WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality; Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 17116 should vest in and be held by the Hon. the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage in trust for the purpose of "Water": Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Hon. the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage in trust for the purpose aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act.

THE ABORIGINES ACT, 1905.

501/19; A. & F. 234/19.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following additional Regulation under "The Aborigines Act, 1905," and numbered 12A.

### Regulation 12A.

AT any time after the Minister has decided, pursuant to Section 12 of "The Aborigines Act, 1905," to cause any aboriginal to be removed to and kept within the boundaries of a reserve or to be removed from one reserve or district to another reserve or district and kept therein, he may issue his warrant according to the form 10 in the Schedule hereto directed to all or any officers of the police of the State directing them to remove such aboriginal and convey him within the boundaries of the reserve or from one reserve or district to and within another and him safely to keep during the Minister's pleasure within the reserve or district to and within which he shall be conveyed pursuant to the Warrant. Such Warrant shall continue in force notwithstanding the demise of or the vacation of office by the Minister.

Any Minister charged for the time being with administration of the said Act may at any time issue any warrant in aid of or substitution for the original warrant in order to carry into effect the purposes thereof.

By-law restricting Traffic for Motor Roads.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Board of any Road District is empowered to make By-laws for any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act; and whereas the Ashburton Road Board is desirous of making by-laws for the purpose herein as positioned. Now therefore the Ashburton Road Board is desirous of making by-laws for the purpose herein as mentioned: Now, therefore, the Ashburton Road Board doth, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every power enabling it in this behalf, hereby make and publish the following By-law:-

#### Motor and Cycle Traffic.

The roads described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby set apart for Motor and Cycle traffic only as from the date of the publication of these By-laws in the Government Gazette.

No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor car, motor wagon, motor cycle or cycle, without pneumatic tyres, on any road for the time being reserved for motor and cycle traffic.

No person shall drive or ride any animal on any road for the time being reserved for motor and cycle traffic. Any person offending against any provision of these By-laws shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.
