West Arthur Road District.

Ex. Co. 3910; P.W. 3747/18.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 195 of "The Roads Act, 1911," as amended by "The Roads Act Amendment Act, 1912," that a Board may adopt, in any townsite or in any area defined for that purpose by proclamation, the system of valuation on the Annual Value: And whereas it is desirable to approve of and

define the areas hereinafter described as areas within which the West Arthur Road Board may adopt the system of valuation on the Annual Value: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby approve of and define the following areas situated within the West Arthur Road District, viz., Williams Location 36, as an area in which the West Arthur Road Board may adopt the system of valuation on the Annual Value.

WHEREAS by "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893, Amendment Act, 1896" (60 Vict., No. 22), the Governor is empowered, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to revest in His Majesty, as of his former estate, all or any lands whereof His Majesty may become the registered proprietor: And whereas His Majesty is now the registered proprietor of Boulder Town Lot R227, registered in the Office of Titles in Volume CLXXXIX., Folio 32: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation revest in His Majesty, his heirs and successors, Boulder Town Lot R227 aforesaid, as of his former estate.

WHEREAS by Crown Grants registered in the books of the Office of Land Titles in Enrolment 1626, and subsequently Certificate of Title, Vol. 301, Folio 90, Cockburn Sound Location 128, containing forty acres two roods and twenty perches, was granted to John Wellard, of Fremantle, and Volume VII., Folio 23, Cockburn Sound Location 222, containing 40 acres, was granted to John Healy, of South Fremantle, Farmer, subject to the reservation to His Majesty the King, his heirs and

successors, of the right to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said lands which it might at any time be deemed necessary to resume for roads, tramways, railway stations, bridges, canals, towing-paths, harbour or river improvement works, drainage or irrigation works, or quarries, and generally for any other works or purposes of public use, utility, or convenience, and such lands so resumed to hold to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, as of his or their former estate, without making to the said grantee any compensation in respect thereof, so that the lands so resumed should not exceed one-twentieth part in the whole of the land aforesaid, and that no such resumption should be made of any land upon which any buildings should be erected, or should be in use as gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such buildings, without compensation: And whereas it is desirable to resume the land hereinafter described (being a portion of the land granted as aforesaid not exceeding one-twentieth thereof) for the purpose of a Road: Now know ye that I, the Governor of this State, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that, in exercise of the power contained in the said Crown Grants as aforesaid, the land described in the schedule hereto, being a portion not exceeding one-twentieth of the whole of the land comprised in the said Grants, was on the 30th day of October, 1918, resumed on behalf of His Majesty, for the purpose of "a Road."

WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Public Works Act, 1902," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any Public Work (subject as to Railways to Section 96), and such authorisation shall be deemed an authority to such Minister by and under that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Public Works Act, 1902," doth hereby authorise the Honourable Minister for Works to provide a Siding at Spencer's Brook in connection with the Wheat Marketing Scheme, on the Great Southern Railway, as is delineated and shown coloured green and

blue on Plan P.W.D., W.A., No. 19702, which may be inspected at the office of the Minister for Works, Perth.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in Section 74 of "The Constitution Act, 1889," whereby the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council, does not apply to minor appointments which by Order in Council are vested in Heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State: And whereas the appointment of Foremen and all other persons employed at a daily rate of wages on works under the control of the Department of Agriculture was vested in T. S. McNulty: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby cancels the authority of T. S. McNulty to appoint foremen and all other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Department of Agriculture, and vests same in H. C. Trethowan and any person or persons appointed to temporarily act in the place of such officer.

Amendment of Regulation.

2165/17.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to repeal existing Prisons Regulation 85, and to approve the following Regulation in lieu thereof:—
"85. A warder shall pay strict attention to cleanliness of person and dress, and shall at all times when on duty wear the officer's uniform according to the

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911.

M.P.H. 2565/18.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the following amendment of By-laws.

CITY OF PERTH.

Health By-laws.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in Part IV. of "The Health Act, 1911," the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth, being the Local Authority for the Municipal District of Perth, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. Part 1, Section 10, is hereby amended by the addition of the following clause:—

(f.) Any person using any public latrine shall before leaving such latrine completely adjust his clothing.

2. The following amendments are made to Part III. of the Health By-laws:—

(a.) Sections 3, 4, and 5 are hereby repealed and the following sections are substituted in lieu thereof:

3. Every person who occupies or conducts any private hospital registered under these By-laws shall during the first week in September in each year make application to the Local Authority for registration during the ensuing municipal year in the form set out in Schedule "E" hereto.

4. If it appears to the Local Authority that all the conditions and reservations of these By-laws are satisfied it may grant such application.

5. Every person who intends to open, occupy, or conduct any premises situate within the district as a private hospital shall before opening, occupying, or conducting any such premises as a private hospital make application to the Local Authority for registration thereof in the form set out in Schedule "A" hereto, and shall cause notice of such application to be published in a Perth daily newspaper, and the Local Authority shall not give consideration to any such application until one month has elapsed after the publication of such notice.

(b.) Section 7 is amended by adding after the word "Hospital" in the third line the following words, "not already registered."

(c.) Section 8 is amended by striking out the word "the" first appearing in the second line and inserting in lieu thereof the word "any."

(d.) The following Schedule shall be added:—

SCHEDULE "E."

Application for Registration of Premises already Licensed.

3. Part IIIa. is hereby amended by the addition of the following clauses:—

Precautions to be taken in the Handling of Dead Bodies.

1. (a.) The keeper of any private hospital or the person in charge of any public hospital or any undertaker (hereinafter referred to as the "keeper," "person," and "undertaker" respectively) shall provide surgical rubber gloves and a mask of gauze for use by every person handling the body of any person who has died of an infectious disease.

(b.) Every person handling such body shall while so doing use the gloves and mask provided for that person.

(c.) The keeper, person, or undertaker shall cause any such mask so provided to be destroyed immediately after use.

(d.) The keeper, person, or undertaker shall cause each surgical glove immediately after the use thereof to be sterilised by having the same immersed in boiling water.

2. The keeper of any private hospital or the person in charge of any public hospital shall as soon as possible after the death of any person from an infectious disease cause the body to be wrapped in a shroud which has first been soaked with a disinfecting solution. The said keeper or person in charge shall also as soon as possible cause the body to be placed in a coffin or other container properly closed, before removal from his premises.

3. The keeper of a private hospital or the person in charge of any public hospital shall cause any body which is in an advanced stage of decomposition or likely to be a nuisance to be placed in a coffin or other container properly closed before removal from his premises.

4. Subclause (b) of Clause 29 of Part VII. of the Health By-laws is hereby repealed, and the following section shall be added to Part VII. and shall form part of the By-law:—

29a. Any person engaged or employed in the transport or delivery of carcase meat within the district shall at all times when so engaged wear a cap which shall be constantly covered with a detachable covering made of washable material, and he shall wear overalls made of washable materials which shall completely cover his clothes. He shall cause such covering and overalls to be kept thoroughly clean.

5. Part IX. of the Health By-laws is hereby amended by adding the following:—

(1.) Adding after the words "Section S—Flock Factories," the words "Section T—Second-hand Jute Stores."

(2.) By adding after Section 2 the following section:—

(a.) No approval of the Local Authority shall be given to the establishment of an offensive trade by any person whom the Local Authority shall deem unfit to conduct such trade or business.

(3.) By inserting in Schedule A, under the words "Premises proposed to be used," the following words:—
 "Nationality of applicant."
 "Place and date of birth."
 "If naturalised, state particulars."

(4.) By adding after Section 1 (c), Section S, the following clause:—

Section T—Second-hand Jute Stores.

In the construction of this section of the By-law, unless the context otherwise requires,—

"Jute Stores" shall mean and include a place where second-hand jute goods are received for storing, repairing, cleaning, and/or sale.

"Impervious material" shall mean in Clause 2 (a), concrete, granolithic, brick grouted with cement, or wood covered with at least one inch of tar macadam, and in Clause 2 (b) shall mean concrete, granolithic, or brick grouted with cement or plain iron.

1. Every occupier of a jute store shall cause all second-hand jute goods to be stored in such manner

and position as to prevent the emission of noxious, offensive, or injurious effluvia therefrom.

2. Every occupier of a jute store shall comply with the following conditions as regards such store:—

(a.) The floor shall be properly paved with impervious material and shall be kept in such a state of repair as may be from time to time required and/or directed by the Local Authority.

(b.) The walls of the building used for such store shall, on their interior side be covered to a height of six feet from the floor with impervious material rendered hard and smooth.

(c.) Sufficient means of ventilation by direct communication with the external air shall be provided to the satisfaction of the Local Authority.

(d.) Every room in a jute store which is used for cleaning and repairing second-hand jute goods shall be lit by windows in the external walls having a ratio of not less than one square foot of unobstructed glass to each ten square feet of floor area of the room.

3. Every occupier of a jute store when directed by an inspector to do so shall remove or cause to be removed from the store anything which by reason of its condition creates or is liable to create a nuisance.

6. Add the following clauses to Part X:—

Morgues.

(1.) The annual fee for a place for a license for the temporary reception of the bodies of the dead, and for keeping such bodies for the purpose of view, examination, identification, or other lawful purpose before burial or cremation, shall be £2.

(2.) Every license shall expire on the 31st day of October next after the day of its issue.

(3.) No such license shall be granted in respect of any premises unless:—

(a.) The walls thereof are constructed of stone or brickwork; and

(b.) The interior surface of all walls is covered with glazed tiles or is rendered impervious with some material, to be approved by the Board, so as to be non-absorbent and washable; and

(c.) All floors are constructed of some impervious material, to be approved by the Board, such as granolithic, or glazed tiles, laid upon a bed of four-inch concrete, having a fall to an outlet discharging over a trapped gully; and

(d.) The premises are adequately ventilated by direct communication with the outer air.

(4.) No such license shall be granted in respect of any room the dimensions of which are less than ten feet by nine feet by twelve feet in height.

(5.) No such license shall be granted in respect of private premises unless the site thereof is approved by the Board, or if the same are within twenty feet of any dwelling-house.

7. Part IX., Section 3, is amended by inserting the word "July" in lieu of "May" in the twelfth line.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the following Regulations.

