WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 10 of "The Mining Act, 1904," it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation alter or amend the boundaries of a Goldfield or District: Now therefore I, Sir William Grey Ellison-Macartney, Governor of the said State, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers in me vested in that behalf by the said Ordinance, do hereby proclaim that on and after the first day of January, 1920, the existing boundaries of the East Murchison and Mt. Margaret Goldfields and the District of Lawlers of the East Murchison Goldfield and the District of Mt. Malcolm of the Mt. Margaret Goldfield shall be altered, the boundaries of which are to be as follows:—

#### *East Murchison Goldfield.*

Bounded as described in the *Government Gazette* dated the 1st day of November, 1912, at page 4348, to exclude the portion of the Lawlers District as described hereunder:—

"Starting at the South-East corner of the Wiluna District and extending West about 42 miles along the Southern boundary of the said District to a point due North of Survey Mark AN 78; thence South about 64 miles passing through Survey Mark AN 78 to a point due West about seven miles from Survey Mark AN 62; thence East passing through Survey Mark AN 62 about 42 miles; thence North about 64 miles to the starting point."

#### *Lawlers District.*

Boundaries as described in the *Government Gazette* dated the 2nd day of June, 1911, at page 1775, to exclude portion of the said District as described hereunder:—

"Starting at the South-East corner of the Wiluna District and extending West about 42 miles along the Southern boundary of the said District to a point due North of Survey Mark AN 78; thence South about 64 miles passing through Survey Mark AN 78 to a point due West about seven miles from Survey Mark AN 62; thence East passing through Survey Mark AN 62 about 42 miles; thence North about 64 miles to the starting point."

#### *Mt. Margaret Goldfield.*

Boundaries as described in the *Government Gazette* dated the 7th day of September, 1917, at page 1405, to include portion of the East Murchison Goldfield as described hereunder:—

"Starting at the South-East corner of the Wiluna District and extending West about 42 miles along the Southern boundary of the said District to a point due North of Survey Mark AN 78; thence South about 64 miles passing through Survey Mark AN 78 to a point due West about seven miles from Survey Mark AN 62; thence East passing through Survey Mark AN 62 about 42 miles; thence North about 64 miles to the starting point."

#### *Mt. Malcolm District.*

Boundaries as described in the *Government Gazette* dated the 7th day of September, 1917, at page 1405, to include portion of the Lawlers District of the East Murchison Goldfield, as described hereunder:—

"Starting at the South-East corner of the Wiluna District and extending West about 42 miles along the Southern boundary of the said District to a point due North of Survey Mark AN 78; thence South about 64 miles passing through Survey Mark AN 78 to a point due West about seven miles from Survey Mark AN 62; thence East passing through Survey Mark AN 62 about 42 miles; thence North about 64 miles to the starting point."

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Crown Suits Act, 1898" (as amended by "The Crown Suits Act Amendment Act, 1919"), that Rules of Court may be made by the Governor for regulating proceedings under section thirty-five of the said Act, and for prescribing the practice and procedure thereon, and for fixing the Court fees that shall be paid in connection therewith: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Rules of Court under and for the purposes of the said section, that is to say:—

1. The fees set out in Part I. of the Schedule to these rules shall be paid in connection with the matters to which they are respectively applicable.

2. The form of summonses to be issued under Sub-section 3 of Section 35 of "The Crown Suits Act, 1898," after the filing of a petition in a Local Court shall be in the Form No. 1 in Part II. of the said Schedule.

3. Notice of intention to defend may be in the Form No. 2 in Part II. of the said Schedule, and it shall not be necessary to deliver any defence unless it is intended to rely on some one or more of the special defences mentioned in "The Local Courts Act, 1904."

4. A certificate of judgment to be given by the Clerk of the Local Court may be in the Form No. 3 in the said Schedule.

5. Subject to these rules and to the said Act, the rules, forms, fees, and costs made and prescribed under "The Local Courts Act, 1904," shall, so far as applicable, be followed, used, paid, and received in proceedings under the said Section 35.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

*Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.*

*South Perth Water Supply.*

(a) 4" dia. C.I. Main in Angelo Street, from Forrest Street to Lot 4, including existing lifting 1" dia. and 1¼" dia. mains; length about 11½ chains.

(b) 3" dia. C.I. Main in Angelo Street, from Tate Street to Lot 7; length about 13¼ chains.

All mains provided with valves, hydrants, and necessary apparatus as indicated on plan W.S., S., and D.D. No. 3582.

