The Game Act, 1912-13.

Reserves for Native Game.

1030/19; A. & F. 287/19.

WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1912-13," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare any one or more portions of the State or any one or more localities to be respectively defined in such Proclamation a Reserve for Native Game or any particular Native Game: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the portion of the State and localities mentioned that the portion of the State and localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto shall be a Reserve for Native Game.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 45 of "The Vermin Act, 1918," that the Governor may appoint the Board of any Road District situated within the South-West Division of the State to be the Board of any Vermin District the boundaries whereof are the same as those of the Road District: And whereas that portion of the State situated within the said South-West Division known as the Jandakot Road District has been constituted a Vermin District, under the name of the Jandakot Vermin District: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the Board of the Jandakot Road District should be appointed the Board of such Vermin District: Now,

therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, appoint the Road Board of the said Jandakot Road District to be the Vermin Board of the said Vermin District the boundaries whereof are the same as those of the Road District.

# The Roads Act, 1911.

Moora Road District-Alteration of Ward Boundaries. P.W. 5074/18; Ex. Co. 1433.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 8 (e) of "The Reads Act, 1911," it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council alter the boundary of any Road District or Ward, and transfer portion thereof to another Road District or Ward: And whereas it is desirable to alter the respective boundaries of some of the Wards of the Moora Road District, by transferring portions of some Wards to other Wards of the said District; and whereas due notice of the intention of the Governor in Executive Council to exereise such power has, in accordance with the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," been duly published in the Government Gazette and served on the Board concerned, in the manner prescribed by the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of Section 8 (e) of "The Roads Act, 1911," and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby alter the respective boundaries of some of the Wards of the Moora Road District, by transferring portions of some Wards to other Wards of the said District, in such manner that the several Wards of the said District shall be respectively bounded as set forth and described in the Schedule hereto, and the said boundaries of the Wards of the Moora Road District are hereby altered and settled to the extent set forth in the said Schedule accordingly.

ORDER OF THE BRITISH EMPIRE.

LADIES and gentlemen who have been appointed to the Order of the British Empire may, should they wish to do so, wear the Insignia of the Order with morning dress on Official Occasions and at Public Functions.

The Ribbon of the Order may be worn on all occasions, at the discretion of the holder.

The method of wearing the Insignia with morning dress is as follows:-

Knights Grand Cross, Dames Grand Cross, Knights Commanders, and Dames Commanders, should wear the Star only on the left breast of the coat or in a corresponding place on the dress, as the case may be.

In the case of gentlemen who are Commanders, the Ribbon from which the Badge is suspended is worn under the tie, which should be a bow, the Badge hanging about three-quarters of an inch below the bow.

Ladies who are Commanders, and Officers and Members, both ladies and gentlemen, should wear the Badge on the left breast of the coat or in a corresponding place on the dress, as the case may be.

The method of wearing the Ribbon of the Order, which will be the same for all five Classes, both for ladies and gentlemen, is as follows:—

12. The expression "development work" used in Subsection eight of Section seven of "The Dividend Duties Act, 1902," shall mean all underground mining work, other than labour and material, the cost of which is included in working expenses.

# COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 5 of 1918.

Between The Metropolitan Barmaids and Barmen's Union of Workers, Applicant; and R. McCutcheon, W. W. Smith, J. Monaghan, T. Ryan, J. Stack, T. Stack, W. Greenwell, W. J. P. Wing, J. Quigley, J. J. Ryan, J. T. Jeffs, W. H. Thompson, C. Antill, E. Burton, H. A. Merton, and A. Button, Respondents.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties:-

#### AWARD.

1. Definitions: In this schedule, and unless the context otherwise indicates and without limiting the ordinary meaning of the term,-

"Barmaid" or "barman" means any person over the age of sixteen years employed for more than two hours in any day in the sale of liquor by retail in any hotel licensed under a publican's general license, hotel license, or wine and beer license.

- Wages: The wages of a barmaid or barman shall be £3 14s. per week without board and lodging and shall be payable weekly.
- Residence: Except as hereinafter provided, no barmaid or barman shall board or reside upon the licensed premises of the employer by whom she or he is employed.

The above proviso shall not apply to:-

- (1) Any barmaid or barman who is the son or daughter of the licensee of the hotel in which he or she is working;
  (2) Any hotel to which, in the opinion of the Board of Reference, it is inex-
- pedient that it should apply.

The Board of Reference shall consist of the Secretary of the Licensed Victuallers' Association, the Secretary of the Barmaids and Barmen's Union, with the Clerk of the Arbitration Court as Chairman.

- 4. All work done in excess of forty-eight hours in any week, or of nine hours in any one day, shall be paid for at time and a-third.
- 5. Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Sunday: All work done on Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday shall be paid for at the rate of two shillings and sixpence per hour, or portion of an hour, in addition to the weekly wage.
- 6. A barmaid or barman employed in booths on race-courses, or at the Royal Show Ground, shall be paid at the rate of two shillings per hour, with a minimum of sixteen shillings. Time for meals not to count. Railway fares must be paid by the employer. All work done after eight and a-half hours shall be paid for at the rate of three shillings per hour.
- A barmaid or barman employed on booths at Trotting Races shall be paid at the rate of two shillings and sixpence per hour, with a minimum of seven shillings and sixpence.

The time for starting work shall be the time at which he or she is told to be on the ground.

- 7. Uniform: Where an employer insists upon a barmaid or barman wearing uniform whilst at work, the employer shall provide such uniform and shall maintain the same in a reasonable state of cleanliness.
- 8. Meal Time: A barmaid or barman shall be allowed one hour between the hours of twelve noon and three o'clock in the afternoon for dinner; and on every evening, when required to work after half-past six o'clock, one hour between the hours of five and eight o'clock for tea.
- 9. Weekly Half-holiday: The weekly half-holiday shall commence not later than two o'clock on some one week-day in each week.
- 10. Holidays and Annual Leave: A barmaid or barman shall be entitled to one week's leave on full pay after the expiration of each twelve months' service. leave may be applied for at any time after it becomes due.

A barmaid or barman whose service has been terminated before twelve months have expired shall be entitled to payment for one half-day for each calendar month worked.

- 11. Notice: Twenty-four hours' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either side.
- 12. Term: This award shall operate for a period of three years from its day of issue. Either party may, after twelve months from the date of issue, apply to amend, alter, or revise the same.
- 13. Record Book: Each employer shall keep or cause to be kept, at his business premises, record books in which shall be entered the name of each worker, the time each worker commences and ceases work each day, the total number of hours and the amount of overtime worked, the time worked on a Christmas Day, Good Friday, and on any Sunday, and the amount of wages and overtime paid, and the worker's signature for the same.

The worker and the employer shall be jointly responsible for the proper posting of the record books daily.

Such record books shall be so kept as to be open to and available for inspection by an accredited representative of the union during business hours.

- 14. Schedule of Wages and Working Conditions: Each employer shall keep on some portion of his business premises a copy of this schedule of wages and working conditions, where it shall be open to the inspection of the worker at all reasonable times.
- $15.\ Area:$  This award shall apply to the area comprised within a radius of four-teen miles from the General Post Office, Perth.
