WHEREAS by "The Mctropolitan Water Supply, Sew-erage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works; And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from cer-tain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Excentive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sec-tions 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted. Fremantle Water Supply.

Laying of 75 chains of 8in. diameter cast iron water main, along Marmion Street, East Fremantle, from Carrington Street to Duke Street, with all apparatus connected therewith.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 30th day of January, 1920.



#### Wyndham Water Board, Wyndham.

### DIVISION I.

Interpretations. 1. (a.) The words "Authorised," "By-laws," "Dis-triet," "Fittings," "Local Authority," "Occupier," "Owner," "Pipe," "Prescribed," "Ratepayer," "Rateable Land," "Road," "Reservoir," "Stream," "Water Area," "Waterworks," "Watercourse," and "Works" shall have meanings severally attached to them is "" "Works" shall have meanings severally attached to them in "The Water Boards Act, 1904," hereinafter and the By-laws made thereunder. (b.) "Reservoir" shall mean any reservoir, dam,

(c.) 'High Water Mark'' shall mean the level of full supply of any reservoir or feeder thereto.
(d.) ''Domestic Supply.'' A supply of water for

domestic purposes shall not include a supply for eattle or for horses, or for any steam engine or for washing carriages, where such horses or carriages are kept for hire or are the property of any dealer, or for any hotel, inn, trade, manufacturer, or business whatever, or for watering gardens or for fountains or for any ornamental purpose. . (c.) "Private Service."

For the purposes of these By-laws "Private Service" includes all the pipes and fittings, and all connections and apparatus of whatsoever nature or kind, and whether used temporarily or otherwise on any part of the premises of the owner or occupier of any premises supplied with water, whether by meter or otherwise, and includes any pipes or fittings the property of the consumer, which are used for convey-ing water from the mains of the Minister whether situated on the premises of the consumer or otherwise.

#### DIVISION II.

# By-laws for Protecting the Water, Grounds, Works, etc., from Trespass and Injury.

#### Trespassing prohibited.

2. Trespassing within the fenced-off ground adja-cent to or reserved for Water Supply Works, or the eutering without proper authority of any Water Work not open to the public, shall not be permitted.

#### Camping and lighting of fires.

3. Camping or lighting of fires within the vicinity of any reservoir, except on land set apart for such purposes, shall not be permitted. The lighting of fires on any other reserves or fenced-off land is absolutely prohibited.

#### Protection of flora, shrubs, etc.

4. The removal, plucking, or damaging of any wildflower, shrub, bush, tree, or other plant growing on any land or reserve vested in the Minister, within half a mile of any reservoir, shall not be permitted.

#### Dogs prohibited.

5. Dogs shall not be permitted on any portion of the grounds in the vicinity of any Water Works.

#### Disposal of refuse, etc.

6. Loose paper or other refuse shall not be left on any portion of the grounds in the vicinity of any reservoir or works, except in the receptacles provided therefor.

#### Posting or distribution of bills, etc.

7. Bills, advertisements, or other notices shall not be posted or distributed on any portion of any reservoir or works, or on any portion of the works or grounds in the vicinity thereof.

#### Nuisances.

S. Nuisances shall not be committed on any portion of the grounds in the vicinity of any reservoir or works.

### Protection of pipes.

9. Vehicles, conveyances, or animals shall not be driven, taken, or ridden in such a manner as to endanger the main conduit or any branch thereof, or be permitted to cross the same except where crossing places have been provided as indicated by sign-boards.

#### DIVISION III.

#### Licensing of Plumbers.

Plumbing work shall be done by licensed plumbers.

10. Any person shall not do, or cause to be done, any work within the Water Area in connection with the water supply of any premises or in connection with any have first been duly admitted by the Board as a "licensed Water Supply plumber.'

### Description and scope of licenses.

11. The Board will grant Water Supply plumbers' licenses, operative only in the area to which these Bylaws apply, to water supply plumbers upon the applicants satisfying the Board that they are competent water supply plumbers, and that they are fit and proper persons to hold such licenses, and the applicants may be required to submit to an examination in the theory and practice of plumbing work.

#### Annual fec for license.

12. A fee of ten shillings shall be payable for every license except when a license is granted after the tenth day of July in any year, in which case the fee shall be five shillings.

#### Renewal of license.

Licenses issued by the Board under the By-laws 13. and Regulations shall be current only from the 1st January to the 31st December of the year of issue, and water supply plumbers shall apply for a renewal, and pay the their existing license is current.

#### List of licensed plumbers shall be published.

14. A list of licensed water supply plumbers shall, from time to time, be published at the office of the Board.

#### Breaches of By-laws by plumbers.

15. Any licensed water supply plumber offending against any By-law or Regulation of the Board, or who shall refuse to give any needful or proper information required by an officer of the Board, either by himself or those employed by him, or who fails to complete any contract with the Board or with a private owner within the time specified, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Twenty pounds, and he shall also show cause why his license shall not be suspended or cancelled. Any person who has been removed from the list shall not be readmitted as a licensed water supply plumber until he shall have served the suspension order or paid such fine, not exceeding Twenty rounds, as the Board may determire.

