Alteration of By-laws.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," of the amendment of Clause 6 of the Regulations for the Yalgoo Common Reserve 6936 as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th June, 1916, and of the following additional By-law to be known as Clause 6a:—

At a meeting of the Yalgoo Road Board held on 14th August, 1918, it was resolved to amend the By-laws of the Yalgoo Common gazetted on June 6th, 1916, as under:—

By-law (6.)—*Bona fide* travellers and teamsters will be allowed to run their horses, cattle, camels, mules or asses on the Common for seven clear days free of charge. Such stock after being on the Common for that period must make a *bona fide* trip of at least three days' absence from Yalgoo before being entitled to another seven days free; should the seven days be exceeded, such stock will be charged at the rate of six-pence per head per day or part of a day, but in no case shall such stock remain on the Common under this By-law longer than 12 days at any one time.

By-law (6a.)—Resident teamsters will be allowed to run their teams on the Common for an annual charge of £5, payable quarterly in advance, such teams not to exceed 30 donkeys, 17 camels, or 12 horses; any stock above these numbers to be charged as in By-law No. 4, namely, at the rate of 15s. per head per annum.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to repeal Regulations made under "The Abattoirs Act, 1909," as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 24th May, 1918, and to approve of the following Regulations, which shall have effect in lieu thereof as from the 1st November, 1918.

THE ABATTOIRS ACT, 1909.

Amended Regulations.

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the existing Regulations to the contrary, any person may, by license in writing of the Minister, slaughter pigs for

bacon curing or other trade purposes or for domestic consumption elsewhere than at an Abattoir: Provided that—

- (a) the premises on which the pigs are slaughtered are registered under Division 2 of Part VII. of "The Health Act, 1911";
 - (b) all relative By-laws under "The Health Act, 1911," and its amendments are duly observed and performed by the licensee; and
 - (c) the prescribed fee is paid by the licensee.
2. Every licensee shall pay to the Department of Public Health, or its collector, as an inspection fee, the sum of sixpence for each pig killed.
3. The minimum number of carcasses presented for inspection to be twenty, otherwise the licensee to pay fees as if twenty pigs had been inspected.
4. Twenty-four hours' clear notice shall be given the Department of Public Health by the licensee that an inspection is desired, or alternatively a licensee may, by arrangement with the Department of Public Health, fix definite days and hours of inspection.
5. Every license shall be revocable by the Minister in his absolute discretion.
6. A license may be in the form or to the effect of the Schedule.

A BY-LAW of the Midland Junction Municipality, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 61, for regulating Motor Traffic and Standard Lights for all Vehicles.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Midland Junction Municipality order as follows:—

The Uniform By-laws for regulating Motor Traffic and Standard Lights for all vehicles, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th day of October, 1915, are hereby amended by repealing By-laws Nos. 24 and 25, and substituting the following By-laws in lieu thereof:—

By-law No. 61.

Lights.

No person shall, between sunset and the following sunrise, ride, drive, or impel, haul or place on any road

any motor car, motor wagon, motor carrier, motor cycle, vehicle, cycle, hand-cart, engine, or trailer unless a lamp or lamps as hereinafter prescribed are kept continually burning sufficient to afford an adequate means of signalling the approach or position of the motor car, motor wagon, motor carrier, motor cycle, cycle, vehicle, hand-cart, engine, or trailer and as hereinafter provided:

(a.) The top of the main beam of light projecting from any lamp or lamps shall have the main beam of light projecting therefrom restricted to a height of three feet above any road at a distance of 75 feet on a level from the front of any motor car, motor wagon, motor carrier, motor cycle, cycle, hand-cart, engine, or trailer in the direction in which the same is proceeding or intending to proceed.

(b.) Provided that if any lamp or lamps are provided with any lens or other immovable device which efficiently prevents the beam of light dazzling, blinding, or confusing any other person, at a greater distance than that specified in the foregoing by-law, and if written approval is obtained of such lens or other immovable device from the local authority by which such motor car, motor wagon, motor carrier, motor cycle, cycle, hand-cart, engine, or trailer is licensed, such lens or other immovable device shall be deemed to comply with the provisions of the foregoing By-law.

By-law No. 61.