This order in Council shall take effect from the 2nd day of January, 1920.

Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an "Order for Burial," in the form contained in the Schedule C.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustees in such time as to allow at least five working hours' notice being given to the Secretary at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Magistrate's order therefor, be handed in at the office in such time as to allow of at least six working hours' notice being given as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed, the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the Superintendent.

6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.

7. Every grave shall be at least 6ft. deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3ft. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

8. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

9. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the Cemetery, unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Superintendent, at the latest, upon the funeral entering the Cemetery. Should the undertaker or his representatives be unable to produce the said certificate from the Registrar, he shall give a written guarantee to produce same within three days, and satisfactory reasons must be given for the non-production of such certificate in the first instance. In default of the production of the said certificate within three days, the undertaker's license may be suspended until such certificate is produced. The certificate will be retained, but the Coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.

10. Unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance to the Cemetery shall be open daily between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. during the remaining months of the year.

11. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

11a. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified by a Medical Officer of Health or by a Police Magistrate, or by two Justices of Peace, that for sanitary or special religious reasons it is necessary or advisable that the burial take place on that day.

12. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and, if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to a fine of 10s. 6d.

13. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery, or stand opposite the entrance gates. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the Cemetery, and shall proceed at and by such roads as directed by the Secretary or other officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery. No bicycle shall be ridden within the Cemetery.

14. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

15. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

16. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

17. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, grave, or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws, shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

18. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers, which are to be placed in the receptacles provided by the Trustees for same), or any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the Trustees or their representatives.

19. No person shall pluck any tree, plant, shrub, or flower growing in any portion of the Cemetery.

20. No person shall remove or carry out of or attempt to carry out of the Cemetery any tree, plant, shrub, or flower without the written authority of the Trustees or their representative.

21. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever, without the written consent of the Trustees, and any person infringing this By-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

22. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery, other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.

23. Subject to the By-laws, and to the directions of the Trustees, the Secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

24. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased person whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

25. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof, or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

26. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

27. Every such Grant shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

28. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and any space surrounding such coffin to be filled in with charcoal, dry earth, or other suitable material, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

29. In the event of such exemption being obtained from the Trustees, each coffin placed in any brick grave or vault shall be properly lead lined and hermetically sealed.

30. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced, together with the "Grant of Right of Burial."

31. Should the grantee be unable to produce the "Grant of Right of Burial" on making application for a grave to be reopened, for the purpose of interment, through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, and shall pay the fee for a copy of such "Grant of Right of Burial," as prescribed in Schedule A, before an "Order for Burial" will be issued by the Trustees.

32. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of the principal Act (61 Viet., No. 23).

33. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

34. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Secretary or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.

35. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition, to the satisfaction of the Secretary.

36. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of 10s., which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the two preceding By-laws be not complied with to the satisfaction of the Secretary.

37. All material required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery; and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Secretary shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

38. No catacomb shall be allowed.

39. Subject to the approval of the Trustees, each applicant for an "Order for Burial" shall, within three months from date of the application, enclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slate, or stone, and shall cause to be placed thereon a number-plate bearing the number of the grave or vault. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by, and at the expense of the grantee. Should the grantee's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the Trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee. No mounds shall be allowed.

40. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.

41. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the Secretary.

42. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Secretary, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Secretary, shall be removable from the Cemetery.

43. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees in the form contained in Schedule G; such licenses to be renewed annually in the month of July.

44. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—
- (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
  - (b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Secretary.
  - (c.) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Secretary.
  - (d.) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

45. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees an annual fee of £2 2s., and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and unless in the possession of such a "Permit" no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

46. The Trustees may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantees so to do. If the grantees do not desire the Trustees to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Trustees for that purpose.

47. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Trustees, or those licensed by the Trustees, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

48. Any person committing any breach of any of these By-laws and Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws, lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall be forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, the Secretary or other officer of the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.

49. A plan of the Cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation and number of grave, and a Register of all certificates of "Rights of Burial," shall be kept at the office.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at their office on Tuesday, 25th November, 1919.

By-law 106.

During the time any meter is undergoing repairs, or should it cease to properly register the consumption of water, the Minister or any officer appointed by the Minister may, at his option, estimate the quantity of water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during any previous period, or by adopting any other basis of adjustment, as the Minister may determine, and the quantity so ascertained shall be paid for by the consumer.

By-law 107.