#### Delay in work.

16. Plumbers shall execute any work they undertake with reasonable despatch; and any inconvenience to the public caused by licensed water supply plumbers by unnecessary delay in carrying out work will be rigorously dealt with by the Board.

#### Accidents to pipes shall be reported.

Accidents caused by licensed water supply 17 plumbers to water, gas, or other pipes shall be at once reported, and immediate steps taken to have repairs effected, and the cost of same shall be defrayed by such plumber.

#### Deposit and declaration.

18. Prior to issue of the license, the person to whom the same is to be issued shall deposit with the Board a sum of Five pounds, which shall be retained during the currency of the license as a security for the proper performance of all work done by him, and shall sign a declaration that he accepts such license subject to and in conformity with the conditions thereof and with the Regulations of the Board, and that he will conform and comply therewith.

#### Deductions from deposit.

19. The Board may deduct from such deposit any fine inflicted or the expense of making good any bad work of the licensed water supply plumber or his workmen, and as often as any amount is so deducted the licensed water supply plumber shall make good the deposit to the sum of Five pounds, and in default his license will be cancelled.

Change of address shall be notified.

20. Every licensed water supply plumber shall, within forty-eight hours of any change in his address, give notice, in writing, thereof to the Board.

#### DIVISION IV.

#### Water Supply Plumbing.

Specification of pipes and fittings for private services. 21. In connection with the laying down, maintenance, alteration, or repair of every private service, the following regulations shall be observed by the owner or occupier of the premises whereon such service is:---

- (a.) All pipes and fittings shall be of lead, or galvauised wrought or malleable iron.
- (b.) Where lead pipes are used, they shall be of drawn lead of equal thickness throughout, and of at least the respective weights following, viz.:--

(c.) Where wrought iron tubes are used they shall be butt welded or solid drawn of regular section with British standard thread and of the following weights:---

- (d.) The minimum weight of wrought and malleable iron fittings shall be fixed from time to time by the Board, and no malleable fittings unless of approved brand shall be used.
- (e.) Tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplets, plugs, etc., shall be of the best manufacture, true in section, regular, and of equal thickness, properly and truly cut with the British standard thread, perfectly sound and new, and free from all defects.

The tees, bends, tubes, etc., shall be capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.

- (f.) All joints between pipes, tees, bends, thimbles, couplings, elbows, and cocks, etc., shall be made with red lead and flax or other approved jointing material. All joints on lead pipes shall be of the kind known a s' wiped joints," and all connections between lead and iron water pipes shall be made with brass couplings and wiped joints.
- (g.) No pipe or other apparatus shall be laid through any sewer, drain, ashpit, cistern, or manure bin, or through, in, or into any place where, in the event of the pipe becoming unsound, the water conveyed through such pipe would be liable to be polluted or to escape without observation, unless such pipe or apparatus be laid through an exterior cast iron pipe or box of sufficient length and strength to afford due protection to the same and to bring any leakage or waste within easy detection.
- (h.) All taps, stop-cocks, ball-cocks, valves, service boxes, waste-not regulators, bath taps, or valves or other fittings used in connection with the supply of water shall be of approved types and capable of withstanding a pressure of 300lbs. per square inch, and shall be tested and stamped

by the duly authorised officer of the Board before being fixed. The Board will test and stamp the same, and charge the following fees for testing and stamping:---

Bib and stop-cocks	 2d. each.	
Ball-cocks or valves	 2d. each.	
Waste-not regulators	 6d. each.	

- (i.) Every eistern and tank shall be provided with an equilibrium ball valve, and the overflow pipe shall be laid and fixed in a suitable manner, so as to discharge in some conspicuous place open to inspection, and in a position approved by the Board.
- (j.) No service pipe shall communicate directly with any cistern, tank, or vessel intended or used for the reception of water, other than water obtained from the Board's mains.
- (k.) No part of any service shall communicate directly with the water in any steam boiler or other apparatus used for the generation of steam, but the feed water shall be supplied in such a manner that none of the water in the boiler, or such other apparatus, can return into the main or service pipe.
- (1.) Every water closet fitting shall be approved of by the Board, and shall be supplied from the service pertaining to the tenement, through a proper cistern or service box, fitted with approved waste preventing apparatus. No service pipe shall communicate directly with a basin or trap, or otherwise than with the cistern of a water closet.
- (m.) In every bath the outlet shall be distinct from and unconnected with the inlet or inlets, and the inlet or inlets shall be placed at least one inch above the highest water level of the bath. The outlet of every bath shall be provided with a perfectly water-tight plug. The Board will not supply any bath unless the same shall be so constructed as to prevent a waste of water.
- (n.) Every urinal shall be supplied only through a cistern or service box, fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No service pipe shall communicate directly with any urinal.

#### Maintenance of private services.

22. (a.) The owner or occupier for the time being of any premises supplied with water shall at his own risk and expense, and, subject to the provisions of these By-laws, arrange with a licensed plumber to lay down his private service and keep it in good order and repair, and so that the same shall at all times be in accordance with the By-laws for the time being.