Motor Cars, Motor Wagons, and Motor Carriers.

At least two lamps so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction in which such motor car, motor wagon, or motor carrier is proceeding or intending to proceed, and one lamp so constructed and placed as to exhibit a red light from the rear of the motor car, motor wagon, or motor carrier, and a white light to so illuminate the rear number plate as to make the inscription thereon easily distinguishable, and all such lamps shall, during the time as aforesaid, and whilst such motor car, motor wagon, or motor carrier is in any street or way, be kept lighted, and shall show a light sufficiently clear and strong to afford adequate means of signalling the approach or position of such motor car, motor wagon, or motor carrier.

Number Plates on Cycles.

No person shall, drive, ride, or impel any cycle unless there shall be attached thereto, in conspicuous positions in front and at the rear, number plates containing the number of the license of such cycle, together with the distinguishing letter or letters of the district of the Local Authority in which the same is licensed. The said number is to be at least two inches in height and to be in white figures on black ground.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws for the Carnarvon Water Board, under the provisions of "The Water Boards Act, 1904."

CARNARVON WATER BOARD—BY-LAWS.

Interpretation Clause.

The terms "House" and "Land" shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of "The Health Act, 1911."

The words "Board," "Fittings," "Land," "Occupier," "Owner," "Person," "Pipe," "Prescribed," "Rateable Land," "Water Area," "Waterworks," and "Works" shall have meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of "The Water Boards Act, 1904."

"Inspector" and "Local Officer" respectively shall mean a person appointed by the Board for the purposes of these By-laws or to administer the said By-laws.

Division 1.—By-laws for preventing Pollution of the Waters of the Catchment Area.

1. No person shall bathe, or wash clothes or other articles, in any reservoir or other waterworks within the water area, or wash, throw or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal; or throw or convey, or permit to be conveyed or thrown therein any rubbish, dirt, filth, dead animal, or other noisome thing, or otherwise cause any pollution within the Water Area.

2. No person shall deposit, or permit to be deposited any refuse, dung, manure, or other offensive matter in or near any Catchment Area, or in any place where, in the opinion of the Inspector, storm waters will be liable to wash such matter into any feeder.

3. No person shall place or deposit or spread, or permit to be placed, deposited, or spread, in or upon any land or garden within the Catchment Area, any night-soil or human urine, whether mixed with any other substance or not, or any solution of nightsoil, unless the same has been thoroughly deodorised and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Inspector, and unless written consent thereto has been obtained.

4. In the event of the death, or of any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcase of such animal shall be removed by the owner thereof to a safe distance from any waterworks, or to such place as the Inspector may direct, and the owner shall immediately thereafter dispose of same, by burning, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

5. No person shall deposit or permit to be deposited any rubbish, filth, blood, offal, or manure, or any slops, soap-suds, urine, water containing urine or other refuse, noisome thing, or matter in any part of the Catchment Area or Water Area, whence it may, in the opinion of the Inspector, be carried by storm water into any feeder.

6. Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by any Inspector or other authorised officer shall be determined by the Board according to the nature of each case.

Division 2.—By-laws for protecting the Water, Grounds, Works, etc., from Trespass and Injury.

7. No unauthorised person shall trespass within the fenced area adjacent to any waterworks, or any reserve or other lands vested in the Board.

8. No person shall, without first obtaining a license, cut or remove timber from any land or from any reserves or other properties in the possession of the Board.

9. No person shall, without proper authority, enter any machinery house, valve house, or other portion of the works not open to the public, or enter any enclosure within the Water Area containing a tank, reservoir, meter, house, office, or other waterworks.

10. No person shall permit live stock to have access to any portion of the grounds in the vicinity of any waterworks.

11. No person shall post any bills, advertisements, or other notices on any portion of any waterworks or grounds in the vicinity without consent of the Board.

Division 3.—By-laws for the Licensing of Plumbers.

12. By-laws under this division shall apply to all plumbers' work done within the boundaries of the Water Area, and in districts not within such boundaries plumbers' work shall be done under such arrangement as may be specified in each case by the Board.