REGULATIONS FOR THE COLLECTION OF STATISTICS.

All persons prescribed hereunder shall, to the best of their knowledge, when required by the Statistician so to do, fill up and supply in accordance with the instructions respectively contained in the Forms Nos. 1 to 20, and also in the forms in Schedules 1 and 2, prescribed hereunder or which shall respectively accompany such forms, the particulars respectively specified in such forms, and in default shall be liable to the penalty mentioned in Section 9 of the said Act.

Provided that where, under these Regulations, anything is required to be done in the "form prescribed," it shall be sufficient if such thing be done substantially in the form so prescribed, or to the effect thereof, and any such form may be modified by the authority of the Government Statistician to suit particular cases.

2. Every owner, or agent for the owner, of goods exported from any port or station of Western Australia to any port or station in any one of the other States of the Commonwealth, whether such goods are intended for export to such State of the Commonwealth or for re-export thence, shall, when consigning such goods, furnish to the duly authorised Statistical Collector appointed for the purpose at such port or station in the State of Western Australia, a return filled in with all the particulars required in the First Schedule to these Regulations.

3. Every owner, or agent for the owner, of goods delivered at any port or station of Western Australia, from any port or station in any one of the other States of the Commonwealth, whether such goods were originally received from outside the Commonwealth or not, shall, when obtaining possession of such goods, furnish to the duly authorised Statistical Collector appointed for the purpose at such port or station in the State of Western Australia, a return filled in with all the particulars required in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.

4. All previous regulations made under "The Statistics Act, 1907," are hereby superseded.

His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules and Regulations under "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," and to repeal existing Rules and Regulations made under that Act or "The District Fire Brigades Act, 1909."

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE BOARD.

Returning Officer.

1. The Under Secretary, Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, shall be the Returning Officer.

Election of two Members by the Insurance Companies.

2. The members to be elected by the insurance companies shall be elected at a meeting held for that purpose during the month of December, 1918, and every alternate year thereafter.

3. At such meeting, which shall be held at a time and place to be stated in the notice convening the same, the representatives of the insurance companies shall elect a chairman, and the election of two members of the Board shall be decided by a majority of votes of the representatives present, and the votes to be allotted to each representative shall be according to the following scale, namely:—

Where the insurance company's fire premium income in the State of Western Australia does not exceed two thousand pounds, the representative shall be entitled to one vote; where such income is above two thousand pounds and does not exceed five thousand pounds, the representative shall have two votes; where such income is above five thousand pounds, such representative shall have three votes; and the chairman of such meeting shall have, in addition to his own vote or votes, a casting vote.

4. Such meeting may regulate its own procedure.

5. The names of the persons elected shall be forthwith communicated to the Returning Officer who shall, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, declare such persons duly elected.

Election of one Member by the Council of the City of Perth.

6. The member to be elected by the Council of the City of Perth shall be elected at a meeting of the Council to be held during the month of December.

The name of the person elected shall forthwith be communicated by the Town Clerk to the Returning Officer who shall, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, declare such person duly elected.

Election of Members of Local Authorities.

7. The Council of each Municipality and the Board of each Road District mentioned in Parts II., III., and IV. respectively of the Second Schedule of the Act, or as may be added thereto or excised therefrom under Section 4, may nominate a candidate for election as a member of the Board to represent each of such groups of Municipalities and Road Districts.

In the case of a united Fire District the Board shall acquaint the Returning Officer not later than November of each year of the names of local authorities constituting united Fire Districts.

Every local authority whose district or portion of district forms part of a united Fire District shall have the right to nominate a candidate for election and to vote at the election.

8. Nomination papers are to be addressed to the Under Secretary, Colonial Secretary's Department, Perth, and must be received not later than the 1st day of December.

9. If not more than one candidate is nominated to represent any one of the said groups of Municipalities and Road Board Districts, as set out in Parts II., III., and IV. of the Second Schedule to the Act, or as may be added thereto or excised therefrom under Section 4, the Returning Officer shall, by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, declare such candidate duly elected.

10. If more candidates than one are nominated by any of the said groups of Municipalities and Road Boards, the Returning Officer shall cause a list of the

candidates to be prepared, and shall forward a copy of such list to each Municipal Council and Road Board concerned, and each such Municipal Council and Road Board of the several groups shall, on the occasion of any ordinary or special meeting, strike out of such list the names of all candidates except the name of the candidate for whom the Council or Board votes, and shall return the list addressed to the Under Secretary, at the Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, so that the same may be received not later than the 31st day of December.

11. The Returning Officer shall forthwith, after receipt of the voting papers for each of such groups of Municipalities and Road Districts, by notice in the *Government Gazette* declare the candidate receiving the largest number of votes for each such groups of Municipalities and Road Districts to be duly elected.

12. In the case of an equality of votes, the Returning Officer shall have a casting vote.

Election of a Member by the Volunteer Fire Brigades.

13. In the month of November, 1918, and every alternate year thereafter, the Board shall furnish the Returning Officer with a list of all registered volunteer fire brigades in the Fire Districts, and such list shall be published by the Returning Officer in the *Government Gazette*.

The name of any registered volunteer brigade omitted from the list may be inserted in the list on application by the Board to the Returning Officer within seven days from the publication thereof.

Such list when published shall be the roll of registered volunteer fire brigades within the meaning of Section 6 of the Act.

On or before the 1st day of December, 1918, and every alternate year thereafter, each registered brigade so enrolled may by notice in writing addressed to the Returning Officer nominate one or more candidates.

14. If no more than one candidate is nominated, the Returning Officer shall by notice published in the *Government Gazette* declare such candidate duly elected.

15. If more candidates than one are nominated, the Returning Officer shall cause a list of the candidates to be prepared and shall forward a copy of such list to each brigade, and such brigade shall, on the occasion of any ordinary or special meeting, strike out of such list the names of all candidates except the name of the candidate for whom the brigade votes, and shall return the list to the Under Secretary, at the Colonial Secretary's Department, Perth, not later than the 31st day of December.

16. The Returning Officer shall forthwith, after the receipt of the voting papers, count the votes, and by notice in the *Government Gazette* declare the candidate receiving the largest number of votes to be duly elected.

17. In the case of an equality of votes, the Returning Officer shall have a casting vote.

Telegraphic Communications.

18. In all cases where it is impracticable to communicate any matter by post without occasioning undue delay, any telegraphic advice communicated in the ordinary course shall suffice for the purpose of these regulations.

19. Every extraordinary vacancy in the office of a member of the Board shall be filled by appointment or election as the case may require under and subject to the provisions of Section 14 of the Act, and the procedure for periodical elections shall apply. Provided that the time within which such vacancy shall be filled up shall be eight weeks from the occurrence of the vacancy.

20. The names of all persons appointed or elected members of the Board shall forthwith be notified by the Returning Officer in the *Government Gazette*, and such notification shall be deemed a declaration by the Returning Officer of the result of the election.

Conduct of Proceedings of the Board.

21. The Board shall meet for the transaction of ordinary business on such days and at such time and place as the Board shall from time to time determine.

22. The President may, or on the written requisition of three members of the Board the Secretary shall, call special meetings of which each member shall receive at least seven days' notice.

23. The Board may delegate any of its powers to committees duly appointed by the Board, but any committee so formed shall in the exercise of its powers so delegated conform to any direction that may be imposed upon it by the Board. Each such committee shall report to the Board. The President shall be *ex officio* a member of all committees.

24. Any member may on giving seven clear days' notice submit to the Board at its ordinary meeting or at a special meeting any motion for the purpose of altering, amending, rescinding, or extending any by-law or regulation authorised under the existing Fire Brigades Act.

25. Entries of all proceedings of the Board and of every committee with the names of the members who attend each meeting shall be made in books kept for the purpose under the direction of the Board and committees, and shall be signed at the next or some subsequent meeting of the Board or committee.

26. The Common Seal shall be placed in the custody of the Secretary, who shall keep it securely locked up in the office or have same deposited with the bankers of the Board for safe keeping. The seal shall not be affixed to any document except by the order of the Board as recorded in the minutes, and when affixed must be witnessed by at least two members of the Board and by the Secretary or any other officer authorised by the Board in that behalf.

27. The fees allowed to the Board shall be divided amongst the members by resolution of the Board.

28. The following travelling allowances shall be payable to members of the Board when travelling:—In cases of journeys occupying more than one day, £1 ls. per day, and 10s. 6d. for each half day. The cost of conveyance by road, rail, steamer, or coach, etc., may be allowed. In the case of a member resident in the country the Board may provide such member with a seasonal ticket.

29. All payments of £1 and over shall be made by cheque upon the bankers of the Board, and shall be signed by two members of the Board and countersigned by the Secretary or other officer authorised by the Board.

30. The financial year of the Board shall commence on the 1st day of January and end on the 31st day of December in every year.

31. In all cases the debate on all questions shall be governed by the rules, forms, and usages of the State Parliament and shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Board.

CONTROL OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF LOCAL COMMITTEES.

32. Where two or more municipal or road districts or one or more municipal districts together with one or more road districts are united, the local committee of such united fire district shall consist of representatives from each municipal or road district within the united fire district, the number of such representatives to be mutually agreed upon by the council or road board concerned. Provided that in case of disagreement the number of representatives shall be determined by the Board.

33. When the local authorities within a united fire district have mutually agreed upon the proportion which each shall pay of the total annual contribution due to the Board such sums shall be levied and payable to the Board as mutually agreed upon.

CONTROL OF PERMANENT FIREMEN EMPLOYED BY THE BOARD.

34. Applications for appointment as permanent firemen must be in candidates' own handwriting addressed to the Chief Officer.

35. Candidates must be physically strong men, free from any defect in limb, hearing, or sight, and will be required to undergo a medical examination by such legally qualified practitioner as the Board may appoint.

36. Candidates must not be less than 21 years of age (unless under special circumstances as to physique or qualifications) nor more than 40 years, unless they have been previously and recently engaged as active and efficient firemen, or otherwise thoroughly competent. In such cases the limit may be extended to 45 years. They must not be less than 5 feet 5 inches in height nor less than 35 inches in natural measurement of chest.

37. Candidates will be required to produce testimonials as to character and ability. They may also be required to produce certificate of birth or other satisfactory proof of age.

