WHEREAS by "The Aborigines Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown Lands to be Reserves for Aborigines: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Aborigines should be declared at the Moola Bulla Native Cattle Station: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a Reserve of 1,119,000 acres at Moola Bulla Native Cattle Station, near Hall's Creek, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Aborigines.
