WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency the Right Honourto Wit. Sable Sir William Grey EllisonMacartney, Privy Councillor, Knight
Commander of the Most Distinguished
Order of St. Michael and St. George,
Governor in and over the State of
Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

To the Honourable John Rooth, a Judge of the Supreme Court of Western Australia.

WHEREAS by motion agreed to in the Legislative Assembly of the said State of Western Australia on the 2nd day of October instant, it was deemed desirable that a Royal Commission, consisting of a Judge of the Supreme Court, should be appointed to inquire fully

- (1.) The forfeiture of Conditional Purchase and Homestead Leases formerly held by one W. J. Curtis in the Kulin District.
- (2.) The conversion of the said leases into a Grazing Lease and the granting of the same to A. L. Johnston.
- (3.) The interest, if any, ever held in the said Grazing Lease by one W. M. Butler, an agent at Wickepin, and the whole of the circumstances and history of an application for a provisional certificate for a hotel to be erected on the said
- Grazing or Homestead Lease.

  (4.) The conduct and attitude of the Lands Department, the Titles Offices, the Agricultural Bank, the Magistracy, the Police Department, and the applicants and their agents in reference to the above-mentioned leases, and the application for a provisional certificate in respect thereto, and in respect also to the application for a provisional certificate at Perenjori, and upon all matters relating to or affecting the said leases matters relating to or affecting the said leases and applications at Kulin and Perenjori respectively, the Commission to have power to report and make such recommendations as it may think fit, and to do all things necessary to obtain the fullest information upon the matters berein submitted to it matters herein submitted to it.

Now therefore I, the Right Honourable Sir William Grey Ellison-Macartney, P.C., K.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, do hereby appoint you, the said the Honourable John Rooth, a Commissioner for the purpose of inquiring into and reporting upon the matters aforesaid; and I

do hereby desire and request that you do, as soon as the same can conveniently be done (using all diligence), report to me, in writing, your proceedings in virtue of this Commission.

And I declare this to be a Royal Commission within the meaning of "The Royal Commissioners" Powers Act, 1902.

The Game Act, 1912-13.

1946/18; A. & F. 2936/14. WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1912-13" (Section 6), the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare inter alia-

- (a) The close season for any particular native game, either generally throughout the State, or in any one or more districts thereof, to be defined in any such Proclamation.
- (b) Any one or more portions of the State or any any one or more localities to be respectively defined in any such Proclamation a reserve for native game or any particular native

(c) That any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State

or in any one or more portions thereof.

And whereas it is desirable to exercise the powers hereinbefore mentioned, in manner hereinafter set out: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and

declare that the close season for Wild Geese and Wild Ducks of all descriptions within the boundaries of the Magisterial District of East Kimberley shall be from the beginning of December to the end of April in each and every year: And further, that the Egret shall be at all times strictly preserved generally throughout the State as from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette.

The Early Closing Act, 1902.

M.P.H. 2363/18.

Merging of Mt. Magnet Municipal District into the Mt. Magnet Road District.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and "The Roads Act, 1911," it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, dissolve any Municipality and include the District in any adjoining Road District: And whereas it is desirable to abolish the Municipality of Mt. Magnet Road District: And whereas notices of intention to do so have been duly given and published in accordance with the respective requirements of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and "The Roads Act, 1911": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby abolish the Municipality of Mt. Magnet as from the 31st October, 1918, and order that the District thereof be included in the Mt. Magnet Road District as from the 1st November accordingly. Also that all assets and liabilities of the said Municipality shall continue with the Mt. Magnet Road Board.

Avon and Beverley Road Districts: Alteration of Boundaries.

P.W. 3735/18.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council alter the boundary of any Road District or ward, and transfer portion thereof to another Road District or ward: And whereas it is desirable to alter the boundaries between the Avon and Beverley Road Districts: And whereas due notice of the intention of the Governor in Executive Council to exercise such power has, in accordance with the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," been duly published in the Government Gazette and served on the Boards concerned, in the manner prescribed by the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," and all other powers therein him enabling, doth hereby alter and amend the boundaries of the Avon and Beverley Road Districts by transferring from the Avon to the Beverley Road District all that territory defined in the schedule hereto, and the boundaries of the Avon and Beverley Road Districts are altered and amended accordingly, and the boundaries of the South-West Ward of the Avon Road District are altered and amended so far as the portion of the boundary between such wards is affected by the said alteration to the boundaries of the Avon and Beverley Road Districts. This order to come into force on and from the 1st day of October, 1918.