38. Eligible candidates when finally approved will be accepted as members of the brigade on probation only, the term of which must not be less than two months (unless under special circumstances), and will receive such rate of pay as shall be determined by the Board. At the end of such probation the probationer, if he has given satisfaction to the Chief Officer and has proved himself suitable, may be appointed by the Board as a permanent fireman. At the expiration of 12 months as third class fireman, firemen who have served to the

satisfaction of the Chief Officer will be promoted to the rank of second class, and on the expiration of 12 months service as second class firemen shall be promoted to the rank of first class, provided that service and conduct have been to the satisfaction of the Chief Officer.

39. The Chief Officer may at any time, for sufficient cause and with the approval of the Board, reduce any member of the brigade to a lower grade with corresponding reduction of pay.

40. All engagements or appointments made by the Board may be canceled or annulled without any reason being assigned, one week's pay to be granted in lieu of notice.

41. All officers and firemen on the permanent staff shall receive such rates of pay as may be fixed by the Board.

42. The Chief Officer will receive a salary as the Board may from time to time determine.

43. All members of the permanent force may be allowed 24 hours' leave in each eighth day and six hours' leave every eighth day commencing the fourth day after the ordinary day leave, and an annual leave of 14 days. Provided always that the Chief Officer may for sufficient reason, either from stress of work or other cause, cancel any or all leave at any time. The Chief Officer will be granted leave at the pleasure of the Board.

44. No first class fireman shall be promoted to a higher grade (unless under special circumstances) unless he shall have served at least two years as first class and has passed an examination in the practical working of fire brigades appliances and must satisfy examiners appointed by the Board that he is qualified to take charge at fires and drills and be able to instruct firemen in the practical working of fire appliances.

45. Every probationer and other member of the brigade must subscribe to the following conditions, to which persons joining will be subjected on becoming members:—

- (a.) Every member is to devote the whole of his time to the service of the brigade, and must not engage in any trade or business nor will he be permitted to derive any pecuniary profit or advantage from any public contract or from any purchase made by himself or others on behalf of the Board under pain of instant dismissal by the Board.
- (b.) Every member must serve and reside wherever it may suit the convenience of the Chief Officer.
- (c.) Every member of the brigade must obey and carry out the lawful orders of his superior officers to the best of his ability, and must conform to all rules and regulations which have been made or may be made from time to time in the brigade order book.
- (d.) He shall not resign or discontinue the duties connected with the brigade unless permitted by the Chief Officer, or in his absence any other responsible officer of the brigade, unless he shall have given to such officer one week's previous notice in writing. Should he resign or withdraw without such leave or notice he will forfeit all pay due to him, and will further be formally dismissed by the Board.
- (e.) Any member of the brigade or probationer will be liable to dismissal for intoxication, insubordination, disobedience, or omission of duty, incompetency, disrespect to any person in authority, or to the Board, or any member or officer thereof, for insolent or immoral behaviour on the premises, or any crime, misdemeanour, or other misconduct punishable by the law, in addition to such penalty as may be fixed by the Board.
- (f.) Any member agitating any cause for himself or any other person whereby the order and discipline of the brigade are imperilled or guilty of the offences named in paragraph (e) will be immediately suspended.

46. Every member will be liable to suspension from duty at the discretion of the Chief Officer, or, in his absence, by any responsible officer of the brigade. Every case of a suspension shall be brought before the Board at its first meeting after the offence, and the suspension may be continued for a longer period according to the discretion of the Board. During his suspension no fireman shall receive any pay if suspension is sustained. Any member of the brigade suspended shall not appear in uniform during suspension.

47. Any member not being satisfied with the award of the Chief Officer may appeal to the Board, and the Board may if necessary re-open the case.

48. The Chief Officer shall report all offences and awards for same to the Board at its next meeting after the offence has been dealt with.

49. Any member dismissed from the service or who may resign his appointment shall, immediately after his dismissal or resignation, deliver up all clothes and accoutrements that have been supplied to him, and if any article or articles shall have been, in the opinion of the Chief Officer, improperly used or damaged a deduction from the pay or moneys due to the member will be made sufficient to cover the loss sustained.

50. No member of the brigade shall send any communication to the Board or any newspaper otherwise than through the Chief Officer. Any man disobeying this order will be suspended.

51. Any member having a grievance of any kind or having any charge to make against another member of the brigade will be required to do so through the officer in charge of his station in writing to the Chief Officer.

52. No member shall absent himself from his station without permission from the officer or senior in charge of the station for the time being. Any member found absent from the station without leave is to be immediately suspended by the aforesaid officer, who shall at once report the case to the Chief Officer.

53. Any member breaking his leave will be liable to have his leave stopped for a certain period by the Chief Officer, and the record will be taken to weigh against his promotion.

54. No member of the brigade shall upon any occasion or under any pretence whatever accept any money gifts or address from any person for services rendered at a fire without permission of the Chief Officer or the Board.

55. At no time excepting when on leave shall any member of the brigade wear clothes other than his uniform without permission of the Chief Officer. No member will be permitted to attend theatres or any place of amusement in part or whole uniform without the permission of the Chief Officer.

56. On all occasions of fire the whole of the men are to be rung out. If any man is too late for the engine when it is his duty to be on the said engine or does not answer the bell, he will be liable to such fine as the Chief Officer may think fit to award.

57. Firemen will be held responsible to the officer in charge of the station for their apartments, bedding, and furniture being kept in a clean and respectable manner at all times, ready for inspection after 10 a.m. each day.

58. The duty man in charge of the telephone or other signalling apparatus will be held answerable on the occasion of a fire that the electric bells are rung and that all men are turned out; that the correct time of the call is taken, and that the name and address of the person by whom the call is given are entered in the station occurrence book.

59. The Chief Officer shall be empowered:—

- (a.) To deal with all cases of breaches of discipline and minor offences committed by members of the brigade, unless he deem it necessary to bring any particular case or cases before the Board with the view of dispensing with the services of the offending members.
- (b.) To impose penalties in such sums as he may think necessary for breaches of discipline and minor offences, but the penalties inflicted shall in no case exceed a week's pay based on the salary to which the offending members are entitled at the time of the offence.
- (c.) In case of members having been suspended for breaches of discipline and minor offences, he may reinstate such offending members until their cases can be dealt with by the Board.
- (d.) If he deems it necessary he may engage auxiliary firemen to act temporarily in the place of permanent firemen while the latter are under suspension or during sickness.

60. The man on duty in charge of the watchroom is to be in clean and undress uniform by 10 a.m., and will be held responsible that the watchroom is kept clean and in proper order.

61. Members living out of the station are required to be in readiness at all times at their homes in order that they may be able to immediately answer any call that may be given them. Any member found absent from his home without the requisite permission will be

immediately suspended and the case referred to the Board. The case in question will be equivalent to a man being absent from the station without leave.

62. At fires no member will be allowed to enter any hotel for refreshments without the permission of the Chief Officer or such officer who may be in charge of the fire. All refreshments, if possible, will be supplied in the vicinity of the fire, and not in an hotel. At no time at fires will any member be permitted to supply or use his authority towards supplying any person, civilians or otherwise, with refreshments of any description without the orders of the Chief Officer or such officer as may be in charge of the fire. Anyone violating this rule will be immediately suspended.

63. Any member heard to speak slanderously, contemptuously, disparagingly, or insubordinately of any officer or in any manner uttering words calculated to cause a breach of the rules or disorder in the brigade shall be suspended.

64. Should at any time any member wilfully strike any officer of the brigade he is to be immediately dismissed.

65. Members guilty of tampering with the books or wilful damage to or destruction of the buildings, goods, effects, chattels, clothing, apparatus, or plant belonging to the Board or in its charge will be liable to immediate suspension.

66. Men on leave are under ordinary circumstances not liable to be called on duty, whether they are on the station or out of it, but in case of heavy work every man whether on leave or not is liable to be called upon for active service, but if recalled from leave to duty the leave forfeited will be made good to him as soon as circumstances permit.

67. Firemen are prohibited from carrying out any order or instructions given other than by a superior officer, but attention should be paid to any information which may seem of value, and this should be at once communicated to the superior officer.

68. In the absence of senior officers all other ranks will assume command according to seniority on the permanent list.

CONTROL OF AUXILIARY FIREMEN.

69. Applications for appointment as firemen in the auxiliary force must be made in candidates' own handwriting to the Chief Officer.

70. Candidates must be physically strong men, free from defect in limb, hearing, or sight, and not subject to fits or nervousness.

71. Candidates must be of suitable age and be approved by the Chief Officer.

72. Candidates will be required to give the names of at least two respectable persons who must be able to testify to the character of applicants, and, if necessary, they will be required to produce satisfactory proof of age.

73. Candidates must belong to such trade or occupation as will fit them for the duties of a fireman, and for the work of fire extinction.

74. Candidates will be required to serve at least one month on probation, and if found suitable will be appointed to the auxiliary force.

75. Auxiliary firemen will receive pay in accordance with the following scale, viz.:—

A retaining fee of 10s. per month.

In addition to the retaining fee, pay will be allowed for attendance at fires in accordance with the following schedule:—

Foremen—	s. d.
For first hour	6 0
For second hour	3 0
For each subsequent hour	1 6
Firemen—	
For first hour	5 0
For second hour	2 6
For each subsequent hour	1 0

No pay will be granted for attendance at drills, false alarms, fires with but trifling damage, or chimney fires, unless under special circumstances, and no fireman will be entitled to receive pay under this schedule for services at any fire unless he shall have received orders to attend such fire from his superiors.

76. The engagement of every member will be for one month, and thereafter from month to month.

CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF VOLUNTEER FIRE BRIGADES.

Classification of Brigades.

77. For the efficient working of fire brigades the Board may register brigades and place them under classification as it may from time to time determine.

The classification for the present shall be as follows:—

Class A.—A complement of 15 effective registered members graded as follows:—Captain, foreman, secretary, and 12 firemen.

Class B.—A complement of 20 effective registered members graded as follows:—Captain, foreman, apparatus officer, secretary, and 16 firemen.

Class C.—A complement of 25 effective registered members, graded as follows:—Captain, foreman, apparatus officer, secretary, auxiliary station-keeper, and 20 firemen.

