4. At least 24 hours' notice in writing shall be given of every meeting and shall be delivered or court by receipt.

or otherwise to the address of each of the members previous to such meeting.

5. The Chairman shall be selected by the members, and if there is more than one nomination the matter shall be decided by vote. In the absence of such Chair-man the members present shall elect from their number

a chairman for the day.

6. The Chairman, or in his absence, the Chairman for the day, shall have a vote, and when there is an equal division of the votes upon any question, shall have a

second or casting vote.

second or casting vote.

7. Every order, notice, certificate, or other document of the Board relating to the execution of this Act shall, after the approval of the Board, be sufficiently authenticated if scaled and signed by the Chairman and countersigned by the Secretary.

8. Three members of the Board shall form a quorum and no business shall be transacted except at least three members are present.

9. All powers vested in the Board may be exercised by the majority of the members present at any meeting duly held and all questions shall be decided by the majority and by open voting.

10. At all meetings held as herein, unless otherwise

10. At all meetings held as herein, unless otherwise provided, all members present shall vote; but if a member refuses to vote his vote shall be counted for the negative and so recorded on the minutes.

11. The members present at any meeting may, from time to time, adjourn the meeting, and if a quorum is not present within 15 minutes from the time appointed for the meeting the meeting the measure are not as a contract of the measure of t for the meeting, the members present or any one member, if only one is present, or the Secretary if no member is present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not later than twenty-four hours from date of such adjournment, and members shall be duly notified in writing to this effect; provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent the adjournment of any meeting to a later hour on the same day on which such meeting was appointed to be held.

12. No motion to rescind any motion carried during

the previous 12 months shall be considered by the Board, unless previous notice has been given to the Secretary and communicated in writing to the members at least three days before the date of the meeting at which it is

to be considered.

13. No proceedings of the Board shall be invalid by reason of any defect in any appointment or by reason of there being any vacancy in the number of members at the time of such proceedings, provided the quorum is not reduced below three.

14. No member who is not present at any Board

meeting within fifteen minutes from the time appointed for the meeting of same shall be entitled to any remuneration for his attendance unless the Board shall so

agree.

16. The Board may take evidence on oath and may call such evidence or witnesses it thinks fit. The oath may be administered by the Secretary or any member of the Board.

23. At all ordinary meetings of the Board the minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read, confirmed or amended, and the presiding Chairman shall sign them as so confirmed or amended.

24. The Secretary shall have charge of the common seal of the Board and shall have charge of the safe.

seal of the Board and shall be responsible for its safe

custody and proper use.
25. The Board may recommend such regulations as may be necessary or convenient for the carrying out of the provisions of the Act; but no such recommendation shall be finally passed or adopted except at a full meeting of the Board.

26. The order of business at Board meetings shall

be:-

(a) Confirmation of minutes.(b) Business arising out of minutes or any communication or otherwise which the Chairman may consider should take precedence.

- (c) Consideration of properties offered.
 (d) Granting of certificates of qualification to discharged soldiers.
- (e) Applications from discharged soldiers to settle on the land, etc.
 (f) Simultaneous applications.
 (g) Assistance and advances by Agricultural

Bank.

- (h) Reports of Committees.
 (i) General business or any other matter not coming under the above heading, including notices of motion.
- 27. Any member may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be handed to the Secretary at least twenty-four hours previous to the time of meeting, and the substance of such notice to be communicated by the Secretary to the members on notice paper.
- 28. Notices of meeting shall give brief particulars of the matters to be debated, notices of motion, adjourned debates or decisions.
- 29. If it is found impossible to clear up the notice paper at any meeting, then the matters not dealt with shall take precedence at the next following ordinary meeting unless a special meeting shall be called for consideration thereof.
