The Early Closing Act, 1902.

M.P.H. 2338/18.

The Game Act, 1912-13.

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Game Act, 1912-13," that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof: Now therefore I, the said Governor with the advice and general of the Proceedings. BY-LAWS OF THE WICKEPIN ROAD BOARD. WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1911," the Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purpose in the said Act mentioned: it is hereby resolved by the Board of the Wickepin District that the following By-laws should, by and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, be in force within the said District from the date of the publication thereof in the Government Gazette:-

#### Interpretation.

In these By-laws the following shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—
''The Act,'' "The Roads Act, 1911,'' and its

amendments.

amendments.

"District," the Wickepin Road Board District.

"Board," the Wickepin Road Board.

"Secretary," the Secretary of the Board.

"Road or Reserve," a public road or reserve as the case may be under the control of the Board.

"Footpath or Footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of foot passengers and whether the same be made or passengers and whether the same be made or kerbed or otherwise.

"Cycle," a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede. "Cyclist," a person riding, impelling, or otherwise using or having the management or control of any cycle.
"Person" shall include the plural and also the body

corporate.

"Permission of the Board," the consent of the Board given in writing. "Vehicle," any cart, dray.

any cart, dray, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, or other conveyance (not being a hand cart), with or without springs.

Other interpretations are as defined in Interpreta-tion Clause 5 of "The Roads Act, 1911."

#### BY-LAW No. 1,

#### Appointments.

No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until seven clear days' notice has been given by an advertisement published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment.

All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

## BY-LAW No. 2.

## Duties of Secretary.

(a) To attend all Board meetings.

(b) To attend Committees when considered neces-

(c) To take notes of all minutes and prepare reports for Committees.

(d) To conduct all correspondence and to give other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.

(e) To answer all questions on the Board's business.(f) To supervise the preparation of the rate books and Board's electoral lists, examine proofs of latter, and arrange for the distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all Courts of Revision or Appeal, making the necessary arrangements for the elections, and preparing papers, etc., for the clerks.

(g) To summon the members to Board and Committee meetings, other than the regular meetings.

(h) The Secretary shall keep the cash book, as well as any and all other books issued by the Minister for Works in accordance with instructions inserted therein and those required to show receipts and expenditure made by the Board. The said books shall be kept written up every fortnight ready for the inspection

of the Board or any member of the Board who may at any time during office hours desire to see them.

(i) He shall check all accounts sent in to the Board, and see that all accounts for work (exceeding £5 in amount) have stated on them the authority under which such works have been done, and shall check all returns made by the Collectors or other of the Board's officers, and see that, with all returns made, the heels of the receipt books accompany the returns; he shall supervise and attend to the due payment of all money coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board; he shall report to the Board at their next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with necessary vouchers attached

(j) He shall pay into the Bank, as soon as possible after the receipt, to the credit of the Board, any sum or sums of money which may be received by him on behalf of the Board.

(k) He may have the cash book and bank pass-book made up in readiness for the meetings of the Board, and shall produce them at each meeting thereof. Should any member of the Board desire to see them at any time during office hours, the Secretary should produce them for his inspection. No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board, except by or through the Secretary. The Secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms. The Secretary shall readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and shall attend to all other matters affecting the finances of the Board and not herein speci-

#### BY-LAW No. 3.

Duties of Collector.

(a) To send out all rate notices.

(b) To collect all moneys due to the Board for rates and licenses.

(c) To report to the Board at every meeting the business he has transacted for the Board, the amount of money he has collected and paid over to the Secretary.

#### BY-LAW No. 4.

Meetings and Proceedings.

(a) Notice shall be given by the Chairman or the Secretary of ordinary or special meetings at least three days before such meeting and "Notice in writing" of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding two

(b) The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or if, after being present, he shall retire, one of the members of the Board or ratepayer chosen by the ratepayers or members present (as the case may be) shall preside for the remainder of the meeting.

(c) Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds, "Ordinary" and "Special." A quorum shall be any

three members.

(d) It shall rest with any three members of the Board to exclude the public when, in their opinion, it

is expedient so to do.

(e) A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time and in the manner prescribed by Section 123 of the Act, but the Chairman may call a meeting of the Board as soon as he may think proper.

(f) No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was

called.

(g) At all meetings of the Board, when there is no quorum present, or when the Board is counted out, which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present, such circumstances, to-gether with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

## BY-LAW No. 5.

Order of Business.