Class D.—A complement of 30 effective registered members, graded as follows:—Captain, foreman, apparatus officer, secretary, auxiliary station-keeper, and 25 firemen.

Class E.—Such complement and grades as the Board may from time to time determine.

In addition to the complement of registered members as provided for above, brigades may elect reserve members, subject to the approval and registration by the Board, who will be required to attend fires, practices, and drills, and to render themselves efficient in the use of fire extinguishing apparatus. As vacancies in the ranks of registered members occur the places should be filled as far as practicable from the reserve. Reserve members will not be granted uniforms.

Registration may be suspended.

78. Whenever any brigade by reason of deaths, resignations, or expulsions shall have reduced its roll to less than a minimum effective strength to be determined by the Board, the registration of the said brigade may be suspended, and any allowances payable to any members thereof may be reduced or forfeited to the Board as the Board may determine. If through dissensions or other cause the efficiency of any brigade is, in the opinion of the Board, impaired, registration may be suspended or the brigade may be disbanded by the Board.

Notice before Disbandment.

79. If after one month's notice from the Board any registered brigade remains below the minimum effective strength determined by the Board, the Board may cancel the registration of such brigade.

Qualifications of Membership.

80. No person shall be registered on the roll of any brigade unless—

1st.—He is in good health, and sound in body and mind.

2nd.—He is of good moral character and habits.

3rd.—He is over the age of 18 years, and not over the age of 40 years. (For exceptions see Regulations 81 and 82.)

Maximum Age of new Members.

81. No person who is over the age of 40 years shall be enrolled without the consent of the Board.

Retiring Age of Members.

82. No member over the age of 55 years shall be allowed to remain on the registered roll of any brigade unless under special circumstances, and with the approval of the Board.

New Members.

83. In each case of persons desiring to join, after a brigade has been registered by the Board, if the candidate complies with the requirements set forth in Regulation 80 and the brigade approves of him, the name and particulars of such candidate shall be submitted to the Board in such form as the Board may from time to time direct for approval or otherwise, and no person shall be recognised as a member of any brigade until his name has been approved by the Board, and registered on the roll of such brigade by the Board. The Board may require a certificate from the Captain of the brigade that due regard has been paid to the distribution of the membership over the area in which property has to be protected. Members shall reside within easy sound of the alarm bell. Their services must be reasonably available as required.

Persons not Eligible for Membership.

84. No person shall, unless with the consent of the Board, be eligible for re-election to any brigade who has been dismissed or struck off the roll of any brigade for misconduct, or for persistent neglect to attend fires or practices, or for want of interest generally in his duty as a fireman, or for any cause which, in the opinion of the Board, would disqualify him for membership.

Transfers of Members.

85. Members may be transferred from one brigade to another, provided the complement of the latter permits of such transfer, on production of a certificate of discharge from their former brigade, and with the approval of the Board.

Leave of Absence and Resignations.

86. Members desirous of obtaining leave of absence must apply for same in writing to their brigade, and in the event of such leave being sought for a longer period than one month, the applications must be forwarded to the Board with the brigade's recommendation.

Members desiring to retire from the membership of their brigade will be required to send in their resignations in writing to the Board through the brigade.

Annual Election of Officers.

87. Every brigade shall meet during the first week in December in each year, and elect by ballot the complement of officers allotted to it under its classification. All officers elected shall be effective registered members of their respective brigades, and shall hold office for the term of one year from and including the first day of January next ensuing, unless during the year they are removed from office or cease to be members of the brigade. When under the powers conferred on the Chief Officer by Section 34 of "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," the Chief Officer suspends any officer of any brigade, he shall within 24 hours report such suspension and the reasons for it to the Board, in writing, for its inquiry and decision. The officer suspended shall be entitled to receive a copy of the Chief Officer's report to the Board, and be entitled to be heard at the inquiry. Brigades may make their own rules or resolutions with regard to the date and method of nominating for the positions of officers.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

88. The duties of the respective officers of every brigade shall be as follow, viz:—

The Captain.

(a.) The Captain of the brigade shall see that all apparatus and buildings belonging to the Board or in charge of the brigade are kept in good condition and repair; shall take command of the brigade at fires, practices, drills, and parades; shall see that the members or persons employed do their duty faithfully; and shall enforce the regulations of the Board. He shall have power to suspend any officer or member for disobedience of orders, or for delinquency in the performance of their duties, and shall forthwith report such suspension to the Chief Officer. In the absence of any senior officer of the Board the Captain shall act.

The Foreman.

(b.) The Foreman shall act with and be under the direction of the Captain, and in his absence perform his duties. Where a station-keeper is not provided he shall take charge of all appliances, and shall be responsible for their cleanliness and the good order of the fire station. In the event of there being any defect he must immediately report same to the Captain.

Apparatus Officer.

(c.) The Apparatus Officer shall be subject to the senior officers of the brigade and shall assist the Foreman in his duties.

The Secretary.

(d.) The Secretary of the brigade shall attend all meetings of the brigade, and shall enter in ink the minutes of resolutions and proceedings in a minute book to be kept for that purpose. He shall perform, to the satisfaction of the Board and of the brigade, all such duties as may be imposed upon him, and shall, subject to the control of the Board, have charge of all books, papers, and other documents of the Board that may be in the custody of the brigade, and he shall be held responsible for all moneys of the Board which may be remitted to the brigade. He shall attend promptly to all communications received from the Chief Officer or

Secretary of the Board, and shall use despatch in forwarding reports and returns, etc., and shall keep a copy of all official correspondence. He shall forward to the Secretary of the Board reports of fires within seven days of their occurrence. He shall forward a return of the roll of attendances at all fires and practices of his brigade, countersigned by the Captain, on the proper forms, within the first week of each quarter, to the Secretary of the Board. He shall keep a register of the names of all persons who now are or who may hereafter become members of the brigade. He shall promptly send to the Secretary of the Board a notification of the election or resignation of a member of the brigade. He shall send to the Secretary of the Board a notification of the election of officers within seven days after such election, stating the names of the persons elected, and the office to which they have been elected. He shall do such other things as the Board or the regulations may require, and shall receive such remuneration as the Board may determine. He shall be under the general direction of the Secretary of the Board in all matters relating to office routine and management. He shall be liable to suspension, removal, or dismissal by the Board. Secretaries retiring from office shall furnish to the Board all returns to the end of the term for which they held office, and shall hand over to their successors all moneys, books, correspondence, or other documents which are the property of the Board.

(e.) List of returns, forms, and reports to be furnished to the Board by Secretaries of brigades:—

(f.) List of books and records to be kept by the Secretary of each brigade, and such books and records shall be and remain the property of the Board:—

- (i.) A book in which shall be entered in ink the names of every registered member of the brigade, together with his age, birthplace, occupation, residence, brigade rank, date of admission, date of leaving, and remarks; reports of fires, with full details; attendances of members at fires, alarms of fire, and monthly practices, and quarterly statements of minor supplies expenditure.
- (ii.) A book containing the minutes of resolutions and proceedings of the brigade, written in ink.
- (iii.) A book containing particulars of the horses (if any), and of all apparatus, showing in separate lists particulars of the apparatus belonging to the Board and to the brigade.
- (iv.) A file of all regulations and general and special circulars issued by the Board, and all inward correspondence; also copies of all outward official correspondence.
- (v.) Forms for requisitions for supplies and repairs for the brigade.

All entries made in the brigade books are to be examined by the Captain of the brigade, and must be produced at all meetings of the brigade, and whenever required by any officer of the Board.

Duties of Members.

89. The members of each brigade shall upon an alarm of fire proceed promptly with the appliances to the fire. They shall immediately on arrival report themselves to the senior officer present, and shall perform such duty as may be required of them. They shall remain on duty until relieved by orders, which shall be given only by the officer in command. In brigades where no station-keeper is provided members are required to keep the appliances and buildings in good order without cost to the Board.

DUTIES OF EMPLOYEES.

The Station-keeper.

90. Where the classification of a brigade provides for a permanent station-keeper it shall be his duty to reside at the headstation wherever practicable. He shall attend to and be responsible for the cleanliness, good order, and condition of the fire station and out-stations, and the fire-extinguishing appliances belonging to the Board or in charge of the brigade. He shall at all times be under the direction of the senior officer of the brigade present for the time being. He shall receive such remuneration as the Board may determine, and shall be liable to suspension, removal, or dismissal by the Board. Permanent station-keepers must not leave their station except when on duty without the sanction of the captain or officer in charge.

Conduct of Members.

91. Members of brigades are required, in their intercourse with each other, official or social, to observe a courteous demeanour, and officers or men addressing each other will do so in a respectful manner. While on duty at fires, practices, drills, or parades, the greatest degree of silence compatible with a proper discharge of duty will be required, and members must address officers by their official titles.

(a.) Members of brigades are considered to be on duty at all times when in uniform; and at fires, alarms of fire, practices, drills, parades, or brigade meetings, whether in uniform or plain clothes. Any member of a brigade who may be deemed to be guilty of disobedience of orders, insubordination, conduct subversive of discipline, intoxication, abusive or obscene language or other unseemly conduct when on duty shall within twenty-four hours be reported to the Board, in writing, by the senior officer of the brigade present, who may suspend such member from duty pending an inquiry by the Board. Officers below the rank of captain shall forward their reports in such cases to the captain for transmission to the Board for its decision. In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 34 of "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," the Chief Officer may suspend any member of any brigade, and shall within twenty-four hours report such suspension and the reasons for it to the Board, in writing, for its inquiry and decision. The member suspended shall be entitled to receive a copy of the Chief Officer's report to the Board, and be entitled to be heard at the inquiry.

(b.) The Board shall have power to deal with members against whom a charge has, in the opinion of the Board, been proven either by reprimanding them, suspending them, or by removing them from office or from the roll of registered members.

Duties at Fires.

92. At fires the senior officer present shall take command until the arrival of his senior. The brigade's duties are not completed until the fire is properly and effectually extinguished. Members must turn out to fires or alarms of fire in the Board uniform when they can do so without causing undue delay in attending.

Roll Call at Fires.

