Regulations for the treatment of Auriferous Copper Ores at the State Smelting Works, Phillips River Goldfield.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred by Section 29 of "The Mining Development Act, 1902," has been pleased to cancel the Regulations for the purchase of Auriferous Copper Ores at the State Smelting Works, Phillips River Goldfield, which were published in the *Government Gazette* of the 2nd day of July, 1915, and to make the following Regulations in their place.

THE MINING DEVELOPMENT ACT, 1902.

Regulations for the treatment of Auriferous Copper Ores at the State Smelting Works, Phillips River Goldfield.

1. In the following Regulations—
 "The Minister" shall mean the Minister for Mines, or any acting Minister for Mines.
 "The Works" shall mean the State Smelting Works, near Ravensthorpe, in the Phillips River Goldfield.
 "The Manager" shall mean the person appointed by the Minister to have the control and direction of the Works and all operations thereat.
 "The Ore Receiver" shall mean the person appointed by the Minister to receive, sample, and assay the material presented at the Works for treatment.
 "The Owner" shall mean the person sending ore or material to the Works for treatment.
2. All ores shall be delivered free of charge at the Works, on such place as may be directed from time to time by the Ore Receiver.
3. The Ore Receiver shall be the sole judge as to whether any parcel of ore shall be accepted for treatment or not, and may order the removal of any ore which he thinks unsuitable; whereupon the owner shall remove it forthwith from the Works.
4. (1) As soon as practicable after receipt of a parcel of ore it shall be weighed at the Works, and the weight so determined shall be taken to be the true gross weight thereof.
 (2) The percentage of moisture present will be determined by assay, and deducted from the gross weight, and the net weight so obtained shall be the weight upon which the ore is treated.
 (3) The ton used shall be the standard ton of 2,240lbs.
5. The owner, or his representative, may be present during the weighing and sampling of parcels of ore, but shall take no part in the handling thereof, nor interfere in any way with the weighing or sampling, nor approach the ore being sampled nearer than is allowed by the Ore Receiver.
6. (1) After weighing, the ore shall be sampled according to such method as the Ore Receiver shall decide, and three samples shall be drawn—one for assay at the Works; one for the owner, and the third as an umpire sample.
 (2) The umpire sample shall be sealed in the presence of the owner or his representative, and retained at the Works until required for umpire assay.
7. (1) In the event of the owner not agreeing with the assay of the Works, the umpire sample shall be sent to the Government Assayer, in Perth, whose analysis shall be accepted as final by both parties.
 (2) The cost of the umpire assay shall be borne by the party whose assay differs most from the umpire's result.
 (3) The Government Assayer shall be such officer of the Geological Survey of Western Australia or of the Government Analyst's Department as shall be appointed from time to time by the Minister to carry out such duty.
8. No charge will be made for sampling and assay of any accepted parcel of ore exceeding five tons (5 tons) net weight, but any smaller parcel shall be charged with a fee of One guinea (£1 1s.), except in the

case of a *bona fide* first trial parcel from a new working.

9. All parcels of ore which, after sampling, are found unsuitable for treatment by the Works shall be charged with a fee for sampling and assay of One guinea (£1 1s.) for each five tons or fraction of five tons net weight contained therein.

10. Assays for copper shall be made by such wet process as the Ore Receiver shall determine, and assays for gold and silver by fire methods, or by any combination of wet and fire methods that may appear to him most suitable.

11. After agreement of assays, the following deductions shall be made from the agreed assay values, in order to arrive at the amounts of the metals on which advances will be made, and which shall be the basis for calculation of final settlement for the ore:—

No copper under 1 per cent. to be taken into account. Deductions for fractions of 1 per cent. in assays exceeding 1 per cent. to be taken from the next higher figure shown on the table, e.g.:—

Assay being 0.97 per cent., no copper would be taken into account.

Assay being 6.00 per cent., deduction 1.02 would be made and 4.98 per cent. taken into account.

Assay being 8.27 per cent., deduction 1.19 would be made as for 8.4, and 7.08 per cent. taken into account.

Gold.—No gold to be taken into account if assay return is less than 1dwt. per ton. Five per cent. to be deducted from all gold assays returning 1dwt. or more per ton.

Silver.—No silver to be taken into account if assay return is less than two ounces per ton. Ten per cent. to be deducted from all silver assays returning two ounces or more per ton.

12. Any ore or metal-bearing material offered for purchase, which in the opinion of the Ore Receiver requires sintering before blast-furnace treatment may be charged five shillings per ton for sintering, in addition to the foregoing charges, and any ores which in his opinion require screening may be screened through a three-quarter inch screen, and charged seven shillings and sixpence per ton of fines passing through the screen, to cover costs of screening and sintering.

13. Ores which contain iron and sulphur in sufficient quantity to have a value as flux and fuel in the treatment of other ores, may be smelted at a reduced charge, calculated on such value, at the discretion of the manager.

14. Ores suitable for concentration treatment may be treated in the concentrating mill at the Works on terms to be arranged in each case by the manager, subject to approval of the Minister. All operations of the concentrating plant shall be deemed to be part of the operations of the Works.

15. A charge will be made of two shillings per ton of ore accepted at the Works for smelting treatment, and shall be payable to the proprietor of the Smelting Works by way of rental for the use thereof.