(b.) The service pipe being the property of the owner or occupier of the land supplied by such service pipes, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service pipe requires repairing, immediately arrange with a licensed plumber to repair the same, subject to the provisions of these By-laws, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after receipt of such notice, and the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise, as the Minister may see fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

(c.) Without prejudice to the right of the Board to proceed for any penalty for the breach or non-observance of any of the provisions of this By-law, the Board may cut off the supply of water to any premises whereon the private service or any part thereof is not at all times laid, fixed, used, or maintained in all respects in accordance with the provisions of the said By-law, and may keep the same cut off until such provisions have been fully observed.

#### Interference within three feet of meter.

23. Licensed plumbers or other persons shall not under any circumstances disconnect the joints from the meter, or, after a meter has once been fixed on a service and water has been turned on, disconnect or interfere with any piping within three feet of such meter. Such work shall be done only by the servants of the Board.

### DIVISION V.

#### By-laws for General Purposes.

#### Applications for services.

24. Applications for water services shall be made on the printed form procurable at the office, and shall be lodged not less than seven days before the service is required Full information, as indicated on the prescribed form, shall be supplied, and the full amount of rates or other charges due on the premises to which a service is required shall be paid on or before application and before the work is commenced.

#### Supply to non-rated premises.

25. Any person or persons requiring a water service to any non-rated property, may be supplied on payment of a minimum charge, which shall be fixed by the Board in each case. The minimum charge shall then take the place of a water rate, and the general provisions of these By-laws, as applying to ratepaying consumers, shall apply to minimum charge paying consumers.

#### Supply of water not compulsory.

26. It shall be at the discretion of the Minister to supply water to any individual consumer or to any land whether rated or not.

#### Separate services required.

27. Except with the written permission of the Board, not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Board may, in special cases, consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the subservices shall be so arranged that the supply to each house shall be independent of the supply to the remaining houses and controlled by a stop-cock on such subservice.

#### Sizes of service pipes.

28. The size of the service pipe shall in each case be fixed at the discretion of the Board.

#### Notice of intention to build.

29.The owner or occupier of any land supplied with water within a Water Area who shall erect, or make, or cause to be erected or made any building or addition to an existing building on such land shall, before the commencement of same, give notice in writing thereof to the Board.

#### Locking of taps, etc.

30. The occupier of any premises to which the water has been laid on, or, in the event of there being no occupier, the owner shall cause proper means to be taken, by locks or otherwise, subject to the approval of the Board, to prevent the use of the water from the main by persons not connected with the said premises.

#### Misuse of Water.

Any person entitled to a supply of water for 31.domestic purposes only, or entitled only to a supply of water for any other specified purpose, shall not use such water for any other purpose except that specified.

#### Illegal taking or selling of water.

Any person, whether entitled to receive water 32.from the Board or not, shall not, without the written permission of the Board, take, carry away, or allow to be taken or carried away, such water from his premises, or sell the same to any other person.<sup>4</sup>

#### Turning off when repairing and tapping.

33. The Board may, from time to time, when neces-sary for the purpose of tapping or repairing the main, or otherwise, cut off the supply of water from any part or parts of a water area.

#### Reward—Reporting leakage.

34. The Board may in its discretion adequately reward any person (not being the person in fault) who shall communicate timely information to the Board of any leakages or waste of water, whether the same be accidental, negligently or wilfully occasioned or suffered, or who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of any person or persons who shall steal or cause to be stolen or improperly appropriated the water of the Board.

#### Waste of water.

35. Any person supplied with water by the Board, whether by meter or otherwise, shall not allow the same to run to waste.

#### Fixing of meters.

36. Any officer appointed by the Board for the purpose may fix a meter on any service, and shall determine the size and class of meter in each case. Meters will be supplied by the Board and may be open or encased, at the discretion of the Board.

### Repairs and maintenance of meters.

37. Any person supplied with water through a meter belonging to the Board shall pay the cost of making good all damages to such meter whilst on his land and in his charge. Any repairs required shall be done by the officers of the Board, and the expense incurred by the Board in so doing shall, on demand, be paid by the owner or occupier of the land, and if not paid on demand shall be recoverable in the same manner as water' rates.

#### Notice of damage or non-registration shall be given.

38. Any person supplied by the Board with water through a meter shall, on finding that meter is damaged. or not registering, immediately give notice of the fact to the office.

#### Interference with meters.

39. Any person shall not break or in any way interfere with the seal fixed on the meter through which water is supplied by the Board, or turn or attempt to turn any screw, bolt, or nut on or attached to such meter. or use any tool or appliance on any such meter or introduce or attempt to introduce any body or substance into such meter, or in any way interfere with any portion of such meter or any pipes or fittings attached thereto.

#### Period for reading.

40. The quantity registered by a meter at any time between ten days before and ten days after any stated date may be taken as the reading of the meter at such stated date.

#### Averaging of consumptions.

41. During the time any meter is undergoing repairs, or should it cease to properly register the consumption of water, the Board or any officer appointed by the Board may, at its option, estimate the quantity of water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during such period as the Board may determine, and the quantity so ascertained shall be paid for by the consumer.

