WHEREAS by a motion agreed to in the Legislative Assembly of the said State of Western Australia the opinion was expressed that a Royal Commission should be appointed to inquire into the death of Francis Andinach, in the Claremont Asylum, on the 29th June: Now therefore I, the Right Honourable Sir William Grey Ellison-Macartney, P.C., K.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, do hereby appoint you, the said Honourable Robert Bruce Burnside, a Commissioner for the purpose of inquiring into the death of Francis Andinach, in the Claremont Hospital for the Insane, on the 29th day of June, 1918; and I do hereby desire and request that you do, as soon as the same can conveniently be done (using all diligence), report to me, in writing, your proceedings in virtue of this Commission.

And I declare this to be a Royal Commission within the meaning of "The Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902."

to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby declare that the Opossum shall be at all times strictly preserved generally throughout the State, from the 1st day of January, 1919, until the 31st day of December, 1919.

The Early Closing Act, 1902.

M.P.H. 907/15.

WHEREAS by "The Early Closing Act, 1902," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, temporarily suspend the operation of the said Act, in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed for any shop or shops: And whereas it is expedient to exercise such power, in manner hereinafter appearing: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation suspend the operation of the said Act (including all amendments thereof) on the 24th day of December, 1918, between the hours of six o'clock and ten o'clock in the evening, in so far as it applies to the closing time of all shops situated in all the shop districts throughout the State.

IN pursuance of Section 34 of "The Rabbit Act, 1902," and all other powers me in this behalf enabling, I hereby declare, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, the domestic cat run wild or at large to be the natural enemy of the rabbit, and prohibit the wounding, killing or capturing, selling or disposing thereof, within the whole of the State of Western Australia, without a special permit in that behalf.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Extension No. 2 to Sewerage Reticulation Area No. 16, Perth District.

Description of proposed works.—Reticulation sewers constructed of 6-inch diameter stoneware pipes, with all manholes and other apparatus connected therewith.

The localities in which the proposed works will be constructed and area to be drained.—As shown on Plan W.S., S., & D.D. No. 3359, deposited at the office of the Minister.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 12th day of December, 1918.

Constitution of Health District at Dalwallinu under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911."

M.P.H. 2634/18.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 19 of "The Health Act, 1911," that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute any portion of the State, not being a Municipal District, to be a Health District, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the order: And whereas it is desired to constitute a Health District with the boundaries and under the name hereinafter specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute the area of land embraced in the under-mentioned boundaries a Health District under the provisions of the said Act; such District to be styled the Dalwallinu Health District.

Boundaries.—All that area included in the Townsite of Dalwallinu (Reserve No. 1882, containing 1,000 acres).

*The Health Act, 1911-18.**Infectious Diseases.*

M.P.H. 2819/18.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 205 of "The Health Act, 1911-18," the Commissioner of Public Health may, if authorised by the Minister, exercise, and delegate to any public health official, certain specified powers for the purpose of more effectually checking or preventing the spread of any dangerous infectious disease: And whereas the said Commissioner may exercise any other power conferred on him under the said Act by the Governor: And whereas it is considered necessary that certain other powers be conferred on the said Commissioner: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby, in accordance with the power and authority of the said Act, confer on the Commissioner of Public Health power and authority, if authorised by the Minister from time to time, and for such time as the Minister thinks fit, to exercise and delegate to any Public Health official the following special powers within and with respect to any district in the State, for the purpose of more effectually checking and preventing the spread of any dangerous infectious disease:—

1. He may requisition the use of buildings, premises, and things which in his opinion are needed for, or in connection with the treatment of patients; or their transport, feeding, or accommodation; provided that the Commissioner shall pay a reasonable sum for the use or hire of any buildings, premises, and things, and provided further that, if the Commissioner and the owner, or, in the case of a building, the owner or occupier, cannot agree upon a reasonable sum, then such sum shall be assessed by arbitration under "The Arbitration Act, 1895."

Municipal Corporations Act, 1906, and The Roads Act, 1911.

Dissolution of the Broome Municipality and inclusion of the District thereof in the West Kimberley Road District.

P.W. 2783/18; Ex. Co. 4332.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and "The Roads Act, 1911," it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, dissolve any Municipality and include the District thereof in any adjoining Road District: And whereas it is desirable to dissolve the Municipality of Broome and to include the District thereof in the West Kimberley Road District: And whereas notices of intention to do so have been duly given and published in accordance with the respective requirements of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and "The Roads Act, 1911"; Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby dissolve the Municipality of Broome and order that the District thereof be included in the West Kimberley Road District as from the 31st December, 1918.

*Fremantle Water Supply.**The Public Works Act, 1902.*

1. No person shall deposit any filth, refuse, or other deleterious matter in any tidal or inland waters, or into any watercourse, whether dry or not, leading into the same.
2. No person shall deposit any filth, refuse, or other deleterious matter or discharge any matter from mining works, sawmills, gas works, or other manufactories, or boiling-down or woolwashing establishments, in such manner or place as to cause or be likely to cause the destruction of fish or injury to any fishing grounds.