93. On returning from a fire or an alarm of fire, the officer in command shall cause the roll to be called, and record the names of members present at such fire or alarm of fire, and a copy of such roll, together with a report of the fire, signed by the officer in command at the fire and the Secretary of the brigade, shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the Board within seven days after the occurrence of the fire. The officer in command may exempt members from returning to the fire station for roll-call, and he may call the roll at the place of the fire or alarm of fire.

Brigades to Requisition for Appliances, etc.

94. Plant and appliances and supplies required by any brigade shall be requisitioned for to the Board. Requisitions shall be sent in only on the authority of a properly constituted meeting of the brigade.

A receipt for all plant and appliances and supplies received shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the Board and particulars of same entered in a book to be kept for that purpose by the Secretary of each brigade.

Urgent repairs to plant may be effected by the brigade without requisition, provided the cost does not exceed two pounds. Where the repairs involve a larger expenditure requisition must be made to the Board.

Brigade Rules.

95. Each brigade may have its own rules of internal and general working, which must in all cases be subject to the approval of the Board. All proposed alterations or additions must be submitted to the Board for approval or otherwise. No rule shall be contrary to the Board's regulations. Every officer and member shall conform to the regulations made, or which may hereafter be made, for the management of the various fire brigades, and shall be subject to the duties, conditions, and penalties named therein. All allowances and salaries shall, at the discretion of the Board, be subject to stoppage or absolute forfeiture in the event of wilful violation of the regulations.

Practices.

96. The members of each brigade shall be practised in the duties at engine, reel, or other drill, at least once each calendar month, under the supervision of their officers, and at such other time as the Board, Chief Officer, or Captain may direct. During the winter months or in inclement weather brigades may hold their monthly practice or drill indoors.

A recognised practice shall mean practical work in fire extinction, or other drill, for at least three-quarters of an hour. Brigades are required to see that the fire plugs are at all times kept in good order.

Each brigade may appoint its own dates for practice, and moonlight nights should be selected when practicable.

Effective Members.

97. Every member of a brigade must make himself effective by attending fires and practices. An effective member shall mean one who has, each half-year, attended at least two-thirds each of the fires, or alarms of fire, and also of the recognised monthly practices, except in the case of brigades of Class E, in which, owing to the large number of calls, an attendance of 50 per cent. will be sufficient to render members effective. Any member who has failed to keep himself effective in such attendances, without leave or sufficient excuse, shall be liable to be struck off the register by the Board. Members are expected to attend all brigade meetings, but these meetings must not be counted towards the attendances required for effectiveness.

Allowance for Purchase of Minor Supplies.

98. An allowance will be provided for every brigade for the purchase of such minor supplies, and for defraying cost of such repairs to plant, as may be required for the ordinary maintenance of the brigade. The total amount of such allowance must not exceed in any one year the amount provided for in the Board's estimates. Such allowance shall be available quarterly, and the vouchers for such expenditure, showing full particulars of the purchases made or repairs effected, duly certified by the Captain and Secretary of the brigade, and received in proper form, must be forwarded to the Secretary of the Board for examination, not later than the 21st day in the months of January, April, July, and October in each year. Such expenditure shall be subject to the approval of the Board, who may disallow any of all of it.

Allowances for Expenses at Fires, Practices, etc.

99. An allowance, to be determined by the Board, will be granted to every brigade for the purpose of defraying the incidental expenses of the brigade, and for expenses incurred while on duty at fires and recognised practices, and in connection with the annual demonstrations. Such allowance is not to be regarded as remuneration for services rendered and must not be divided amongst individual members.

Demonstrations and Competitions.

100. Brigades shall at no time attend fire brigades competitions or demonstrations outside a radius of five miles from the head station without leaving a sufficient number of effective registered members within their respective districts. Neither will any of the apparatus (with the exception of a competition reel and appliances) be permitted to be taken to a competition or

demonstration without the written consent of the Board. Captains will be held responsible for the carrying out of this regulation.

Brigade District.

101. The district within which each registered brigade shall be liable to do duty shall be that portion that is within the boundary of the fire district in which the brigade is established.

Such fire district shall be known and designated as the brigade district under the name of the said fire district.

Uniforms.

102. The uniforms for registered firemen will be provided by the Board, and shall consist of a coat with arm badge, cap, belt and spanner. Helmets will be supplied to brigades in cases where the Board considers they are required.

Members must provide their own trousers and cap covers. Trousers should be of dark blue or black cloth either plain or with scarlet piping, or with scarlet cloth stripes one and a quarter inches wide. Brigades should be uniform as regards pipings or stripes on trousers. All articles of uniform provided by the Board must at all times be kept clean, and Captains must inspect same at least twice a year either at practice or at a monthly meeting, and report on condition of same to the Board. Members must not alter or in any way add to the uniforms without the consent of the Board. Long service badges are to be worn on right breast of uniform coat and long service clasps are to be worn three-quarters of an inch below the badge. Members qualified in ambulance work should wear their badges on left arm.

No member will be allowed to lend a uniform or any part of it to any person not in the service. Flowers are not to be worn in coats and tan boots should not be worn. Members must not at any time appear dressed partly in uniform and partly in plain clothes, except in case of emergency at fires. At the Chief Officer's inspections full uniform must be worn.

The uniform and equipment are the property of the Board, and they are only loaned to members. A receipt for same must be obtained by the Secretary of the brigade, who must retain and file it. Members must use reasonable care in keeping uniforms and equipments in good order, and must return same to the Captain of the brigade or to the Chief Officer on being requested in writing to do so. If a member fails to comply within seven days of the transmission to him of such request he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and shall, in addition to the penalty named, be further liable for and shall pay the cost of any article not returned.

CONTROL AND ATTENDANCE OF FIREMEN ON DUTY ON PUBLIC BUILDINGS.

103. On every occasion when at any public building any entertainment is given in connection with which scenery is used, or when an exhibition of animated pictures is given, a skilled fireman, approved by the Chief Officer of the Fire Brigades, shall be employed and be in attendance in such building during the whole time such building used as aforesaid is occupied by the public; and such fireman shall see that the fire prevention appliances and the exit doors are in proper working order, and perform such other duties for the prevention of fire and of panic as he may deem necessary, or as the Chief Officer of Fire Brigades may direct.

Provided that in localities where volunteer fire brigades are established, the Chief Officer shall not, without the concurrence of the Board, approve of firemen other than members of volunteer fire brigades.

Fees.

104. For the services of each fireman employed under the preceding regulation, a fee of 5s. per performance for each fireman shall be payable by the owner or occupier of the premises on which such fireman shall have been employed.

105. In the event of any person failing to pay any fees due under Regulation 104 such fees may be recovered summarily by complaint made by the fireman to whom such fees are due before any Justice of the Peace, in manner provided by "The Justices Act, 1902."

106. The Chief Officer of Fire Brigades may, in writing, grant permission for the owner or occupier of any public building to dispense with the services of a fireman during any exhibition of animated pictures held between the hours of sunrise and sunset.

107. All firemen approved by the Chief Officer under these regulations shall be subject to the direction and control of the Chief Officer of Fire Brigades.

Recognition of Long Service.

108. Officers and members of permanent and volunteer brigades who shall have efficiently served not less than fifteen years in any one or more brigades in Western Australia, of which at least twelve years shall have been under the Western Australian Fire Brigades' Board, shall be entitled to the Board's Long Service Badge. Firemen with twenty years' service may wear a red clasp below the badge; with twenty-five years' service, an additional white clasp; and with thirty years' service, an additional blue clasp. Applications for badges must show all details of service, and be duly certified by the applicant, and the Captain and Secretary of the brigade. Service as a reserve member is not to be counted in the periods of service mentioned in this regulation.

Captains with not less than five years' service as Captains under the Board, and not less than fifteen years' service in all, shall be entitled to retain and wear their uniforms and to wear an ex-Captain's badge. Firemen with not less than twenty-five years' service, including not less than ten years under the Board, shall be entitled to retain and wear their uniforms. Service as a reserve member is not to be counted in the periods of service mentioned in this regulation.

The Board may, however, in its discretion, withhold the above privileges if the applicant shall at any time have been adjudged guilty of any offence against the Board's regulations.

Penalties.

109. Any person guilty of a breach of any of the foregoing, whether by act or omission, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

"Board"—The Bridgetown Road Board.

"Board Room"—shall be the office, hall, or building in which the meeting of the Board is held from time to time.

"Cycle"—A bicycle, trieycle, or other velocipede.

"Cyclist"—Any person riding, impelling, or otherwise using or having the management or control of any cycle.

"District"—The District under the jurisdiction of the Bridgetown Road Board.

"Footpath" or "Footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed or otherwise.

"Motorist"—Any person impelling or otherwise using or having the management or control of any motor car, wagon, or carrier.

"Secretary"—The Secretary of the Board.

All other interpretations to be as prescribed in the Roads Act or other Acts or regulations thereunder.

Duties of Secretary.

2. The duties of the Secretary shall be:—

- (a.) To attend all Board meetings.
- (b.) To attend all Committee meetings.
- (c.) To take notes of minutes and prepare reports of Committees.
- (d.) Conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.
- (e.) Answer all questions on the Board's business.
- (f.) See that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance sheets prepared and published yearly in the *Government Gazette*, and any other duties specified under the Roads Act.
- (g.) Prepare and place before the Board the quarterly financial statement at the end of each quarter of the financial year, and enter the same on the minutes as required by the Act.
- (h.) Supervise the preparation of the rate-books and the Board's electoral lists; to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all courts of revision or appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections; to issue instructions to the supervisor in accordance with the Board's resolution.
- (i.) Summon the members to Board and Committee meetings.
- (j.) Keep all books entered up to date in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister, and additional instructions of Board.
- (k.) Check all accounts sent into the Board, and see all accounts for works have stated in them

the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the Collector or other of the Board's officers, and see that the counterfoils of the receipt book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board.

- (l.) Report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.
- (m.) To pay into the bank after receipt, to the credit of the Board, all moneys received by him on behalf of the Board when such moneys shall amount in the aggregate to the sum of £5 or over, with the exception of moneys granted by the Government which are paid into Treasury book.
- (n.) No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the Secretary, as directed by the Board, and the Secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms.
- (o.) Readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board and not herein specified.
- (p.) See that all bonds and other forms of security to be taken from the contractors are prepared, and that the security required of servants is taken within due time, and report as to such matters to the Board.
- (q.) Report to the Chairman any servant of the Board who has been guilty of any neglect of duty or who is incapable of performing the duties allotted to him.
- (r.) Exercise, subject to any directions given by the Board or Chairman, control over all servants of the Board.

