The following words to be added:-For each street corner truncated, 5s.

THE LAND ACT, 1898.

Amended By-laws-Derby Common Reserve.

Corr. 1892/88

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following amended By-laws for the control and management of the Derby Common; those previously gazetted being hereby cancelled :-

Commonage By-laws amended.

THE West Kimberley Road Board, as the Board of Management of the Derby Common, do hereby, under powers conferred by the Governor pursuant to the pro-visions of Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," make and publish the following By-laws for the regulation and good management of the Derby Common:

1. These By-laws shall be known and cited as "The Derby Common By-laws.'

2. The following words and expressions used in these By-laws shall, unless there is something in the context repugnant thereto, have the meaning set against them respectively:

"Owner"-The person having the property in or having possession, control, management or con-trol of animals or stock. "Cattle"—Bull, ox, cow, heifer, and calf. "Travelling Camels"—Any camels taken or driven

or about to be taken or driven to any place more than twenty miles from the place upon which such camels were depasturing previously to starting.

"Travelling Stock"-As above.

- "Stock'"—Any horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, mule, camel, bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer, calf, ram, ewe, wether, lamb, or goat. "Board"—The West Kimberley Road Board as
- the Board of Management.

"Common'"-All that country known and marked on the map as "The Derby Commonage." "Ranger"-The Ranger appointed by the Board or

any officer or member of the Board.

3. All stock running on the Common otherwise than in accordance with the following By-laws shall be treated as trespassing stock and shall be subject to "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" Vic., No. 7), and its amendments. (46

4. No person shall depasture any animal or animals upon the Common or any part thereof without having first obtained a license so to do from the Board.

5. The following fees shall be paid for licenses to any person and persons (except butchers and dairymen) to depasture under these By-laws, and such fees shall be paid in advance on or before the first day of January in each and every year, and if any payment be not made when due the license shall be void, and owners shall be subject to By-law No. 3 hereof.

Schedule of Fees.

For horses, asses, mules, and cattle-15s. (Fifteen shillings) per head per year.

For sheep-1s. (One shilling) per head per annum.

For goats-4s. (Four shillings) per head per annum. Travelling stock—Teamsters, packers, etc., large stock including camels, shall be subject to the fees in force for the time being of the Derby Water Board. Travelling Sheep-Goats, etc., shall be subject to the fees for the time being of the Derby Water Board. Butcher's license-£5 (Five pounds) per annum.

Dairy cows-5s. (Five shillings) per head per annum up to 20; over that number the usual rates.

Nanny-goats-2s. (Two shillings) per head per annum up to 25; over that number the usual rates.

Any stock under six months of age, free.

Horses, milking cows, or goats up to the number of three may be run on the Common by any ratepayer of Derby free of charge.

No swine or camels shall be depastured upon the Common.

6. No person shall travel, drive, or permit to stray on the Common any animal or animals infected with or suffering from any infectious or contagious disease. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of one pound per day per head during con-tinuance of such offence, for large stock, and three shillings per head per day for small stock.

7. Every applicant for a license to depasture under these By-laws shall give a correct list in writing of the numbers of horses, sheep, cattle, goats, asses, mules, that he or she shall intend to depasture on the Common, and shall describe therein the brands, numbers, and other distinguishing marks thereon, and shall obtain a license signed by the Secretary or other person duly authorised in that behalf, setting forth the number and description of the animals licensed by the Board to depasture on the Common upon the terms and conditions of the within By-laws.

8. No license shall be granted to any person to depasture on the Common at any one time a greater number of horses than ten (10), cattle than ten (10), or a greater number of goats than six (6), or sheep than fifty (50).

9. No license shall be granted to any butcher to depasture on the Common at any one time more than three hundred (300) sheep and thirty (30) head of cattle for killing purposes, and no license shall be granted to any dairyman to depasture on the Common at any one time more than twenty-five (25) head of cows or goats for dairying purposes without the written permission of the Secretary first had and obtained.

10. The Chairman of the Board, Secretary, or other person authorised in that behalf may permit the holder of a license to depasture issued under these By-laws to substitute any other horses, sheep, asses, cattle, goats, or mules not exceeding the number prescribed by such license for those included and described in such license, such permit to be endorsed on such license.

11. No stock shall be mustered on the Common without the written permission of the Commonage Ranger, and no person or persons shall brand stock running or depasturing on the Common unless in the presence or by permission of the Secretary or Commonage Ranger.

12- No person shall run or depasture horses, sheep, cattle, goats, asses, or mules on the Common except in accordance with the provisions of the within By-laws.

13. No teamster shall depasture his team on the Common between the first day of December and the thirtyfirst day of March inclusive in each year without having first paid a fee of ten shillings (10s.) and obtained permission from the Secretary or Ranger so to do; from first of April to the thirtieth November the usual fees per head proportionate to time shall be charged.

14: The Commonage Ranger or the Secretary for the time being shall have authority to demand particulars of stock depasturing on the Common from any person who is in his opinion able to give such particulars, and any person refusing to give such particulars as afore-said on demand shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person or persons who shall introduce, cause, or allow to be introduced or depastured any diseased animal or animals upon the Common shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 5$ (Five pounds) for each offence, and $\pounds 2$ (Two pounds) per day for a continuation of the offence, but not more than $\pounds 20$ (Twenty pounds) in the aggregate, where no other penalty is imposed by the By-laws in respect to the specific offence.