#### Testing of meters.

42. If any consumer shall at any time be dissatisfied with any particular reading of a meter, and be desirous of having the meter tested, he shall give written notice thereof to the Board or their officer within seven days of such reading, and thereupon the said meter shall be tested by passing through it a predetermined quantity of water, and if upon such testing it shall appear to the satisfaction of the Board or their officer that the meter registered more than five per cent. in excess of the quantity that shall actually pass through it at such testing, then the Board shall bear the expense of and incidental to such testing, and shall also adjust the charge to the said consumer; but if the meter upon such testing shall not register more than five per cent. in excess of the quantity that shall actually pass through it, then the consumer shall pay to the Board all the expenses of and incidental to such testing, providing that the expense of every test shall be fixed by the Board, subject to a minimum charge of ten shillings for each test; provided also, that the consumer shall not be at liberty to avail himself of the right to test the registration of the meter for any period other than the period of registration next preceding the date of reading in respect of which he shall have given notice as aforesaid.

Authority to enter premises. 43. Any officer acting under the Board's authority may, at all reasonable times, enter any house or premises connected, or intended to be connected with the water mains, in order to examine whether the water pipes and fittings in such house or premises are in proper order. Any person refusing such admission or in any way hindering such officer in the execution of his duty shall be liable to a penalty as hereinafter prescribed.

#### Gratuities prohibited.

44. Officers, workmen, or agents of the Board shall not solicit or receive any fee or gratuity whatever,

#### Standard drawings and fittings.

45. Approved standard fittings and type drawings will be exhibited at the Board's office. Lue consideration will be given by the Board to the claims of any other fittings which may be presented for approval, and, if considered satisfactory, the same may be placed among and become one of the approved standard fittings. The Board may, from time to time, amend, alter, or cancel any or all of the standard fittings or type drawings, and replace them by such other fittings or drawings as they may approve of.

### Junction or interference with pipes or fittings.

46. Any person shall not make any connection or interfere with any pipe or fitting of the Board or with any water pipe or fitting communicating therewith, at any other place than shall be approved of by the Board, and the mains shall only be tapped by the workmen of the Board.

#### Inspection of works.

47. Work shall not be undertaken in connection with water supply, or in the extension or alteration thereof, until such time as the necessary printed permit is obtained. Two days' notice shall in all cases be given by the licensed plumber before work is intended to be commenced, unless the officer of the Board duly appointed to issue permits expressly accepts shorter notice. In no case shall any water pipes or apparatus in connection with Water Supply be used until the said work shall have been inspected and, if necessary, tested, by the said officer, and certified by him on the prescribed form. No underground or enclosed work shall be covered up or concealed from view until the same shall have been duly inspected and passed by the Inspector, and for this purpose the person to whom the permit has been issued shall immediately report any work which is ready for inspection or test, and every facility shall be afforded to such officer for making such inspection or tests.

#### DIVISION V1.

#### Rates and Charges.

#### Ratina.

48. (a.) Within the Wyndham Water Area the water rate shall be at a rate not exceeding two shillings in the pound per annum upon the net annual value of all rateable land, provided that a minimum rate of not exceeding per annum shall be payable on each

per annum shall be payable on each separately assessed piece of land.

(b.) The Board may, in their discretion, allow a discount of not exceeding 25 per centum upon any rates paid within three months of the date upon which such rates become payable, but such discount shall not apply to minimum rates or fees, which shall be paid in full.

(c.) In making rates a distinction may be made between occupied and vacant land, and in the event of a dispute as to whether or not land shall be regarded as vacant, the decision of the Board shall be final in every case.

### Rates—How payable.

49. Rates shall become due and payable yearly in advance on the first day of July. Provided that in all cases where a rate is made after the first day of July in any year the notice of the order for the making and levying of such rate, published in the *Government Gazette* and a newspaper, as provided by Section 94 of the said Act, shall specify the minimum sum payable as rate as aforesaid, and the date or dates when the rates shall be due and payable, and such rate shall be and become due and payable in accordance with the terms of such notice.

#### Allowance for rate.

50. Subject to the provisions of these By-laws every ratepayer will be entitled to consume on each separately assessed piece of land of which he is the owner or occupier that quantity of water which, if calculated at the price specified in the Schedule 1 hereto as being that at which water is supplied in return for the rate in the area in which such property is situated would amount to the equivalent of the water rate paid on each property, provided that such water is taken during the period for which the rate is struck.

#### Payment for excess water.

51. Every rate paying consumer taking water in excess of the quantity to which he is entitled in respect of the

## rate shall pay for the excess in accordance with prices set forth in the Schedule 1 hereto.

Fees—State or Commonwealth Government Departments. 52. For each water service for purposes of any State or Commonwealth department there shall be payable, as a minimum annual fee in lieu of water rate, the sum of not less than One pound  $(\pounds 1)$  when the service is metered, and of not less than One pound ten shillings  $(\pounds 1 \ 10.5)$  when the service is non-metered.

It shall be at the discretion of the Board as to whether or not a meter shall be fixed in each case.

### Fees for additional services.

53. In any case where the owner or occupier of any separately rated piece of land requires more than one cervice to be installed for supplying water to such land, such additional service or services shall, at the discretion of the Board, be installed on such occupier or owner paying in advance the cost of installation and a fee of not less than One pound per annum, in addition to meter rent, for each additional service. In return for such fee an equivalent quantity of water will be given in each year, in the same way as water is given in return for water rates.