Supervisor's Duties.

2A. The duties of the Supervisor shall be:—

- (a.) To promptly attend to all instructions received through the Secretary.
- (b.) To prepare proper plans and specifications for all works and improvements as regards roads, bridges, culverts, buildings, or premises under the control of the Board situate within the district; examine all materials to be employed in such works, and see the same faithfully and properly executed and performed; lay out such work as to height, lines, levels, and dimensions, and watch the progress and formation thereof; submit all specifications and plans to the Board before tenders are called.
- (c.) To see that the work of cleaning and repairing all public roads and footways are properly carried out.
- (d.) To see that no labourers are engaged but those who are able-bodied and sober, and to immediately discharge any labourer guilty of disobedience, insubordination, and found incapable of performing the duties allotted to him.
- (e.) To see that all drains, sewers, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency.
- (f.) To see that all officers under his control carry out their duties efficiently, and to report any departure therefrom.
- (g.) To attend all Board and Committee meetings, if required.
- (h.) To specially examine all roads throughout the district at least twice a year.
- (i.) To render to the Secretary, when required, reports and accounts of all matters under his control; to supply fortnightly, or oftener if required, to the Board, returns of all work completed or in progress, with remarks thereon.

Appointment of Officers.

3. No permanent appointment shall be made to any office under the Board until after an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an

appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board. In the event of there being more than one applicant for such appointment, the election thereto shall be conducted by ballot so as to obtain an absolute majority of the members present.

4. The election of all other officers shall be conducted by a show of hands, unless a ballot be demanded, in which case the procedure in the foregoing By-law shall be followed.

5. The salary or allowance attached to the office under consideration of the Board shall be fixed in all cases preceding the election, and the salary of any officer when fixed shall not at any time be considered with a view to its increase or reduction unless specially authorised by a meeting of the Board, at which at least five of the members are present.

6. All complaints against servants of the Board must be in writing, and must in every case be signed by the person or persons complaining, and no notice whatever shall be taken of any complaint not made in accordance with this By-law. All such complaints as are receivable may be addressed to the Chairman, who, upon the receipt of such complaints, shall have power to investigate the same, and he shall report thereon to the Board at their next meeting.

Meetings and Proceedings.

7. Notice shall be given in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or regular meetings, and also of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding six days.

8. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—"Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are the regular meetings held in pursuance of these By-laws for the transaction of the general business of the Board, including meetings adjourned for the purpose of any incomplete business, but an adjourned meeting would not exclude any business which was considered necessary to transact. Special meetings are those called under Section 123 of the Act, and shall include those called by the Chairman in response to a requisition signed by three members on his own behalf, and the notices for such special meetings shall have such special business notified thereon for which the meeting was called, and for which each member shall receive seven days' notice. No other business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called, provided that any matter of emergency can be discussed, with the ruling of the Chairman and the consent of those present. The ratepayers' meeting shall consist of one called under Section 136 of the Roads Act, and the standing orders shall, so far as the Act allows, apply to the proceedings, but the provisions of the Act shall be first dealt with. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members of the Board, as the case may be, shall preside.

9. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board, at Bridgetown, on second and last Mondays in the month, at 2.0 p.m., unless otherwise arranged by resolution carried to that effect at the preceding ordinary meeting of the Board, of which each member has received due notice of the proposed alteration.

10. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business will be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless at least three members of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman or the member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present.

11. Any three members may require the Board room to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman, or other presiding Chairman, shall immediately give directions to have the order executed.

12. At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present), or within 30 minutes after time for which meeting is called, such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

13. The first business of all meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud with a view of their confirmation.

Voting.

14. Each member (including the Chairman) shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present. All motions and amendments shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a division is demanded, before the next business is proceeded with.

Minutes of Meetings.

15. The minute-book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the Secretary. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy or for the rectification of a clerical error.

Standing Orders.

16. The order of business at all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be as follows, that is to say:—

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary, also special meetings (if any).
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
- (c.) Questions, of which due notice has been given by members or officers of the Board.
- (d.) The Chairman shall have the right of directing attention at any meeting to any matter or subject within the jurisdiction or official cognisance of the Board by a minute signed by himself, and such minute shall when introduced take precedence of all business before or to come before the Board, and the adoption thereof may be put by him from the chair as a motion without being seconded, but he shall confine himself to the questions contained therein.
- (e.) Reports of sub-committees.
- (f.) Presentation of petitions or memorials, and consideration thereby.
- (g.) Reading of correspondence (received and despatched) and taking action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (h.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.
- (i.) Passing of accounts for payment.
- (j.) Motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (k.) Motions without notice (by leave of the Board under By-law 2).
- (l.) General business.
- (m.) Notice of motions.

17. In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move the suspension of the standing orders, and, if agreed to by the Board, such business shall take precedence to all others.

18. Any member wishing to rescind any motion shall act in direct compliance with Section 128 of the Roads Act, by giving seven days' notice to each member or submitting to the Secretary of the Board notice of his intention in time to enable him to give the necessary notice prescribed by the Act to each member.

Petitions.

19. Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures; and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature or prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

Tenders.

20. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a Committee appointed for the purpose.

Orders of Debate.

Speakers must not digress.

21. A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Unopposed Notices of Motion.

22. The Chairman may call over the notices of motion on the business paper in the order in which they appear thereon; and if objection is not taken to a motion being taken as a formal motion, may call upon the mover to move the same, and upon the motion being seconded may then, without discussion, put the motion to the vote.

Correspondence.

23. All correspondence with the Board shall be addressed to the Secretary and submitted to the Board. No letter addressed to the Board shall be presented or read by a member.

Consideration of Reports.

24. (a.) If in a report of a committee distinct recommendations are made, the decision of the Board may be taken separately on each recommendation.

(b.) Any report of a committee or any portion thereof may be amended by the Board in any matter it may think fit, or may be referred back to the committee for further consideration.

(c.) The recommendations of any committee when adopted by the Board shall be resolutions of the Board.

Precedence of Chairman.

25. When the Chairman rises in his place during the progress of a debate, any member then speaking or offering to speak shall immediately resume his seat, and every member present shall preserve strict silence so that the Chairman may be heard without interruption.

Notice of Motion: Absence of Mover.

26. In the absence of a member who had placed a notice of motion on the business paper for any meeting any other member may at such meeting move the same, or such motion may be deferred until the next ordinary meeting of the Board.

Withdrawal of Motions.

27. Except as elsewhere provided, no motion, after being placed on the business paper, shall be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Motions to be Seconded.

28. No motion shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions not to be withdrawn without Consent.

29. When a motion has been proposed and seconded it shall become subject to the control of the Board, and shall not be withdrawn without consent of the Board.

Amendment may be moved.

30. When a motion has been proposed and seconded, any member shall be at liberty to move an amendment thereon, but no such amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions and Amendments to be in writing.

31. No motion or amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been reduced to writing if the Chairman so directs.

Further Amendment may be moved on Amended Question.

32. If an amendment has been carried the question as amended thereby shall become itself the question before the Board, whereupon any further amendment upon such question may be moved.

How Subsequent Amendments may be Moved.

33. If an amendment, whether upon an original question or upon any question amended as aforesaid, has been negatived, then a further amendment may be moved to the question to which such first-mentioned amendment was moved and so on, provided that not more than one question and one proposed amendment thereof shall be before the Board at any one time.

Motions for Adjournment.

34. No discussion shall be permitted upon any motion for adjournment of the Board. If upon the question being put on any such motion the same is negatived, the subject then under consideration or next on the business paper shall be discussed, and it shall not be competent for any member to again move a motion for adjournment until half an hour has elapsed from the time of moving the one that has been negatived.

Mover of Adjournment when entitled to Priority.

35. On resuming any discussion which has been adjourned, the mover of such adjournment shall be entitled, if he has not already spoken on the subject under discussion, to speak first.

Notice of Questions to be given.

36. Sufficient notice of every question shall be given to the Chairman or member expected to reply thereto, to permit of consideration of such reply and, if necessary, reference to other persons or to documents.

Questions to be put without argument.

37. Every such question shall be put categorically and without any argument.

Replies and Objections and subsequent Motions received.

38. No discussion shall be permitted respecting any reply or refusal to reply to any question.

Mode of addressing Board, etc.

39. Members shall on all occasions when at a meeting address and speak to each other by their official designations, as Chairman or Secretary, as the case may be and, with the exception of the Chairman, shall rise in their place and stand while speaking (except when prevented from so doing by bodily infirmity).

Speaker not to be interrupted if in order.

40. No member shall be interrupted while speaking except for the purpose of calling him to order as hereinafter provided or in pursuance of By-law.

41. One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment; then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they were moved.

42. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

43. In submitting a motion or amendment the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

44. When an amendment is carried, the motion amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendments may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

Limitation as to Number of Speeches.

45. The mover of an original motion shall have the right of general reply to all observations which have been made in reference to such motion and to any amendment moved thereon, as well as the right to speak upon every such amendment. Every member, other than the mover of an original motion, shall have the right to speak once upon such motion and once upon every amendment moved thereon. No member shall, without the consent of the Board, speak more than once upon any one question, or for longer than ten minutes at any one time, unless when misrepresented or misunderstood, in which case he may be permitted to explain without adding any further observations than may be necessary for the purpose of such explanation.

All Members to Vote.

46. Upon a vote being taken, all members present within the Board room, unless disqualified from voting, shall, and the Chairman, unless so disqualified, may upon the question being put, record their respective votes in the affirmative or negative as each shall deem desirable, but if a member other than the Chairman neglects or refuses to vote, his vote shall be counted for the negative.

Determination of Questions.

47. (a.) All questions shall, if not otherwise decided by law, be determined thus:—Upon a question being put, those in favour shall say "Aye" and those against "No," and the Chairman shall declare whether the "Ayes" or "Noes" have determined the question; or if the Chairman prefer he may call for a show of hands for and against the question. The decision of the Chairman shall be final and conclusive, unless such decision be immediately challenged and two members rise and demand a division.