13. No person shall affix, alter, or repair any service pipe or fitting to be used in connection with any main or other pipe belonging to the waterworks, or interfere in any way therewith, unless licensed as a plumber under these By-laws, or with the consent of the Board.

14. An application for a plumber's license shall be in writing, signed by the applicant, and addressed to the Board.

15. Every applicant for a plumber's license shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber, and may be required to submit to an examination in the theory and practice of plumbing work.

16. Every license shall be granted by the Board; and the granting and cancellation of any license shall be in the absolute discretion of the Board.

17. Every license shall be annual, expiring on the 10th day of January next following the granting thereof, and may be in the Form "A" in the Schedule hereto.

18. A fee of ten shillings shall be payable for every license except when a license is granted after the 10th day of July in any year, in which case the fee shall be five shillings.

19. Every applicant for a plumber's license shall, before receiving a license, deposit with the Board the sum of five pounds, to be held by the Board during the currency of the license as security for the proper performance of all work undertaken by the licensee.

20. The Board may deduct from such deposit the expense of making good any bad work of the licensed plumber or his workmen, and as often as any expense

is so deducted the licensed plumber shall make good the deposit to the sum of five pounds, and in default his license will be cancelled.

21. Every licensed plumber shall, within forty-eight hours of any change of his address, give notice, in writing, thereof to the Board.

22. The mains shall be tapped only by the workmen of the Board.

23. No licensed plumber or any other person shall interfere with any pipe or fitting belonging to the waterworks, without the permission in writing of a local officer first obtained.

24. No ground shall be opened, nor shall any work be undertaken for the purpose of laying and fixing a new service or fittings, or in the extension or alteration of an existing service or fittings until notice shall have been given by the responsible licensed plumber to a local officer. Such notice shall be in writing, in the Form "B" in the Schedule, and shall describe the nature and extent of the proposed work, and shall be given forty-eight hours at least before the work is intended to be commenced, unless the officer expressly accepts shorter notice.

25. On the completion or extension of any service, the responsible plumber or other person shall report the work to a local officer as ready for inspection.

26. In no case shall the ground be filled in or water be turned on to any land until the work executed by the responsible plumber or other person has been examined and passed by a local officer, and a certificate in writing has been given by such officer to that effect.

Division 4.—By-laws for General Purposes.

27. Within the Carnarvon Water Area the water rate shall be at a rate not exceeding two shillings in the pound per annum upon the net annual value of all rateable land, provided that a minimum rate of not exceeding one pound per annum shall be payable on each separately assessed piece of land.

28. Water rates shall become due and payable half-yearly in advance, on each first day of January and July: Provided that in all cases where a water rate is made after the first day of January in any year the notice of the order for the making and levying of such rate, published in the *Government Gazette* and a newspaper as provided by Section 94 of the said Act, shall

specify the minimum sum payable as rate as aforesaid, and the date or dates when the rate shall be due and payable, and such rates shall be and become due and payable in accordance with the terms of such notice.

29. Every ratepayer will be entitled to consume, on each separately assessed property for which he is rated, that quantity of water which, if calculated at a price not exceeding two shillings per thousand gallons, would amount to the equivalent of the water rate paid on such property, provided that such water be taken during the period for which the rate is struck.

30. Every ratepaying-consumer taking water in excess of the quantity to which he is entitled in respect of the rate will be charged for the excess at a price not exceeding five shillings per thousand gallons.

31. It shall be at the discretion of the Board to supply water to any individual consumer, whether rated or not, at such price or prices as may be mutually agreed upon.

32. Where water is supplied by measure to the owner or occupier of land, whether rated under the Act or otherwise, payment of the same shall be made at such times and in such manner as may be agreed upon between the Board and the consumer.

33. Any person or persons requiring a water service to premises in respect of which for the time being a water rate may not be made may be supplied on payment of an annual minimum charge, which shall be fixed by the Board in each case. The minimum charge shall then take the place of a water rate, and the general provisions of these By-laws, as applying to rate-paying consumers, shall apply to minimum-charge paying consumers: Provided that the minimum charge to any public building or for any water service for public purposes shall be subject to the approval of the Minister.

34. Application for services shall be made on the printed form procurable at the local Water Supply Office, and shall be lodged not less than one week before the service is required.