If any consumer shall at any time be dissatisfied with any particular reading of a meter, and be desirous of having the meter tested, he shall give written notice thereof to the Minister or his officer within seven days from date of such reading, and thereupon the said meter shall be tested by passing through it a pre-determined quantity of water, and if, upon such testing, it shall appear to the satisfaction of the Minister or his officer that the meter registered more than five per cent. in excess of the quantity that shall actually pass through it at such testing, then the Minister shall bear the expense of and incidental to such testing, and shall also adjust the charge to the said consumer; but if the meter upon such testing shall not register more than five per cent. in excess of the quantity that shall actually pass through it, then the consumer shall pay to the Minister all the expenses of and incidental to such testing, providing that the expense of every test shall be fixed by the Minister; subject to a minimum charge of ten shillings for each test; provided also that the consumer shall not, unless the Minister decides otherwise, be at liberty to avail himself of the right to test the registration of the meter for any period other than the period of registration next preceding the date of reading in respect of which he shall have given notice as aforesaid.

**WESTERN AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS.**

The Commissioner of Railways, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by "The Government Railways Act, 1904," does hereby make the following By-laws, which shall be read and construed with the By-laws made on the 9th day of February, 1914, and approved by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council on the 25th day of February, 1914, as if they were inserted therein between By-law No. 33 and By-law No. 34:—

*33a. Unauthorised stacking of timber on railway premises.*

No person shall, without the written permission of the Commissioner or some person in the employ of the Commissioner authorised to give such permission, stack or bring or cause to be stacked or brought any timber whatsoever on or on to any railway, pier, wharf, jetty, station, land, or other premises vested in, used by, or under the control of the Commissioner or the Minister.

Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*33b. Timber to be removed from Railway premises on demand.*

Every person by or on whose behalf any timber shall be stacked or remain on any such railway, pier, wharf, jetty, station, land, or other premises as aforesaid shall, unless he has the right to retain it thereon, forthwith after demand made by or on behalf of the Commissioner

remove such timber from the place on which the same is so stacked or remains as aforesaid.

Any breach of this By-law will render the offender liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The Commission to remain in force until the said Max Kott ceases to reside in Western Australia aforesaid, or until he ceases to practise the profession of a Solicitor there, or until revoked.

## COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 1 of 1919.

Between Coastal District Committee Amalgamated Society of Engineers' Industrial Association of Workers, Applicant, and A. W. Dobbie & Company; Tomlinson Brothers; J. & E. Ledger; Wright & Gibb; George Kent, Limited; Atlas Engineering Company; and Metropolitan Ironmasters' Industrial Union of Employers, Respondents.

IN pursuance of Clause 10 (b) of the Award in this matter, the Court approves of the terms of the scheme set out below as a scheme providing for holidays and payment for overtime to the employees of the Fremantle Tramways and Electric Lighting Board of Fremantle, and the terms of such scheme shall be incorporated with the said Award in lieu of Clause 2 thereof, so far as regards the said Fremantle Tramways and Electric Lighting Board and their employees.

*The Scheme above referred to.*

Employees to be entitled to one week's holiday on full pay after twelve months' employment.

Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and Eight Hours' Day to be paid holidays. Any work performed on those days or on Sunday to be paid for at the rate of double time.

Any employee called back to work after leaving to be paid at least one hour.

Overtime to be paid as follows:—

On Saturdays for work performed after the usual time for ceasing work until 3 p.m., time and a-quarter. After 3 p.m. until midnight, time and a-half. From midnight until starting time next morning, double time. On other week-days for work performed after the usual time for ceasing work until 8 p.m., time and a-quarter. From 8 p.m. until midnight, time and a-half. From midnight until starting time next morning, double time.

Special men required for attending to consumers' calls to remedy trouble in the evening may be employed and paid—

- (a) four hours per fortnight if required for attendance at depot on alternate Friday night to answer calls, and—
- (b) three hours per week for keeping themselves available alternate weeks at telephone (to be provided by Board) at their own houses.
- (c) Overtime as set out in third and fourth paragraphs if they are called out at any time during the week except the four hours Friday night.

## COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

"All time worked in excess of a night shift of eight hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half calculated on the basis set forth in Clause 3 for payment of night shift."

## COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

*Between The Western Australian Amalgamated Society of Railway Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and The Commissioner of Railways of Western Australia, Respondent.*

WHEREAS by the Award made between the above-named parties on the 28th day of January, 1918, it was provided that the Court might at any time after the 28th day of January, 1919, amend the said Award: And whereas the above-named Union on the 12th day of May, 1919, applied to the Court in the prescribed manner to amend the Award in certain particulars: Now it is hereby declared and the Court doth order that the Award be and the same is hereby amended as follows:—

## 1. Interpretation.

“Casual Hand” means a worker employed for less than one week continuously.

“Barracks” means any building or van provided with bed and clean bedding and cooking utensils, and light and lighting facilities, and water and fuel.

“Married man” does not include a married man whose wife and family are neither resident with nor dependent upon him, but includes a single man who has a parent or child solely dependent upon him and resident in the State of Western Australia.

“Market Towns.”—The following shall be approved market towns:—

2. Workers performing higher duties.—Any worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular pay shall be paid such higher minimum.

## 3. Hours of Duty.—Except as hereinafter provided—

(a) Forty-eight hours, exclusive of Sunday work, shall constitute a week's work for all workers included in Part I.

Forty-four hours, exclusive of Sunday work, shall constitute a week's work for all workers included in Part II.

Provided that during the period between the making of this award and the 31st December, inclusive, workers whose weekly hours are hereby reduced to forty-four hours may be required to work an additional four hours at ordinary rates.

(b) All time worked over the hours fixed for a week's work shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-quarter.

(c) Time worked between Saturday midnight and Sunday midnight shall stand.

(d) The above subclause shall not apply to telephone operators, watchmen, caretakers, or waiting-room attendants, and other attendants whose hours and conditions shall remain as they are at present.

(e) Any worker brought on to work outside his ordinary working hours shall, except when such work, exclusive of meal times, is continuous with his ordinary shift, be paid a minimum of two hours' pay at ordinary rates.

(f) Except at country stations where the train arrangements render it impracticable, each day's work of eight hours shall be completed within ten hours from the time of starting.

(g) Except in cases of emergency, unless due to regular rotation of shifts, no head shunter, shunter, or signaller shall be called upon to work more than ten hours continuously, or shall be called on duty until he has had at least twelve hours off. In this subclause the word “emergency” shall not be construed to cover a mere increase of traffic which could have been foreseen and might reasonably have been provided for without encroaching on the twelve hour rule.

(h) The present practice of calling shunters when rostered for duty outside their ordinary shifts shall be continued.

(i) No member of the running staff shall be rostered for less than four hours in any one day.

(j) Except in cases of emergency juniors shall not be employed (except to act as call boys) between the hours of midnight and 6 a.m., but may be required whilst not calling to attend telephone and to sweep, dust, and clean.

(k) Any employee brought on duty on Sunday shall be paid a minimum of four hours' pay at ordinary rates.

## 4. Promotion.

(a) A worker promoted to a higher position, the minimum pay for which is less than he received in the position vacated, shall be paid his former rate.

(b) A junior worker on attaining the age of 21 years shall, providing he has passed the prescribed examination, be entitled to be appointed as a porter. He shall be afforded the opportunity to receive the necessary instruction and to pass such examinations prior to reaching the age of 21.

(c) Before any promotion to a vacancy shall be made otherwise than by seniority, such vacancy shall be advertised in the “Weekly Notice,” unless in any particular case it is necessary to fill a position without the delay involved by such advertisement.

(d) In the case of a married worker refusing promotion owing to lack of accommodation at the place where the vacancy exists, he shall not be penalised because of his refusal to accept such promotion.

### 5. Retirement.

(a) No worker after six months' continuous service shall leave the Department until the expiration of fourteen days' written notice of his intention so to do, without the approval of the Commissioner.

(b) Fourteen days' written notice shall be given by the Commissioner to any such worker whose services are no longer required, and the reason for dismissal shall be given. Provided that this sub-clause shall not apply to cases of summary dismissal for misconduct, or to workers for whom the Commissioner is unable to find work by reason of any action on the part of any of his employees, or for any other cause beyond his control.

### 6. Allowances and Arrangements re Guards.

(a) Any guard rostered for duty and being informed that he is not required shall, unless he has been notified as provided in sub-clause (d), be paid two hours' pay at ordinary rates, but may be called for further duty without any further period of rest.

(b) Any guard going out on traffic shall be paid not less than four hours' pay at ordinary rates, and no guard shall be called to work more than twice in one day.

(c) A guard attending at the station with a hamper for a trip for which he is booked and which is cancelled shall be allowed 2s. 6d. in respect of such hamper.

(d) No guard rostered for duty shall be entitled to any pay or allowance when notice that he is not required has been left at his place of residence at least two hours before his rostered time.