#### Meter rents.

54. Meters will be supplied by the Board, and may, in the discretion of the Board, be open or encased, and every person supplied with water by measure to other than rateable premises or private residences shall pay meter rent in advance according to the following scale:—

#### Reconnection fec.

55. In every case in which the supply of water shall have been cut off by reason of non-payment of rates or other charges, or by reason of a defective service, or by request of the occupier or owner, or when, in the opinion of the Board, necessary to prevent waste of water, or for other reasons, a minimum fee of five shillings shall be charged for disconnection and reconnection; provided that where the cost exceeds the minimum fee the actual cost of the disconnection and reconnection, as determined by the Board, shall be charged, and shall be payable by the owner or occupier for the time being, on demand. The service shall not be restored until such fee has been paid.

#### Private fire services.

56. Private fire services will be allowed, but every such service shall be sealed, except in cases where the Board may decide that sealing is unnecessary. For each such service there shall be paid the actual cost of installation, and a fee equivalent to five per centum on cost per annum shall be paid in advance as rental, subject to a minimum fee for each service of Ten shillings per annum. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion except for extinction of fire. In the event of the seal having been broken in case of fire or by accident, or etherwise, the occupier shall give notice, and pay the cost of re-sealing.

#### Building fees.

57. Where water is required for building purposes the Board may permit the supply thereof at prices as set

- forth in Schedule 1 hereto and on the following terms:-(a.) The afore-mentioned prices shall apply only to supplies to buildings intended for use as ordinary dwellings.
  - (b.) In the case of buildings other than ordinary dwellings, the supply shall be on such terms as may be agreed upon by the Board, subject to a minimum fee of One pound for each service.
  - (c.) All fees shall be paid in advance. If any work is done other than that mentioned at the time of applying to the Board, the same shall be paid for in advance, or the whole supply will forthwith be cut off.
  - (d.) It shall be at the discretion of the Board as to whether or not in any case a supply of water shall be classed as a supply for building purposes, and as to whether or not the supply shall be measured by meter.
  - (e.) Applications for water under this By-law shall be in writing, stating the nature of the work to be done and the purpose for which water is required.

When accounts due and payable.

58. Where water is supplied by measure to the owner or occupier of land, whether rated under the Act or otherwise, payment for same shall become due and payable within 14 days after due service of the account, unless otherwise agreed upon.

#### Schedule 1.

#### Schedule of Prices of Water.

Purpose for which water is supplied, or class of water service, and price per 1,000 gallons.

Excess water—10s. per 1,000 gallons.

### DIVISION VII.

#### Penalties.

59. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws or any amendment thereof, to which no specific penalty is attached, or who shall refuse or neglect to obey any injunction in any such By-law or to comply with any requirements therein contained, shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, and, in case of continuing offence, a further penalty not exceeding £5 for each day after notice of such offence shall have been given by the Board to such offender.

The West Kimberley Road Board, as the duly con-stituted Water Board to administer the provisions of "The Water Boards Act, 1904," and any amendments

thereof, do hereby make and publish the following By-laws to come into force as from the 1st day of July, 1919, in the Water Area described as the Derby Water Area, and any extension of the boundaries thereof :--

#### Interpretation Clauses.

The terms "Houses" and "Land" shall have the

The terms "Houses" and "Land" shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of "The Health Act, 1911." The words "Board," "Fitting," "Land," "Occu-pier," "Owner," "Person," "Pipe," "Prescribed," "Rateable Land," "Water Area," "Waterworks," and "Works" shall have meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of "The Water Boards Act, 1904." "Catchment Area" shall mean Water Reserve No.

9973.

"Inspector" and "Local Officer," respectively, shall mean a person appointed by the West Kimberley Road Board as the duly appointed Water Board for the purposes of these By-laws or to administer the said By-laws.

"Board" shall mean "The West Kimberley Road Board,' as the duly constituted Board to administer the provisions of "The Water Boards Act, 1904," and any amendments thereof.

# Division 1.—By-laws for preventing pollution of the waters of the Catchment Area.

No person shall bathe, or wash clothes or other articles, in any reservoir or other waterworks within the water area, or wash, throw, or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal, or throw or convey, or permit to be conveyed or thrown therein any rubbish, dirt, filth, dead animal, or other noisome thing, or otherwise cause any pollution of water within the water area.

2. No person shall deposit or permit to be deposited any refuse, dung, manure, or other offensive matter in or near any catchment area, or in any place where, in the opinion of the Inspector, storm waters will be liable to wash such matter into any feeder.

No person shall deposit or place or spread, or permit to be deposited, placed or spread, in or upon any land or garden within the catchment area, any nightsoil or human urine, whether mixed with other substance or not, or any solution of nightsoil, unless the same has been thoroughly deodorised and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Inspector, and unless written consent thereto has been obtained.

In the event of the death, or of an accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcase of such animal shall be reother animal, the carcase of such animal shall be re-moved by the owner thereof to a safe distance from any waterworks, or to such place as the Inspector may direct, and the owner shall immediately thereafter dispose of same by burning to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

5. No person shall deposit, or cause or permit to be deposited, any rubbish, filth, blood, offal, or manure, or any slops, scapsuds, urine, water containing urine or other refuse, noisome thing, or matter in any part of the catchment area or water area, whence it may, in the opinion of the Inspector, be carried by storm water into any store. any feeder.

6. Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of the thing required to be done by any Inspector or other authorised officer shall be determined by the Board according to the nature of each case.

Division 2.-By-laws for protecting the Water, Grounds, Works, etc., from Trespass and Injury.

No unauthorised person shall trespass within the fenced area adjacent to any waterworks, or any reserve or other lands under the control of or vested in the Board.

8. No person shall, without first obtaining a license, cut or remove timber from any land or from any re-serves or other properties in possession or under the control of the Board.

9. No person shall, without proper authority, enter any machinery house, valve house, or other portion of the works not open to the public, or enter any enclosure within the water area containing a tank, reservoir, meter, house, store, office, or other waterworks.

10. No person shall permit live stock to have access to any portion of the grounds in the vicinity of any waterworks.

11. No person shall post any bills, advertisements, or other notices on any portion of any waterworks or grounds in the vicinity thereof.

Division 3.-By-laws for the licensing of Plumbers. 12. By-laws under this division shall apply to all plumbers' work within the Derby Water Area.

13. No person shall affix, alter, or repair any service pipe or fitting to be used in connection with any main or other pipe belonging to the waterworks, or interfere in any way therewith, unless licensed as a plumber under these By-laws.

14. An application for a plumber's license shall be in writing, signed by the applicant and addressed to the Board.

15. Every applicant for a plumber's license shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber, and may be required to submit to an examination in the theory and practice of plumbing work.

16. Every license shall be granted by the Board; and the granting and cancellation of any license shall be in the absolute discretion of the Board.

17. Every license shall be annual, expiring on the 10th day of January next following the granting thereof, and shall be in the Form A in the Schedule hereto.

A fee of ten shillings shall be payable for every license except when a license is granted after the 10th day of July in any year, in which case the fee shall be five shillings.

19. Every applicant for a plumber's license shall, before receiving a license, deposit with the Board the sum of five pounds, to be held by the Board during the currency of the license, as security for the proper performance of all work undertaken by the licensee.

20. The Board may deduct from such deposit the ex-pense of making good any bad work of the licensed plumber or his workmen, and as often as any expense is so deducted the licensed plumber shall make good the deposit to the sum of five pounds, and in default his license will be cancelled.

21. Every licensed plumber shall, within forty-eight hours of any change of his address, give notice in writ-ing thereof to the Board.

22. The mains shall be tapped only by the workmen of the Board.

23. No licensed plumber shall interfere with any pipe or fitting belonging to the waterworks without the permission in writing of a local officer first obtained.

No ground shall be opened nor shall any work be 24 undertaken for the purpose of laying and fixing a new service or fittings, or in the extension or alteration of any existing service or fittings, until notice shall have been given by the responsible licensed plumber to a local officer. Such notice shall be in writing, in the Form B in the Schedule, and shall describe the nature and extent of the proposed work, and shall be given forty-eight hours at least before the work is intended to be commenced, unless the officer expressly accepts shorter notice.

25. On the completion or extension of any service, the responsible plumber shall report the work to a local officer as ready for inspection.

In no case shall the ground be filled in or water 26.turned on to any land until the work executed by the responsible plumber has been examined and passed by a local officer, and a certificate in writing has been given by such officer to that effect.

#### Division 4.-By-laws for General Purposes.

27. Within the Derby Water Area the water rate shall be at a rate not exceeding Three shillings in the pound per aunum upon the net annual value of all rate-able land; provided that a minimum rate of not exceeding One pound per annun shall be payable on each separately assessed piece of land.

Water rates shall become due and payable yearly 28in advance, on each first day of January. Provided that in all cases where a water rate is made after the first In all cases where a water rate is made after the first day of January, in any year, the notice of the order for the making and levying of such rate, published in the *Government Gazette* and a newspaper, as provided by Section 94 of the said Act, shall specify the minimum sum payable as rate as aforesaid, and the date or dates when the rate shall be due and payable, and such rate shall be and become due and payable in accordance with the torus of cuch paties. the terms of such notice.

29. Every ratepayer will be entitled to consume, on cach separately assessed property for which he is rated, that quantity of water which, if calculated at a price not exceeding Seven shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons would amount to the equivalent of the water rate paid on such property; provided that such water be taken during the period for which the rate is struck.

30. Every ratepaying consumer taking water in excess of the quantity to which he is entitled in respect of the rate will be charged for the excess at a price not

the rate will be charged for the excess at a price not exceeding Five shillings per thousand gallous. 30a. The price to be charged for supplying water to shipping within the water area shall be as follows:— Supplies per meter to shipping and machinery con-necting with shipping, not exceeding Ten shillings per 1000 collars 1,000 gallons.

31. It shall be at the discertion of the Board to supply water to any individual consumer, whether rated or not, at such price or prices as may be mutually agreed upou.

Where water is supplied by measure to the owner 32.or occupier of land, whether rated under this Act or otherwise, payment for the same shall be made at such times and in such manner as may be agreed upon between the Board and the consumer.

tween the Board and the consumer. 33. Any person or persons requiring a water service to premises in respect of which, for the time being, a water rate may not be made, may be supplied on pay-ment of an annual minimum charge, which shall be fixed by the Board in each case. The minimum charge shall then tele the place of a water rate such the general are then take the place of a water rate, and the general provisions of these By-laws, as applying to ratepaying con-sumers, shall apply to minimum charge paying consumers.