The ordinary business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say:

(a) Reading and confirming of minutes of last

ordinary and of special meetings, if any.
(b) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.

(e) Reading of correspondence (received and despatched), and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard there(d) Presentation of petitions and/or memorials

and/or reports, and consideration thereof.

(e) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts,

Passing of accounts for payment.

(g) Ordinary business of the Board.
(h) No discussion shall take place upon the minutes except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of any clerical error.

(i) Immediately after the confirmation of the minutes, the Chairman may make any communication to the Board which he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary; and it shall be competent for any member of the Board to ask any question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at the time.

#### BY-LAW No. 6. Petitions.

Every petition or memorial must be couched in respectful and temperate language and shall be presented by a member only; such member shall affix his signature thereon.

#### BY-LAW No. 7. Tenders.

Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matters of the tenders come on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a Committee appointed for the purpose. Deposit up to £5, nil; over £5, 5 per cent.

## BY-LAW No. 8. Order of Debate.

Every member addressing the Chairman must stand on his feet.

- (a) A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate, and speak for not more than ten minutes, unless by permission of the Board.
- (b) A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn unless by consent of the Board.

(c) One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board.

(d) When more than one amendment is moved the question shall first be put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they are moved.

(e) A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

(f) In submitting a motion or amendment, the Chairman must put the question, first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

(g) When an amendment is carried the motion as amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendment may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

(h) All notices of motions shall be in writing, and shall be lodged with the Secretary seven clear days before the regular meeting of Board.

(i) Notices of expenditure must be given one month previous, with the power of the Chairman to accept same, with the consent of the Board,

without notice, in case of urgent matter.
(j) No motions shall be brought forward for discussion except given notice of or permission being granted by members and Chairman of the Board present.

(k) In case of an equality of votes the Chairman or

other presiding Chairman shall give a casting vote, and any reasons stated by him shall

be entered in the minutes and proceedings.
(1) No By-law shall be finally passed or rescinded at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next or some subsequent meeting of the Board duly convened.

Members to apologise for Disorderly, etc.

(m) Whenever any member shall make use of an expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the Board.

Members called to order to sit down.

(n) A member called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

Member twice offending guilty of an offence.

(o) Any member using offensive or disorderly lan-guage or having been twice called to order or to withdraw or apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

#### Voting.

- (p) The Board shall vote by show of hands, and any member present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.
- (q) If any person shall be guilty of an offence or negligent act or omission contrary to any provision in the foregoing By-laws he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £5.

#### BY-LAW No. 9. Committee.

No Chairman shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without the express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or by a resolution of the Board.

## BY-LAW No. 10.

Finance Accounts.

All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the Chairman at the ordinary meetings, and after being certified correct shall be so initialed by him and paid by cheque.

#### BY-LAW No. 11. Unauthorised Expenditure.

Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any Committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure.

#### BY-LAW No. 11A.

Custody of Records, Journals, etc.

The custody of records, books, and all documents what-soever laid before or the property of the Board shall be kept in the charge of the Secretary, who shall neither take nor permit to be taken any such records, journals, or documents from the Board's office without the express leave or order of the Board.

#### BY-LAW No. 12.

## Rates.

All rates shall be payable yearly, and the Collector for the time being duly appointed by the Board shall, within sixty days after the making up of the rate book, leave with the person liable to pay the same at his residence, or post to his last known address, or fix upon the property rated, a notice of the amount due by such person, and requiring payment within thirty days, or at such other times, and by such instalments as the Board may by resolution appoint; and if the amount be not paid at the expiration of thirty days after such application, or at the times and in the manner directed by the Board in any resolution as aforesaid, the Collector shall take proceedings for its recovery.

#### BY-LAW No. 13,

Offences, Omissions, or Neglect.

Any person guilty of the following offences, omissions, or neglects shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10):-

(a) Riding or driving a horse, cattle, or other animals, or wheeling any barrow or driving

any carriage upon or along any footpath.

(b) Placing any timber, bricks, or other building material upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or carriage road without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.

(c) Placing any advertisement board or placard on property under the control of the Board, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.

(d) Opening any drain or sewer or removing any surface of any road or carriage road without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.

(e) Rolling any cask, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, football, catapult, airgun, or firearm, or playing any game to the annoyance or damage of any person, or obstructing any road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across such road or by placing any goods thereon or otherwise.