(e) Guards of goods and mixed trains shall be allowed 30 minutes before departure time to prepare for their trip, and where the distance between the place where they sign on and where they commence duty exceeds a quarter of a mile they shall be allowed an extra five minutes for each quarter of a mile in excess thereof. Guards of passenger trains, other than suburban trains, shall be allowed 15 minutes to prepare before starting on a trip.

Guards of suburban passenger trains shall be allowed 15 minutes before beginning and 15 minutes at the close of each shift.

All guards other than guards on suburban passenger trains shall be allowed 15 minutes at the end of each trip.

Nothing in this subclause shall operate to reduce the time at present allowed to any guard so long as present conditions remain unaltered.

(f) Any guard booked off shall come on duty at such time as he may be directed, before leaving the station, by the responsible person in charge or by the roster posted at the station. Except in cases of emergency, or unless in special cases by agreement between the Union and the Commissioner, the minimum time a guard shall be off duty at home stations shall be twelve hours, and at foreign stations eight hours. In case of emergency, unless for good reason to the contrary, the guard who has been off duty the longest shall be the first to be called on. In this subclause the word "emergency" shall not be construed to cover a mere increase of traffic which could have been foreseen and might reasonably have been provided for without encroaching on the twelve hour rule.

(g) The present practice in regard to the calling of guards shall be continued.

(h) At home stations, should a guard not be able to ascertain when booking off, from the responsible person in charge or from the roster, when he will be required for further work, he shall be free to assume that he will not be required for twelve (12) hours, but at the expiration of that time shall make personal inquiry at the depot as to when he will be required. If not then informed when he will be required, written notice shall be left at his place of residence at least two hours before he is required to go on duty: Provided that if the 12 hours expire after 5 p.m. and before 7 a.m. he shall not be required to make such inquiry until 7 a.m. following.

(i) Any guard standing by at a foreign station shall be allowed full time when not booked off, and half time when booked off up to five hours. If not required for active duty until the expiration of five hours, he shall be booked off.

7. Knowledge of Roads.—Except in the case of new lines opened for traffic, and so far as the requirements of the Service will permit, a guard before being required to take a train over a road with which he is not acquainted shall be allowed to travel over it at least twice with a guard familiar with the road without loss of pay. Should the exigencies of the Service require a guard to be sent over a road with which he is not acquainted, the station-master shall report the circumstance to the Head of the Branch.

8. Away from Home Allowance.—The following allowances shall be granted to workers other than tradesmen and their assistants and labourers working with tradesmen, covered by this award booked off or temporarily lodging away from their home station:—

(a) For the first 30 hours or part thereof the sum of 2s. 6d. where barracks are provided, and 4s. where they are not. After 30 hours and up to 7 days, the sum of 3d. per hour, and thereafter 2d. per hour: Provided that the reduction from 3d. to 2d. per hour shall only be made in cases where the worker shall be stationed for over 7 days in one place.

(b) Where attendance is not provided at barracks an extra 6d. shall be allowed for the first 30 hours or part thereof.

(c) After the first 30 hours a charge of 1s. per night, with a maximum of 5s. per week, shall be made where accommodation at barracks, other than a van, is available, and a charge of 6d. per night, with a maximum of 2s. 6d. per week, shall be made where barracks in the shape of a van or tent with bed and blankets are provided and used.

(d) A worker booked off or temporarily lodging away from home station in a district carrying a higher allowance than his home station shall receive the higher district allowance in addition to the allowance specified above for each twenty-four hours or part thereof whilst in such district, calculated from time of departure from home station to time of departure from foreign station within such districts.

(e) Nothing in the foregoing sub-clauses shall be taken to interfere with the discretion of the Commissioner to make any additional allowance in special cases, or with the discretion of the head of the branch to make a special allowance up to 7s. 6d. per day.

(f) The allowance shall be calculated from the time of booking on to the time of booking off at home station.



(g) The allowance shall not be granted to any worker stationed in and sent to work within suburban areas, unless approved by head of the branch.

(h) The above subclauses shall not apply to repairers at out-camps on their own lengths, but they shall be granted 1s. for each night during which their gang is stationed at an out-camp.

(i) Any worker other than a guard who is not temporarily lodging away from his home station, and who is absent from his home station on duty, shall be paid 1s. 6d. for his second and each succeeding meal: Provided that any worker who in fact incurs expense in procuring his first meal shall be entitled to be paid 1s. 6d. in respect thereof.