35. Applications will not be entertained unless full information, as indicated on the printed form, is supplied, and the full amount of rates due on the premises to which a service is required is paid.

36. The Board may, by notice to a consumer, from time to time restrict the quantity of water that may be supplied to him in any one week.

37. The Board may, from time to time, when necessary for the purpose of tapping or repairing the main, or otherwise, cut off the supply of water from any part or parts of the Water Area. The Board shall have power to regulate the time for the use of sprinklers.

38. It shall be at the discretion of the local officer as to whether or not a meter shall be affixed to any service, and such officer will also determine the size and class of meter in each case.

39. Meters will be supplied by the Board, and may, in the discretion of the Board, be open or encased, and rent for same, if ruling, be payable in advance, on the following scales:—

40. The quantity registered by a meter at any time between ten days before and ten days after any stated date may be taken as the reading of the meter at such stated date, but in addition the Board may determine, on its merits, any dispute arising in regard to the reading of any meter.

41. During the time any meter is undergoing repairs, or should it cease to properly register the consumption of water, the Board may, at its option, estimate the quantity of water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous month or quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, and shall charge for the consumption so ascertained.

42. If the consumer shall at any time be dissatisfied with any particular reading of a meter, and shall be de-

sirous of having same tested, he shall give written notice thereof to the local officer within seven days of such reading, and thereupon the said meter shall be tested by passing through it a predetermined quantity of water, and, if upon such testing, it shall appear to the satisfaction of the local officer that the said meter registered above five per cent. more than was actually passed through it at such testing, then the said Board will bear the expense of and incidental of such testing, and will also adjust the charge to the said consumer; but if the said meter upon such testing shall not register five per cent. more than the quantity that shall actually have passed through it, then the said consumer shall pay to the said Board all the expenses of and incidental to such testing; provided that the amount representing the expense of each and every test shall be fixed by the Board, and shall in no case exceed the sum of forty shillings: Provided, also, that the said consumer shall not be at liberty to avail himself of the right to test the registration of the said meter for any period other than three months next preceding the date of reading in respect of which he shall have given notice as aforesaid: Provided further, that for testing meters of sizes ¾ in. and under, a uniform fee of 10s. shall be charged.

43. No person shall break or in any way interfere with the seal fixed on a meter through which water is supplied by the Board, or turn or attempt to turn any screw, bolt, or nut on or attached to such meter, or use any tool or appliance on any such meter, or introduce or attempt to introduce any body or substance into such meter, or in any way interfere with any portion of such meter or of any pipes or fittings attached thereto.

44. No licensed plumber, or holder of an operative plumber's certificate, or other person shall under any circumstances disconnect the flange from a meter, or shall, after a meter has once been fixed on a service and water has been turned on, disconnect or interfere with any piping within twelve feet of such meter. Such work shall be done by the servants of the Board only.

45. Any person supplied with water through a meter belonging to the Board shall pay the cost of making good all damages to such meter whilst on his land and in his charge, and shall deliver such meter up in good order on ceasing to hire same. Any repairs required shall be done by the officers of the Board, and the expense incurred by the Board in so doing shall, on demand, be paid by the owner or occupier of the land, and if not paid on demand, shall be recoverable in the same manner as water rates.

46. Any person supplied by the Board with water through a meter shall, on finding that meter is damaged or not registering, immediately give notice of the fact to the local Water Supply Office.

47. No person knowing that a meter is damaged or does not register properly shall draw water through such meter from a service pipe which is supplied with water by the Board.

48. In every case in which the supply of water shall have been cut off by reason of non-payment of rates or other charges, or by reason of a defective service, or by request of the occupier or owner, or when, in the opinion of the Board or local officer, necessary to prevent waste of water, or for other reason, a fee of five shillings shall be charged for re-connection, and shall be payable by the owner or occupier for the time being on demand. The service shall not be restored until such fee shall have been paid.

49. No person to whom water is supplied by the Board shall, without written permission, sell or supply water to any person who may not reside on the premises of which he is the occupier.

50. The occupier of any premises to which the water has been laid on, or in the event of there being no occupier, the owner shall cause proper means to be taken by locks or otherwise, subject to the approval of the local officer, to prevent the use of water from the main by persons not connected with the premises supplied.

