WHEREAS by "The Early Closing Act, 1902," as amended, it is provided that in any Shop District polls of electors qualified to vote shall be taken on the question "Do you vote that shops generally throughout the district shall close at one o'clock p.m. on Saturdays?"; and whereas pursuant to the said Act a petition in writing signed by not less than one-tenth in number of the duly registered electors residing within the Collie Shop District who would be entitled to vote at an Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly in and for the Collie District has been presented to the Minister requesting that a poll be taken therein: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, fix Wednesday, the 24th day of September, 1919, as the day on which a poll shall be taken in the Collie Shop District on the said question.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th day of February, 1904, the Municipal District of Collie was declared to be a

District for the purposes of "The Early Closing Act, 1902"; and whereas by a Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th day of April, 1910, the boundaries of the said Municipal District were amended by severing a portion of the District and including the same in the Collie Road District; and whereas it is desirable that the boundaries of the said District under "The Early Closing Act, 1902," should be co-terminous with the boundaries of the said Municipal District as now existing: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by Section 3 of the said Act, do hereby abolish the District under "The Early Closing Act, 1902," as established by the said Proclamation of the 19th day of February, 1904, and constitute that portion of the said District now comprised within and co-terminous with the boundaries of the Collie Municipal District as now existing a District within the meaning of "The Early Closing Act, 1902," in lieu of the District as declared by the said Proclamation of the 19th day of February, 1904.

WHEREAS by "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, revoke or vary any Proclamation made under the said Act: And whereas it is desirable to vary the Proclamation made under the said Act published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of June, 1916, by amending the boundaries described in the Schedule to the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby vary the said Proclamation by the deletion of the Schedule to the said Proclamation and the substitution of the following therefor:—

“All that portion of Western Australia situate Southward and Westward of lines starting from Point John, near Cape Peron, and extending Easterly along the shores of Mangles Bay to the terminus of the Rockingham-Jarrabdale Railway; then Easterly along the said railway, but excluding Mundijong townsite; thence South-Easterly to a point excluding the Williams townsite; thence South-Easterly to the Southern boundary and excluding Tingerup townsite on the Great Southern Railway; thence North-Easterly to the No. 1 Rabbit-proof Fence to the latitude of the Gowjendup Hill; thence East to Mt. Ridley; thence South to the sea-coast at Cape Le Grand.”

WHEREAS by “The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909,” it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.

- Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements—Cottesloe.
- 3in. cast-iron water main in Marmion Street, between Napier and Eric Streets.
 - 3in. cast-iron water main in Clarendon Street, between Marmion and Nailsworth Streets.
 - 3in. cast-iron water main in Broome Street, between Loma and Napier Streets.
 - 1½in. water main to connect 3in. main in Broome Street with the existing 1½in. main in Napier Street.

All mains provided with valves, hydrants, and necessary apparatus, as indicated in red on Plan W.S., S., & D.D., No. 3521.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 22nd day of August, 1919.