(j.) Tradesmen and their assistants and labourers working with tradesmen shall be paid at the rates set out in Clause 6 of the Railway Engineers' Award, Nos. 11 and 12 of 1917 as amended.

9. Travelling Time.

(a) A worker travelling as a passenger going to work away from or returning to his home station shall be paid at ordinary rates for the actual travelling time and waiting time in his ordinary working hours between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., and for his actual travelling time or whilst waiting for train at ordinary rates up to a maximum of eight hours in one day outside the hours mentioned.

(b) Sunday travelling time shall be paid at the same rates and on the same conditions as on week-days.

(c) Workers in breakdown gangs shall, in lieu of away-from-home allowance and travelling time, be provided with board and sleeping accommodation, and shall be paid from the time they leave until they return to their home station, except during such period as they shall be booked off duty if such period shall exceed 10 consecutive hours. Time occupied in travelling shall be paid at bare time rates. Actual working time shall be paid at overtime rates after eight hours' work per day.

(d) Workers on the permanent way when starting from camp shall travel in Department's time and return in their own time, unless they are required to propel the trolley they ride upon, in which case they shall travel both ways in the Department's time.

10. Transfers and Transfer Allowance.

(a) When any transfer is ordered by the Department the worker transferred shall not lose his right of appeal against the transfer, and if on inquiry it is found that a transfer can be arranged with another worker to suit the convenience of the Department, then he shall be retransferred. A worker transferred from one station to another over one mile distant involving a change of residence shall—

- (1) be paid not less than £2 for a married man and 15s. for a single man.
- (2) be paid such further out-of-pocket expenses (if any) as the Commissioner in his discretion shall decide to have been reasonably incurred;
- (3) be granted free passes for self and family, and free railway transport of his furniture and effects;
- (4) be paid actual travelling and waiting time up to a maximum of eight hours per day. No overtime rates shall apply.

(b) The granting of an allowance in excess of that provided above to meet special cases shall be at the discretion of the Commissioner.

(c) Any worker who is transferred from one place to another to suit himself, or who is transferred by way of punishment, shall be entitled to the provision of sub-clause (3) only.

(d) At least seven days' notice shall be given to an employee required to permanently transfer from one station to another.

11. District Allowance.—Workers stationed at Geraldton shall in addition to their ordinary wages be paid a district allowance of 9d. per day for seven days a week.

(a) Workers stationed at Yerbillon or eastward or northward thereof on the Eastern Goldfields line as far as Goongarrie, or at Yalgoo or eastward or northward thereof on the Murchison Goldfields line as far as Mt. Magnet, or on the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe railway, shall be paid a district allowance of 1s. 6d. per day for seven days a week, and this allowance shall be increased to 1s. 9d. per day to workers on the Eastern Goldfields line eastward or northward of Goongarrie, or on the Murchison Goldfields line eastward or northward of Mount Magnet.

(b) Allowance shall not apply where the worker is absent without pay unless such absence is due to sickness and does not exceed three months.

(c) Workers leaving the service for any cause and due for payment in lieu of holidays shall not be paid district allowance for the period of such holidays.

12. Water Allowance.—Water shall be delivered alongside the line gratis to any worker in the following scale:—

- To a married man . . . . . 30 gallons per day;
- To a single man . . . . . 10 gallons per day.

This shall not apply at stations where a public water scheme is available.

13. Uniforms.—The following uniforms shall be supplied by the Commissioner:—

One oilskin suit every two years shall be provided at Fremantle, Perth, Midland Junction, Northam, and Kalgoorlie for the exclusive use of the worker acting as lampman, and for the worker hosing out stock trucks at Fremantle, Midland Junction, Northam, and Kalgoorlie, and for each repairer, length runner, and repairer ganger on lengths between Geraldton and Walkaway, Geraldton and Ajana, and Geraldton and Yuna, and on lengths on lines west of the No. 2 Rabbit-proof Fence, and south of Goomalling.

The uniforms shall be held by the worker and worn on duty only, and shall not be sold or disposed of.

#### 14. Free Passes.

(a) After twelve months' continuous service any worker shall be allowed three second class passes per annum, viz.:—

One "station to station" on the occasion of the annual holiday, provided that such holiday extends over two days and may be issued to cover the full term of holidays due, and two return journey passes. The passes may be issued in favour of the worker and his wife, and members of his family under eighteen years of age, and unmarried daughters over eighteen years of age, all of whom are resident with him and solely dependent upon his earnings, and may be extended to the mother of a worker resident with him and solely dependent upon his earnings.