51. The owner or occupier of any allotment of land within the Water Area who shall erect or make, or cause to be erected or made, any building or addition to an existing building on such land shall, within one calendar month thereafter, give notice in writing thereof to the Board.

52. Officers or workmen employed by the Board shall not solicit or receive from the public any fee, gratuity, or reward.

53. No person shall use or distribute water on gardens or premises generally from a tap, piping or hose without the medium of a sprinkler or hose attachment.

Division 5.—Penalties.

54. Any person contravening any of these By-laws, whether by act or omission, shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 1 of 1918.

Between United Metropolitan Timberyards, Sawmills, and Woodworkers' Employees' Union of Workers, Applicant; and E. B. Banfield; M. Cass; and Proprietors of Fremantle Box Factory, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

AWARD.

1. *Scope of Award.*—This award shall apply only to employers and workers engaged in the Boxmaking industry.

2. *Definitions.*—An *adult worker* means and includes a worker who is over the age of twenty-one years, or a worker who has had over five years' experience in the industry.

A *junior worker* means a worker who is over the age of fourteen and under the age of twenty-one years and who has not had more than five years' experience in the industry.

Casual hand means a worker employed for less than one week continuously.

3. *Wages.*—All wages shall be paid weekly. The minimum rate of wages payable to the several classes of workers paid by time and covered by this award shall be as follows:—

No junior worker shall be employed as sawyer or tailer-out on the breaking-down or planking-out benches.

No junior worker with less than one year's experience in the industry shall be employed tailing out.

No junior worker who is under the age of seventeen years and who has had less than two years' experience in the industry shall be employed as a sawyer, or on the buzzer or thickneser.

The number of junior workers employed by any employer shall not exceed one for each fully paid worker employed by him. Provided that any employer who himself works as a journeyman shall be reckoned as a fully paid worker.

For the purpose of determining from time to time whether a junior worker may be taken on or continued in employment the following provision shall have effect: The calendar year shall be divided into quarters and the first days of January, April, July, and October shall be the quarter days. The average number of fully paid workers employed by an employer on all working days of the six months immediately preceding any quarter day shall, for the purposes of this subclause, be taken as and be deemed to be the number of fully paid workers employed on such quarter day, and the number of junior workers who may be taken on or continued in employment by an employer at any time shall be based upon the number of fully paid workers so deemed to be employed by such employer on the then last preceding quarter day. Fully paid workers shall mean time workers who are receiving not less than the minimum wage, and pieceworkers who are earning for a full day's work not less than the minimum wage for the class of work which they are doing.

4. *Hours.*—The ordinary week's work shall consist of forty-eight hours, which shall be so arranged as to permit of work ceasing at noon on Saturday.

5. *Casual Hands.*—A casual hand shall be paid at least one shilling per day in excess of the minimum rate fixed for his class of work.

6. *Overtime.*—Time worked beyond the usual hours shall be paid at the rate of time and a-quarter for the first two hours and time and a-half thereafter. Each day shall stand by itself.

7. *Holidays.*—Double rates shall be paid for work performed on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours' Day, and Christmas Day, and time and a-half for work performed on Anniversary Day, Easter Saturday, King's Birthday, and Boxing Day.

8. *Under-rate Workers.*—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wages as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed.

The secretary of the union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

9. *Piecework*.—(a) In the case of piecework the rates paid shall be such as to enable the average adult worker to earn not less than the minimum wage fixed for a time worker working at similar work under like conditions.

(b) The employer shall supply to each worker employed on piecework before the work is put in hand a docket containing the particulars of and rate to be paid for such work.

(c) All piecework shall be done at the employer's factory and shall be limited to the hours during which time workers are working in the factory.

10. *Record Book*.—Each employer shall keep a record of the time worked by and the wages paid to each worker, including overtime. Such record shall be available at least once per week, during working hours, to the secretary or other person appointed by the union.

11. *Area*.—This award shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of fourteen miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

12. *Term*.—This award shall continue in force for a period of three years from its date. Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 19 of 1917.

Between the Coastal Master Butchers' Industrial Union of Employers, Applicant; and W.A. Amalgamated Butchers' Union of Workers, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

AWARD.