16. Any person or persons killing stock taken from off the Common must render to the Commonage Ranger monthly a list of brands of the stock killed and dates of killing.

17. All persons in charge of travelling stock, and all packers and teamsters, within twelve hours of arrival on the Common shall report to the Secretary of the Board, at the Road Board office, Derby, during office hours, the number and description of stock under their charge and time of arrival on Common. And in case of stock for shipment shall give the name of the steamer by which such stock are to be shipped.

Any breach of this By-law shall render the offender liable to a penalty of not more than £5 (Five pounds) for each offence.

18. Should any horse or other animal die on the Common, the Ranger or Secretary shall notify the owner thereof to burn or bury the same, and should the owner refuse or neglect to do so within (12) twelve hours after receiving such notice, the Ranger or Secretary may cause the same to be done, and all expenses incurred thereby shall be borne by and recoverable from the owner.

19. The Board shall not be responsible for any damage or injury sustained from any cause by any animal depasturing on the Common under the provisions of these By-laws.

20. No entire horse or bull over the age of six (6) months shall be allowed on the Common, and the owner thereof shall be liable to a penalty of £5 (Five pounds), and £1 (One pound) per day for every day that he allows such entire horse or bull to remain on the Com-mon after being served with a notice to remove the same.

21. The Board shall be the sole judge of what constitutes a bona fide butcher, dairyman, traveller, teamster, packer, and dairy cattle or goats within the meaning of these By-laws.

22. The Secretary of the Board or any other authorised person may on suspicion of any animal being diseased, order or cause the same to be removed from the Common, and if he shall think fit cause the same to be impounded and examined, and if found to be discased, all expenses incurred in connection therewith shall be borne by the owner, and until such is paid the Board shall have a lien on any other animals, the property of such owner, on the Common.

23. The Ranger for the time appointed by the Board shall enter in a book to be kept for that purpose, all fees, dues, and charges for pasturage or water, and shall deliver to the Secretary with his report the said book at least once in every week.

24. No person or persons shall cut or remove any growing timber or dead timber for sale as firewood from the said Commonage without having first obtained the permission of the Board, and the Board may direct where and what kind of timber may be cut, and any per-son found lopping or felling any baobab tree on the Common shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

25. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise pro-vided, be paid to the Board and become the property of, and form part of, the ordinary income of the Board.

26. The Secretary or Commonage Ranger shall at any time, with the approval of the Chairman, or any two members of the Board, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of fees unpaid, or the recovery of any fine or penalty, or for any breach of the within By-laws, or any of them, or for the enforcement of the within By-laws or any of them; and such legal proceed-ings shall be commenced by a complaint made by the Secretary or Commonage Ranger, and all proceedings shall be in conformity with "The Justices Act, 1902," and its amendments, unless such proceedings are repug-nant to the within By-laws or any of them.

27. Careless use of fire.--(a) No person shall make or leave a fire burning on the Common without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(b.) No person shall carelessly or wilfully set fire to any standing tree, grass, bush, or scrub on the Com-mon, and any such offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

All camels taken or driven or about to be taken 28.or driven across the Common shall be subject to the provisions of the "General Uniform By-laws regulating the control of camels," published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th day of August, 1916, and any amendments thereof.

29. All persons in charge of camel teams, or packers or droving camels, shall notify the Secretary of the Board, by telephone from Yeeda Station, on the Fitzroy Road, if approaching from that direction, and by tele-phone from Meda Station, on the Lennard Road, if approaching from that direction, at least three days before their intention of entering the Town of Derby. Penalty for breach of this By-law: Five pounds.

30. Any person or persons offending against any of these By-laws shall, where no other fine or penalty is provided for, be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

31 All existing By-laws relating to the Common are repealed as from the date of publication of these Bylaws in the Government Gazette.

Kalgoorlie-Boulder City-Brown Hill Loop Line.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that the following alterations have been made to the Coaching Rates Book:

On and from Monday, 2nd February, 1920, the section of Railway-Kalgoorlie to Kamballie, via Williamstown, and Kamballie to Kalgoorlie, via Kallaroo (known as the Boulder Loop)-will be worked under Tramway Chit System for the conveyance of passenger traffic.

The fares chargeable under the provisions of the Coaching Rates Book, 1919, and amendments thereto, are cancelled, and the present system of issuing tickets at Stations, and Excess Fare tickets at Unattended Sidings, is abolished.

The fares and conditions shall be as under :----

School children under 15 years, upon their parents and school teacher signing a certificate-one shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per dozen.

Workers travelling by trains specified as "Workers" in the published Time Table, and paying a 3d. cash fare, will be provided, on request, with return tickets available on the day of issue, excepting workers on the Night Shift, when the ticket shall be available on the following day.

Passengers travelling from any point on this section (excepting Boulder City) to a point beyond Kalgoorlie will be required to re-book at Kalgoorlie.

Passengers travelling from any main line station or siding to any point on this line (excepting Boulder City) will require to re-book at Kalgoorlie.