(b) Upon request, a worker may be granted a separate "station to station" pass for his wife and dependants, as mentioned in subclause (a) hereof, where it is inconvenient for both to travel at the same time.

(c) Workers who have not had an opportunity of allowing their holidays to accrue owing to having taken leave on individual public holidays shall be granted their station to station pass, when on special leave, up to fourteen days.

(d) After six months' service an employee shall be entitled to the passes mentioned in subclause (a) in proportion to length of service.

(e) Any employee who may resign from the service and shall have holidays due shall be granted a free pass, station to station, for the time of such holidays.

(f) **Market Passes.**—Workers stationed outside suburban areas will be issued market passes once per month to the most convenient market town. The passes may be issued in favour of the worker, his wife, or his housekeeper, and children between the ages of five and fourteen years. A worker's wife or housekeeper may be granted a market pass once per fortnight if required.

(g) **Free Freight.**—Domestic supplies up to a maximum weight fortnightly of 2cwt. for married men and 1cwt. for single men, shall be carried free by rail to home station from the most convenient market town, and, in addition, meat, bread, vegetables, when not obtainable locally, shall be carried free from the most convenient market town where same are procurable. All such supplies shall be for the sole use of the worker and his family. This subclause shall not apply to the suburban areas.

#### 15. Privilege Tickets.

After six months' service any worker shall be allowed first or second class privilege return tickets at one half the ordinary single fare, with a minimum charge of 1s. for adults and 6d. for a child, to be issued as provided in Clause 14 (a).

Free pass and privilege ticket shall not apply to race, special, guaranteed special, or special excursion trains, within a fifty mile radius, or when, in the opinion of the station-master at the station where the worker desires to commence his journey, there is not ample room in the train.

#### 16. Holidays.

(a) Unless by mutual agreement between the Commissioner and the Union to the contrary every worker shall, after twelve months' continuous service, be granted twelve days' leave on full pay each year, the whole of which shall be taken at one time in each year. Provided always that with the consent of the Commissioner holidays may be allowed to accumulate for two years. Two days' extra annual leave shall be granted to workers stationed at Yalgoo and Goongarrie and north and east thereof, and on the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe railway.

(b) Foremen, guards, signalmen and shunters, after twelve months' service, shall be allowed an additional four days' holiday in each year on full pay subject to good conduct.

(c) Workers shall be paid for holidays at the rate of pay they are drawing at or immediately before the time when such holidays are taken.

(d) Sunday conditions shall apply on Good Friday, Christmas Day, and Eight Hours' Day.

(e) Every worker, after six months' continuous service, shall be entitled to the foregoing holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the twelve months.

(f) No deduction shall be made from annual holidays for the period any worker is off duty through sickness, unless the absence exceeds three calendar months.

(g) At depots and stations, where it can conveniently be done, a roster will be posted showing the approximate dates on which each worker will go on his annual leave and resume duty. Such roster will be subject to alteration to meet the exigencies of the service. Provided always that with the approval of the head of the branch any worker may change dates with another.

(h) Subject to the proviso hereto, any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service shall be entitled to receive payment for any holidays which may be due to him up to the time of leaving the service: Provided that if a worker be dismissed for disobedience of lawful orders, for being under the influence of liquor or for drunkenness, he shall be entitled to be paid only for such leave (if any) as has accumulated from a previous year, and if dismissed for peccation he shall not be entitled to any payment for leave or holidays accumulated or otherwise.

(i) Unless at his own request, no employee shall be booked off for a holiday at a foreign station at which he would not otherwise have remained during such holiday.

(j) Goods sheds employees when called on to do duty on any holiday shall be paid for not less than four hours.

17. **Privilege Season Tickets.**—Second class season tickets at half the ordinary season ticket rates, available between the station nearest his residence and his place of work, shall, on application, be issued to any worker. To any worker in receipt of 5s. or under per day, one-quarter of the ordinary season ticket rates shall be charged.

18. Rates of Pay.

The minimum pay for any male adult worker covered by this award shall be at the rate of £3 6s. per week.

Under-rate Workers.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the Commissioner, and in default of such an agreement within 24 hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after 24 hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have again been fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

21. Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway.—To all workers covered by this part of this award stationed on the Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway—

(a) A district allowance of 5s. per day, 7 days per week, shall be made.

