Resolution.
WHEREAS by Section 267 of "The Health Act, 1911-18," it is provided that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which By-laws may be made by a Local Authority under any of the provisions of the said Act, and that a Local Authority may, of its own motion, by resolution, adopt the whole or any portion of such By-laws: And whereas Model By-laws have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the said section (and published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of November, 1914): Now, therefore, it is resolved and determined by the Bayswater Road Board, being a Local Health Authority within the meaning of the said Act, that Series "A" of such Model By-laws (with the exthat Series "A" of such Model by-laws (with the exception of By-law 34 and Subsections (a) and (b) of By-law 37) be adopted for the district of Bayswater: And whereas under the same Act a Local Health Authority may make By-laws: Now, therefore, the Bayswater Road Board doth hereby make the following By-laws:—

By-law 34.-Keeping of Swine.

No person shall keep swine within that portion of the district embraced within the following boundaries:
Bounded by the Swan River on the South side, and the Sounded by the Swan Kiver on the South side, and the Southern side of the Eastern Railway and part of Swan Locations S and Y on the East and West respectively; nor within one mile North of the Eastern Railway line, and part of Swan Locations S and Y on the East and West respectively; line from Locations S and Y to run parallel with the railway fence on the Northern side of Railway Reserve; except under the conditions specified

- (a) The number of pigs shall not exceed (2) two.
 (b) The pigs must be for private consumption.
 (c) The permission of the Local Health Authority must be obtained in writing.

This permission shall be subject, in writing, to be revoked by the said Local Health Authority at any time. Any person keeping pigs contrary to the conditions of the above By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than 5s, nor more than £5.

By-law 37, s.s. (a).—Keeping of poultry or pigeons. The occupier of any premises shall not keep any pigeons or poultry within 20 feet of any dwelling house, and where pigeons are kept they shall be continually confined except one hour per day.