(f) Having any awning, verandah, or blind on any road not being of the full width of ten feet and eight feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning, verandah, or blind over the road, or erecting any sign-board, sign-awning, blind, overhanging lamp, or other thing over or near any road without first having obtained permission of the Board.

(g) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public road without permission of the Board, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such Board.

(h) Furiously or negligently riding or driving on any road.

(i) Making a cellar door or other opening from any road or footpath without the consent of the Board.

(j) Allowing the drippings of the eaves or gutters of any house or other building to fall upon any public footway.

(k) Neglecting to clean all private yards, stables, pigsties, urinals, ways, passages, or avenues by which neglect a nuisance or an offensive smell is caused.

(1) Beating any carpet or playing any game to the annoyance of any person upon any footway, carriage road, or public place.

(m) Throwing or discharging any stone or missile to the damage or danger of any person or property of the Board.

#### BY-LAW No. 14.

Throwing Dangerous Substances on Footpaths.

1. No person shall throw any orange peel, banana skin or other vegetable substances, or any dangerous, offensive, or noxious substance, vegetable or otherwise,

or throw any lighted match on any footpath.

2. No person shall sweep, throw, or place any rubbish, garbage, sweepings, litter, or refuse of any description on any footpath or street of a town, or into the gutter or channel thereof, or cause or permit the same to remain therein.

3. No person shall empty, throw, or discharge, or permit to be thrown, emptied, or discharged, any fonl or offensive water or other liquid, into or upon any

street of a town, or into any gutter or channel thereof.

4. Every person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

## BY-LAW No. 15.

For the preservation of Trees within the Townsites and Roads.

Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree, shrub, or plant, planted in any of the streets, roads, enclosures, or public places of, belonging to, or under the care or superintendence of the Board, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any tree guard, fences, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants as aforesaid, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

## BY-LAW No. 16.

General Regulation of Traffic.

Every person having the care or conduct of any vehicle shall keep the same on the left or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or vehicle passing or attempting to pass his vehicle.

2. No person between sunset and the following sunrise, shall in, upon, or along any of the public roads within the district drive any vehicle without having a lamp securely fixed on the right side of such vehicle at least one foot higher than the hub of the front wheel, which lamp shall exhibit a white light to its front and a red light to its rear. The lamp shall be so fixed as to

give an unobstructed view of the light of other users of the road in the respective directions before indicated, and the light shall be at all times, whether the vehicle

is moving or stationary, kept burning brightly.

No person shall ride or drive any horse or other animal along any road at a speed exceeding eight miles

per hour.

The driver of every vehicle or the rider of any horse of proceeding or other animal turning for the purpose of proceeding in an opposite direction, or turning a corner of any road in the district, shall bring the horse or other ani-

mal to a walking pace before commencing to turn.

Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act or thing contrary to any of these By-laws shall, upon conviction, for every offence, breach, or negelct, be liable to a penalty not exceeding (except when otherwise provided) the sum of £10.

#### BY-LAW No. 17.

 $Obstruction \ of \ Roads.$ 

Nothing of any kind whatever may be allowed to remain on any part of any road or path within the district after sunset, nor in any case longer than is absolutely necessary, without the permission of the Board, nor shall any person permit a cart, wagon, motor car, or other vehicle to obstruct the footpath, under a penalty, upon the conviction of the offender, not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

#### BY-LAW No. 18.

Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, except-

- ing as otherwise provided for in this By-law.

  2. The Board shall have the power to grant the exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds or reserves within the district, under the control of the Board, for holding sports or amusements, to any responsible person or persons for any time not exceeding three consecutive days, subject to such conditions as may be decided upon by the Board, and any person or persons obtaining such rights shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, erections, and trees upon or enclosing such park lands are receptable for the proper same shall never the Board and or recreation grounds, and shall pay to the Board a fee The public shall have the right to enter into such park lands on payment to the persons so using and occupying as aforesaid a sum not more than 1s. per head per day, and subject to the rules and regulations made by the person or persons so using or occupying; provided that an extra charge of not more than 2s. per head may be made to any part of the grounds set apart as a special reserve or stand, and all vehicles and horses at 6d. each.
- 3. No cattle, pigs, goats, or loose horses shall be allowed upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves or, whether in harness or in saddle, shall be allowed therein without the previous consent in writing of the Board.
- 4. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming and orderly manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public, or playing an unlawful game, or any game which in the opinion of the Board is dangerous, shall be liable to be expelled therefrom by any police con-stable or any officer of the Board, or person or persons using or occupying as referred to in this By-law, or their assistants.