### 23. Hours of Duty.

(a) Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work. Provided that notwithstanding anything contained in Clause 24 of the award workers may until the 31st December, 1919, be required to work an additional four hours per week at ordinary rates. No day's work shall exceed eight hours forty-eight minutes. The week's work may extend over five or six days at the option of the Commissioner.

(b) Any worker brought on duty for any purpose outside his ordinary working hours shall be paid a minimum of two hours, provided such work, exclusive of meal times, is not continuous with his shift.

### 24. Overtime Rates.

(a) All time worked in excess of usual working hours in any one day shall be paid at the rate of time and a-quarter for the first four hours and thereafter at time and a-half, provided that double time shall be paid for overtime on all work other than work for any department of the State.

(b) All work performed on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Eight Hours' Day shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half, and a worker working and paid at such rates on either of those days shall not thereby lose his claim to a paid holiday under Clause 10 hereof.

25. Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway.—To all workers covered by this part of this award stationed on the Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway—

(a) A District Allowance of 5s. per day of seven days per week shall be made: Provided that in the case of tradesmen the allowance shall be increased by such amount (if any) as shall be required to make his week's wages and district allowance equal to 7s. per day over the minimum rate of his trade, plus 5s.

(b) Four shillings for the first 30 hours where Barracks are provided, and 5s. 6d. where Barracks are not provided shall be allowed in lieu of 2s. 6d. and 4s. as provided in Clause 8 (a), and 3d. per hour for any succeeding hour or part thereof.

(c) An extra 12 days' leave on full pay shall be granted annually, such leave to be counted from the time of booking off duty at Home Station.

26. The following clauses of Part 1 shall apply to the worker covered by this part of the award, viz.:—

- Clause 10.—“ Transfers and Transfer Allowance.”
- Clause 11.—“ District Allowance.”
- Clause 12.—“ Water Allowance.”
- Clause 14.—“ Free Passes.”
- Clause 15.—“ Privilege Tickets.”
- Clause 16.—(a), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h), and (i), “ Holidays.”
- Clause 17.—“ Privilege Season Tickets.”
- Clause 19.—“ No New Designation.”
- Clause 20.—“ Under-rate Worker.”

27. Apprentices.—Provision shall be made for Apprentices as follows:—

(a) A probationary period of six months shall be allowed.

(b) Wages:—

During the first year of service . . . . .	15s. per week.
“ “ second year of service . . . . .	20s. “
“ “ third year of service . . . . .	30s. “
“ “ fourth year of service . . . . .	40s. “
“ “ fifth year of service . . . . .	50s. “

(c) Apprentices shall be employed in the Department under such conditions as may be in force from time to time at the rates of pay stated herein. The term of all apprenticeships entered into with any trade or trades to which this award applies shall be for a period of five years. Apprentices on completing their term, if further employed by the Department, shall be paid the minimum rate hereinbefore prescribed.

(d) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination as herein-after provided at the end of each twelve monthly period.

(e) The examination shall take place at the Technical School, Perth, or such other convenient place as may be decided upon, and shall include theory and practice as applied in the science and art of the calling to which the apprentice is indentured.

(f) The examination shall be conducted by the officers of the Technical School, or other approved persons, who shall issue a certificate to each pupil indicating his degree of proficiency, taking into consideration the term of apprenticeship served.

(g) It shall be lawful for the Commissioner to withhold the increase in wages accruing to the apprentice in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (b) hereof, if any apprentice fails to satisfy the examiners.

(h) The Commissioner shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this award if he fails to give apprentices reasonable opportunity to learn.

(i) The number of apprentices shall not exceed the proportion of one to every two journeymen employed in shop work.

(j) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time.

PART 3.

The provisions of this part of the award shall apply generally.

28. This award shall not in itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker who is at present receiving above the minimum rate prescribed for his class of work.

29. Secretary's Pass.—The Commissioner shall grant leave for a continuous period or otherwise of thirty days in each year to the secretary of the union (should such secretary be a railway servant) to enable him to attend exclusively to the union work, and a free pass will be issued to the said secretary whether he be an employee or not, for that period, but the pass may be withdrawn at the Commissioner's discretion. Such pass shall be used exclusively for railway union work and not for political purposes.

30. Term of Award.—The currency of this award shall be three years from the 23rd January, 1918: Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.

31. Area and Scope of Award.—This award shall apply only to workers employed by the Commissioner in and about the working and maintenance of the State Railways, and shall be binding upon the above-named parties, and shall operate over the whole of the State Railways and the workshops used in connection therewith.