The adjustment of rates to be that all rates levied by the Avon Road Board on the properties within the transferred territory for the current financial year, together with any arrears thereon owing at date of this order less five per cent. of such amount which may at the discretion of the Avon Road Board be charged for cost of levying such rate, shall become the property of the Beverley Road Board and may be transferred to, and included in, the books of the Beverley Board and recovered by them in accordance with the provisions of this Act as though they had been levied by the said Beverley Road Board; for which purpose a list shall be made out by the Avon Road Board duly certified by the Chairman and the Secretary, and be transmitted

to the Beverley Road Board within thirty days from the date of the publication of this Order in the Government Gazette, or of such extended time as the Minister for Works may direct.

IIIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amending Acts for the management of the Boyanup Public Čemetery (Reserve 6742).

#### BY-LAWS.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Boyanup, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:-

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times

and manner therein mentioned.

- 2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.
- All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications No free interment shall be allowed within such time. unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.
- The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.
- Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the gravedigger.

Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m.

to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.;

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates,

and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke

within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection,

commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees;

and the renumeration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specific or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all mat-

exercise a general supervision and control over all mat-ters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery. 20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and speci-fications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule. 21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws

for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any

person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or creet any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval

of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897.".

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.
28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any

work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

- 30. All materials required in the erection and comof any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.
  31. No catacomb shall be allowed.
- All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cometery, be subject to the super-vision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workmen permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions

of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material re-

- moved in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any ad-joining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
- (b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.

The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.

(d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the cemetery.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees, held at their office at Boyanup on the 2nd September, 1918.

# THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906.

Kalgoorlie Municipality.

Ex. Co. 3552; P.W. 4544/18. IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the attached By-laws of the Kalgoorlie Municipality, in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906."

#### C. A. MUNT.

Under Secretary for Works and Trading Concerns.

Additions and amendments to By-law No. 116 of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie, made under Sections 179 and 181 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," for regulating and controlling motor and vehicular traffic and standard lights to be carried by all vehicles, and for licensing motor cars and other vehicles, and for prescribing the minimum age of drivers of vehicles.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie order as follows:

After Clause 8 insert a new clause, to be num-

bered 8a, as follows:—
8a. No person shall act as the driver of any motor car within the Municipality of Kalgoorie, whether plying for hire or otherwise, unless such person is of the full age of seventeen years.

2. After Clause 32 insert two new clauses, to be numbered 32a and 32b, respectively, as follows:—

# Restricting glare of head lamps.

32 (a) No person shall, between sunset and the following sunrise, upon any road within the Municipal District of Kalgoorlie, use, ride, drive, or impel, haul, or place any motor car, motor wagon, or motor cycle unless the top of the main beam of light projected from the head lamp of such motor car, motor wagon, or motor cycle, respectively, shall not be higher than three feet above the roadway at a distance of seventy-five feet on a level from the front of the car, wagon, or cycle, in the direction in which such car, wagon, or cycle is pro-(b) Provided that if any lamp or lamps are pro-

vided with any lens or other immovable device which efficiently prevents the beam of light dazzling, blinding, or confusing any other person, at a greater distance than that specified in the foregoing By-law, and if written approval is obtained of such lens or other immovable device from the Town Clerk, such lens or other immovable device shall be deemed to comply with the provisions of the foregoing

By-law.

Clause 34, as amended by the Council of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie on the 1st day of March, 1915, and gazetted on the 9th day of July, 1915, is hereby repealed, and the following clause substituted therefor:-

No car shall be kept for the purpose of plying for hire within the district unless and until a license shall have first been obtained for same, and except during the currency of such license, and if any car shall be so kept the owner thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Schedule "C," as amended by the Council of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie on the 1st day of March, 1915, and gazetted on the 9th day of July, 1915, is hereby amended by striking out all items of particulars after item (11), so that the Schedule shall stand as originally gazetted on the 13th day of March, 191±. 5. Schedule "E," as amended by the Council of the

Municipality of Kalgoorlie on the 1st day of March, 1915, and gazetted on the 9th day of July, 1915, is hereby amended by striking out all items of particulars after item 11, so that the Schedule shall stand as originally gazetted on the 13th day of March, 1914.

6. Schedule "J," as amended by the Council of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie on the 1st day of March, 1915, and gazetted on the 9th day of July, 1915, is hereby amended by striking out the words "for vehicles already licensed in another district" and the words "motor-vehicle licenses (for passengers) for vehicles already licensed in another district; motor car of any horse power, 2s. 6d. (annual)," so that the schedule shall stand as originally gazetted on the 13th day of March, 1914.