5. The Board may in its discretion prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or being carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, re-creation grounds or reserves, without having first ob-tained the written consent of the Board, on any Sunday,

tained the written consent of the Board, on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

6. No game of chance shall be allowed on any park lands, reserves, and recreation grounds under the Board's jurisdiction. Any person offending against this By-law shall, for every offence, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

#### BY-LAW No. 19.

Quarries and Timber.

1. Any person who shall quarry or remove stone or any other material on the lands belonging to, or in charge of or under the possession, control, or power of the Board, without a written license therefor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2. Any person who shall cut or remove any timber or bush on the lands belonging to or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Board without a license shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

#### BY-LAW No. 20.

#### Processions.

1. No procession other than a funeral procession shall pass through any street of a town without having first obtained the written permission of the Board.

2. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

#### BY-LAW No. 21.

Regulating Street Traffic on Special Occasions. The Board may, at its discretion, regulate or pro-hibit the traffic in or along all or any of the foot and carriage ways or any street during times of public interest, amusement, or excitement, or during repairs to any street.

#### BY-LAW No. 22.

#### Damaging Property, etc., of the Board.

Any person who shall, without having first obtained Any person who shan, without having first obtained the sanction in writing of the Board, break up, or cut down, damage, destroy, or injure, or remove, or earry away any footpath, tree, plant, building, sand, or other property belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control or power of the Board shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for each such offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 23.

To prevent Danger from Inflammable Materials within the Boundaries of any Town.

Any person who shall stack any hay, straw, or other inflammable material within 75 feet of any house or other building, and shall not remove the same within two hours after due notice from the Secretary, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each such offence.

## BY-LAW No. 24.

To prevent the accumulation of Inflammable Material. No person shall permit in any yard, way, or other premises owned or occupied by him within any town, any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, empty cases, crates packed with straw, or other inflammable material whatever; and any person who, after two hours' notice from the Secretary for the time being and on that behalf, shall neglect or refuse to remove such inflam-mable material shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and, upon conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

## BY-LAW No. 25. Walls and Fences.

1. Every fence or wall to be erected which abuts on any public street within a town, to wit on a street or footpath, shall be made substantial. Fences not less than five wires, posts, toprails, and wire, and shall be of a height of not less than five feet, or shall be of wooden pickets not less than four feet, and every fence to be erected which abuts on any lane, court, or alley must be a fence within the meaning of the Fencing Act, and any wall to be erected within a town shall not be less than 12in. stone or 9in. brick, and 2ft. 6in. in height; that no person shall erect a fence abutting on any public place within a town.

2. Every person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

## BY-LAW No. 26.

#### · Lamp Posts, etc.

1. Any lamp post, bridle post, telegraph, telephone, or electric lighting pole shall be painted once at least in every three years, as may be directed by the Board, and the Board may order the removal by the owners of

all bent, dangerous, or unsightly poles.

2. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) for every such offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 27.

Prescribing the Removal of Verandahs, Balconies, etc., at expense of Owner or Occupier.

Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway or is dangerous, and all other obstructions to the footway and roadway, or overhanging same, shall be removed when ordered, within such time as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah, balcony, or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law, on conviction, shall pay a sum not less than Ten pounds (£10).

## BY-LAW No. 28.

Encroachments or Obstructions to be removed.

1. On the order of the Board the Secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal within fourteen days of any building, fence, or other obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under the control of the Board.

2. In cases where, after services of notices for such removal, any such encroachment or obstruction has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove same at the cost and charges of the person so offending, and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law; the penalty shall not be more than Twenty pounds (£20).

#### BY-LAW No. 29.

#### Verandah Height and Width Measurement.

That any verandah erected shall extend from the building line of the street to the outer edge of the footpath or as otherwise permitted by the Board, and such verandah shall not be less in height than eight feet clear above the street level, and verandah not less than eleven feet from building.

#### BY-LAW No. 30.

Regulating Sign Boards.