34. Application for services shall be made on the printed form procurable at the office of the Board, Derby, and shall be lodged not less than one week before the commission magnitude the service is required.

Applications will not be entertained unless full in-35. formation, as indicated on the printed form, is supplied, and the full amount of rates due on the premises to

and the rull amount of rates due on the premises to which a service is required are paid. 36. The Board may, by notice to a consumer, from time to time restrict the quantity of water that may be supplied to him in any one week.

37. The Board may, from time to time, when necessary for the purpose of tapping or repairing the main, or otherwise, cut off the supply of water from any part or parts of the water area.

. 58. It shall be at the discretion of the Board as to whether or not a meter shall be affixed to any service, and the Board will also determine the size and class of meter in each case.

39. Meters will be supplied by the Board, and may at the discretion of the Board be open or encased, and rent for same shall be payable yearly in advance for each meter, whether positive or interential, of a size up to three-quarters of an inch, in the case of open meter a minimum of Ten shillings per annum, and in the case of encased meter a minimum of One pound per annum.

40. The quantity registered by a meter at any time between ten days before and ten days after any stated date may be taken as the reading of the meter at such stated date.

41. During the time any meter is undergoing repairs, or should it cease to properly register the consumption of water, the Board may, at its option, estimate the quantity or water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous month or quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, and shan charge for the consumption so ascertained.

42. If the consumer shall at any time be dissatisfied with any particular reading of a meter, and shall be desirous of having same tested, he shall give written notice thereof to the Board within seven days of such reading, and thereupon the said meter shall be tested by passing through it a pre-determined quantity of water, and ii, upon such testing, it shall appear to the satis-taction of the Board that the said meter registered above five per cent. more than was actually passed through it at such testing, then the said Board will bear the expense of and incidental to such testing, and will also adjust the charge to the said consumer, but if the said meter upon such testing shall not register above five per cent. more than the quantity that shall have actually passed through it, then the said consumer shall pay to the said Board all the expenses of and incidental to such testing: provided that the amount representing the expense of each and every test shall be fixed by the Board, and shall in no case exceed the sum of Forty shillings: Provided also, that the said consumer shall not be at liberty to avail himself of the right to test the registra-tion of the said meter for any period other than one month next preceding the date of reading in respect of which he shall have given notice as aforesaid: Provided further, that for testing meters of sizes 34 in. and under a uniform fee of Ten shillings shall be charged.

43. No person shall break or in any way interfere with the seal fixed on a meter through which water is supplied by the Board, or turn or attempt to turn, any screw, bolt, or nut on or attached to such meter, or use any tool or appliance on any such meter, or introduce on attempt to introduce any body or substance into such meter, or in any way interfere with any portion of such meter or of any pipes or fittings attached thereto.

44. No licensed plumber, or holder of any operative plumber's certificate, or other person shall, under any circumstances, disconnect the flange from a meter, or shall, after a meter has once been fixed on a service and water has been turned on, disconnect or interfere with any piping within twelve feet of such meter. Such work shall be done by the servants of the Board only.

45. Any person supplied with water through a meter belonging to the Board shall pay the cost of making good all damages to such meter while on his land and in his charge, and shall deliver such meter up in good order on ceasing to hire same. Any repairs required shall be done by officers of the Board, and the expense incurred by the Board in so doing shall, on demand, be paid by the owner or occupier of the land, and if not paid on demand shall be recoverable in the same manner as water rates.

46. Any person supplied by the Board with water through a meter shall, on finding that the meter is damaged or not registering, immediately give notice of the fact to the Board at the Board's office, Derby.

47. No person knowing that a meter is damaged or not registering properly shall draw water through such meter from a service pipe which is supplied with water by the Board.

48. In every case in which the supply of water shall have been cut off by reason of non-payment of rates or other charges, or by reason of as defective service, or by request of the occupier or owner, or when in the opinion of the Board necessary to prevent waste of water, or for other reason, a fee of Five shillings shall be charged for re-connection, and shall be payable by the owner or occupier for the time being on demand. The service shall not be restored until such fee shall have been paid.

49. No person to whom water is supplied by the Board shall, without written permission, sell or supply water to any person who may not reside on the premises of which he is the occupier.

50. The occupier of any premises to which the water has been laid on, or in the event of there being no occupier, the owner shall cause proper means to be taken by locks or otherwise, subject to the approval of the Board, to prevent the use of the water from the main by persons not connected with the premises supplied.

51. The owner or occupier of any allotment of land within the water area who shall erect or make, or cause to be erected or made, any building or addition to any existing building on such land shall, within one calendar month thereafter, give notice in writing to the Board.

52. Officers or workmen employed by the Board shall not solicit or receive from the public any fee, gratuity, or reward.

#### Division 5.—Mayall's Bore—Mayall's Well, Goody Goody Well, Yabbagoody (Clay-pan), and other surface watering places in the Derby Water Area.

