The Fisheries Act, 1905-13.

3109/16; A. & F. 2887/14.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit (*inter alia*) all persons from—

(a) Taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture,

in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of any year: And whereas the "Prawn" is a prescribed species of fish within the meaning of this provision: And whereas by Section 17 of the same Act the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

That those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule shall be closed against the taking of "Prawns" by means of any net other than a hand-scoop net (such net not to exceed a total length of nine feet upon either the cork line or lead line) from the date of the publication in the *Government Gazette* of this Proclamation until the 31st day of December, 1919, inclusive: And further, that any net which does not exceed 25 fathoms in length and has a mesh throughout the whole of the net of not less than one-half inch, measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall be a lawful net when used or intended to be used for the capture of "Prawns" in any Western Aus-

tralian waters except those portions defined in the Schedule hereto.

That portion of the Swan River extending in a West-erly and Southerly direction downwards to its entrance at Fremantle from a line drawn from the Point Walter Jetty (Walter Point) to Point Resolution, and the Swan River and its tributaries extending upwards in a North-erly and North-Easterly direction to its head from the Narrows at Mill Point.

That portion of the Canning River and its tributaries upwards to its head from the Lower Canning Bridge.

*The Roads Act, 1911.**Perth Road District.**Building Regulations.*

P.W. 2382/18.

WHEREAS by Regulation 2 of the Building Regulations contained in the Second Schedule to "The Roads Act, 1911," as amended by "The Roads Act Amendment Act, 1912," it is provided, in reference to buildings on any block of land laid out for such purpose, that the area allotted to any building and the open space used in connection with such building shall together be not less than the area for the time being fixed by proclamation as the proper area to be allotted to such building: And whereas it is desirable that such area should be fixed for the Perth Road District as hereinafter provided: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the proper area to be allotted to every building and the open space to be used therewith shall, in the Perth Road District, be:—

"A," for Residential Purposes.—An area of ground having a frontage of not less than 44 feet with a minimum depth of 132 feet; except in cases where it can be shown that the title to the land was held prior to the passing of these By-laws and that such land has a frontage of not less than 33 feet with a minimum depth of 132 feet.

"B," for Shop or Trade Purposes.—An area of ground having a frontage of not less than 16ft. 6in. between the centre of the side walls, with a minimum depth of 120 feet.

*The Roads Act, 1911.**Avon Road District—Alteration of Ward Boundaries.*

P.W. 3505/18; Ex. Co. 4151.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council alter the boundary of any Road District or Ward and transfer portion thereof to another Road District or Ward: And whereas it is desirable to alter the boundaries of the South-East and South-West Wards of the Avon Road District, and whereas due notice of the intention of the Governor in Executive Council to exercise such power has, in accordance with the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," been duly published in the *Government Gazette* and served on the Board concerned, in the manner prescribed by the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," and all other powers therein enabling him, doth hereby alter and amend the boundaries between the South-East and South-West Ward of the Avon Road District by transferring from the South-East Ward to the South-West Ward all that territory set forth and described in the accompanying Schedule, and the boundaries of the South-East and South-West Wards are hereby altered and amended to the extent set forth in the said Schedule accordingly.

To come into force on and from the 1st day of January, 1919.

On the Southward by a line commencing at the last-named point and extending Westward along the South boundary of Location 15506 to its South-West corner. On the Westward by a line commencing at the last-mentioned point and extending Northward, Eastward, and again Northward along a Western, a Northern, and again a Western boundary of Location 15506, along the Western boundaries of Locations 10697, 12727, 9991, 9990, 9996, and 8548 to the South boundary of Location 7673; thence Westward along the Southern boundary of Locations 7673 and 7575 to the latter's South-West corner; thence Northward along the Western boundaries of Locations 7675, 8569, and part of that of 8675 to the South-East corner of Location 9550; thence Westward along the Southern boundary of Location 9550 to its South West corner; thence Northward along the Western boundaries of Locations 9550, 10345, 5800, and 5801, and the latter's continuance to the starting point.

Also all that piece or parcel of land bounded on the Northward by lines commencing at the West corner of Avon Location 11196, and extending North-Eastward

