The Health Act. 1911-18. Infectious Diseases.

M.P.H. 2488/18.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 3 of "The Health Act, 1911-18," that the term "infectious disease" means and includes certain specified diseases, and also any other disease which the Governor may bring under the provisions of the Act: And whereas it is desired to bring under the provisions of the Act the disease known as pneumonic influenza: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby bring under the provisions of the said Act the disease above mentioned, that is to say, pneumonic influenza: And whereas under Section 202 of the said Act the Governor may declare any infectious disease to be a dangerous infectious disease, and whereas it is desired to declare pneumonic influenza to be a dangerous infectious disease: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor as aforesaid does hereby declare pneumonic influenza to be a dangerous infectious disease.

M.P.H. 2488/18.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 205 of "The Health Act, 1911-18," the Commissioner of Public Health may, if authorised by the Minister, exercise, and delegate to any public health official, certain specified powers for the purpose of more effectually checking or preventing the spread of any dangerous infectious disease; and whereas the said Commissioner may exercise any other power conferred on him under the said Act, by the Governor; and whereas it is considered necessary that certain other powers be conferred on the said Commissioner: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby, in accordance with the power and authority of the said Act, confer on the Commissioner of Public Health power and authority, if authorised by the Minister from time to time, and for such time as the Minister thinks fit, to exercise and delegate to any Public Health official the following special powers within and with respect to any district in the State for the purpose of more effectually checking and preventing the spread of any dangerous infections disease:

- 1. He may prohibit all or any public meetings or public gatherings.
- 2. He may close all or any places of public entertainment, including theatres, picture halls and concert halls, and all or any places of public resort, and all or any other premises where the public may congregate, whether for pleasure or business.
- 3. He may close all or any churches or other places of public worship, and all or any schools or colleges.
- 4. He may regulate and control the out-patient departments of general hospitals.