1. No person shall place or suspend in any street or lane within a town any sign-board or other sign, show bill, or show board which shall project more than three feet from the building line, or be at a lesser height than

eight feet clear above the street level, except by the permission of the Board.

2. Every person offending against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

## BY-LAW No. 31.

Construction of Crossing Places over Footpaths.

- 1. It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting any street or public place requiring access thereto with horses and vehicles from such street to such thereto with horses and vehicles from such street to such land across any such existing made footpath, channel, or gutter, having first had and obtained the consent of the Board to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such form and manner as the Regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Board's Secretary, and shall thereafter keep and maintain in safe repair. Any person not complying with the provision of this by-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
- 2. Every person who shall wilfully and without lawful excuse ride or drive or wheel any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, or who shall ride any bicycle, velocipede, or tricycle along or across any footpath or water channel or gutter by the side of any street, road, or public way, save in each such case upon and by at some properly constructed crossing shall forfeit and pay upon conviction, a sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

## BY-LAW No. 32,

To restrict the breaking-in of Horses and other Animals in the Streets of a Town.

No person shall break in any horse, mare, gelding, pony, mule, ass, or camel, nor shall drive any bullocks or camels, either by leading, riding, or driving the same, between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 11 p.m., in any street or thoroughfare in a town. Any person not complying with the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

#### BY-LAW No. 33.

For preventing Animals or Vehicles being left in the Streets or Roads, or obstructing any part of the Streets or Roads.

No person shall leave any horse, ass, mule, camel, ox, cow, goat, or any vehicle to which they may be attached and harnessed or any animal unattached in any street or road, or at any place of public resort or entertainment, without the wheel being chained, nor shall any person depasture or allow to roam any goat or other animal in any portion of a street or road, and any Board's officer or police constable may seize and remove any such vehicle or animal to the nearest pound, and the person so leaving such animal shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2) in addition to any pound fees which may have become due and payable by reason of such impounding.

#### BY-LAW No. 34.

#### Carriers and Vendors of Water.

1. The Board shall have at all times the power to make regulations for the removal of water from the public wells, and other water generally for their use and management, as occasion shall require, and shall, from time to time, decide and declare what wells and other water under their control shall be used for the purpose of human consumption, and no person shall take water from public wells or places not so declared for the purpose of selling the same to be used for human consumption within a town.

- 2. Any person desirous of taking water for the purpose of selling the same for human consumption shall obtain a license from the Board (such license to contain the conditions under which the same is granted) and shall pay a fee of 10s. per annum, and shall so provide himself with a suitable marked tank or other receptacle for the carriage of water, to be approved by the Board, and used exclusively for the carriage of such water; and no tank or other receptacle not sufficiently marked shall be used for carrying water from such wells or places for the purpose of being sold; but the Board shall have the power to refuse to grant a license to any person or at any time to revoke any license at their discretion, without being called upon to give any reason for such refusal or revocation.
- 3. Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for each offence.

## BY-LAW No. 35.

To regulate the Copulation of Stock in any Town.

No person or persons, either as owners or otherwise, in charge of an entire horse, bull, or ass shall cause, allow, permit, or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to cover any mare or cow within a town, or to cause or permit, or allow or suffer, any such entire horse, bull, or ass to be turned loose in any yard or public place with any mare or cow for the purpose of allowing such mare or cow to be covered except in some yard, building, or other premises as shall be entirely or sufficiently screened from public view; and any person offending against part of this By-law shall forfeit and pay for every such offence, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Ten pounds £10).

## BY-LAW No. 36.

#### No Glass, etc., to be affixed to Walls.

No person shall affix any broken glass, glass bottles, iron spikes or barbed wire to any wall, fence, or building abutting on any street or roadway within any town, unless at a height of five feet above such street or roadway, and the owner of any spikes placed in any fence, wall, or building at a lower height shall protect the same as to prevent danger to the public; all barbed wire must be placed on the inner side of the posts. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every such offence.

## BY-LAW No. 37.

## Pigs.

No person shall keep any kind of living swine within a town without the permission of the Board. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) for every such offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 38.

To prevent any Trees falling across any Road, and Prevention of Fire.