1. *Definitions*:

"Slaughterman" means a worker who kills and dresses large and small stock for local consumption.

"Tallowman" means a worker who attends to the digester, boiler, desiccator, or other means adopted to render fat.

"Scalder" means a worker who scalds or dresses pigs, calves' feet, tripe, cow-heels, trotters, and heads.

"Beef lump" means a worker who is engaged to lump beef at the slaughter yards, but who may also be required to do other work.

2. *Hours*.—The ordinary week's work shall be:—

For Slaughterman and Slaughterman's Labourer.—Forty-four hours, viz., eight and a-half hours per day on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday, and ten hours on Thursday.

The ordinary starting time shall be eight o'clock a.m., and one hour shall be allowed for dinner, but the employer may fix any other time not later than 10 a.m., as the starting time upon any day or days between the first day of November and the thirty-first day of March. Provided that in each such case he shall notify the yard foreman thereof on the preceding day, and, provided also that in no case shall the finishing time be later than 7 p.m., and if the prescribed hours of work in any day are thereby curtailed the required tally for that day shall be proportionately reduced.

For Tallowmen and Scalders.—Forty-four hours, viz., eight hours per day on five week-days and four hours on Saturday. The starting time, not being later than 9 a.m., shall be fixed by the employer. One hour shall be allowed for dinner.

For Beef Lumpers.—Forty-four hours, viz., eight and a-half hours per day on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday, and ten hours on Thursday. The starting time shall be fixed by the employer. One hour shall be allowed for dinner.

For General Labourers.—Forty-four or forty-five hours, at the employer's option, spread over the week as follows, viz., eight hours per day on five week-days and four hours on Saturday, or nine hours per day on each week-day exclusive of Saturday. The starting time not being later than 9 a.m., shall be fixed by the employer. One hour shall be allowed for dinner.

3. *Wages*.—The minimum rate of wages to be paid to the various classes of workers other than duly registered apprentices and probationers shall be as follows:—

4. *Tally*.—For the purpose of estimating the work required to be done by slaughtermen, the following tally scale is supplied, viz.:—

Bullocks: Two slaughtermen and one labourer—twenty in eight and a-half hours;

Clipped Sheep or Lambs: One slaughterman—sixty in eight and a-half hours; Woolly Sheep or Backsetted Lambs: One slaughterman—forty-six in eight and a-half hours;

Pigs (100lbs. or under): One slaughterman—three per hour, the employer to supply assistance in lifting the pigs;

Jew Cattle: To count two for one;

Rams and Ram-stags: To count two for one.

All sheep penned for slaughter after the thirty-first of May, except those which have been shorn after the thirtieth of November next preceding, shall be deemed "woolly" sheep.

In calculating the required tally for a period of more or less than eight and a-half hours, any fraction of over one-half shall be counted as one, and any other fraction shall not be counted at all.

5. *Variation in Tally.*—Slaughtermen who by reason of the employer not providing the necessary stock fail to kill the full day's tally shall, nevertheless, be paid the full day's wage.

All sheep killed in excess of the day's tally shall be paid for at the rate of sixpence each, to be divided equally amongst the slaughtermen by whom the extra sheep are killed.

All bullocks killed in excess of the day's tally shall be paid for at the rate of three shillings each, to be divided amongst all workers employed in the killing of such extra bullocks in proportion to their ordinary wage.

6. *Crippled Stock.*—All stock required to be killed as part of the ordinary day's tally shall be delivered to the slaughtermen in the pens. Crippled stock required to be killed elsewhere, outside the ordinary day's work, shall be paid for at the rate of two for one.

7. *Compulsory Killing on Saturday.*—Slaughtermen employed on cattle ordered to be killed by the Inspector on Saturday shall be paid for a full day's work at casual rates, irrespective of the number killed.

8. *Casual Hands.*—Casual hands employed for more than three days in any week shall be paid at ordinary rates, but not less than one full week's wage.

9. *Slaughtermen doing other work.*—Slaughtermen shall not be required to lump beef, or clean up, or wash down. Provided that each employer shall be entitled to employ one man at slaughterman's wages to kill half-a-day's tally and do other work for the rest of the day.

