ORDER IN COUNCIL.

The Vermin Boards Act, 1909.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Perth, this
2nd day of October, 1918.

Present:

His Excellency the Governor.

The Honourables—The Premier,

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any defined portion of the State a Vermin District for the purpose of the said Act, and may specify the boundaries of and assign a name to such District: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that for every district there shall be a Board, which shall consist of so many members as may from time to time be prescribed by the Governor, and that until the first elections of the members of a Board the members shall be appointed by the Governor: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council constitute the Corrigin Road District a Vermin District for the purposes of the said Act, under the name of the Corrigin Vermin District, and with boundaries in every respect identical with the boundaries of the said Road District: And in further exercise of the said powers His Excellency the Governor doth, with the advice and consent aforesaid, prescribe eight as the number of members which shall constitute the Board of the said Vermin District, and doth appoint George Wilson, Colin Campbell, Harold Bernardt Overheu, George Percy Cross, John Felix Lindsay, Joseph Keays, William Sommers Kirkwood, and Leslie Larke to be members of the Board of the said Vermin District.

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1911," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make, amend, or repeal By-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act, the Kanowna Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

GOATS.

Goats within Townsite Areas.

1. Every keeper of any goat or goats within the Townsite of Kanowna shall register with the Road Board his or her name as a keeper of goats, and shall register each goat kept, and shall at the time of registration pay the sum of sixpence for each goat so owned and kept within the said townsite boundaries, and shall place and keep on the neck of every goat so owned a collar bearing disc with registration number stamped thereon.

2. No person shall suffer any goat or goats in his or her charge or apparent ownership to run loose within

the said townsite, unless the owner thereof or keeper shall be in constant attendance thereof.

3. The Board may refuse to register any goat if, in the opinion of the Board, suitable accommodation has not been provided for keeping such goat.

Goats within District generally.

4. No person shall allow or cause any goat to be depastured or tethered upon or to loiter or stay upon any roads, streets, or reserves, or any vacant land adjacent thereto, without the permission of the Board.

5. Any goat found wandering upon any street, road, or reserve may be seized and impounded or destroyed.

6. Every person who shall offend against any provision of this By-law shall for every such offence forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, irrespective of and in addition to any other fine or damages for trespass to which the defendant shall be subject, and the Road Board may impound, sell, or destroy any such goat or goats which shall be permitted to run loose as aforesaid.

The above By-law was passed at a meeting of the Road Board held on the fifth day of August, 1918.
