The Aborigines Act, 1905. Prohibited Area.

2091/18; A. & F. 1260/18. WHEREAS by Section 39 of "The Aborigines Act, 1905," the Governor may, by Proclamation, whenever

in the interests of the Aborigines he thinks fit, declare any Municipal District or Town, or any other place, to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for aborigines or half-castes not in lawful employment to be or remain: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the land situated at King River, near Wyndham, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for aborigines or half-castes not in lawful employment to be or remain.

Amendment of Regulations.

1. Regulations 1 and 2 (Registration of Timber Workers) of the Timber Regulations, published in the Government Gazette on the 4th day of January, 1918, are amended as follows:—

In Regulation 1, after the words "Crown land," the words "State forest, timber reserve, concession, timber lease" are inserted, and the words "other permit area" are substituted for "hewing permit area."

Paragraph (b) of Regulation 2 is struck out, and a paragraph is inserted in lieu thereof, as follows:—

- (b.) a fee of two shillings and sixpence shall be paid for each such registration.
- 2. The said regulations relating to the registration of timber workers do not apply to mill hands, navvies, and general labourers.
- 3. Regulation 12 of the said Timber Regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "hewing permit," and inserting in place thereof "concession or timber lease."
- 4. A regulation is inserted after Regulation 13, and shall have effect as follows:—

13a. No person shall employ any other person (except mill hands, navvies, and general labourers) in the timber industry, or in the cutting or removal of forest timber in any State forest or timber reserve, or on other Crown land, or on any timber lease or concession or saw mill permit area or other permit area in the South-West Divisions of the State, unless the person so employed is duly registered under the foregoing regulations.

Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

5. A regulation is inserted after Regulation 39, and shall have effect as follows:—

39a. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Conservator and with the approval of the Governor, extend the term of saw-milling permits, subject to a revision of royalties so far as the holders may not have fully exercised their rights on the basis of the provision of ten years' cutting.

6. A regulation is inserted after Regulation 40, and shall have effect as follows:— $\,$

40a. It shall be unlawful for any person to hew heart free beams over twelve feet in length. Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding fifty pounds.