(b.) Where there is only one dissentient, he may request that his name be recorded in the minutes as opposed to the motion, and it shall be so recorded.

Divisions.

48. Upon a division being so called for, the question shall first be put in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the Chairman and all members present shall vote by show of hands, and the names and votes of the Chairman and members present shall be recorded in the minutes by the Secretary. Any member of the Board present when a division is called for who does not in the manner above indicated vote on such motion, not being disabled by law from so voting, his vote shall be counted for the negative.

Chairman may repeat Question.

49. The Chairman shall be at liberty to put any question as often as may be necessary to enable him to form his opinion as to the result of the voting and declare the same.

Acts of Disorder.

50. Any member who, at any meeting of the Board or any committee, commits a breach of any By-law, or who moves or attempts to move any motion or amendment embodying any matter beyond the legal jurisdiction of the Board or committee, or who in any other way raises or attempts to raise any question, or addresses or attempts to address the Board or committee upon any subject which the Board or committee have no legal right to entertain or discuss, or who uses any language which, according to the common usage of gentlemen would be held disorderly, or makes use of any expression inconsistent with good order and decorum, or who says or does anything calculated to bring the Board or committee into contempt, shall be guilty of an act of disorder.

Members called to Order more than once.

51. Any member who, having been called to order by the Chairman for any infringement of any of the provisions of By-laws or for any breach of decorum, shall, upon the request of the Chairman, withdraw from the Board room for the remainder of the meeting.

Removal from Board Room: Penalty for continued Breach of Order, etc.

52. In the event of a member declining to withdraw from the Board room on being required so to do by the Chairman, the Chairman may order his removal until the termination of the sitting, and such member shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

Disorder.

53. If disorder arise at any meeting, the Chairman may adjourn the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes and quit the chair. The Board on resuming shall, on question put from the chair, decide without debate whether the business shall be proceeded with or not.

Appointment of Committee.

54. The Board may at any time appoint one or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability, or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws, or a resolution of the Board.

Finance and Accounts.

55. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the ordinary meeting, and after being certified as correct shall be paid by cheque.

56. An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received from whatever source, with the exception of money granted by the Government, shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and one or more members of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the Secretary or to any other responsible officer if directed by the Board.

Urgent Works.

57. The Chairman, with one member, or, in the absence of the Chairman, any two members, may, in case of emergency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £10, or any one member £2 10s., which should be confirmed at the next meeting.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

58. Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any committee, or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure, and a breach of this By-law by such person.

Common Seal.

59. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept in a strong box with two locks and keys, one of which keys shall be kept by the Chairman and the other by the Secretary. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the Board.

Prevention of Nuisances.

60. Any person who—

- (a.) Shall keep, or cause to be kept, any abattoir, slaughter-house, pigsty, manure works, works for boiling down meat, bones, blood, or offal, bone mill, bone manure depot, fell-mongery, tannery, wool-scouring establishment, glue factory, soap or candle works, fish-curing establishment, place for storing, drying, or preserving bones, hides, hoofs, or skins, dairy or other work or establishment; or
- (b.) Shall keep, or cause to be kept, any house, passage, yard, way, cellar, drain, stable, cow-shed, earth or other closet or cesspool; or
- (c.) Shall permit any accumulation of stagnant water, manure, dung, offal, or other filth upon any premises owned or occupied by him; or
- (d.) Shall deposit, or cast, or allow to remain upon any road or public place the carcass of a dead animal, or any refuse or offensive matter; or
- (e.) Shall cause or permit any foul or offensive liquid to flow from any land, house, or premises owned or occupied by him in and upon any road or footpath,

so as to be or likely to become a nuisance or injurious to public health, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

61. Any person guilty of any of the following offences shall, on conviction thereof, pay a penalty not exceeding £20:—

- (a.) Riding or driving cattle or horses or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any carriage or cart upon or along any footpath.
- (b.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other material upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or road without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.
- (c.) Burning any shavings or other material or matter in any road or open or public place.
- (d.) Damaging or destroying any dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, or gate under the control of the Board.
- (e.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, printing on or otherwise defacing any house or building abutting or contiguous to a public road, or on any wall, fence, gate, or lamp-post without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
- (f.) Opening or obstructing any drain or sewer or removing the surface of any footpath or road, without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (g.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, discharging any fireworks, using any bow or arrow, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place, or allowing any cart or animal to remain upon any footpath, placing goods upon any footpath, or otherwise obstructing any footpath.
- (h.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile in any road to the damage or danger of any person.
- (i.) Having any awning upon or over the footpath in any road not being eight feet clear

above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway without permission of the Board.

- (j.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any road without the permission of the Board, and not attending to such directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (k.) Furiously or negligently driving or riding along any road.
- (l.) Making any cellar-door or other opening from the footway of any road without the consent of the Board.
- (m.) Plying for hire without a license in the form set forth in Schedule "C" hereto.
- (n.) Fishing off any bridge.
- (o.) Using or having in possession or control any unlicensed vehicle or machine engaged or to be engaged in heavy traffic without having a license in the form set forth in Schedule "B" hereto.
- (p.) Using or having in possession or control any unlicensed cycle or motor without having a license in the form set forth in Schedule "B" hereto.
- (q.) Erecting or cause or permit to be erected any fences with barbed wire abutting on any place within the said district.

General Regulation of Traffic.

62. Every person having the care or conduct of any carriage shall keep the same on the left side or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or carriage passing or attempting to pass his carriage.

63. No person shall ride or drive any horse or other animal along any road at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour.

64. No person shall drive any vehicle between sunset and the following sunrise along any road unless provided with proper lamps as required under the Uniform General By-laws for Regulating Motor Traffic and Standard Lights to be carried by all vehicles, published in *Government Gazette* of 3rd January, 1913, and subsequent amendments published in *Gazettes* of 23rd May, 1913, 5th December, 1913, and 1st May, 1914.

65. No person having the care or control of a horse or other animal, or of any vehicle, shall allow the same to remain in any road of the district, or to obstruct any portion of such road, for a longer period than necessary for loading and unloading the vehicle; provided that where suitable bridle posts are provided the horses may be securely fastened thereto, for any period not exceeding sixty minutes, but immediately upon the request of any officer or member of the Board or police constable such shall be removed.

66. Any person leading any horse or cattle shall, on passing any vehicle or equestrian, keep on the right side of the road, and the attendant must be on the near side of such horse or cattle.

66A. No person shall be allowed to drive between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. mobs of horses, cattle, or sheep through that part of Hampton Street between Phillip Street and Bunbury Street, and through that part of Steere Street between the intersection of Hampton Street and Roe Street.

To prevent Trees falling across any Road or Track.

67. No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or track or reserve under the jurisdiction of the Board without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £20.

68. No person shall set fire to any standing tree upon or near any road or track, and any such offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £20.

To prevent Accidents from Riding, etc., on Bicycles, etc.

69. (a.) No person shall leave any cycle or motor in or on any road or footpath so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle or motor immediately upon being requested to do so by any constable or officer or member of the Board.

(b.) No person shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.

(c.) No person shall ride any cycle or motor round the corner formed by the junction of any roads in the district, or cross the intersection of any of the said roads, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

To prevent Obstructions on the Footpaths.

70A. No person shall permit any box, case, coal, sand, firewood, goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of a road, or on any part of a footpath, within the district after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing and removing same.

70B. And no person shall at any time, day or night, obstruct by seats or resting places of any kind on footpaths.

71. No person shall place, lay, deposit, shoot, or discharge any rubbish or materials or make any hole or excavation whatsoever on the surface of any street, road, footway, or public reserve within the district without having first obtained permission of the Board.

72. Every person shall, after having received from the Board, as in the last preceding section provided, a permit to deposit rubbish or materials or make any hole or excavation on the surface of any road, footway, or public reserve, have and keep sufficient and continuous light burning thereon from sunset to the following sunrise during the time such rubbish or material shall remain or continue so deposited.

To prevent Damage to Footpaths and any other Board Property.

73. No person, without having first obtained the written sanction of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any footpath, gutter, drain, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings or other property of the Board, or under the control thereof.

Preservation of Trees, etc.

74. Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree, shrub, or plant, standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places of, belonging to, or under the care or superintendence of the Board, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants as aforesaid, shall forfeit for every such offence a penalty not more than £10.

Throwing Dangerous Substances on Footways or Roads.

75. Any person who shall throw vegetable substances, or any offensive, noxious, or dangerous substance upon any footway or roads within the district shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £1 for every such offence. Any person or persons placing, or causing to be placed, or broken in or upon any road, pathway, reserve, or park lands under the care or supervision of the Board, any glass, metal, or earthenware bottles or utensils, without having first obtained the consent of the Board so to do, shall be liable, beyond the costs and charges incidental to the removal of any such glass, metal, or earthenware, to a fine, upon conviction, not exceeding £2, in addition to amount of damages caused thereby.

Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

76. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The Board shall have the power to grant exclusive right to use any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the district for holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons; and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all such fences, buildings, and trees, or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, and reserves, and shall pay the Board a fee to be fixed for admission on such occasions.

77. No horse, cattle, or vehicle shall be allowed on any park lands or recreation grounds without the written permission of the Board.

78. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police constable or officer of the Board.

79. The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

80. No person shall sell, or expose for sale, any goods, wares, fruit or merchandise in any park lands, recreation ground, or reserve without first having obtained the permission of the Board, and shall pay a fee, the amount of such fee not to exceed £10.

81. No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub, or plant in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves. Any person offending against this by-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

Erection of Tents, etc.

81A. No person shall erect or allow to remain any tent, pavilion, shed, or other structure of calico, canvas or other inflammable material (except it has been erected by the Board on the lands of the Board within the limit of the townsite boundary, or by the Government on any Government reserve, for temporary purposes only) without a license from the Board, or except for such time and upon such terms as shall be specified in and endorsed upon such license.

The fee for a license for the erection of a tent within the boundary of any townsite within the district shall be the sum of 2s. 6d. The license for the erection of a tent shall be for a term not exceeding three months from the first day of January, April, July, or October preceding the date of issue, but may be renewed by the Board from quarter to quarter upon payment of the quarterly fee of 2s. 6d.