1. No person shall set fire to any standing tree upon or near to any road or track except by permission of the Board, and any such offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

2. No person shall make or leave a fire near any

2. No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or track under the jurisdiction of the Board, between the first day of November and the sixteenth day in February next following. Any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

#### BY-LAW No. 39.

#### Damaging Road.

- 1. No person shall damage or destroy by means of a horse, team, wagon, dray, or any other means, any road or portion of a road under construction or repair. Any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).
  - 2. Any person who—
    - (a) Cuts or removes, without consent in writing of the Board, timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road; or
    - (b) Erects any heap thereof, without the consent aforesaid, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
    - (c) Draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the water side of a road, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
    - (d) Draws upon a road, timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle or suffers such material, when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle, to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which, or any portion of chains attaching thereto, or any portion of any other attachment, trails or drags upon a road; or

(e) Draws upon any road or street any plough or other implement used in cultivating the land, without having it raised and set in such a way as not to damage the road or street,

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every such offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 40.

#### Heavy Traffic.

The owner of every vehicle or engine which together with its load shall weigh more than four tons, shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at its own risk, and shall be liable to pay for any damage done.

#### BY-LAW No. 41.

## Pounds.

- 1. Any person who shall break, damage, or destroy any pound fence, gates, lock, shed, trough, or premises shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5). Any person who shall obliterate, deface, or damage any table of fees, placard, or other notice required by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
- 2. Any person who shall release, or attempt to release any cattle which shall be lawfully seized for the purpose of being impounded, whether such cattle shall be in the pound or on the way to or from any such pound, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

#### BY-LAW No. 42.

#### Infected Stock.

No animal shall be allowed to stray on any roads or places, and no animal suffering from an infectious or contagious disease shall be ridden or driven on any road. Any animal found so suffering may be slaughtered and destroyed at the owner's expense.

BY-LAW No. 43. Water Supply.

Any person who shall injure or damage any well, bore, pipe, tank, or place for storage of water under the control of the Board, or any machinery or appliances or property used in connection therewith, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and notwithstanding any civil remedy for damages so caused, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

#### BY-LAW No. 44.

Any person who shall waste, or allow water to escape, foul or pollute any water contained in any bore, pipe. tank, or place of storage shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, in addition to any other sum which he may be legally required to pay for damages.

#### BY-LAW No. 45.

1. No person shall pollute or cause to be polluted any watercourse, pool, well, tank, reservoir, catchment area, or other water within the district.

2. Any person so offending shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

## BY-LAW No. 46.

#### Licenses.

The several licenses authorised to be granted by the Board may be granted by the Board for such periods not exceeding twelve months, or for such purposes irrespective of any period of duration. And upon payment of such fees as shall be prescribed; and if any person holding such license shall make default in any of the conditions obtained in such license, the license shall thereupon become null and void, and the fee paid therefor shall be forfeited to the Board, and such person shall, in the event of any breach of the said license, be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

## BY-LAW No. 47.

The owner of every licensed vehicle plying for hire or engaged in heavy or medium traffic, and of every licensed bieycle or motor shall have their licensed number fixed on some conspicuous part of such vehicle, cycle or motor, and any person who shall refuse or neglect to have such number so affixed shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

## BY-LAW No. 48.

Obstructing Roads or Streets whilst Camping or Breakdown.

No person shall obstruct any of the roads or streets within the Board's jurisdiction by leaving vehicles or animals thereon whilst camping, by day or night, or in case of breakdown. Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

#### BY-LAW No. 49.

## Bells on Straying Stock.

1. No person shall place or cause to be placed any bell or other noisy mechanical device on any stock whatsoever allowed to stray or roam within the boundaries of the towns in this district.

2. Any person offending against this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a fine not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

#### BY-LAW No. 50.

Depositing Rubbish, etc., on Unoccupied Lands.

1. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited on any unoccupied lands within the boundaries of the town of Wickepin any sweepings, rubbish, manure, or waste material, otherwise than at the sanitary depôts provided at such town for such purpose.

2. Any person offending against this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a fine not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

BY-LAW No. 50A.

To provide for the Licensing of Hawkers trading within the District, and fixing the amount to be paid for their Licenses, for the Registration of the Names, and the Regulation of their Conduct.

