NOTICE is hereby given that, at a special meeting of the Executive Council held in the Council Chamber, Perth, on Wednesday, the 21st day of January, 1920, it was reported that His Excellency the Governor has left the State, and that, in pursuance of his Commission as Lieutenant-Governor, Sir Edward Albert Stone, K.C.M.G., was commanded to administer the Government of the State pending the arrival of a successor to His Excellency Sir William Grey Ellison-Macartney. Having taken the prescribed oaths before the Honourable the Chief Justice, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor issued the following Proclamation:—

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, (By His Excellency Sir Edward Albert
TO WIT. Stone, Knight Commander of the Most
Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St.
George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over
[L.S.] the State of Western Australia and its
Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of
Australia.

To all whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS by a Commission under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet dated the seventh day of May, 1906, I, Sir Edward Albert Stone, was duly appointed Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, and by the said Commission I was authorised and required, in the event of the office of Governor becoming vacant, or of the Governor being incapable, or of his departure from the said State, to administer the Government thereof, with all and singular the powers and authorities contained in certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster the twenty-ninth day of October, 1900, constituting the office of Governor in and over the said State of Western Aus-

tralia, and according to such instructions as the said Governor for the time being had already received, or might thereafter receive from His Majesty, or through one of his Principal Secretaries of State, and according to such laws as were then or might hereafter be in force in the said State: And whereas the Right Honourable Sir William Ellison-Macartney, Privy Councillor, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc., has taken his departure from the State: Now this is to give notice that I, the said Sir Edward Albert Stone, having duly taken the Oaths required by the Letters Patent, have, in pursuance of the said Commission, this day assumed the office of Administrator of the Government pending the arrival of a successor to the said Sir William Ellison-Macartney, or during His Majesty's pleasure: And by the terms of the said recited Commission His Majesty doth command all and singular his Officers, Ministers, and loyal subjects in his said State and its dependencies, and all others whom it may concern, to take due notice thereof and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said State, at Perth, this 21st day of January, 1920.
