, goats, camels, or asses depasturing on the said Common under the provisions of these By-laws.

12. The Road Board shall be sole judge of what constitutes a *bona fide* butcher, dairyman, traveller, teamster, drover, or packer within the meaning of these By-laws.

13. The Road Board prohibits the doing by unlicensed persons of any act or thing for which a license may be granted under the provisions of these By-laws, and any unlicensed person doing such act or thing shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

14. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding £5.

15. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Road Board.

16. Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce his license upon being required to do so by any constable or officer of the Road Board.

17. If the Road Board should at any time require the services of a Ranger or Herdsman, the person so appointed by the Board will be required to find two

sureties of £25 each for the full and faithful performance of his duty under these By-laws.

18. All existing By-laws relating to the said Common are hereby repealed as from the date of the publication of these By-laws in the *Government Gazette*.

These By-laws were passed at a general meeting of the Westonia Road Board held on 2nd July, 1918.

34a. No person shall ride or impel any cycle unless there shall be attached to the head piece of such cycle a plate containing on both sides thereof the number of the license of such cycle, together with the distinguishing letter or letters, mark or marks, of the Local Authority licensing such cycle; the said number and letter or letters, mark or marks, shall be at least one inch in height and of corresponding breadth painted white on a black ground. The said plate shall be affixed to the front of such head piece in a line with the front wheel, or at the rear of such head piece in a line with the saddle.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations for Scholarships for Children of Fallen or Disabled Soldiers.

CECIL ANDREWS,  
Director of Education.*Regulations for Scholarships for Children of Fallen or Disabled Soldiers.*

1. Six places will be reserved annually in the Modern School for children of fallen or disabled soldiers, provided that candidates of sufficient attainments are forthcoming.

2. Four places will be reserved annually in the Goldfields High School for such children, provided that candidates of sufficient attainments are forthcoming.

3. Ten scholarships will be given annually, tenable at any of the District High Schools or at any Secondary School approved by the Department.

The children selected for any of these positions will, if they are obliged to live away from home in order to attend an approved school, receive an allowance of £30. If they are not obliged to live away from home they will receive an allowance to cover the cost of books (not exceeding £3 per annum), and any necessary travelling expenses, if their homes are more than two miles from the school.

The scholarships are tenable in the first instance for three years. If the holders' progress is satisfactory and if they have passed the Junior University Examination, the scholarships may be renewed for a further two years. Their entrance fees on sitting for the Junior in the third year and for the Leaving Certificate in the fifth year will be paid by the Department.

The Education Endowment Trustees have also offered a scholarship of £22 per year for two years, tenable at the Narrogin School of Agriculture. This covers the cost of board and lodging; there is no charge for tuition.

Candidates for any of these scholarships must have passed the sixth class in a State school, or an equivalent standard in any other efficient school. They should be over 12 and under 14 on the 1st of January, 1919. The candidates for the Narrogin School of Agriculture should not be less than 13½ years old.

Candidates for the scholarships mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 should sit for the Examination for Secondary School Scholarships, which will be held on the 10th and 11th of October. Candidates for the scholarships mentioned in paragraph 3, if they are at school in a town, should also sit for this examination. If they are in small country schools they should apply to the Department as early as possible, so that arrangements may be made for a special report upon them when an Inspector visits the district.

##### Subiaco Municipality.

BY-LAWS of the Subiaco Municipality made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 63 and 64, for regulating Motor Traffic and Standard Lights for all vehicles.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Subiaco Municipality order as follows:—

The Uniform By-laws for regulating Motor Traffic and Standard Lights for all vehicles, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th day of October, 1915, are hereby amended, by repealing By-laws Nos. 24 and 25, and substituting the following By-laws in lieu thereof:—

By-law No. 63.

##### Lights.

No person shall, between sunset and the following sunrise, ride, drive, or impel, haul, or place on any road any motor car, motor wagon, motor carrier, motor cycle, vehicle, cycle, hand-cart, engine, or trailer, unless a lamp or lamps as hereinafter prescribed are kept continually burning sufficient to afford an adequate means of signalling the approach or position of the motor car, motor wagon, motor carrier, motor cycle, vehicle, hand-cart, engine, or trailer and as hereinafter provided:

- (a.) The top of the main beam of light projecting from any lamp or lamps shall have the main beam of light projecting therefrom restricted to a height of three feet above any road at a distance of 75 feet on a level from the front of any motor car, motor wagon, motor carrier, motor cycle, cycle, hand-cart, engine, or trailer in the direction in which the same is proceeding or intending to proceed.
- (b.) Provided that if any lamp or lamps are provided with any lens or other immovable device which efficiently prevents the beam of light dazzling, blinding, or confusing any other person at a greater distance than that specified in the foregoing By-law, and if written approval is obtained of such lens or other immovable device from the local authority by which the motor car, motor wagon, motor carrier, motor cycle, cycle, hand-cart, engine, or trailer is licensed, such lens or other immovable device shall be deemed to comply with the provisions of the foregoing By-law.

##### Motor Cars, Motor Wagons, and Motor Carriers.

At least two lamps so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction in which such motor car, motor wagon, or motor carrier is proceeding or intending to proceed, and one lamp so constructed and placed as to exhibit a red light from the rear of the motor car, motor wagon, or motor carrier, and a white light to so illuminate the rear number plate as to make the inscription thereon easily distinguishable, and all such lamps shall, during the time as aforesaid, and whilst such motor car, motor wagon, or motor carrier is in any street or way be kept lighted and shall show a light sufficiently clear and strong to afford adequate means of signalling the approach or position of such motor car, motor wagon, or motor carrier.