- 1. It shall not be lawful for any person, without being licensed as herein provided, to hawk within the district, for the purpose of trading or carrying about for sale, any fresh fish, meat, fruit, or vegetables, on any beast of burden or in any cart, dray, wagon, truck, or any vehicle drawn by horses, oxen, or other animals, or drawn or pushed by hand, or in any pack or basket.
- 2. Licenses in the form of the Schedule may be issued by the Secretary to every person applying to be licensed to hawk or vend meat and other goods, except fruit and vegetables, for which latter the payment will be 2s. 6d. per month, on the payment for the same of a fee of 10s. per month, and the Secretary shall keep a register of the names of all licensed hawkers.
- 3. Every person licensed shall have exposed to public view, while hawking, on his licensed vehicle, truck, pack, or basket, his name and licensed number, and the words "Licensed Hawker" painted in legible and conspicuous letters, not less than one inch in length and of corresponding width.
- 4. Every unlicensed person who shall exhibit, for the purpose of hawking goods, any name on any vehicle or pack purporting to be the name of the licensed person, who shall omit to show to any inspector, or other officer of the Board, or police constable, on demand, his license for hawking, or shall neglect to have painted the same number and words aforesaid, or fail to keep them legible and conspicuous, and generally every person offending against any provision of this section, shall forfeit and pay for each offence, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for every such offence.

## BY-LAW No. 51.

#### Penalties.

1. Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform same and charge the cost and expenses against such persons, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

2. Any person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be deemed liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for every such offence.

3. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the district, except so much as may be payable to any informer.

## BY-LAW No. 52.

The Secretary of the Board shall be the Licensing Officer for the issuing of licenses and the collection of fees under "The Cart and Carriage Licensing Act, 1876," and "The Dog Act, 1903."

#### THE ROADS ACT, 1911.

Department of Works and Trading Concerns, Perth, 3rd October, 1918.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved, under the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," of the following amendment to the Uniform General By-laws for Motor Traffic and Uniform Lights to be carried by all Vehicles in all Road Districts.

Amendment of Uniform General By-laws for Regulating Motor Traffic and Standard Lights for all Vehicles, published in the Government Gazette of the 3rd day of January, 1913.

#### Registration of Cycles.

THE Uniform General By-laws for regulating Motor Traffic and Standard Lights for all vehicles, published in the Government Gazette of the 3rd day of January, 1913, are hereby amended by the repeal of the subclause to By-law No. 23, as published in the Government Gazette of the 2nd day of November, 1917, for numbering cycles and the insertion of the following subclauses in lieu thereof:—

- (f.) No person shall ride or impel any cycle upon any road, street, or public thoroughfare whatsoever until such cycle has been duly registered by the local authority in whose district it is owned or kept and the registered number, together with the distinguishing letters or marks of such local authorty, duly inscribed on both sides of a plate in white letters on a black ground, to be affixed to such cycle in the manner hereinafter specified.
- (g.) The distinguishing letters and number to be at least one inch in height and of corresponding breadth.
- (h.) To be affixed in a vertical position to the head piece of the cycle in a line with the rear wheel so as to be legible for the purpose of identification.
- (i.) No person shall in any way obscure or conceal the number on any plate attached to any cycle, or suffer or permit any such number to be in any way obscured or concealed
- (j.) No unauthorised person shall deface, remove, or otherwise damage any identification plate of a cycle or suffer or permit any such number to be in any way obscured or concealed.


THE DOG ACT, 1903.

P.W. 5433/16.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the following Regulations numbered 1 to 5 under the provisions of "The Dog Act, 1903," to come into operation in every Municipal and Road District throughout the State on and from the 1st January, 1919:—

1. All regulations previously made under the Act shall be and are hereby repealed, as from the 31st day of December, 1918.

- 2. These regulations shall come into operation and have the force of law in every "District" throughout the State, on and from the 1st day of January, 1919.
- 3. The registration label for the calendar year of 1919 required by Section 9 of "The Dog Act, 1903," is hereby prescribed to be a flat piece of metal of the size and shape depicted hereunder provided with the name of the Local Authority, a distinguishing number, and the year of issue, also with a hole whereby it shall be securely affixed to a collar and worn round the dog's neck.



- 4. All dogs must have the registration label as prescribed by these regulations securely affixed to a collar and worn round the dog's neck.
- 5. Any person applying for a license for a dog or bitch bona fide employed in tending cattle and sheep may be required to produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Local Authority or Licensing Officer that the dog or bitch is so employed, or at the discretion of the Local Authority or their Licensing Officer furnish a statutory declaration as required by the Evidence Act of 1906.
- 6. Any person or persons who contravenes any provision of these By-laws, whether by act or omission, shall on summary conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.