16. (1) Forthwith after agreement of assays, cash advances will be made to the owners upon the estimated net returns expected to be realised from the sale of the products of treatment of each parcel of ore, at such rates as may be approved from time to time by the Minister, and which shall be kept posted at the Works in a conspicuous position accessible to the public.

(2) For the purpose of such advances interim charges will be made as follows:—

(a) Up to the end of the year 1918, on account of the cost of receiving, sampling, and smelting the ore to matte of thirty-three shillings per ton of ore (net weight), except when the assay in gold is over two ounces per ton, when the charge shall be forty-five shillings; and towards the further expenses of realising the values therein there shall be an additional charge per ton of ore (net weight) of three shillings and ninepence per unit of copper in the agreed assay value for copper less the schedule deduction aforesaid, and six per cent. of the agreed assay value in gold and silver less schedule deductions.

(b) From and after the first day of January, 1919, the foregoing interim charge of thirty-three shillings will be increased to thirty-eight shillings, and that on gold ores assaying over two ounces per ton to fifty shillings, and the additional charge of three shillings and ninepence per unit of copper will be increased to five shillings per unit of copper.

(c) The Ore Receiver may make an extra charge on any parcel of ore in which the silica (SiO_2) exceeds 40 per cent. of sixpence for each unit of silica (SiO_2) in excess of forty.

(d) The foregoing interim charges may be varied or increased by the Minister, from time to time, by notification published in the *Government Gazette*, and posted at the Works in a conspicuous position accessible to the public.

17. (1.) All the ore-receiving, sampling, assaying, smelting, converting, realisation, and/or any other operations necessary for the carrying on of all the business of the Works shall be conducted entirely under the control of the Minister for Mines, at his discretion, by the Manager and Ore Receiver, together with such other officers, agents, and workmen as shall be appointed and/or employed under his authorisation.

(2) All the expenses of such operations shall be for the account of the owners, and shall be payable by them, severally so far as the costs can be justly distributed to each individual account, and jointly as regards expenses applicable to the business as a whole; and subject to Regulation 19 the rates to be charged for the treatment operations shall be thereby determined.

(3) The Minister may decide which expenses shall be charged to individual accounts and which to joint account.

(4) All expenses chargeable to joint account shall be deducted from the gross proceeds of sale of the products by smelting before proceeding to distribute the balance among the individual accounts.

(5) Credit will be given for interim charges made for the purpose of advances under Regulation 16.

18. (1) The Minister may purchase or otherwise procure for use in the operations all required materials, supplies, and stores, inclusive of such as may be required for repairs, renewals, and additions to the Works, and also inclusive of any metal-bearing fluxes and materials recommended by the Manager, and all such expenditure shall be a charge against the operations.

(2) The proceeds from sale of metals contained in metal-bearing fluxes or materials so purchased or procured will be included in the gross total of proceeds resulting from treatment of the ores.

19. (1) The treatment operations at the Works will be conducted in periods of convenient duration approved by the Minister, depending upon the duration of smelting "runs" or "campaigns."

(2) The end of each period shall be on such date closely succeeding the termination of a smelting campaign as may be determined by the Manager subject to approval of the Minister, and the next period shall commence immediately thereafter.

(3) Accounts shall be made up in respect of all transactions and operations at the Works during each period, but such shall also include expenditure upon and returns from the products of smelting in such period incurred and obtained subsequently to the close thereof.

(4) Final settlement for all the ore smelted in each period will be made as soon as practicable after completion of realisation of the products therefrom.

(5) The Manager, subject to approval of the Minister, may decide what portion, if any, of expenses incurred during any period shall be charged to a subsequent period, and what expenses paid subsequently to the close of a period in respect of ore treated and other operations within such period shall be included in the accounts for the same, the intention being that the accounts for each period shall show as nearly as practicable the just costs incurred on all ore smelted within that period and the total returns received therefrom.

20. (1) The marketable products resulting from the smelting operations in each period will be disposed of by the Minister by sale or otherwise as he may deem to be to best advantage, and the net proceeds therefrom, after deduction from the gross returns of all expenditure of every sort by the Minister on all the operations and transactions in connection therewith, inclusive of interest at the rate of $6\frac{1}{4}$ per cent. per annum on all moneys laid out thereon by him, will be distributed to the owners of the ore treated in the period.

(2) If the account for any parcel of ore should show a loss instead of a balance in favour of the owner, the said owner shall repay the Minister the amount of such loss, which shall be a debt recoverable at law.

21. (1) In order to obtain earlier completion of the accounts for each period, the Manager may estimate outstanding items of cost of which final accounts have not been received, provided such estimated accounts do not exceed five per cent. of the total costs.

(2) Final distribution of the proceeds of the period may then be made in accordance with such actual and estimated costs, and any differences between such estimated costs and the actual figures for the same items finally obtained shall be debited or credited, as the case may be, to the operations of the next succeeding campaign.

22. All accounts against the State for payments due on account of ore accepted at the Works shall be rendered on the usual forms of accounts against His Majesty's Government, and shall be certified as correct by the Ore Receiver before being paid.

23. All parcels of ore received at the Works under the foregoing regulations shall only be so received subject to the owner agreeing to the conditions therein contained and to his being bound by the said regulations.