53. All persons in charge of travelling stock and all packers and teamsters shall, within twelve hours of their arrival on the Derby Water Area report to the Secretary of the Board, at the Board's office, during office hours, the number and description of the stock in his charge and time of arrival on the Derby Water Area aforesaid, and shall fill in and sign the following printed declaration giving full particulars and description of the said stock at the time of so doing :--

Any offender against the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction before any one or more Justices of the Peace, be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

54. The following fees shall be paid by all travelling stock watering on the Derby Water Area: Provided that a minimum charge of one day shall be paid, irrespective as to whether they had been watered or not, such minimum charge shall be at the scale of fees payable by the description of stock, as described in the Stock Declaration referred to in By-law 53 as having arrived on the Derby Water Area.

#### Schedule of Fees.

For horses, donkeys, mules, camels, horned cattle, or other large stock travelling for sale, or for delivery, or for shipment, or being transferred from one station or stations to another station or stations:—One shilling per head for the first twenty-four hours or part thereof; Sixpence per head for the second twenty-four hours or part thereof; Threepence per head for every succeeding twenty-four hours or part thereof (subject to minimum charge).

For small stock (sheep, pigs, goats):—Twopence per head for the first twenty-four hours or part thereof; One penny per head for the second twenty-four hours or part thereof; One halfpenny per head for every succeeding twenty-four hours or part thereof (subject to minimum rate).

Teams.—Horses, donkeys, mules, bullocks, and camels (including packing teams):—Twopence per head per day or part thereof for the first three days; One penny per head per day or part thereof after the first three days.

Teams watering at Rowan Street trough shall pay a fee of twopence halfpenny per drink per head, and each individual teamster shall apply to the Secretary at the Board's office, Derby, for the key of said trough and return said key to the Secretary at Board's office, Derby, when watering has been completed. Teamsters shall not when watering has been completed. Teamsters shall not be permitted to hand the key of said trough from one teamster to another. Stock for shipment or travelling shall not be permitted to water at Rowan Street trough without the permission of the Secretary or Ranger, and on payment of the charge fixed per drink for watering at Rowan street trough aforesaid, and shall be in addi-tion to the fees payable under these By-laws.

Mayall's Bore .- No person shall wash clothes in, throw sticks, twigs, rags, paper, grass, or any filth or rubbish of any description into the receiving chamber at Mayall's Bore, nor introduce any obstruction, or cause to be introduced any obstruction into the outlet pipes from said receiving chamber, nor introduce any ob-struction or cause to be introduced any obstruction into the overflow pipes of the iron troughing or concrete troughing, nor unscrew or attempt to unscrew any bolt, screw, or nut attained to the covering of the ball tap, nor unscrew or attempt to unscrew the control valve from the supply pipe, nor introduce any substance into the fittings of said control valve, nor tamper with the ball attached to the control lever, nor unscrew or at-tempt to unscrew the caps from the silt plugs attached to each end of each section of the said concrete troughing, nor introduce any substance into the pipe connection of the two sections of the aforesaid troughing.

56. No person shall use any tools or appliance, nor in any way interfere with the control valve of Mavall's Bore.

57. No person shall be permitted to yard stock of any description in the enclosure protecting Mayall's Bore, nor remove rails, nor in any way interfere with the fence protecting the said Mayall's Bore.

58. No teamsters, travellers, packers, nor any other person or persons shall be permitted to camp within one quarter of a mile of Mayall's Bore or troughing. Any offender against any provision of this By-law shall, upou conviction before any one or more Justices of the Peace, be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

59. No swine or camels shall be permitted to water at any of the troughing at Mayall's Bore during the vatering of stock for shipment or travelling stock: Pro-vided that the person or persons in charge of such swine or camels be notified by the person in charge of such s ock for shipment or travelling stock, in sufficient time to withdraw to a safe distance, and also of his or their intention of approaching the troughing for the purpose of watering thereat.

60. The Board shall not be responsible for any damage or injury to any animal or animals by reason of their attempt to enter the concrete troughing, or having en-tered suffered any injury by so doing. In the event of tered suffered any injury by so doing. In the event of the nature of such injury necessitating the slaughter of such animal or animals, the owner or person in charge shall dispose of the carcase thereof to the satisfaction of the Board or its officer.

61 After a mob of cattle exceeding the average number for shipment have watered, at any one time, on any one day, at Mayall's Bore troughing, the Board re-serve the right to state the time at which the next mob may water, provided the next mob arrive at the trough-ing within ten hours after the mob first written above have watered. The Board shall be the sole indge of have watered. The Board shall be the sole judge of what constitutes "the average number" referred to in this By-law.

The Board shall not be liable to any damages or demurrage charges by reason of the enforcement of the above proviso.

62 No person or persons shall on foot approach the troughing when eattle are watering, nor drive nor attroughing when eather are watering, hor drive nor at-tempt to drive any vehicle to the troughing when eattle are watering, nor drive any unotor-car, or motor cycle or motor cycle with side-car attached, nor wagon, dray, or any vehicle past such eattle when they are watering at the troughing aforesaid. Penalty for breach of this By-law, Five pounds (not exceeding).

Any person contravening any of these By-laws, whether by act or omission, shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, where not otherwise provided.

The above By-laws were passed at a meeting of the West Kimberley Road Board (as the duly constituted Water Board to administer the provisions of "The Water Boards Act, 1904," and any amendments thereof) held on the 11th day of November, 1919.