Sand, Gravel, and Timber.

82. Any person who shall remove any sand, gravel, or other materials from any lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without a license in form set forth in Schedule "E" hereto, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

83. Any person who shall cut or remove any timber or bush on any lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without a license in the form set forth in Schedule "E" hereto, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

Construction of Footways, Crossing Places.

84. It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting or adjoining any road or public way requiring access thereto with horses and vehicles from such street to such land across any existing made footway, kerbing, channel, or gutter, having first had and obtained the consent of the Board, to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such form and manner as the regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Secretary, and shall thereafter keep and maintain the same in good and safe repair. Any person not complying with the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5.

85. Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse shall ride or drive, or wheel any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, or shall ride any bicycle, velocipede, tricycle, or motor upon, along, or across any footway, kerbing, or water channel, or gutter by the side of any street, road, or public way, save in each such case upon or by, or at some properly constructed crossing, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding £5, and shall also pay to the Board such sum, not exceeding £10, by way of compensation for any damage done to the footway, kerbing, or channel, as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.

Lamp-posts, etc.

86. No lamp-post, bridle-post, water-trough, telegraph, telephone, or electric lighting pole, or flagstaff shall be erected by any person in any street or road without the written consent of the Board, and upon consent being obtained shall be placed in such position, and shall be painted at least once in every three years, as may be directed by the Board; and the Board may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly posts or poles. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

Prescribing the Removal of Verandahs and Balconies, etc., at expense of Owner or Occupier.

87. Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footways, or roadways, or overhanging same, shall be removed when ordered within such time as shall be notified by the Board, and all

expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah, balcony, or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law, on conviction, shall pay a sum not exceeding £10.

Encroachments or Obstructions to be removed.

88. On the order of the Board, the Secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal, within 14 days, of any building, fence, or other obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, road, lane, or public place under the control of the Board.

In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such obstruction or encroachment has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove same at the cost and charges of the person so offending and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which breach shall be not more than £20 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed therein.

Damaging Roads.

89. No person shall damage or destroy by means of horse, team, wagon, dray, or any other means, any road or portion of a road under construction or repair, and any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

90. Any person who—

- (a) cuts or removes without the consent in writing of the Chairman of the Board timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road; or
- (b) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
- (c) draws, without any consent aforesaid, across the water-side of a road, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
- (d) draws upon a road timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material, when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle, to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which, or any portion of chains attaching thereto, or any portion of any other attachment, trails or drags upon a road, or locks any wheel of any vehicle or implement, thereby damaging road,

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

Cattle to keep off the Roads.

91. The owner of any cattle, sheep, horse, pig, or other animal straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2, and no animal suffering from an infectious or contagious disease shall be ridden or driven on any road. Any animal found so suffering may be slaughtered and destroyed at the owner's expense.

92. The owner of any bull, stallion, or boar straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Copulation of Stock.

93. Any owner who, as owner or otherwise, while in charge of an entire horse, bull, or ass, shall cause, allow, permit, or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to try to cover any mare or cow within the township, or shall cause or permit or allow or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to be turned loose in any yard or other place with any mare or cow for the purpose of allowing such mare or cow to be tried or covered, except in some yard, building, or other premises as shall be entirely and sufficiently screened from public view, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

94. No entire shall be led or exhibited in township at inexpedient hours.

Heavy Traffic.

95. The owner of every vehicle or engine which, together with its load, shall weigh more than five tons, shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own

risk, and shall be liable to pay for any damage done.

95A. A yearly license fee of Two pounds per pair of wheels shall be paid for every jinker or whim used within the district.

95B. No single or two-wheeled jinker or whim shall be allowed on any declared road within the district.

96. The Board may, by notice affixed to any bridge or culvert, declare the maximum weight of any engine, agricultural or other machine, or vehicle of any kind, and of any load or material which shall be permitted to cross such bridge or culvert, and also the pace or speed at which such engine, machine, vehicle, or load shall be driven, led, or taken over any such bridge or culvert, and any person who shall cross any such bridge or culvert in contravention of this By-law shall, in addition to any liability for damage he may have caused, be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Pounds.

97. Any person who shall break, damage, or destroy any pound fence, gate lock, shed, trough, or premises shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

98. Any person who shall obliterate, deface, or damage any table of fees, placard, or other notice required by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

99. Any person who shall release or attempt to release any cattle which shall be lawfully seized for the purpose of being impounded, whether such cattle shall be in the pound or on the way to or from any such pound, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Bathing.

100. No person shall bathe in any river or open public water within the limits or abutting on the boundary of the Road District, within the jurisdiction of the Board, between the hours of six in the morning and eight in the evening, without suitable bathing costume or clothing.

100A. No person over the age of 13 years shall undress or disrobe on the river foreshore for the purpose of bathing within the limits of this district.

100B. No male person shall bathe in that portion of the Blackwood River, within three hundred yards of the west side of the railway bridge, which portion is set apart for the sole use of females for the purpose of bathing.

101. Any person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Water Supply.

102. Any person who shall injure or damage any well, bore, pipe, tank, or place for storage of water under the control of the Board, or any machinery, appliances, or property used in connection therewith, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and notwithstanding any civil remedy for damages so caused shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £5.

103. Any person who shall waste, or allow water to escape, foul or pollute any water contained in any bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, in addition to any other sum which he may be legally required to pay for damages.

104. No person shall pollute or cause to be polluted any watercourse, pool, well, tank, reservoir, or other water within the district.

105. No animal shall be allowed to stray on any roads or places, and no animal suffering from an infectious or contagious disease shall be ridden or driven on any road. Any animal found so suffering may be slaughtered and destroyed at the owner's expense.

Licenses.

106. The several licenses contained in the schedules hereto may be granted by the Board for such periods not exceeding twelve months, or for such purposes irrespective of any period of duration, and upon payment of such fees as shall be prescribed; and if any person holding any such license shall make default in any of the conditions obtained in such license the license shall thereupon become absolutely null and void, and the fees paid therefor shall be forfeited to the Board, and such

person shall, in the event of any breach of the said license, be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

107. The owner of every licensed vehicle plying for hire or engaged in heavy or medium traffic, and of every licensed bicycle or motor shall have their license number affixed on some conspicuous part of such vehicle, cycle, or motor, and any person who shall refuse or neglect to have such number so affixed shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

Penalties.

108. Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed; it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

109. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be deemed liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

110. No person shall commence to build, take down, alter, repair, or add to any building, or do any act whereby any road may be obstructed without first submitting plans and specifications to the Board and receiving the Board's approval.

111. All penalties or other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the district, except so much as may be payable to any informer.

Previous By-laws.

112. All previous By-laws affecting all or any of the matter hereinbefore dealt with shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

Petition to dissolve the Broome Municipality and merge same into the West Kimberley Road District.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that a petition the substance and prayer whereof are hereunder set forth has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and "The Roads Act, 1911," praying for the dissolution of the Broome Municipality and the inclusion of the District thereof in the adjoining West Kimberley Road District.

Petition.

The substance and prayer of the petition are as follows:—

1. That the petitioners form a majority of the rate-payers of the Broome Municipal District.
2. That the Broome Municipality may be dissolved and the district thereof included in the adjoining West Kimberley Road District.
3. That territory may be excised from the West Kimberley and Marble Bar Road Districts and a new Road District to be called the Broome Road District (to include the Broome Municipal District) created therefrom.
4. That such other proceeding as may be necessary may be taken to carry the wishes of the petitioners into effect.
5. That the address at which notices may be served on the petitioners is in care of Streeter & Male, Limited, Short Street, Broome, Western Australia.

Broome Road District.

Excision of certain territory from the Marble Bar and West Kimberley Road Districts, and creation of a new Road District therefrom to be called the Broome Road District.

Notice of intention.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is the intention of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," and all other powers enabling him on this behalf, to—

1. Alter the boundaries of the West Kimberley and Marble Bar Road Districts, by excising therefrom all those respective portions thereof which are comprised and described in Schedule A.
2. Constitute the territory so comprised and described in said Schedule A a new Road District, under the name of the Broome Road District.
3. Declare the Broome Road Board (when formed) to consist of seven members.
4. Divide the said Broome Road District into two wards, with the boundaries, the names, and the number of members described, assigned, and allotted in Schedule B hereto.

NORTH FREMANTLE MUNICIPALITY.

By-law No. 45.—Parks and Reserves.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, the North Fremantle Council doth hereby make and publish the following By-law No. 45:—

By-law No. 45.

1. No person shall damage or interfere with any tree, shrub, fence, soil, or other property in any Park or Public Reserve.

2. No person shall throw stones or other missiles in any Park or Public Reserve, or leave therein any bottle, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

3. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or using obscene language, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or making harangues whereby a crowd is collected, or committing any act of indecency in any Park or Public Reserve, shall be liable to be forthwith removed by any officer or servant of the Council, or by any constable, and shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

4. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in any Park or Public Reserve any goods or articles of any description, without having previously obtained written permission from the Town Clerk.

5. No person shall light any fire within any Park or Public Reserve, without permission from the Town Clerk.

6. No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix, or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted, or otherwise affixed, any placard,

handbill, notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever, upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, flagging or path in or around any Park or Public Reserve, without the written consent of the Council first obtained.

7. No person or organised club shall practise or play at any game on any Park or Public Reserve within the Municipality, without having first obtained a written permit from the Council so to do.

8. No person or organised club having obtained any such permit as aforesaid shall practise or play at any such game, except at such times and upon such portions of the Parks or Public Reserves as shall be specified in such permit.

9. It shall be lawful for any officer or servant of the Council, or any constable, to remove from any Park or Public Reserve any child under the age of ten years not being under the control of some competent person.

10. No person shall erect or place within any Park or Public Reserve any tent, stall, platform, or table for public amusement or for any performance, whether for gain or otherwise, without the consent of the Town Clerk being first had and obtained.

11. No person shall bet, gamble, or call the odds or offer to bet or gamble within any portions of any Park or Public Reserve.

12. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, for every such offence, to a penalty not exceeding £20.