10. *Overtime.*—Workers, other than those working on tally, who are called upon to work in excess of the hours specified shall be paid for such extra work at the rate of time and a-half.

11. *Holidays.*—Workers shall be entitled to the following days as paid holidays, on which days no work shall be done, viz., Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Royal Show Day, Eight Hours' Day, and Picnic Day.

12. *Time-Book.*—Each worker shall keep or cause to be kept a time-book containing a record of the names of all employees, the class of work performed, the wages paid to each worker, and the number of hours worked by each worker. Such time-book shall be kept at the slaughterhouse and shall be open for the inspection of the secretary of the workers' union on any day during working hours.

13. *Apprentices.*—Apprentices may be taken to the Slaughtering trade in the proportion of one apprentice to every four slaughtermen, or where less than four slaughtermen are employed, one apprentice to every two slaughtermen.

The term of apprenticeship shall be five years, with a probationary period of six months.

The wages of apprentices shall be as follows:—

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

AWARD.

1. *Hours and Overtime.*—(a) Forty-eight hours shall constitute the ordinary week's work.

(b) Time worked beyond the usual hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half. Each day shall stand by itself with a minimum of one shilling for each day upon which overtime is worked. In addition, one shilling tea money shall be paid on each day upon which overtime is worked beyond 6.30 p.m.

(c) Wages shall be paid weekly on any day except Saturday.

2. *Distribution of Work.*—As between workers doing the same class of work there shall be a fair distribution of work between the workers for the time being employed in any workshop.

3. *Outdoor Work.*—The occupier of every factory shall in addition to the particulars required to be kept by Section 38 of the Factories Act, 1907, keep a record of the price paid for all work given out to be done by a worker elsewhere than in the factory. Such record shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of the union during working hours.

4. The minimum rate of wages payable to the several classes of workers (other than junior workers and duly registered apprentices and probationers) paid by time and covered by this award shall be as follows:—

5. *Piecework.*—(a) In the case of piecework the rates paid shall be such as to enable the average adult worker to earn not less than the minimum wage fixed for a time worker working at similar work under like conditions.

(b) The employer shall supply to each worker employed on piecework before the work is put in hand a docket containing the particulars of and rate to be paid for such work.

(c) In cases where an employer requires from a time worker a minimum quantity of work in return for a specified rate of pay the following conditions shall be observed:—

1. The employer shall supply the worker with a docket showing the quantity of work required and the rate at which such work is calculated; or
2. The like particulars shall be posted in a conspicuous place in the factory.
3. The rate shall be not less than the recognised piecework rate for similar work; or
4. If there be no recognised piecework rate the rate for the required output shall be such as would enable the average adult worker to earn not less than the minimum wage fixed for a time worker working at similar work under like conditions.

6. *Apprentices.*—(a) An apprentice means a worker registered as an apprentice in manner hereinafter provided.

(b) Apprentices may be employed in any of the following branches of the trades covered by this award, viz., (1) Cutter, (2) Presser, (3) Coat and Vest hand, and (4) Coat Machinist, in the trade of Men's and Boy's ready-made clothing (outer garments); (5) coat, bodice, blouse, and mantle hand; and (6) skirt hand, in the order dressmaking trade, and Stock Cutter in the ready-made dressmaking trade.

(c) The term of apprenticeship shall be five years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful, such probationary period to be counted as portion of the term in the event of the probationer becoming bound.

(d) Any employer hereafter taking an apprentice or probationer shall within fourteen days thereafter register such apprentice or probationer by giving notice thereof to the clerk of the Court in the prescribed form: Provided that an apprentice or probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the said period of fourteen days.

(e) The proportion of apprentices in the various branches of the trade to fully paid workers employed in such branches, respectively, allowed to be taken by an employer shall be as follows:—

Stock Cutter (clothing or dressmaking) and presser, one apprentice to every two or fraction of two (not being less than one) fully paid workers. Coat and vest hand and coat machinist, one apprentice to each fully paid worker. Coat, bodice, blouse, and mantle hand, and skirt hand, two apprentices to each fully paid worker. Provided that any junior workers employed in any of the above-mentioned branches by virtue of Clause 8 of this award shall for the purpose of applying this subclause be deemed to be apprentices.

