#### The Vermin Act, 1918.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 45 of "The Vermin Act, 1918," that the Governor may appoint the Board of any Road District situated within the South-West Division of the State to be the Board of any Vermin District the boundaries whereof are the same as those of the Road District: And whereas that portion of the State situated within the said South-West Division known as the Brookton Road District has been constituted a Vermin District, under the name of the Brookton Vermin District: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the Board of the Brookton Road District should be appointed the Board of such Vermin District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, appoint the Road Board of the said Brookton Road District to be the Vermin Board of the said Vermin District the boundaries whereof are the same as those of the Road District.

Constitution of "Broome Health District under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911."

M.P.H. 97/19. WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 19 of "The Health Act, 1911," that the Governor may constitute any portion of the State, not being a Municipal District, to be a Health District, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the order: And whereas it is desired to constitute portion of the Broome Road District a Health District under the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia. by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute the area of land em-braced within the undermentioned boundaries (being nortion of the area comprised in the said Road District) to be a Health District by the name of the Broome Health District, under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911," as from the first day of January, 1919:— Bounded on the East by the East boundary of the

Broome Commonage; on the North by the North boundary of the Broome Commonage and its extension Westerly to the sea-coast, and on the South and West by low-water mark on sea-coast.

Fire Brigades Act, 1916.

Northam Fire District.

1221/17. WHEREAS by "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute any municipal or road district a fire district, and excise from any district any specified portion thereof and may unite one or more municipal districts together with one or more road districts into one fire district: And whereas it is desired to constitute portions of the Northam Road District a fire district, and to unite those portions of such road district with the area of the existing Northam Fire District as constituted by the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute those portions of the Council, doth hereby constitute those portions of the Northam Road District described in the schedule hereto a fire district to the exclusion of the remaining portion of the Northam Road District, and doth hereby unite such portions of the Northam Road District with the area of the Northam Fire District as constituted by "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," such united district to be included in Part IV. of the second schedule to the said Act, and to continue under the name of the Northam Fire District.

(3) In Avon Location C.—Bounded by lines starting from the South corner of Leake Park, in Kennedy Street, and extending North-North-West to the North corner of original subdivision 10 of Avon Location C; thence West-South-West along the North-West boundaries of original subdivisions 10, 12, 14, 16, and 18, and onward to the North-East side of Robinson Street; thence South-South-East to the North-West side of thence South-South-East to the North-West side of Dorcas Street, and thence East-North-East along the North-West sides of Dorcas and Kennedy Streets to the starting point.

(4) Bounded by lines starting from the South corner of subdivision 180 of Avon Location P1, in East Street and extending North-Easterly to the South corner, and East-North-East to the East corner of subdivision 62, in Yilgarn Avenue; thence Easterly along the South side of Yilgarn Avenue and onward to the North side of York Road; thence Easterly along the said road to the South corner of subdivision 186 of Location P1; thence East-North-East, North-North-West, and West-South-West along the exterior boundaries of said subdivision 186 to its West corner; thence Westerly along the North side of York Road to the South corner of subdivision 2 of Location P1; thence Northerly to the South corner of subdivision 35, in Dempster Street; thence North-North-Westerly to the South corner of subdivision 85 in Goomalling Road; thence East-North-East to that subdivision's East corner; thence North-North-West through the North corner of subdivision 72 to the South-East boundary of subdivision 70, thence (4) Bounded by lines starting from the South corner North-West through the North corner of Subdivision 70, thence 72 to the South-East boundary of subdivision 70, thence the latter's East corner; thence North-North-West partly along that subdivision's North-East boundary to the North-West boundary of subdivision 64; thence West-South-West through its North-West corner to the West side of Goomalling

Road; thence Southerly to the North-East corner of subdivision 40, on the said road; thence West-South-West partly along the North-West boundary of the said lot and the South-East side of a subdivisional road to the right bank of and a branch of the Mortlock River; thence Southerly along the said bank to the South boundary of Northam Suburban Lot 2; thence Easterly through its South-East to the South corner of subdivision 31, in Goomalling Road, and thence South-South-East along part of the North-East boundary of Northam Townsite to the starting point.

# COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 2 of 1918.

Between The Metropolitan Female Printing Employees' Union of Workers, Applicant, and William Detmold, Limited; E. S. Wigg & Son; and Sands & McDougall, Limited; Respondents.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties :-

#### AWARD.

- Area.—This award shall operate over a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Perth.
- Term.—This award shall operate for a period of three years from its date: Provided that, at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date, the Court may alter or amend the same on the application by any party or person affected by its provisions.
- 3. Hours.—Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work, which shall be worked to suit the employer's business.
- 4. Overtime.—All time worked beyond the ordinary working hours shall be deemed overtime and shall be paid for at increased rates as follows:—For the first two hours, time and one-third; afterwards and up to 10 p.m., time and a-half; after 10 o'clock p.m., 2s. 6d. per hour. Provided that any employee called upon to work after 6 p.m. shall be paid the sum of one shilling over and above her wages, as tea-money.

For work performed on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Eight Hours' Day, and Christmas Day, double time rates shall be paid.

- 5. Holidays.—The following holidays shall be allowed and paid for at ordinary rates:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Eight Hours' Day, and Christmas Day.
- 6. Annual Leave.—One week's leave on full pay shall be given annually. In the event of an employee being employed for less than one year, leave shall be given on a pro rata basis according to length of employment.
- 7. Record Book.—Each employer shall keep, or cause to be kept, a record of the time worked by and the wages paid to each worker, including overtime. Such record shall be available at least once per week, during working hours, to the secretary or other person appointed by the Union.
- Termination of Employment.—All employees shall receive seven days' notice of termination of their employment, and shall give similar notice of intention to leave.
- 9. Piecework.—A schedule of any piecework rates operating in any establishment shall be posted in a conspicuous place in such factory, and a copy served on the secretary of the Union, together with notification of the date from which it is proposed the schedule shall operate.

Any girl employee on leaving or being discharged from the employment of an employer shall be entitled to a note stating the date when such employment began and the date of its termination; such note shall be the property of the employee.

Juniors.—The number of juniors in any establishment shall not exceed one junior

to every two seniors. This clause shall not apply to a bag-making department.

Should the number of juniors employed in any establishment on the 29th March, 1919, exceed the above proportion, a continuance of employment shall be lawful, but no fresh arrangements shall be made except in accordance with this clause.

- 12. Under-rate Workers.—Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity, is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and in default of such an agreement within the writing setween the third and the complying the the third and the tempty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating her desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by her to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have again been fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.
- 13. No employer shall permit any employee under this award to do bronzing or dusting off work.
