By-law No. 87.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Mayor and Councilors of the Municipality of York do hereby make the following by-law:—

By-law No. 87.

(a) No person shall ride, drive, or impel any motor car, motor wagon, motor cycle, motor carrier, or other motor vehicle round the corner formed by the junction of any roads or streets, or across the intersection of any of the said roads or streets at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

(b) No person shall ride, drive, or impel any motor-car, motor wagon, motor cycle, cycle, motor carrier, or other motor vehicle along any street or way at a speed exceeding twelve miles an hour.

(c) Nothing in this by-law shall be deemed to limit or otherwise interfere with the operation of By-laws Nos. 7 and 23 (e) of the Uniform General By-laws for regulating Motor Traffic and Standard Lights to be carried by all vehicles passed by the York Municipal Council, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 3rd day of January, 1913.