(f) For the purpose of determining from time to time whether an apprentice proposed to be taken by an employer is within the number of apprentices allowed to such employer the following provisions shall have effect:—

The calendar year shall be divided into quarters and the first days of January, April, July, and October shall be the quarter days. The average number of fully paid workers employed by an employer on all working days of the six months immediately preceding any quarter day shall, for the purpose of this subclause, be taken as and be deemed to be the number of fully paid workers who are employed on such quarter day, and the number of apprentices who may be taken on by an employer at any time shall be based upon the number of fully paid workers so deemed to be employed by such employer on the then last preceding quarter day. Fully paid workers shall mean time workers who are receiving not less than the minimum wage and pieceworkers who are earning for a full day's work not less than the minimum wage for the class of work for which they are doing.

(g) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his or her term with another employer, but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the clerk of the Court of Arbitration of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced.

(h) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprentices:—

(1) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform, viz., teaching the apprentice the trade, as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of Subclause (10), pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.

(2) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate to show that he or she has served his or her apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him or her to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this award, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the clerk of the Court of Arbitration of such transfer in the form provided. It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he or she shall so misconduct himself or herself as to entitle the employer to discharge him or her, but he shall nevertheless give him or her a certificate for the time actually served.

(3) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he wilfully neglects to keep him or her constantly at work; but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him or her to an employer willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him or her.

(4) When an apprentice is discharged for cause, the employer shall send notice, in writing, of the discharge, and the cause thereof, to the said clerk of the court.

(5) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be as follows:—

(6) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit him or herself to examination by a Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted once in each six months of his or her service when called upon by the clerk of the Court so to do.

(7) The clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, or such other place as the Court may decide, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required and in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

- (8) The examination will be held in the months of April and October in each year. The Board of Examiners will consist of persons skilled in the particular class of the trade to which the candidate is apprenticed, to be nominated by the union and by the employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies; or, failing such nomination, or nominations, such person, or persons, as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them, or nominated by the Court, or the President, at the request of either member, and the decision of such third person shall be final and conclusive. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.
- (9) The examiners shall report to the Court, in writing, as to the result of the examination.
- (10) The clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of the examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing, in accordance with the scale set forth in Subclause (5) hereof, from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.
- (11) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this award under Section 90 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.
- (12) Such fees shall be paid by the clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.
7. *Junior Workers*.—(a) "Junior worker" means a worker over the age of four years and under the age of twenty-one years.
- (b) Junior workers may be employed in those branches of the trades covered by this award in which no provision is made for apprentices, but (except as provided by Clause 8) not otherwise.
- (c) Junior workers may not be employed by any employer in excess of one junior worker for every fully paid worker employed by such employer in those branches of the trade in which junior workers are allowed. For the purpose of this subclause the number of fully paid workers employed by an employer shall be ascertained as provided in Clause 6 (f) of this award.
- (d) The minimum rate of wages payable to a junior worker shall be as follows:—

8. The provisions of this award limiting the number of junior workers who may be employed, or the branches of the trade in which they may be employed, shall not operate or be so construed as to require the discharge of any person employed in the trade at the date of this award, or to prevent the employment or engagement as a junior worker of any person who at the date hereof or at any time within three months prior thereto was employed in the trade.

If by virtue of this provision any junior workers continue to be employed in any of those branches of the trade in which provision is made for apprentices, they shall be paid not less than the rates of pay fixed for apprentices.

9. *Under-rate Workers*.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his or her desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wages as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him or her to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

10. *Record Book*.—A time and wage book shall be kept by each employer, in which book shall be entered the name of each worker paid by time, the nature of the work he or she is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wage received by him or her each week. The employer shall be responsible for the proper posting of the book each week. The said book shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of the union during working hours.

11. Nothing in this award shall in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker below the rate actually received by him at the date hereof.

12. *Area*.—This award shall apply over the area comprised within a radius of 25 miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

13. *Term*.—This award shall be binding upon the above-named applicant and respondents, and shall continue in force for a period of three years from its date: Provided that, at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.