and South-Eastward along its North-Western boundaries and the latter's continuance to the North-Western boundary of Location 11193; thence North-Eastward along part of the latter's North-Western boundary to its North corner. On the Eastward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned point, and extending South-Eastward along the North-Eastern boundary of Location 11193 to its East corner; thence North-Eastward and Southward along part of the North-Western and Eastern boundaries of Location 10606, Westward and Southward along a Northern and a Western boundary of Location 18734, and continuing Southward to and along part of the Western boundary of Location 6838 to a North-Eastern corner of Location 10443; thence South-Westward and Southward along the North-Eastern and Western boundaries of Location 10443 and the Western boundary of Location 10442, and its continuance to the North boundary of Location 8673. On the Southward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned point and extending Westward to and along the Southern boundary of Location 10440 to its South-West corner. On the Westward by lines commencing at the aforesaid South-West corner, and extending Northward along an Eastern boundary of Location 10256, part of the South-Eastern and the Eastern boundaries of Location 10510 to the latter's North-East corner; thence South-Westward along part of the Northern boundary of Location 10510 to a point in prolongation Southward of the Eastern boundary of Location 10290; thence in a generally Northerly direction along the Eastern boundaries of Locations 10290 and 10544, the North-Eastern boundaries of Locations 12369 and 11194, and to and along the North-Eastern boundaries of Location 6498 to a point in prolongation of the North-West boundary of Location 11196; thence following said prolongation to the starting point.

FIRST ASSIGNMENT.—Know ye that we have assigned you and each and every of you to be Our Justices to keep Our Peace in Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies either alone or with any one or more of Our Justices now or hereafter appointed in Our said State and its Dependencies and to keep and cause to be kept all laws for the preservation of the Peace and for the quiet rule and good Government of Our People in Our said State and its Dependencies according to the form and effect of the same and to punish all persons offending against them or any of them in the said State and its Dependencies as by the said laws is provided and to cause to come before you all persons within our said State and its Dependencies who use threats to any of Our People to find security for keeping the Peace or for their good behaviour towards Us and Our People : AND if they refuse to find such security then to cause them to be safely kept until they find such security :

SECOND ASSIGNMENT.—We have also assigned you and each and every of you either alone or with any one or more of such Justices now or hereafter appointed as aforesaid to inquire the truth concerning all manner of crimes misdemeanours and offences concerning which Our Justices of the Peace may lawfully or ought to inquire by whomsoever and in what manner soever done perpetrated or attempted in Our said State and its Dependencies : AND upon all complaints before you to issue such process against the persons charged until they are taken or surrender themselves as may by law be issued :

THIRD ASSIGNMENT.—We have also assigned you and each and every of you either alone or with any one or more of such Justices now or hereafter appointed as aforesaid to have exercise and discharge all other the powers authorities and duties which under or by virtue of any law of Our Realm or of Our said State belong or appertain to the office of Justices of the Peace in or for Our said State :

AND THEREFORE We command you and each and every of you that you diligently apply yourselves to keep and cause to be kept the Peace and all Laws of Our Realm and of Our said State and that at certain days and places duly appointed for these purposes you make inquiries into the premises and hear and determine all and singular the matters aforesaid and perform and fulfil the duties aforesaid doing therein what is just according to the laws of Our Realm and of Our said State: AND We command Our Sheriff and other officers of Our said State to aid you by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the premises.

In testimony whereof We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Our said State to be hereunto affixed.

FIRST ASSIGNMENT.—Know ye that we have assigned you and each and every of you to be our Justices to keep Our Peace in our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies either alone or with any one or more of our Justices now or hereafter appointed in Our said State and its Dependencies and to keep and cause to be kept all laws for the preservation of the Peace and for the quiet rule and good Government of Our People in Our said State and its Dependencies according to the form and effect of the same and to punish all persons offending against them or any of them in the said State and its Dependencies as by the said laws is provided and to cause to come before you all persons within Our said State and its Dependencies who use threats to any of Our People to find security for keeping the Peace or for their good behaviour towards Us and Our People: AND if they refuse to find such security then to cause them to be safely kept until they find such security:

SECOND ASSIGNMENT.—We have also assigned you and each and every of you either alone or with any one or more of such Justices now or hereafter appointed as aforesaid to enquire the truth concerning all manner of crimes misdemeanours and offences concerning which Our Justices of the Peace may lawfully or ought to enquire by whomsoever and in what manner soever done perpetrated or attempted in Our said State and its Dependencies: AND upon all complaints before you to issue such process against the persons charged until they are taken or surrender themselves as may by law be issued:

THIRD ASSIGNMENT.—We have also assigned you and each and every of you either alone or with any one or more of such Justices now or hereafter appointed as aforesaid to have exercise and discharge all other the powers authorities and duties which under or by virtue of any law of Our Realm or of Our said State belong or appertain to the office of Justices of the Peace in or for Our said State:

AND THEREFORE we command you and each and every of you that you diligently apply yourselves to keep and cause to be kept the Peace and all laws of Our Realm and of our said State and that at certain days and places duly appointed for these purposes you make enquiries into the premises and hear and determine all and singular the matters aforesaid and perform and fulfil the duties aforesaid doing therein what is just according to the laws of Our Realm and of Our said State: AND we command Our Sheriff and other Officers of Our said State to aid you by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the premises.

In testimony whereof We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Our said State to be thereunto affixed.

WITNESS Our trusty and well-beloved Sir William Grey Ellison-Macartney, Privy Councillor, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, at Perth, this 19th day of November, in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighteen.
