MINGENEW COMMON RESERVE 9693. By-laws.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 1st September, 1908, and made pursuant to Section 96 of "The Roads Act, 1902," the Governor placed Reserve 9693, Mingenew Common, under the control of the Upper Irwin Road Board, as a Board of Manageemnt, with power to make By-laws: Now, therefore, the Upper Irwin District Road Board doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:

Interpretation.

In these By-laws the following terms shall have the

meanings as stated:—
"District"—The locality or area for the time being under the control of the Upper Irwin District Road Board.

triet Road Board.

"Chairman"—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.

"Board"—The Upper Irwin District Road Board.

"Member"—A member of the Upper Irwin District Road Board.

"Road"—Any road as defined by "The Roads Act, 1911."

"Reserve"—Any reserve or common under the control of the Board.
"Person"—Shall include the plural, also a body

corporate.
"Officer":—Shall mean any officer of the Board,
"Ranger":—Shall mean the Ranger appointed by

the Board. '-Shall mean the Secretary of the "Secretary

Board. 1. All stock running on the Common, otherwise than in accordance with these By-laws, shall be treated as

trespassing stock. That with the exception of stock owned by bona fide travellers, travelling teamsters, or as packers, as hereinafter provided for, no person shall run or depasnereinatter provided for, no person shall run of depasture stock of any description on the Common unless the owner of such stock is the holder of a license under these By-laws and prescribed fees are paid, except as hereinafter provided, and the following fees shall be payable in advance in respect of all stock so running or depasturing thereon. Persons residing within the boundaries of the Mingenew Townsite and the Upper Furnia Read District only to have the right to a license. Irwin Road District only to have the right to a license to run stock upon the Common.

3. The scale of fees shall be as follows:—

Sheep—£5 per 100 head or portion per annum or portion of year.

Goats-2s. 6d. per head per annum or portion of

Horses, mules, and asses-20s. per head per annum or portion of year. Cattle—15s. per head per annum or portion of

vear.

Dairy cows-5s. per head per annum or portion of year.

Camels-60s, per head per annum or portion of year.

Except by permission of the Board, only sheep kept for killing by bona fide butchers for supplying the public shall be allowed under license to run or depasture on the Common; and 200 sheep to be the largest number allowed to be depastured at any one time by each butcher or firm of butchers.

- Bona fide travellers, teamsters, and packers shall 4. Bona ide travellers, teamsters, and packers sman be allowed to run their horses, cattle, asses, and camels on the Common for the space of three clear days free of charge. Should that period, however, be exceeded, they shall be charged at the rate of sixpence per head per week or part of a week for all horses, cattle, mules, and asses, and for camels two shillings per week.
- 5. Travelling cattle and sheep waiting for railway trucks shall be allowed to rnu on the Common for two (2) clear days free of charge, and travelling cattle and sheep being unloaded from railway trucks shall be allowed to run on the Common two (2) days free of charge. If these times are exceeded a charge of three shillings per 100 for sheep and 6d. per head for cattle per day or part of a day will be made.
- 6. No license shall be granted to any person to depasture on the said Common at any one time a greater number of horses than 20 head, or cattle a greater number than 40 head, over the age of six months, camels more than 10 head, mules and asses more than 40 head.
- 7. Any person or persons running stock on the Commonage may change such stock from time to time, provided that he or they do not at any time exceed the number for which he or they shall pay commonage fees.
- 8. That it shall be compulsory upon all persons making use of the Common as heretofore provided to furnish the Secretary of the Board or Ranger of the Board with a list giving a correct description of all stock placed by them on the Common, within twelve hours of placing such stock thereon, and to obtain from such officer a certificate showing the number and description of such stock cription of such stock.
- All travelling stock, with the exception of those 9. All travelling stock, with the exception of those travelling to and from the railways, shall be allowed to cross the Common, conditionally that the owner or drover in charge of such stock gives written notice of his intention to travel such stock and to comply strictly with Section 29 of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No.

7).

10. That all annual license fees shall be due and nayable on the first day of January in each year, or on the date of issue of license, if applied for and issued during a current year, and the Secretary or Ranger shall, at any time, with the approval of the Chairman or any two members, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of any fees unpaid.

11. That no entire horse, donkey, pig, ram, bull, or bull camel over the age of six months (except by permission of the Board) shall be allowed on the Common,

and in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereof if known, any such horse, donkey, pig, ram, bull, or bull camel found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in the manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46

Vict., No. 7).

12. The Secretary of the Board shall decide upon which portion of the Common any licensed or travelling stock shall at any time depasture, and shall have power to travel such stock at any time from any portion of

the Common to another portion of the same.

13. The Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever by any horse, sheep, cattle, pig, goat, camel, or ass depasturing on the said Common under the provisions of these By-

The Board shall be sole judge of what consti-

14. The Board shall be sole judge of what constitutes a bona fide butcher, dairyman, traveller, teamster, drover, or packer within the meaning of these By-laws.

15. The Board prohibits the doing by unlicensed persons of any act or thing for which a license may be granted under the provisions of these By-laws; and any unlicensed person doing such act or thing shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws shall produce his license upon being required to do so by any con-

his license upon being required to do so by any constable or officer of the Board.

17. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding £5, and £2 per day for each succeeding breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

18. All penalties and other sums recovered under the
