WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1911-18," it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation suspend the operation of the provisions of the Act, in any district or a part thereof, for any period: And whereas it is desired to suspend the operations of Section 229 of the Act, in so far as it relates to the notification of cases of the infectious disease known as Influenza: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation suspend the operation of Section 229 of the said Act, in so far as it relates to the notification of the infectious disease known as Influenza throughout the State, until such time as this Proclamation shall have been cancelled.

PROCLAMATIONS-continued.

The Fisheries Act, 1905-13.

2144/18; A. & F. 921/18. WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish what-soever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing Australian waters, by means of hisning nets and hisning lines, or either of such means of capture or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:

That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the date of the publica-tion of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette until the 31st day of December, 1919, inclusive.

Schedule.

(1.) All that portion of Western Australian waters known as the Quarries, or Channel, near Cape Naturaliste.

All that portion of Western Australian waters (2.)known as Yallingup Bay, starting from the point of high water mark at the Rocky Point half-a-chain South of the mouth of Yallingup Brook; thence into the water a quarter of a mile; thence North-Easterly to a point a quarter of a mile from the North-West corner of Government Reserve No. 8427A; thence Easterly to the point of high water mark on the foreshore, and back to the point of commencement.

RULES AND DIRECTIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF SURVEYORS UNDER THE DEPARTMENT OF LANDS AND SURVEYS.

Amendment of Regulation 90.

Department of Lands and Surveys

7027/02. Perth, 1st November, 1918.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under Section 161 of "The Land Act, 1898," has been pleased to cancel Clause 90 of the Rules and Directions for the Guidance of Surveyors under the Department of Lands and Surveys, and to substitute the following:--

90. Whenever the nature of the country and other conditions will admit, townsites should be laid out in rectangular sections 8 chains by 5 chains 25 links, each section to be intersected centrally by a lane 25 links wide parallel to its longer side, and subdivided into allotments of a quarter of an acre each, with the exception of the corner lots with a frontage of 100 links and depth of 250 links.

In subdivisions of towns and suburban allotments containing 10 acres and under, all corners at street or road intersections shall be rounded off by circular arcs, the tangents of which shall be of the following lengths, laid off from the intersection of the street alignments:-

- (a.) 50 links where the contained angle is 40 degrees and over.
- (b.) 100 links where the contained angle is less than 40 degrees.

Provided that in the case of corners possessing any special features, the arcs shall be set out as the Surveyor General may direct.

The tangent points and the crown of a circular arc shall be marked in accordance with General Regulation No. 45.

30b. At street or road intersections, whether in town, suburban, or rural land, where corners are truncated or rounded off by circular arcs, the tangent points and the centre of the arc shall each be marked by a flat topped peg three inches square and eighteen inches long sunk fifteen inches in the ground. A tack shall be driven in the centre of each pcg. Reference marks shall be placed as provided in General Regulation 47.

L. & S. 5670/10; L.S.B. 139/10. IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Excentive Council has been pleased to approve of the cancellation of Clause 47 of the General Regulations for the Guidance of Surveyors, and the substitution of the following in lieu thereof, to take effect forthwith :-


Clause 47.-In any subdivision into allotments containing 10 acres and under, street or road intersections shall be referenced as follows :--

Two corners .-- Two reference marks shall be placed at distances of five (5) links from one of the corners on the alignments produced. See Diagram A.



Four or more corners.--At least two corners shall be similarly referenced.

In cases where the angles have been rounded off (or truncated) and included in the streets, the reference marks shall be placed as shown on Diagram B.



Reference marks to be of galvanised iron tube, iron bar, or glass, and not less than half-inch diameter and 15 inches long. The upper surface of the mark shall be sunk at least six inches below the natural surface of the ground.

And of the amendment of the said Regulations by the inclusion of the following additional regulation to be known as No. 44a:-

Clause 44a.—It shall be obligatory on the part of any surveyor defining the boundaries of any pastoral lease

to lodge with the Surveyor General his field book. together with a certified plan compiled therefrom of the survey of any pastoral lease carried out by him or under his immediate supervision, within three months from the completion of any such survey on the ground, or such time as the Surveyor General may allow.
