IT is hereby notified, for public information, that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has approved of the following Order in Council under "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919":—

Whereas by "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," it is provided that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, determine the maximum prices which may be charged for food-stuffs in any proclaimed area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, on the recommendation of the Commissioners appointed under the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby determine that the prices of the food-stuffs mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be the maximum prices that may be charged for such food-stuffs within the metropolitan area.

Schedule.

Wheat, f.a.q., 7s. 8d. per bushel.
Flour, per ton of 2,000 lbs., £16 17s. 6d., less 5s. if paid for on delivery or within seven days thereafter, and subject to the ordinary terms and conditions.
Flour, per ton, in 50 lb. bags, £18, less 5s. if paid for on delivery or within seven days thereafter, and subject to the ordinary terms and conditions.
Flour, per ton, in 25 lb. bags, £19 5s., less 5s. if paid for on delivery or within seven days thereafter, and subject to the ordinary terms and conditions.
Bran and Pollard, per ton, £8 5s., less 2s. 6d. if paid for on delivery or within seven days thereafter, and subject to the ordinary terms and conditions.
Bread, per 2 lb. loaf, 5½d., including delivery and booking.
