POLICE BENEFIT FUND REGULATIONS.

Regulation 6 .- Add the following: -

"This provision shall also apply to any member who has drawn his gratuity upon enlisting for Active Service abroad, and who, upon returning to the State, rejoins the force."

Regulation 7.—Substitute for "four," in the last line, the words "one month," and add the following:—

"7A. The services of any member of the force who resigned upon enlisting for Active Service abroad, and who, upon returning to the State, rejoins the force, and pays arrears of contributions, shall, for the purpose of these regulations, be deemed to be continuous. The period allowed for repayment of such arrears shall be the same as that spent on Active Service. In the event of a contributor leaving the force before the whole of the arrears are paid, the amount unpaid shall be deducted from any gratuity due under the Regulations? tions.

Regulation 18.—Delete the words ''by the Ministerial Accountant.''

Regulation 19.—Repeal existing Regulation, and substitute the following:

"The Board shall cause to be kept a proper record of receipts and disbursements made under these Regulations, and such shall be audited every twelve months by the Auditor General, who shall affix his signature to the yearly statement, and every four years the condition of the Fund shall be examined by the Government Actuary, who shall report on such to the Board."
